Block-leader (1938-42). Abraham, together with SS-men Hinkemann and Kubitz, under orders from OSF Schober, buried alive all University Graduates and Rabbis (March 1942). Killed a Jew by banging his head against a wall. Took part in drowning Jewish prisoners in a pond and in an open sever. Transferred to front in 1942.


