

She stated that she heard that relatives of the victims reached the scene almost immediately, but that she does not know whether there were enough people around shortly after the explosion that it is certain that she would have noticed the crowd if the explosion had taken place before they passed.

advised that she was not personally frightened and that her departure from Mims was according to her original plan. She reported that she had not lived there for three years and that she had merely returned to visit her mother and that she had purchased a round trip ticket originally. She advised that her return to Slaton was as she had planned.

She again denied that she had made a telephone call from Titusville on December 25, but that she did call at Slaton, No. 647W, on December 26, 1951, at about 9:00 A.M. She stated that the call had no reference to the bombing. She repeated that it was made from the Truck Stop in Mims.

She positively denied that she had made any statements to the effect that she or the men had seen a patrol car at the grove near victims! house nor has she heard either of the men make any such statement.





The results of investigation to date relfect that some of the KKK members at Apopka and Winter Garden, Florida, are in all probability responsible for the bombing in this case. No admissions have been obtained but information received from informants and witnesses indicate that certain renegade members of the Klan were making inquiries about Moore and "casing" his home at Mims for a number of months prior to the bombing. These remegade Klan members deny any participation and at the present time other acts of terrorism by Klan members are being investigated to determine the identities of Klan members responsible which information in turn, may be used in questioning the main suspects. has been interviewed by Agents from the Savannah office and has admitted participation at five floggings and has identified only one other Klan member. He has not

given all information he undoubtedly possesses. It is believed that Miami Agents, thoroughly familiar with this case and Klan activities in Florida, will be in a much better position to question and be more likely of obtaining valuable information. Consideration is being given to calling Klan members before a FGJ and knowledge of participation in acts of terrorism should materially assist in questioning the Klan members. 

It has been rumored in the Orlando area that DORA MAE MOSBY received word she had better get out of town or something would happen to her. She is presently residing at 170 First Street, Troy, New York, with Mrs. LEROY (DOROTHY) ROBINSON.

regarding the shooting of MELVIN WOMACK. In the conduct of investigation in Florida it has been determined that many of the victims of terrorist incidents and witnesses and relatives of victims are terrified and fear that if they cooperate with the FBI they may be subject to reprisals on the part of the persons participating in the terrorist incidents. Therefore, in interviewing DORA MAE it is important to convince her it is necessary for the benefit of her race that she cooperate with the Agents and that any fear of reprisals against against and LUTHER COLEMAN, be allayed. In this connection it is noted the COLEMANs have been very cooperative in this matter.

enclosed a group of photographs, identified only by name, of known Klansmen, many of whom are known to be on the Klan "wrecking crews", for exhibition to DORA MAE MOSBY. There are several poses of some individuals. After she has been interviewed the photographs should be returned to the Miami Office.

In the event she can effect an identification or furnish any information of value it should be incorporated in a signed statement. The Orange County Sheriff's Office performed a cursory investigation of the killing of WOMACK and the Miami Office has been advised by a confidential source in the Sheriff's Office that during the investigation DORA MAE was questioned as to whether there was any truth to the rumor she had been living with a white man and as a result he because of jealousy was instrumental in WOMACK's death. The source believed this was merely a "cover up" on the part of the investigator to distort facts regarding the persons responsible for the shooting.

DORA MAE MOSBY is described as approximately 45 years of age, light brown complexion, 130 pounds, wears glasses and is a very neat and good dresser.

It is requested this interview be given expeditious attention and in the event she effects an identification of any of the photographs that the Miami Office be advised by teletype.

Informant T-1 related that the meeting at LaGrange, Georgia did not take place as HENDRIX could not get there. He, thereafter, told that he had talked to a high Klan official, believed by to have been and reiterated that he had positive information that E. E. CAMPBELL, Exalted Cyclops of the Robert E. Lee Klavern at Birmingham, Wlabama, was the individual responsible for the Birmingham bombing, as well as the Florida bombing. stated the bomber had only one regret in regard to his bombing and, according to T-1, that was the fact that a child had been hurt by one of the dynamite explosions. Informant stated the only child he can recall as having been even slightly injured was who was in the home at Phenix City, Alabama at the time it was damaged by dynamite.
Informant T-1 stated that E. E. CAMPBELL resides at 1902 Stouts Road in North Birmingham, is a Tennessee Coal and Iron Company worker, and his time slips at the plant would not prove his absence from work at the time of any of the bombings as, according to T-1, CAMPBELL has relatives there who fix up these time slips to show him in attendance and thereby give him an airtight alibi. T-1 stated that during his inquiries of the Birmingham bombings, he ascertained that CAMPBELL at that time had his own plane, a Piper Cub. Since then, the plane has been sold, but CAMPBELL is a Colonel and Commanding Officer of Civil Air Patrol No. 1 at Birmingham, and consequently, has planes at his disposal.
Informant T-1 related that the bombing in wims, Florida, according to information, was a deviation from the regular routine, as it was believed that some sort of clock had been used to detonate the dynamite on the Mims job. Ordinarily, the dynamiter preferred to throw the explosive from a moving vehicle.
Informant T-1 further stated he personally recalls that in about April 1950, E. E. CAMPBELL was questioned by  State Investigators of the Sheriff's Office, and Detectives He stated that at that time CAMPBELL denied knowledge of the technique required to use dynamite. He was also
evasive in answering any questions, particularly if white residents of the area where the Negro houses were bombed, were Klan members. The only admissions secured from CAMPBELL was a statement to the effect that he had admitted at one time working with a man who had used dynamite in blowing stumps.



further reflected from the credit file that CAMPBELL enjoys a good business reputation and was not known to have been engaged in any "illegal or unethical practices." The file also indicated that no complaint or criticism had been received in regard to the character, habits or morals of this individual. The file did not contain any newspaper clippings or references to any past or present Klan activity on the part of CAMPBELL. His residents was shown as 1902 Stouts Road, Birmingham, Alabama. This residence was indicated as being owned by relatives of CAMPBELL's wife.

A review of the files of the Birmingham Office revealed that during the late 1940's, CAMPBELL was Exalted Cyclops of the Robert E. Lee Klavern No. 1 of the Federated Ku Klux Klans, Inc. He did not receive a great deal of newspaper notoriety in this capacity. Informant stated that he was recognized as the leader and motivating influence in Klan activity in Jefferson County, Alabama during the period which he headed the Robert E. Lee Klavern. During the "Klan Trials" held in Circuit Court, Jefferson County, Birmingham, Alabama, after numerous instances of floggings while masked were attributed to Klan members during the early months of 1949, CAMPBELL avoided a great deal of newspaper publicity which was received by other Klan officials at Birmingham, inefuding WILLIAM HUGH MORRIS, head of the Federated Ku Klux Klan, Inc. During the course of these trials, numerous photographs of WILLIAM HUGH WORRIS and other Klan officials appeared in the Birmingham press, but although news photographers were known to have taken pictures of E. E. CAMPBELL during that period, his photograph was never published in connection with his Klan activities.

Based upon information appearing in letter from the Miami Office to the Bureau dated January 11, 1952, setting forth the dates and circumstances surrounding additional bombings in Miami, Florida, as well as the instant case, contact was had with a confidential source, T-3, an official of the Tennessee Coal and Iron Company, a U. S. Steel subsidiary, with reference to the time and attendance records of suspect CAMPBELL during the periods September 22, 1951, (Carver Village); November 30, 1951, (Jewish schools and centers); December 23, 1951 (St. Peter and Paul Catholic Church) and the instant case, 10:30 p.m., December 25, 1951.

The following work record of suspect CAMPBELL, preceding and following the dates above, is set forth, noting that CAMPBELL is employed on the night shift of the Fairfield Steel Plant of the company from 11:00 p.m., to 7:00 a.m., and the hours worked under the individual dates set forth below refer to the day in which the seven hours of his

shift were worked, i.e., the table shows on December 25, 1951, as CAMPBELL being "off duty," however, eight hours' work were reflected on December 26, 1951, which means that he reported on his regular shift at 11:00 p.m., Christmas night, December 25, 1951, and worked through the end of his shift 7:00 a.m., December 26, 1951.

Subsequently T-3 was contacted with reference to additional information which might reflect that suspect CAMPBELL did, in fact, begin his tour of duty at 11:00 p.m., December 25, 1951. This source subsequently advised he had definitely and discretely established that CAMP-BELL was present and had worked on that shift, basing his comments upon contact with CAMPBELL's supervisor and a review of the "job record" of work performed by CAMPBELL on that night. In connection with the "job record," T-3 stated that when CAMPBELL entered on duty at 11:00 p.m., December 25, 1951, his "job record" showed him working on a particular job assignment which had the same "job number" as the work he was performing on his last tour of duty, but that during this particular shift, he had completed that item and was assigned to, and began working on, another "job number." T-3 stated it would have been impossible for this re-assignment of job work to have occurred in the records of this company had not suspect CAMPBELL been present at that time to receive his assignment and begin working on the new "job number."

In reply to inquiries concerning suspect E. E. CAMPBELL, T-5 stated he was well acquainted with that individual and knew definitely that CHAMPBELL had been a member of the Klan and was Exalted Cyclops of the Robert E. Lee Klavern at Birmingham, but that in the definite knowledge of himself, T-5, CAMPBELL resigned from the Klan over a year ago and has taken no active interest in Klan activities since his resignation. T-5 stated CAMPBELL's whole interest now outside his regular employment appears to be taken up with work with the Civil Air Patrol. T-5, at this time, had no other definite information which might be of interest in this case.

In furtherance of investigation to determine the whereabouts of suspect CAMPBELL during the period immediately preceding the Mims bombing, in instant case, the following investigation was conducted:

Mrs. MATTIE D. SMITH, widow of WILLIAM M. SMITH, who is a reliable individual and presently employed by the Title Guarantee Company at Birmingham and who resides in the residence at 1922 Stouts Road, Birmingham, which is the closest residence on the same side of the street as that occupied by E. E. CAMPBELL, was contacted by reporting Agents. She stated that for 15 or 20 years she has been very close to Mrs. E. E. CAMP-BELL and visits daily with her, either in her own home or in the CAMPBELL residence. She recalled that on Christmas Day, 1951, having visited the CAMPBELL residence and although she does not distinctly recall whether E. E. CAMPBELL himself was in the living room, she is sure in her own mind that individual was either at home or at Birmingham on that day and during the week end immediately preceding Christmas. She stated Mr. CAMPBELL personally has been a very good neighbor and that she has never heard anything derogatory concerning him. She is of the firm belief that had E. E. CAMPRELL been away from his residence for the day or so before December 25, 1951, that she would have learned about it throughhis wife.

During the interview with \_\_\_\_\_\_\_ she stated E. E. CAMPBELL has a reliable brother, HENDON B. "HUMP" CAMPBELL, who operated the Chambers Cleaners in North Birmingham and whom she stated could be expected to offer his assistance in any investigation.

Mr. HENDON B. CAMPBELL, known as "HUMP" CAMPBELL, who operates. the Chambers Cleaners with main offices located at 3411 - 27th Street. North Birmingham, who resides at 2314 - 34th Avenue, was contacted with reference to his knowledge of the whereabouts of his brother, E. E. CAMPBELL, during the period December 22 - 25, 1951. Mr. CAMPBELL stated since he was older than his brother, E. E., he had not been closely associated with him throughout the years and only infrequently visited in the brother's home. He was unable to recall definitely having seen him during December 22, 23, and 24, 1951, but was of the opinion that he and his wife had Christmas dinner on December 25, 1951, together with his brother, E. E. CAMPBELL and his wife, at the residence of their parents, Mr. and Mrs. G. G. CAMPBELL, at 3428 - 35th Avenue. In connection with the investigation being conducted in the above captioned case, the fatal shooting of MELVIN WOMACK, a negro at Oakland, Florida, has come under consideration as possibly having some bearing on instant matter inasmuch as persons responsible for this murder may also have been involved in the murder of victims HARRY T. and HARRIETT MOORE.

MELVIN WOMACK, a 27 year old negro, resided at Oakland, Florida, during March, 1951, with one DORA MAE MOSBY. According to statements made by DORA MAE to the Sheriff's Office, she and WOMACK were living as man and wife and had intentions of marrying.

On March 28, 1951, at approximately 10:45 P.M., four white men appeared at the house and forcibly took WOMACK from the house. WOMACK was later found on March 29, 1951, at approximately 9:30 A.M. by Constable CARL SANDERS of Winter Garden, Florida. He was lying alongside the road on the edge of an orange grove mortally wounded. He was taken to the office of Dr. ALBERT GLEASON at Winter Garden who after examining WOMACK instructed that he be hospitalized. He was thereafter taken to the Orange Memorial Hospital at Orlando. Examination reflected he had several gunshot wounds, reported to have been from shotgun slugs. He was hospitalized March 29, 1951, at approximately 12:30 P.M. and died March 31, 1951, at approximately 1:25 A.M. without divulging the identity of his assailants.

For the information of the Albany Office, one LUTHER COLEMAN, negro, while working as a janitor at the First National Bank of Winter Garden, Florida, was accosted on the sidewalk beside the bank at about 7:00 P.M. February 6, 1951, and after being beaten on the head with clubs was taken across the street and told to get in an automobile and lie on the floor. COLEMAN managed to break away from his abductors and while running he heard one man yell to shoot him. He heard a shot fired which apparently creased his right leg, causing him to fall. The commotion and the screaming of COLEMAN apparently frightened the abductors and the group, number unknown, fled in two automobiles.

The men made good their escape but the girls were caught and driven to a nearby orange grove located near Black Lake. Winter Carden, Florids. There they were forced to lie on the ground and submit to a severe beating with orange tree switches.

Other information developed indicates a Klensman, name unknown, the was married and the has a family was attempting to date \_\_\_\_\_\_at about this time. She steadfastly refused his advances. According to information developed at the time the beating was over one of the men in the group reportedly said to her "I'll bet the next time a married man asked you to go out with him you'll go."

Investigation to date has disclosed little information of value as to the activities of victim LOOKE during December, 1951. Referenced letter states that BHIL HENDRIX has advised he had a conversation with victim MOOKE in Jacksonville, Florida, approximately two weeks before MOOKE's demise, during which conversation LOCKE "confided" in MINDRIX that he ferred for his life. This is the first specific information that has been received from anyone indicating MOOKE gave any indication he believed his life was in imminent danger. There has not been received previously any information to the effect that LOCKE had any intention of curbing his activities in the WAAOP and the Frogressive Voters League or any information that he ever considered affiliating with the Civil Pights Congress. It is also to he noted that no information has been received freviously to the effect victim MOOKE was in Jacksonville during the time stated by HANDRIX.

The latter requested that this office re-interview BILL MINDRIX in an effort to obtain complete details as to his conversation with MOORE as well as his knowledge of MOORE and MOORE's activities. It was also requested that it be ascertained why he had the conversation with MOORE in Jacksonville and that HENDRIX be thoroughly interviewed as to MOORE's statements when MOORE allegedly confided in HENDRIX that he feared for his life.

As the Bureau and Miami Office are aware, HENDRIX recently "resigned" as Grand Dragon, Southern Knights of the KKK, in order to push his campaign for Governor of Florida.

Although the Bureau has specifically directed previously that HENDRIX not be interviewed in this matter, the Bureau has stated that Agents may accept information which HENDRIX volunteers. Inasmuch as HENDRIX apparently has indicated his desire to "volunteer" the above information as set forth in Mobile letter to Bureau dated March 19, 1952, HENDRIX will be re-interviewed UACB prior to April 10, 1952.


