SYNOPSIS OF FACTS:

The name of [Redacted], appeared on a list of members of the United Negro and Allied Veterans of America, which organization has been cited by the Attorney General as coming within the purview of Executive Order 9835. Interview of neighbors, acquaintances, employers, and former school teachers failed to disclose any disloyal information re this applicant. Credit and criminal checks negative. Memphis informant T-3 advises that applicant and ERNEST C. WITHERS, Memphis, Tenn., joined U.N.A.V.A. upon receipt of endorsement of this organization by heavyweight champion JOE LOUIS; that applicant is no longer a member and has never participated in activities of U.N.A.V.A.

Lieutenant PERRY WILLIAMS, Identification Bureau, Memphis, Tennessee Police Department, advised that the records of his office contained no reference to this applicant. The records of the Nashville, Tennessee Police Department likewise contained no reference to [redacted] b6 -4

The records of the Identification Division of the Federal Bureau of Investigation, Washington, D. C., were checked against the name of this applicant and no criminal record was located pertaining to him.

Memphis Confidential Informant T-3, of known and proven reliability, who is active in the affairs of veteran's organizations in the city of Memphis, advised that he has been acquainted for a great number of years with [redacted] of the applicant. He is also well acquainted with this applicant. He stated that he has always known these individuals to be highly reliable and of excellent character, particularly with reference to their loyalty and patriotism to the United States. He specifically advised that he has never heard the loyalty or patriotism of [redacted] questioned. With reference to the membership of [redacted] in the United Negro and Allied Veterans of America, T-3 stated that he had engaged in conversation with one ERNEST C. WITHERS, a youth of Memphis, Tennessee, who is a close friend of applicant [redacted] WITHERS and [redacted] were in the Army together, and both were discharged on the same date at Fort Bliss, Texas. WITHERS advised T-3 that immediately following their discharge from the Army at Fort Bliss they returned to the city of Memphis. A short while after arriving home, both [redacted] and WITHERS received certain literature from the United Negro and Allied Veterans of America soliciting their membership. Included among this literature was a strong testimonial in favor of this organization written above the name of world heavyweight boxing champion JOE LOUIS. WITHERS further explained to T-3 that based solely upon the recognition accorded this organization by JOE LOUIS, he and [redacted] decided to join, and accordingly filled out the necessary applications and submitted the same to Houston, Texas by mail. WITHERS further explained to T-3 that this was the last official connection either individual had with the United Negro and Allied Veterans of America. They have engaged in no functions of this organization and have not preserved their membership therein.
