On March 14, 1952 [Redacted] was reinterviewed by Special Agent [Redacted] and the reporting agent at his residence at [Redacted] Jackson, South Carolina.

[Redacted] explained that he joined the Ku Klux Klan at Apopka, Florida upon invitation of [Redacted] at Apopka, Florida.

[redacted] advised that he resigned from the Klan during the latter part of [redacted]

[redacted] admitted that he had participated in the flogging of one white man and four negroes residing in Apopka, Florida during the year [redacted] however steadfastly refused to cooperate in naming or identifying the flogging victims. He declined to state where the floggings had taken place or to identify the Klansmen who accompanied him on these floggings. He stated, however, that the caravan consisted of five automobiles, and that the individual Klansman who participated in the floggings did not wear robes or hoods.

He admitted that [redacted] was a member of the Ku Klux Klan in Apopka, Florida, and had accompanied him [redacted] as a driver of one of the cars on one or two occasions, but that neither he nor [redacted] took part in any of the floggings. He added that it was customary for the Exalted Cyclops to solicit volunteers from the Klavern when these floggings took place and that the [redacted] had never to his knowledge accompanied the group on any floggings. He termed [redacted] as "yellow."

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[redacted] advised he attended approximately 15 or 20 meetings of the Apopka Klavern of the Ku Klux Klan, and that he had visited the Orlando, Florida Klavern on two occasions.

[redacted] stated he knew EARL BROOKLYN to be a member of the Klan at Apopka, Florida, and admitted that he had met BROOKLYN at a Klan meeting in Orlando, Florida during 1949. He reiterated that he knew nothing of BROOKLYN ever possessing the floor plans of HARRY T. MOORE's home, nor did he know of any members of the Apopka Klavern who are familiar with the use of dynamite blasting caps or fuses.

[redacted] claimed he has never visited Mims, Florida and does not know where the town is located. He stated that he never heard HARRY T. MOORE's

name mentioned at any of the meetings of the Klan that he attended and further advised that he does not know HARRY T. MOORE.

[redacted] advised that he is still in sympathy with the Ku Klux Klan, and therefore does not care to divulge any information concerning Klan activities which might cause any of the members to become involved with the authorities.

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[redacted] stated that he does not believe the Apopka Klavern was involved in the recent bombing of the home of HARRY T. MOORE. He stated that his first knowledge of the bombing was a newspaper report of the incident.

[redacted] declined to furnish a signed statement concerning any of his Klan activities.

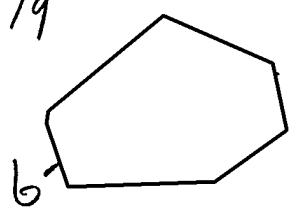

[redacted] interviewed. Denies any knowledge of threats made to HARRY MOORE. He stated he had met MOORE possibly two dozen times during a five or six year period, but always as a result of their joint activities in the National Association for the Advancement of Colored People and similar groups. [redacted] left Miami for California, June 21, 1951. [redacted] presently employed as a social case worker for Los Angeles County. He stated he had received a couple of threats but did not know whether or not they were connected to any that HARRY MOORE might have received.

[redacted] presently employed as a social case worker for Los Angeles County, business address 5427 Whittier Boulevard, Los Angeles, telephone number Union 8-1201, was interviewed by SA GROVER C. SCHOONOVER, JR. and the writer. [redacted] advised that he had left Miami on June 21, 1951 and came to California with his family. He stated that he had met HARRY MOORE possibly two dozen times in the past five or six years and that all of these occasions were as a result of their joint activities for the National Association for the Advancement of Colored People and also as a result of their activity in attempting to have colored students admitted to the University of Florida.

[redacted] stated that he had not known that MOORE had received any threats and was at a loss to understand how anyone would feel that he had

been close enough to MOORE to have known of such a thing. He stated that he had never been close to MOORE socially and only knew him as indicated.

[] did state that he had received a couple of threats but he did not know whether these threats were in any way connected with the bombing of HARRY MOORE's residence or not. However, he furnished information concerning these threats for whatever value they may have.

He did feel that [] Ocala, Florida, was friendly with MOORE and might have information in this regard.

The statement taken from [] the original of which is being maintained in the file of the Los Angeles Division, is quoted as follows;

"Los Angeles, Calif.
Feb. 27, 1952

"I, [] made the following voluntary statement to Grover C. Schoonover, Jr. and Ira J. Kellogg whom I know to be Special Agents of the Federal Bureau of Investigation. No threats or promises have been made to me in order to induce this statement as I make it of my own free will. I have been informed that anything I do say may be used in a court of law.

"I knew Harry Moore approximately five or six years and during that time I saw Harry Moore possibly two dozen times. I never knew Harry Moore socially and was acquainted with him as the result of his activities in the NAACP and the Progressive Voters League of Florida, both organizations in which I was also active.

"The last time I saw Harry Moore was around Apr. 1951 at a meeting which was held at Fissenden Academy, Martin, Florida. Moore was a member of a committee which was active in trying to get Negro students admitted to the Univ. of Florida. Moore did not mention anything to me regarding any threat which might have been made against him and I was unaware that any threat had been made to or against Moore.

"I left Florida 6/21/51, as the result of the forced closing of Fissenden Academy due to a lack of funds. I was [] this school and had been for 9 yrs. After leaving Florida I came to Los Angeles, Calif. with my wife [] and two children. Since I have been in Calif. I have not received any communication from Harry Moore.

"The following may or may not have any connection with Harry Moore but is being offered for whatever it is worth.

"I purchased a refrigerator from the [redacted] on a time contract. I missed a payment around Mar. or Apr. of 1951 due to my absence from town and I received a letter from [redacted] who was bookkeeper for the Marion Hardware Co. The letter was headed 'Dear John' and went on to tell me about being behind in my payment. I wrote a letter in return addressed [redacted] and objected to the salutation used by [redacted] in his letter to me. Approx. 2 weeks later an unknown person called my home during my absence and told [redacted] who was working for us in my home the following: "Tell [redacted] that next time he won't be called "Mister" but will be called a black s-- o- b----".

"During May of 1951 a friend [redacted] drove out to my home late one night and said 'two white friends of his had been contemplating contacting me [redacted], that a group of seven had been planning to teach me a lesson in connection with the letter I had written [redacted] but that they would forget it if I would write [redacted] an apology - that they were planning to have a county policeman arrest me for some traffic violation and then to turn me over to these men. Or they would import some KKKs from Ga. to way lay me some night on the highway. I told [redacted] to tell them that there wouldn't be any apology. I called [redacted] Ass't State Atty. of Marion Co. and told him what had happened and asked him if it was against the law to carry a gun in my car. [redacted] said I had a right to protect myself but that he didn't place too much importance upon the threat. Nothing ever came of this threat.

"I have read the above statement consisting of three and a fraction pages of handwriting, and it is true and correct to the best of my recollection and belief.

[redacted] Investigator from the Governor's Office, Tallahassee, Florida, contacted Special Agent JAMES B. HAFLEY of the Tallahassee Resident Agency on March 13, 1952, and stated that he had developed an informant very recently at Apalachicola, Florida, who "looks pretty good." [redacted] said that he would rather not reveal the identity of this informant at this time; however, he would identify him to this Bureau at a later date if it develops that he actually has any information of value to the captioned case.

[redacted] indicated that this informant was active in Klan circles and appeared to have some information on the captioned case as well as the Miami dynamitings. He explained that he was having to proceed very slowly with this informant; however, he expected to have some information either positive or negative by March 18, 1952 or March 19, 1952. He promised to re-contact Special Agent HAFLEY on the latter date for the purpose of giving him any information that he may have obtained from his Apalachicola, Florida informant.

On 3/11/52 SA JAMES B. HAFLEY interviewed Governor FULLER WARREN at Tallahassee, Florida regarding instant matter.

WARREN stated that he had known HARRY T. MOORE and had received numerous letters from him prior to his death. He pointed out that his office had not instructed any officials in Madison County, Florida to make any inquiry regarding MOORE. WARREN also stated that the only letter he had received from MOORE which might have a pertinent bearing in instant case is one he received dated March 19, 1950, which enclosed a letter dated March 18, 1950, which MOORE had written to former U. S. Senator CLAUDE PEPPER at Tallahassee, Florida. Governor WARREN emphasized that he was making the contents of these letters available to this Bureau with the understanding that the information would be considered as strictly confidential, therefore this information should not be imparted to any persons outside the Bureau, regardless of their official connection with this case. These letters are being quoted verbatim as follows:

We were pleased to learn that you have communicated with the Registrars and the Sheriffs in these counties and have advised them to uphold the law with respect to the efforts of Negroes to register and vote. The opening up of ballot boxes to Negro citizens in these "tough" counties is a matter of deep concern to Negroes all over Florida. We realize that our people in these counties need the free use of the ballot as a means of protecting themselves against police brutality, injustice in the courts, inequalities in educational opportunities, and the various other forms of discrimination that face them.

You are the only one who has the power to break down this hostile and undemocratic attitude on the part of certain local officials. You can apply enough pressure to secure the franchise for helpless Negro citizens in these particular counties. We realize, also, that it will not be an easy task, and that some of these county officials will dodge the issue, if they can. We urge again, therefore, that you "follow through" on your first instructions to these county officials and make sure that your instructions are obeyed. We ask that you not "ease the pressure", but that you apply all necessary force and take any steps necessary to make sure that Negroes in Madison and other "tough" counties are able to register and vote in the primaries this year.

If you desire more details on the situation in Madison County, please make contact with [redacted] Tallahassee. He is employed in the Attorney General's Office. We also shall be glad to co-operate in any way possible.

Please advise us as to further steps taken, and keep us informed of the progress being made in solving this problem.

As an enclosure to the above letter, Governor WARREN received a copy of a letter dated March 18, 1950 from MOORE to former U. S. Senator CLAUDE PEPPER, which letter reads as follows:

Mims, Florida
March 18, 1950

Senator Claude Pepper
Tallahassee, Florida

Dear Senator Pepper:

When a committee from the Progressive Voters' League of Florida talked with Governor Warren last November, one of the most important problems that we discussed was the intimidation of prospective Negro voters in Madison, Taylor, Suwannee, Hamilton, Jefferson, Gadsden, Calhoun, and a few other "tough" counties. In response to our request, Governor Warren promised protection for Negro citizens in these counties who desire to vote. Since then, we understand, the Governor has communicated with the Registrars and Sheriffs of these counties and has advised them to afford Negroes every opportunity to register and vote. He also advised that Negroes be given ample protection in exercising this right. Evidently, Governor Warren planned to "follow through" and see to it that his instructions are carried out.

Unfortunately, however, we have received information that some of your campaign leaders have asked the Governor to "go easy" with this matter and not press these county officials to open the ballot boxes to Negroes. It seems that those leaders are afraid that positive action on the part of the Governor might endanger the success of your present campaign.

As we have stated in several letters to you, Florida Negro citizens appreciate the stand that you have taken in the interest of a fair deal and equal opportunities for all citizens, without regard to race, color, or creed. That is one of the reasons why we are working so hard now to get a heavy registration of Negro voters. We have traveled the

state extensively during recent months, and we have found a strong sentiment in your favor among our people.

But it is very discouraging to learn that some of your lieutenants are trying to persuade the Governor to ease the pressure on those counties that refuse to let Negroes vote. The right to vote is a fundamental right of every citizen. But officials in Madison County have told some of our representatives that they do not intend to let the 3897 eligible Negro citizens there register and vote. They say that the very idea is "Communitistic". Negroes comprise almost half the population of Madison County. If we cannot make it possible for these Negroes to vote, how can we ever hope for them to get relief from the discriminations and severe oppression that plagues our people there?

This is a matter of very deep concern to other Negroes in Florida. If it were to become generally known among our people that some of your chief advisors are now standing in the way of our efforts to get the franchise for Negroes in these "tough" counties, their present friendly attitude toward your candidacy might "cool off" considerably.

We urge, therefore, that you get in touch with Governor Warren immediately and advise him to bring to bear all the pressure necessary to make it possible for Negroes in these particular counties to register and vote. We know that the Governor has this power, and we are expecting him to exercise it.

Tallahassee, was leader of the delegation that discussed this matter with officials in Madison County. is employed in the Attorney General's Office in Tallahassee. We also are inclosing addresses of NAACP branch officers in some of these counties, as it might be necessary to get in touch with them.

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Please give this matter your immediate attention and let us get some results before the books close. We shall be glad to co-operate in every possible way.

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Governor WARREN identified [redacted] as being [redacted] who is employed in the State Attorney General's Office at Tallahassee. He said that he did not know [redacted] D. [redacted], Ocala, Florida, who received a copy of MOORE's letter to PEPPER, however he presumed that he is one of the Negro leaders in the Ocala area.

WARREN reiterated that his office had not sent any person to Mims, Florida to make inquiry concerning MOORE prior to the latter's death and he pointed out that if officials from Madison County, Florida had made such inquiry in Mims, they had done so "on their own" and without the official knowledge or sanction of the Governor's Office.

Governor WARREN requested that the above mentioned communications be returned to him for the completion of his file. These letters are being returned to the Governor in accordance with his request.

The above information is being furnished for the information of the Bureau and the Miami Office. No attempt will be made to interview [redacted] at Tallahassee or to conduct any further investigation in the Mobile territory unless instructions to the contrary are received from the Bureau or the Miami Office.

[redacted] Southern Knights of the KKK, contacted the Tallahassee Resident Agency on 3/18/52 and stated that he wished to report the following information:

He said that in looking over a copy of the 2/18/52 issue of The Daily Worker, he noticed that it contained a statement by WALTER WHITE of the NAACP that nitro-glycerin was used in the murder of the two victims in this case at Mims, Florida. [redacted] said that this was the first time he had heard that nitro-glycerin had been used, however he recalled that he, [redacted] had had a conversation with Victim HARRY T. MOORE in Jacksonville, Florida about two weeks prior to MOORE's death. During this conversation MOORE confided in [redacted] that he, MOORE, feared that his life might be in danger. In this connection MOORE told [redacted] that "there is a lot of nitro-glycerine being used in this state." [redacted] received the impression that MOORE felt he had gone too far in his activities in behalf of the NAACP and the Progressive Voters League. According to [redacted] MOORE indicated to him that he intended to curb his activity in the above organizations, however he stated that he might become active for the Civil Rights Congress.

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Continuing, [redacted] said that in his conversation with MOORE at this time, MOORE informed him that he had been doing everything possible to help improve conditions among his people, however he admitted to [redacted] that he "may have been working in the wrong direction."

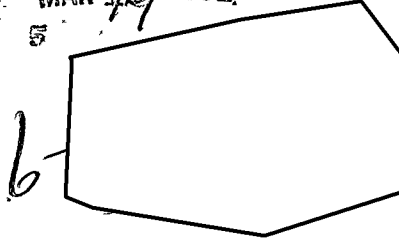
