SYNOPSIS OF FACTS:

UNAVA still dominated in Houston area by State Headquarters of the Communist Party. Entire state membership UNAVA set out.

DETAILS: AT HOUSTON, TEXAS:

Investigation of this case in the Houston Field Division was conducted as a result of information furnished by [redacted] to the effect that the Communist Party Headquarters in Houston has been influential in sponsoring the activities of the UNAVA in the Houston area.

[redacted] advised that on the night of July 22, 1946, a meeting was held at the NAACP Hall at Houston for the purpose of making arrangements for a visit to Houston by the National Commander of the UNAVA, KENNETH C. KENNEDY, around the first of August, 1946. At this meeting on July 22 were INEZ WRIGHT, Chairman of the City Branch of the Communist Party, LULU WHITE, member of the State Executive Committee of the Communist Party, and KENNETH SUSSAN, member of the State Executive Committee of the Communist Party. At this meeting it was decided to get all the veterans of World War II together at a meeting during KENNEDY's visit to Houston. It was pointed out that this meeting should be held under the auspices of the UNAVA, but that the Communist Party would use the meeting for the distribution of Communist literature in the interest of the advancement of the colored people.

has gotten the impression that organizing chapters on a citywide basis is the important thing. He states that this will obtain members more readily and start the ball rolling in terms of dues payments.

As a further indication of the influence of the Communist Party in this organization is a letter dated 7-16-46 from J. D. BARKFIELD, Regional Director, to W. H. CRAWFORD, State Negro Organizer for the Communist Party. This letter states in part, "I am scheduled to go to Colvert, Texas, the fourth Sunday coming to set up a veteran's organization. Will you go along with me? My real interest now is hearing from you and SMITH about the papers. Please let me hear from you early. I would like to get something done on incorporating our state very soon now. The National Office is anxious to hear about it".

The SMITH referred to in this letter is ROBERT L. SMITH, of Houston, Secretary of the Texas Provisional Committee, UNAVA.

On October 1, 1946, [redacted] furnished the following list of members of the UNAVA. This list was obtained from the Texas State Headquarters of the Communist Party, 305 Hermann Building, Houston, Texas. It will be noted that the addresses for some of the members set out in this list are addresses outside the state of Texas.

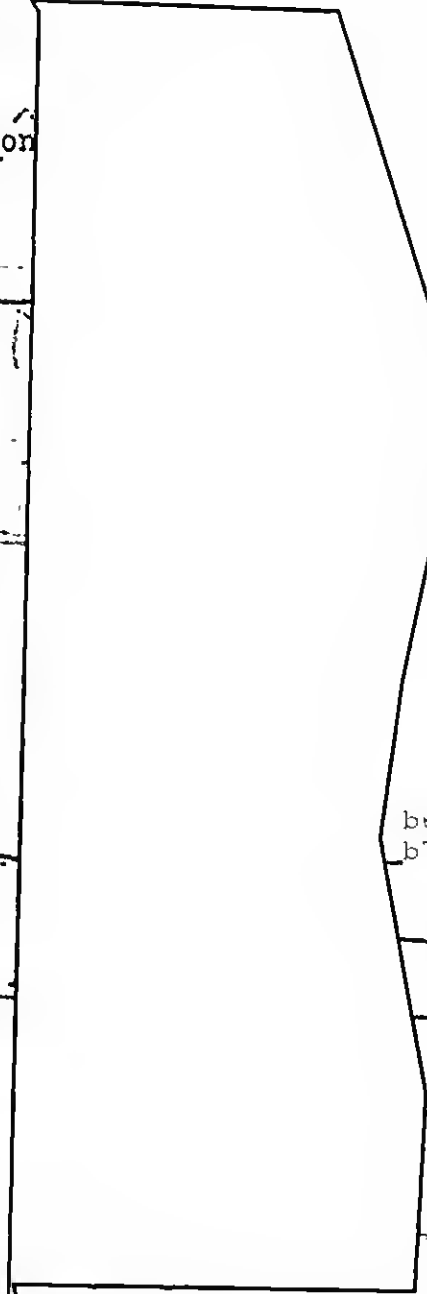
