Moore, Florida official of the National Association for the Advancement of Colored People, which resulted in his death, the east coast Communist newspaper "Daily Worker" has been appealing for communications to President Truman. Attorney General J. Howard McGrath, and Florida Governor Fuller Warren demanding a halt to "the genocidal terror in Florida." In addition, protests emanating from Dommunist and non-Communist sources have been feathed. The December 31 issue announced that more than 200, Con flyers relating to the bombing were issued and circulated by the "Daily Worker" publishers.

Elsewhere throughout whe country Communists and Communist-dominated with the disc have been active in exploiting the bombing. For example, it has been reliably reported that: 3311500 40 14310

Page 89 of rerep makes reference to a security matter investigation and also reveals the identity of a former informant of the Miami Office. It is desired that this page be rewritten in the proper manner and copies be made available to the Bureau and other Offices receiving copies of this report. This should be handled without delay.

Rerep is a lengthy report and reflects very little organization in its preparation. As an example the results of interview with neighbors are scattered throughout the report rather than being grouped together in a logical manner. Likewi e, investigation concerning one specific phase of the investigation is reported in various parts of the report. The report has very little continuity and is extremely hard to analyse to determine if all leads have been covered. Previous lengthy reports in the Carver Village and Jewish Property cases were very well or anized and prepared and it is suggested that the form and organization of those reports be followed in future reports prepared in tals case. It is also desired that a table of contents and an index be prepared in future voluminous reports in this case.

Three copies of reports are sufficient for Bureau, purposes in this case.

Yoe, Attorney, Pensacola, Florida, recently made the statement that he had been retained by an insurance company to investigate the death of victim Moore. It is further reported that the insurance company was in the process of drawing up a policy fan Moore's life, however, it is not known whether this policy was in effect at the time of Moore's death. Miami requested authority to have Coe interviewed. Coe is the subject of a Security Matter-C investigation. The Bureau's file (100-358684) reflects the following information: John Mareno toe, U. S. born prominent attorney of Pensacola, Florida, has represented known Communists and racial cases of interest to the Communist Party in various courts throughout the South. The has associated with known Communist Attorneys and has attended meetings at which Communists were present, such meetings being in connection with cases handled to Coe. He has contributed to the Daily Worker and other Communist or anizations. He was a member of the United States Army for approximately seven months during 1918. He has two sons, one served in the Air Force and the other in the Army during World War II. He has two daughters, both of whom married U. S. Naval Officers. Coe served a short time as Special Assistant to the U. S. Attorney at Pensacola, Florida to handle routine criminal cases shortly after World War I. 

It is not telieved this informent can be "shoved" but will have to be handled diplomatically. If it appears at any time that he is not being truthful the Bureau will be advised immediately and consideration will be given to recommending possible prosecution under the Obstruction of Justice statute.


