Reported to have been Camp Commandant of Esterwegen 1933 - 1936, of Dachau 1936 - 1939, and of Sachsenhausen since 1939 until April 1943, when appointed Chief of Police at Oslo.

Former police official at Augsburg; imprisoned for dishonesty and dismissed. Nazi Party official since 1929. Owned house property at Dachau and elsewhere valued at RM. 168,000.

A pervert and sadist; invented the 'black arrest'; granted three days' leave and prize money for shooting "escaping" prisoners. Responsible for atrocities at Esterwegen, Dachau and Sachsenhausen resulting in deaths of 8,000 - 9,000 prisoners. Ordered stopping of prisoners' rations in Dachau in 1937, causing epidemic of hunger typhus.
