PREFACE

Since Volume I of UPON THE SHOULDERS OF GIANTS was completed in 1986, several new family connections have been established and that research constitutes the bulk of the ADDENDA section. Errors have been discovered in Volume I, and we have tried to correct the typographical errors and the errors made in the original research in the ERRATA section. However, the errors found in Chapter 31, the Joseph Pitman family, were so great that it was expedient to rewrite the entire section, and it appears as Chapter 102. Also, new data resulted in a complete revision of Chapter 25 (JOHANNES QUICK AND JANNETJE CORTREGHT), which appears as Chapter 111.

The original Ahnentafel number system has been expanded to encompass the new ancestors included in these chapters. One major change was made. Hexadecimal numbers were used to indicate the position of the tenth, and higher children in a family in one generation, i.e., instead of calling him 48.11 he is called 48.B and the twelfth child is called 48.C instead of 48.12. In the next generation the third child is 48.B3 instead of 48.12.3.

Much of the research has been accomplished in Libraries and Court Houses, but we have been aided by many fine new-found relatives discovered in the course of this work.

In the preface to Volume II we have indicated how the new Ahnentafel-Henry number system produces the numbers for the siblings of each ancestor. The sibling has the same Ahnentafel number as the ancestor, but has a different Henry number to the right of the decimal point. Hence ancestor and sibling are one half the number of their sire. While in Volume I and this Addendum the siblings are numbered as derived from the sire and have Ahnentafel numbers double that of the ancestor. For example in the Addendum, Chapter 99, we find:

JOHN McFEATERS	24.0
WILLIAM McFEATERS	48.6 his sibling
JAMES McFEATERS	48.0 their father

In the Errata section we maintained the original system because they refer to specific examples in Volume I and to make changes there would only lead to confusion.

CHAPTER 12

JOHN McFEATERS AND HANNAH CAMPBELL

JOHN McFEATERS, son of JAMES McFEATERS and MARTHA was born in
Lack Township, Cumberland County, PA. He married HANNAH CAMPBELL 9 Nov
1802. Rev. David Denny, Path Valley Presbyterian Church, reported the
groom to be "JAMES" McFEETERS. JAMES was only seven years old at this
time. Rev. Denny probably confused JOHN with his father JAMES. When
MARK McFEATERS named his sons WILLIAM CAMPBELL McFEATERS, THOMAS
STEPHENS McFEATERS, and JOHN GRAHAM McFEATERS. He used the maiden
names of the grandmothers and their mother for their middle names.

CATHERINE SUSAN married JAMES A. FULLERTON of Brookville about 1845-6. Also, in the 1840 census of the THOMAS J CHANDLER family the previously unidentified 20-30 year old woman is probably SARAH R. CHANDLER. We assume tragedy struck this family in the 1830's. We have not found the parents in any 1840 census, have not seen the mother since the 1830 census, or the father since the 1834 Tax Rolls. Two of the three daughters appear to have lived with the families of the two older married children. ELIZABETH

was last seen in the 1830 census, but where was she from then until 22 Jan 1844 when her first child was born in New Orleans?

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CHAPTER 97

THOMAS JOHNSTON CHANDLER AND ELIZA JANE SHERMAN

THOMAS JOHNSTON CHANDLER the son of JEREMIAH NELSON CHANDLER and SARAH JOHNSTON was born 17 Aug 1807 in Bedford County, PA. The family moved to Alexandria, Porter Township, Huntingdon County, PA about 1815. At an early age he learned the trade of silversmith, then that of tailor until he found it injurious to his health. He then commenced the study of dentistry.

He married ELIZA JANE SHERMAN 28 Aug 1829 in Huntingdon County. She was the daughter of THOMAS and HATTIE STEARNS SHERMAN. In the 1830 census for Alexandria we find them living next door to his uncle, JOHN KENNEDY. Prothonotary records indicate that a Dr. CHARLES CORYELL sued THOMAS for \$230 for lessons, presumably in dentistry. The suit with help from friends in Alexandria was discontinued 19 Jan 1835. At about this time THOMAS moved his family of three children to Bridgewater, Beaver County, PA on the banks of the Ohio River and opened his dental office. This chapter is a description of the families of his children.

WILLIAM JOHNSTON CHANDLER, b. 10 Sep 1830, married (1) MARTHA WINSLOW, the daughter of Judge JAMES WINSLOW of Punxsutawney, PA. He learned dentistry from his father and served as a Surgical Dentist during the Civil War. About 1884 he married (2) Mrs. SARAH E. CAMPBELL and practiced dentistry in Jefferson County, PA.

The second son, HENRY BASCOM CHANDLER, b. c. 1834 in Alexandria also studied dentistry under his father. In 1859 as a Surgeon Dentist he opened his practice at 16 Victory Street, New Orleans, LA. On 26 Jun 1859 he was married to EUGLENNE (USALINE or JULIAN) DUSELOH by Rev. ROBERT J. HARP of the Moreau Street Methodist Church. Their oldest son born 1860, HENRY P. CHANDLER, appears in the 1870 census for 7th Ward New Orleans with his parents but also in his grandfather's family in Rochester, PA. He enlisted 15 Jun 1861 in Co. B, 21st Louisiana Infantry as a Second Lt. but resigned his commission 20 Aug 1861. He apparently enlisted for the war in Butler County, Alabama in Co. D, 61st Alabama Infantry. He was taken prisoner at Petersburg, VA in Apr 1865 and released from Point Lookout, MD in June. His Oath of Allegiance was signed with his mark but we know from Army Pay Vouchers that he could write his name. The 1870 census lists him as a cotton sampler, not as a dentist. This suggests that an injury to a hand or arm prevented his continuing the practice of dentistry. He died 23 Sep 1877 and his wife died 12 Jul 1892. Both are buried in New Orleans.

The third son, HARRISON JOHNSTON CHANDLER, was born 4 Sep 1840 in Rochester, PA. He studied dentistry with his father. He practiced in New Orleans in the winter of 1860-1 but returned home and enlisted in Co. F, 10th Pennsylvania Infantry and later in Co. K, 76th PA

Volunteer Infantry. He married 20 Sep 1869, MARY ADA W. CRITCHLOW and practiced dentistry in Rochester, PA.

MARY MATILDA CHANDLER, Tillie, born 1837 in Rochester, PA married Dr. JOHN W. ADAMS, 1 May 1859 by Rev. ROBERT J. HARP of the Moreau Street Methodist Church. He was a student of Dr. T. J. CHANDLER and opened his office at 189 Canal Street in New Orleans in 1859. In the 1860 census THOMAS J. CHANDLER is enumerated with the JOHN W. ADAM's family in New Orleans and also with his family in Rochester, PA. In 1860 four members of this family were living or visiting in New Orleans.

Six more daughters were born to this family. HARRIET A. CHANDLER married Mr. McILVAIN of Rochester. LILLIAN and LARONKA died young, JOSEPHINE married Mr. WELSH of Rochester. CLARA married a Mr. RAMSEY and died in New York City. EMMA Q. CHANDLER married the postmaster, WILLIAM H. BLACK, and eventually moved to Arizona. MARY C. PITMAN, an adopted daughter, married CYRUS V. SHALLENBERGER of Rochester.

Since HARRIET CHANDLER HECKENDORN and THOMAS JOHNSTON CHANDLER were siblings we would expect similarity in thought as evidenced by the names of their children.

HARRIET had a HENRY B. HECKENDORN.
THOMAS had HENRY BASCOM CHANDLER.

HARRIET had a THOMAS J. HECKENDORN with the J. for JOHNSTON and her oldest son JOHN N. HECKENDORN was probably named for her father JEREMIAH NELSON CHANDLER.

THOMAS J. CHANDLER was active in the Prohibitionist Party, the Good Templars and the Methodist Church. His will indicated that he had been very successful in business. He was generous to various charities and the members of his family but he was a domineering parent who cut off one daughter because she went against his wishes. In all he wrote five codicils to his will in the last fifteen years of his life and rewarded or punished various members of his family. He remembered his living sisters and the surviving heir of ELIZABETH CHANDLER VIDAL with small bequests. He ignored the descendants of his sister HARRIET HECKENDORN. He and his wife are buried in the Lacock Cemetery in Rochester, PA. He died 9 Mar 1896.

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CHAPTER 98

SARAH R. CHANDLER-JOSEPH HAYS
ELIZABETH CHANDLER-JOSE MANUEL VIDAL
CATHERINE SUSAN CHANDLER-JAMES ALEXANDER FULLERTON

This chapter is a compilation of the data of the above three families, descendants of JEREMIAH NELSON CHANDLER and SARAH JOHNSTON. THOMAS JOHNSTON CHANDLER's family is described in Chapter 97. The family of HARRIET CHANDLER HECKENDORN is described in Chapter 11. The parents, JEREMIAH NELSON CHANDLER and SARAH JOHNSTON are described in Chapter 19. Two sons listed in the 1820 and 1830 census have not been found. It is not known whether they died young or have not been found after 1830.

In ERRATA the revised Addendum to Chapter 19, page 249 indicates that a dramatic change took place in this family. The last known reference to SON Y, to ELIZABETH and to their mother, SARAH, is in the 1830 census. JEREMIAH NELSON is found in the Tax Rolls of Alexandria, PA as late as 1834 then he too disappears. In late 1834 or early 1835 THOMAS JOHNSTON CHANDLER moved his family of ELIZA JANE and their three children to Bridgewater, PA. In the 1840 census the unidentified 20-30 year old woman living with the THOMAS JOHNSTON CHANDLER family is probably SARAH R. CHANDLER, who married JOSEPH HAYS of Allegheny County about 1841. In the same census the unidentified 15-20 year old woman living with HARRIET CHANDLER HECKENDORN in Brookville, PA is probably CATHERINE SUSAN CHANDLER, who married JAMES ALEXANDER FULLERTON in Brookville c. 1846.

ELIZABETH CHANDLER's marriage to JOSE MANUEL VIDAL was blessed in the Cathedral in New Orleans 17 Apr 1848. She a Protestant, and he a catholic would have been married in a civil ceremony c. 1843. ELIZABETH was born in Alexandria c. 1822 and died 11 Dec 1861. JOSE died 22 Jun 1867 leaving three young ladies born between 1844 and 1849. Little is known of MARIA VICTORIA, but ROSALIA died at age 27 leaving a 6 year old daughter, JOSEPHINE. ROSALIA's obituary requests Rochester, PA and Mobile, AL to copy. This suggests that ELIZABETH may have spent some time in Mobile, AL during the period when she was missing. ELIZABETH and JOSE are buried in the vault of the Portuguese Society of New Orleans in the St. Louis Cemetery. MANUELA VIDAL BINDERNAGEL and ROSALIA VIDAL HEMEL are buried in St. Vincent De Paul Cemetery, New Orleans.

SARAH R. CHANDLER born Jan 1818 in Alexandria married JOSEPH HAYS of Allegheny County, PA about 1841. JOSEPH was a cigar maker born in New Brunswick. They lived on Lacock Street, 4th Ward, Allegheny City in the 1850 and 1870 census but moved to Pittsburgh, and lived at 263 1/2 5th Avenue in the 1880 census. She has not been found in the 1900 or 1910 census, although she is remembered in the Will (3rd Codicil) of her brother, T. J. CHANDLER. JOSEPH is listed as a Tobacconist in

the City Directories of 1881 (5th Ave) and 1883 (Forbes Ave. 7th Ward). Their five sons are all listed in various census schedules as either cigar makers or tobacconists.

CATHERINE SUSAN CHANDLER born c. 1825 in Alexandria, PA was living with her sister HARRIET CHANDLER HECKENDORN in the 1840 census, and married c. 1846 JAMES ALEXANDER FULLERTON of Brookville, PA. They had nine children listed in Catherine's Will. A description of the family appears in "The Fullerton's of North America" but it contains serious errors. The census records and the wills of CATHERINE and her oldest son, JAMES DOWLING FULLERTON, are more reliable. She died 15 Apr 1896. JAMES was listed in 1860 as a tenant farmer, in 1870 as a laborer and in 1880 as a molder.

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CHAPTER 99

JAMES McFEETERS AND MARTHA

JAMES McFEETERS, b. a. 1755 (1800 census), married MARTHA, a. 1777. They were the parents of at least twelve children. He is probably the son of JOHN McFEETERS and his wife JANE (JEAN) SCOTT of Chester County, PA.

In 1779 he was on the Tax Roll for Lack Township, Cumberland County, PA with 2 horses and 2 head of cattle. Lack Township was formed in 1754 as part of Cumberland County and includes the Tuscarora Valley. He served in the 5th Company, Captain Andrew Farrier, 7th Battalion Cumberland County Militia on 1 May 1780 and 1 May 1781. He served a tour of active duty 1 Aug 1780.

In 1783 he was on the Tax Roll for Shirley Township, Bedford County, PA. Shirley was formed c. 1784 while part of Bedford County. When Huntingdon County was erected in 1787 from Bedford County, Shirley Township, which borders Lack and Dublin Townships became part of Huntingdon County. In 1788 he was on the Tax Roll for this township with 100 acres, 2 horses and 2 cows. He warranted 100 acres in 1787 in Bedford County. In 1786 and 1788 he was on the Militia Roll for Huntingdon County. He appears in the 1790 census, 1-1-5, with one son under 16 and five females. In 1791 he was living in the Tuscarora Valley and Supervisor for Dublin Township, Huntingdon County. In 1798 he was Overseer of the Poor for this Township. In the 1800 census he was in Dublin Township, 21101-11200-00. In 1796 he warranted 215 acres and in 1808 92.77 acres in Huntingdon County. In 1821 he was Supervisor for Tell Township. Tell Township was formed from a portion of Dublin Township in 1810.

He prepared his will, 17 Mar 1828, which was proven 14 Jun 1828 when MARTHA renounced and SAMUEL McFEETERS received Letters of Administration. JAMES gave small bequests to ten children by name and to three grand-daughters: MARGARET PATTERSON, POLLY PATTERSON and ELIZABETH WATSON, we assume heirs of two deceased daughters.

"I give unto my beloved wife, MARTHA McFEETERS, my black mare with foal, with food, feed and summer pasture; one feather bed and bedding; one-half of the house and kitchen furniture; comfortable food and raiment during her natural life; two rooms in the dwelling house where we now live, the back room on the first floor and the front room on the second floor and provided with a sufficiency of firewood chopped and laid on the hearth."

"to my daughter, NANCY CAMPBELL, eight dollars to be paid in one year after my death."

"to my daughter, MARGARET NEELY, eight dollars, to be paid within two years after my decease."

"to my son, JOHN McFEETERS, four dollars three years after my decease."

"one dollar to each of my grandchildren: MARGARET PATTERSON, POLLY PATTERSON and ELIZABETH WATSON, four years after my decease."

"to my son, ROBERT McFEETERS, one bed and bedding, his maintenance in food and raiment, my body clothes with hats and shoes, he shall live with my son, SAMUEL, as long as he shall see cause to keep him and give him good treatment, and no man shall take him without permission of my son, SAMUEL."

"to my daughter ELINER McCONNEL, one cow, two years after my decease."

"to my son WILLIAM McFEETERS, two dollars."

"to my son JAMES McFEETERS, one cow in two years."

"to my daughter ELIZABETH CLARK, one cow she now has."

"to my son SAMUEL McFEETERS, two of my horses, horsegear, plow and harrows, one bed and bedding."

"to my daughter HANNAH McFEETERS, two cows and one steer."

"for the use of my son, SAMUEL McFEETERS, I give my real estate as follows..."

SAMUEL received a total of 392 acres with the stipulation that he was to pay the legacies and take care of ROBERT. In the 1830 census SAMUEL is listed as head, although MARTHA and ROBERT are in his household. In the 1840 census, contrary to JAMES' Will, ROBERT is living with MARTHA next door to SAMUEL. MARTHA is dead before the 1850 census and ROBERT (listed as insane by the Census Enumerator) is living again with SAMUEL, NANCY and their nine children.

Three of the older sons: JOHN, WILLIAM and JAMES S. moved to Indiana County, PA, starting in 1816. SAMUEL remained in Tell Township until 1861 and was Supervisor in 1836. He and NANCY, taking ROBERT with them, moved to East Providence Township, Bedford County. SAMUEL, NANCY and ROBERT are buried in Mt. Zion Cemetery, Breezewood, Bedford County, PA. The children are listed in the estimated order of their birth and not in the order they appear in the will.

CHAPTER 100

WILLIAM CAMPBELL AND HANNAH

WILLIAM CAMPBELL is possibly the emigrant and progenitor of this branch of the CAMPBELL family in Pennsylvania. Whether the family emigrated from North Ireland, or directly from Scotland has not been established, but the family is Scottish. He was born a. 1755 (1800 census), and married HANNAH probably between 1765 and 1770. During the Revolutionary War he served in the Cumberland County Militia of Pennsylvania. He completed one tour of duty of eight weeks and three days commencing 1 Sep., 1780 under the command of Andrew Ferrier in the 7th Battalion. He served in the 6th and 7th Company of that Battalion.

My grandfather WILLIAM CAMPBELL McFEATERS (Chapter 4), the son of MARK McFEATERS (Chapter 7) was probably named for his great-grandfather. The earlier generations of the McFEATERS family did not use the given name of MARK. HANNAH CAMPBELL McFEATERS named her son MARK, for her brother, MARK CAMPBELL. The WILLIAM CAMPBELL family in Fannett Township, Cumberland County (Franklin County after 9 Sep 1784), lived in Path Valley. Over the ridge in the Tuscarora Valley in Lack Township, Cumberland County was the JAMES McFEATERS family in 1779. Two of WILLIAM CAMPBELL'S children married two of JAMES McFEATERS' children, viz: JAMES CAMPBELL/NANCY ANN McFEATERS and JOHN McFEATERS/HANNAH CAMPBELL.

On 14 November 1803, WILLIAM, very sick and weak in body, wrote his will (proven 10 Apr 1806). "I give and devise to my loving wife Hannah the house we live in and all the plenishings (sic) therein together with one dun horse and what harness _____ her _____. I declare at this time with the thirds of the benefits of the farm I now live on. I give and bequeath to my son JOHN the tract of land he now lives on. I give and bequeath to my son John the tract of land he now lives on in Fannet (sic) Township with giving his mother ten bushels of wheat and ten bushels of corn yearly during her natural life time. The farm I now live on I give to my two sons WILLIAM and MARK to be equally divided amongst them and they are to cut and provide fire-wood for their mother during her life time. I give to my two sons ANDREW and JAMES that tract of land they now live on in Huntingdon County to be equally divided betwixt them. With respect to my daughters: CATHERINE, ELIZABETH, and HANNAH. I give to CATHERINE her full share except twelve head of sheep that is hers. I give to my daughter ELIZABETH her bald horse and the two cows and calfs that she claims together with her bed and bedding and saddle and one bible. I give unto my daughter HANNA (sic) one bible as I have given her full share heretofore. And lastly I nominate constitute and appoint my two sons WILLIAM CAMPBELL and MARK CAMPBELL to be Executors of this my last will and testament hereby revolkin (sic) all other wills..." Witnesses were SAMUEL GAMBLE, THOMAS WILSON, and JAMES WALLACE. WILLIAM then signed with his mark. Proven 5 Apr 1806 when THOMAS WILSON appeared

and 10 Apr 1806 when SAMUEL GAMBLE took the oath and WILLIAM CAMPBELL, Executor was sworn to administer the will.

"In the name of God Amen. This twelfth day of August eighteen hundred and fourteen I HANNAH CAMPBELL wife of WILLIAM CAMPBELL, deceased, of Franklin County, Fannet (sic) Township and State of Pennsylvania being very sick and weak in body but of perfect mind and memory thanks be to God for the same do make and ordain this my last will and testimony principally and first of all I commit my soul into the hands of Almighty God that givith it and my body to the earth to be buried in decent Christian burial at the discretion of my Executor. I give and devise and dispose of in the following decision and form viz. I give to my son JOSEPH CAMPBELL one rug and sheet, to CATHERINE FLEMING one bed and bedding, to HANNAH McFEATERS one bed and bedding, and to my grand daughters who have been named for me I divide my clothing apparel equally, to WILLIAM CAMPBELL, my oldest son whom I make my Executor I give the whole remainder goods and chattels and whatsoever I devise by law _____ by him to be possessed and enjoyed and do hereby all the ratifying and confirming this to be my last will and testament as ..." Signed in the presence of SAMUEL GAMBLE and JOSEPH WILSON. HANNAH signed with her mark. On 17 Aug SAMUEL GAMBLE appeared and proved the will and on 25 Aug JOSEPH WILSON appeared and was sworn.

These two wills establish that this is the CAMPBELL family from which my great-great-grandmother, HANNAH CAMPBELL McFEATERS descended.

CHAPTER 101

JOHN McFEATERS AND JANE SCOTT

JOHN McFEATERS died intestate a. 7 Sep 1762. JANE (JEAN) SCOTT McFETERS (McFETTERS, McFEETERS) and SAMUEL SCOTT were appointed administrators of the estate. However the final filing of the account is listed for 28 Aug 1784. The estate was estimated at 1500 pounds sterling. SAMUEL SCOTT was probably either an uncle or a cousin of JANE (SCOTT) McFEETERS.

JOHN never secured the patent to this land in Chester County. A map available from the Chester County Historical Society reputed to be of 1788 shows "JOHN McFETTERS, 183 acres in Springton Manor", in West Nantmeal Township. However, at this time the Penn Proprietors instructed their land agents not to sell land in these eastern counties to the Scot-Irish. Instead they were encouraged to either go to the western frontier or emigrate south.

ANDREW SCOTT in his will (East Fallowfield Twp., Chester County, PA) gave three pounds to "my well beloved daughter, JEAN McPHETRICH". The will was written 6 Apr 1776 but not proven until 23 Feb 1784 (Chapter 103).

CHAPTER 102

JOSEPH PITMAN SR. REBECCA GRAHAM, AND MARY ANN

JOSEPH PITMAN is reported to have been born in New Jersey in 1753 and moved to Bedford County, PA with his parents before the Revolutionary War. He served in the Bedford County Militia and as a Ranger of the Frontier 1778-1783.

He married REBECCA GRAHAM ca. 1775, the daughter of Lt. Col. JAMES GRAHAM and ELIZABETH STILLWELL. Indentures in the Bedford County Deed Books indicate that MIRIAM, JOSEPH JR., and BENJAMIN inherited "Ranger's Venture" as heirs of their mother, "REBECCA, deceased daughter of JAMES GRAHAM, deceased", by his will, proven 12 Jun 1779. They secured possession following the death of their grandmother, ELIZABETH, d. 3 Oct 1804. They in turn sold these lands in Bedford County to their uncle, MOSES GRAHAM, in 1806 and 1807. REBECCA died sometime after the birth of JOSEPH JR. ca. 1783, and prior to the sale of land inherited by her brother, JAMES GRAHAM JR., who sold it to his oldest brother, MOSES GRAHAM, 16 Mar 1786. Militia service records indicate that JOSEPH served by substitution in 1783. He appears on the Militia Rolls for Bethel Township, Bedford County as late as 1789 and he requested payment in 1790 for two months service under Captain James Warford, his wife's uncle.

JOSEPH PITMAN SR. appears in the 1790 census in Bedford County, PA, 1-1-2. This does not match the number of his children, but some might have been living with their grandmother, ELIZABETH. JOSEPH eventually moved to Nelson County, KY. He is reported on the tax rolls as early as 1792. It is possible that he never moved to Indiana County PA, in which case it was his son, JOSEPH JR. who appeared on the tax rolls there in 1806 and 1807. The 1810 census is inconclusive. It shows a JOSEPH PITMAN (00001-00100) in Wheatfield Township, Indiana County, PA, over 45 years old with a young woman 16-26 years of age. These data fit neither man perfectly, but come closer to fitting JOSEPH JR., who was ca. 27 at this time, and the age difference could have been due to a careless mark in the wrong column by a census taker.

JOSEPH SR. married MARY ANNE and they raised a large family of seven more children in Nelson County, KY. He was generous in his will (proven 11 Jun 1827) to MARY ANNE and ten of his eleven children. The heirs of MIRIAM PITMAN STEPHENS, who died 18 Dec 1809, are not mentioned. His sons SAMUAL and ALLEN PITMAN were executors. He granted \$50 each to JAMES, SAMUEL, and REBECCA; \$30 each to JOSEPH JR. and BENJAMIN; and \$20 each to ANNA, NANCY and ANDREW. SANFORD and ALLEN had received his help prior to his death.

A deed, dated 13 Aug 1829 indicates the heirs of JOSEPH PITMAN are selling land, 189 acres on the waters of Ashes Creek, Nelson County,

KY, to ASA COOMES. It was signed by: MIRIAM PITMAN, REBEKAH WILSON and her husband, JOHN WILSON, SAMUEL PITMAN, ANDREW PITMAN and his wife BETSEY, NANCY DUGAN and her husband HENSON DUGAN, SANFORD PITMAN and his wife, BETSEY, ALLEN PITMAN and his wife, ELLEN. Here we find the widow listed as "MIRIAM", while in the will she was MARY ANNE. Phonetic spelling as used at that time makes it difficult to ascertain the true name of JOSEPH'S second wife.

JOSEPH JR., BENJAMIN, and MIRIAM remained in Indiana County, PA. JOSEPH JR. appears as late as the 1840 census, but BENJAMIN moved to Knox County, Ohio in 1812 with the family of his father-in-law, ABEDEGO STEPHENS. JAMES apparently moved to KY with his father and the other children probably were born in Kentucky.

CHAPTER 103

ANDREW SCOTT AND CATHRINE

ANDREW SCOTT of East Fallowfield Township, Chester County, PA prepared his will 6 Apr 1776.

"I give and bequeath to my well beloved wife CATHRINE the sum of ten pounds, the stone end of the dwelling house, her choice of any of the horses or mares on the premises, Likewise her choice of any of the milch cows (both to be well kept for her use) her bedding and furniture thereto belonging and a sufficient maintenance with all other necessaries during her natural life (in case she sees cause to dwell on the premies (sic)) and that the plantation be not sold in her life time without her consent. Secondly I give and bequeath to my well beloved daughter JEAN MCPHETRICH (sic) the sum of three pounds. Thirdly I give and bequeath to my well beloved daughter ELIZABETH HESLET (sic) the sum of three pounds. Fourthly I give and bequeath to my well beloved daughter MARY GILKEY the sum of three pounds. Fifthly I give and bequeath to my well beloved son JOSEPH SCOTT the sum of three pounds. Sixthly I give and bequeath to my well beloved son JAMES SCOTT the sum of ten pounds. Seventhly I will and bequeath that after the payment of my just debts and the payment of the above mentioned legacies, that the remaining part of my estate both real and personal be equally divided between my two sons; to wit ISAIAH and WILLIAM SCOTT their heirs and assigns forever & in case any of the two should die without leaving lawful issue the survivour (sic) is to inherit both parts. Eighthly and lastly I do constitute and appoint my well beloved sons ISAIAH and WILLIAM SCOTT whole and sole executors of this my last will and testament and I do hereby disallow, revoke and disahul (sic) all and every other former testaments, wills, legacies and confirming this and no other to be my last will and testament; in witness whereof I have here unto set my hand and seal the day and year above written." N.B. The above mentioned legacies not to be recovered until three years after my decease."

CHAPTER 104

LT. COL. JAMES GRAHAM AND ELIZABETH STILLWELL

It is believed that JAMES GRAHAM was born c. 1730 in New Jersey and his family moved to Bedford County, PA before 1750. A JOHN GRAHAM was the only head of a household on the Tonoloway near Warfordsburg in 1750 and it has been assumed that this was the father of JAMES GRAHAM.

This group of people from New Jersey seemed to migrate as a group. Most of the families were related to ELIAS STILLWELL and in many cases they were sons-in-law of ELIAS, vis: WARFORD, TRUAX, GRAHAM, PITMAN, COOMBS, and PAINE (PAYNE). We find them in Monmouth County, NJ; then Bedford County, PA. Later they moved to Fayette and Westmoreland Counties, PA and finally to Nelson County, KY. Multiple marriages between these families were common into the mid 1800's.

JAMES GRAHAM secured several tracts of land in Bedford County including "Rangers Venture" 30 Aug 1763. He willed this piece of land to the children of his daughter, REBECCA GRAHAM PITMAN, to be theirs following the death of their grandmother ELIZABETH. These children were: MIRIAM PITMAN STEPHENS, BENJAMIN PITMAN, and JOSEPH PITMAN, JR. all living in Indiana County, PA. They sold their shares in "Rangers Venture" to their uncle MOSES GRAHAM. Apparently MOSES was the only GRAHAM to remain in Bedford County because his brothers JAMES and ELIAS sold their inherited lands to MOSES as early as 1786. THOMAS and his sister ELIZABETH also sold their lands to MOSES and these four younger children with their families moved to KY.

Col. GRAHAM'S unrecorded will is difficult to decipher:

"22 January 1777 the following is the true sentiment of my mind and my true will and pleasure. I am now cloose devine providence cauld down to face my inviterate innamy. I have a large family and a sick wife and therefore I think it my duty to order my bisness after the following form and manar (sic) knowing man is mortil and first I leave to my deer and loving wife in full free and soul possession of all my lands and tenements and to rent or let and recover and convert to her one (sic own) proper youses to the support of her self and children and all so my movable asstate (sic) I leave in the same manar and form afore said as long as she shall live and after that I do all annequal divide among all my children and if she sees cause sell it all have it _____ proven to bind out all the _____ trades as she shall _____ and they testify that this is my free will and pleasure and in testimony here I have to set my hand and affix my seal."

Col. JAMES GRAHAM died of smallpox during the Revolutionary War. He had served as a volunteer in the 1st Battalion, Bedford County Militia with Major EDWARD COMBS, Captain OBEDIAH STILLWELL, Lt. JOHN STILLWELL, Ens. STILLWELL TRUAX in Captain HENDERSHOT'S Company in action 9 Jan and discharged 10 Mar with pay until 25 Mar 1777.

CHAPTER 105

ELIAS STILLWELL AND MERIAM EDDY

ELIAS STILLWELL was born in 1708 in New Jersey. We estimate that his lineage is NICHOLAS STILLWELL (60), DANIEL STILLWELL (8), NICHOLAS STILLWELL (1) The Emigrant. Another lineage speculates that his lineage is ELIAS STILLWELL (24), NICHOLAS STILLWELL (3) and NICHOLAS STILLWELL (1) The Emigrant. However, ELIAS STILLWELL (24) was born 13 Dec 1685 and did not have a son ELIAS, while NICHOLAS STILLWELL (60) was born in 1678 and had a son ELIAS (189) probably born in 1708. The lineage numbers are those assigned in "Notes on the Descendants of Nicholas Stillwell the Ancestor of the Stillwell Family in America" William H. Stillwell.

ELIAS owned land in Monmouth County, NJ as early as 1731. He married MERIAM EDDY (MIRIAM or MERIEM) b. 29 Jan 1708 Woodbridge, NJ daughter of JOHN and ELIZABETH EDWARDS EDDY. They moved from NJ to Frederick County, MD and from there to the farm near Hancock, MD, known as the Green Valley Farm. He thought that he was buying land in MD, but when the Mason-Dixon Line was established, his farm proved to be in PA. Sarah McKebbin Harris, in her "Descendants of Meriam Eddy", stated that he left his family in MD, and traveled on horseback north to locate a good farm. He located a field known as the Island Field, and traded with the Indians for the land. He built a cabin, planted some corn, and that same year, 1746, he returned to Frederick County and brought his family to their new home. During the French and Indian Wars they were forced to flee to Fort Frederick which had been built to protect the settlers (1755-1757). On 12 Jan 1756 CATHERINE STILLWELL, the wife of a relative was killed and scalped by the Indians along with one child. Two of her other children, 3 and 8 years old, were carried away. Her husband, RICHARD, escaped to Coombs Fort. ELIAS lost 7 horses and 2 cows to the Indians in this raid. ELIAS took out a patent from MD on Konolawa Creek and in 1762 he patented 150 acres on Big Conoloway Creek for which he paid \$110. In 1767 he patented 300 acres in the same area. Konolawa became Conoloway and later Tonoloway.

In 1799 Stillwell's farm was valued at \$4,700 and was the best in that part of the county. About this time ELIAS was made justice of the Peace for the Township. He was one of the founders of the Tonoloway Baptist Church and was baptized by the preacher in 1752.

"The will of ELIAS STILLWELL, dated 30 Aug 1785:

1. Unto my dear and beloved wife MARIAN STILLWELL one-third part of all my lands except the Big Cove property during her life time, a riding beast, saddle and bridle, bed and bed furniture.
2. My tract of land in the Great Cove be sold after my decease and money from the sale be listed as movable property.

3. Bequeath unto my grandson ELIAS STILLWELL, son of OBEDIAH STILLWELL, deceased, five pounds of Pennsylvania currently to be taken from my movable property.
 4. To my three grand children, the children of OBEDIAH STILLWELL, deceased, namely, ELEANOR STILLWELL, SUSANNA STILLWELL and OBEDIAH STILLWELL thirty pounds PA currency to be equally divided amongst them, out of my movable property.
 5. Bequeath unto my son JEREMIAH STILLWELL, one hundred pounds of PENNSYLVANIA Currency to be paid to my son JOHN STILLWELL out of my real estate as hereafter directed, and all my back accounts against him, I hereby make null and void.
 6. To my grandson ELIAS PAIN, son of SAMUEL PAIN, five pounds PA Currency out of my movable property to be given him when he shall come of age.
 7. Unto my friend the Rev. JOSEPH POWELL, the present Baptist Minister of this place, for the love I bear him five pounds PA Currency out of my movable Estate.
 8. The sum of money given my credit for in the books of the Baptist Church of this place be laid out for the use of the church.
 9. Bequeath unto ELIAS STILLWELL, my grandson, son of JOHN STILLWELL, 5 pounds of PA currency out of my movable estate when he shall come of age.
 10. As to the remainder of my movable property, I do bequeath the same unto my five daughters, namely, ELIZABETH GRAHAM, widow, REBECCA COOMBES, SARAH TRUAX, MARY PAIN, and RACHEL WARFORD, to be equally divided amongst them; and the interest that shall be found upon the note against JAMES GRAHAM not to be demanded in settling with the widow GRAHAM.
 11. Lastly, I do give and bequeath unto my son JOHN STILLWELL all my land, where I now live containing about 250 acres which I hold by a MD survey, he the said JOHN STILLWELL paying a legacy of one hundred pounds Pennsylvania Currency unto my son JEREMIAH STILLWELL...
- I hereby etc appoint my son JOHN STILLWELL and my loving friend JACOB FINK executors.

Witnesses: BENJAMIN TRUAX, JACOB HART, JOSEPH TRUAX
 Proven 27 Feb 1792"

ELIAS died 4 Feb 1792 and ELIZABETH died 19 Oct 1803. They both are buried in the graveyard of the Tonoloway Old School Baptist Church in what is now Fulton County, PA. Pictures of their tombstones are found in Breck, op. cit. 1980. Their stones read:

CHAPTER 106

ELIAS STILLWELL AND MISS STANLEY

ELIAS STILLWELL, the son of Captain NICHOLAS STILLWELL and REBECCA BAYLES was born about 1663 at Gravesend, New Amsterdam. He received a legacy of 7 pounds sterling by the will of his grandfather, JOHN BAYLES, of Jamaica, Long Island in 1682, and appeared on the Tax List of Gravesend in 1683. He was a miller at Gravesend since he agreed to repairs to his tide-mill 26 Dec 1696. The 1698 census for King's County, NY shows only a man and woman, and probably indicates that he had recently married.

He moved to Middletown, NJ with his uncle, JEREMIAH STILLWELL, about 1699 when he registered his cattle mark. In 1713 he was a member of a Grand Jury in Monmouth County, NJ in the Court of Quarter Sessions in Middletown the 1st Tuesday in September. An inventory of his estate was taken in 1715, and on 19 Jan 1715 his father, Captain NICHOLAS STILLWELL, mentioned him in his will as deceased and devised 25 pounds sterling to his children without naming them. RICHARD STANLEY, yeoman, was appointed administrator of his estate since he died intestate. Richard died before the estate was settled, and his widow SARAH STANLEY presented his administrative accounts. His children were all young at his death, and were probably raised by his uncle, JEREMIAH STILLWELL.

CHAPTER 107

JOHN EDDY AND ELIZABETH EDWARDS

JOHN EDDY of Woodbridge, NJ was married at Woodbridge on 31 Mar 1706 by SAMUEL HALE, Justice of the Peace to ELIZABETH EDWARDS, daughter of JAMES and ALISON (NEELL) EDWARDS of Stevenston of the Parish of Haddington, Scotland. JOHN EDDY's name is variously spelled in the NJ records as EDDIE, EDIE, ADIE, AIDE, and AYDE. The descendants have kept in general two spellings: EDDEY and EDDY. However, in PA and KY we find variations of HEADY and HEDDON.

The earliest record which relates to JOHN EDDY of Woodbridge is dated 28 Mar 703, when he appears with THOMAS PIKE as a witness to the will of THOMAS GAUGE or GACH of Woodbridge, who may have been the grandfather of MARY GACH, who married JAMES EDDY, son of JOHN.

JOHN frequently purchased land in the Woodbridge, Middlesex County area, viz.: 28 Oct 1709 30 acres from JOSIAS MARLATH for 11 pounds, 16 Jan 1706 22 acres from JOHN FOREMAN for 20 pounds. In 1734 JOHN ADIE, yeoman of Woodbridge sold to HENRY MOORES, yeoman 67 acres in Woodbridge which was one-half part of land secured by the original settler. It is possible that after the sale, JOHN went further west and purchased land on Manor Maske in York County, PA, and is the JOHN EDDY who died there in 1741. From the names of the EDDYS in York County, and from the fact that JOHN EDDY, JR., one of the NJ EDDYS, owned land in York County, PA, as is shown by his will. It is inferred that there is a very close relationship between the York County EDDYS of Woodbridge.

CHAPTER 108

DANIEL HECKENDORN-BARBARA JENNI AND THE JENNI ANCESTORS

DANIEL HECKENDORN of Langenbruck married BARBARA JENNI 27 Feb 1663, (705.0, b. 1641, see Chapter 47, p. 154). She was the daughter of JOHANNES JENNI (1603-1661), "Bannbruder in the Wanne" at Langenbruck. He married (1) in 1627 ELSBETH RUDIN and (2) 1634-1640 URSULA KELLER (1611-1673). BARBARA was the oldest child of the second wife, URSULA.

JOHANNES JENNI (1603-1661) was the son of WERNER JENNI (b. a. 1567) Innkeeper at the Little Horse, "Zum Rossle", and CHRISTINA HUNZIKER. It is known that WERNER was related to HANS JENNI, "THE Elder", who was living in 1475, but three of the four unrecorded generations intervene. Church registers in Langenbruck were not started until 1564. Land records show Hans "The Elder" rented his farm, Meyers' Hof, in Wald near Langenbruck in 1475.

CHAPTER 109

CAPTAIN NICHOLAS STILLWELL AND REBECCA BAYLES

Captain NICHOLAS STILLWELL, the second son of LT. NICHOLAS STILLWELL, The Emigrant, was probably born in Virginia about 1640, if he was not born in England to Lt. NICHOLAS and his first wife prior to his emigration. He died in 1715, between 19 Jan and 5 Mar, the dates of writing and proving of his Will. In his youth, he followed the migrations of his father, but when Lt. NICHOLAS moved his family to Staten Island, Captain NICHOLAS remained at Gravesend, where he was well established.

He held many elective and appointed posts under both the Dutch and English Governments. He was chosen Constable in 1675, Magistrate in 1678, Sheriff of King's County in 1683. He was Justice of the Peace from 1685 to 1689, and one of the Judges of King's County from 1710 until his death in 1715. On 27 Dec 1689 he was appointed Captain of the Gravesend Militia. In Feb 1692/3, he commanded a contingent of 50 men from King's County on an expedition with Governor Fletcher against the French and Indians at Schenectady.

He was married several times. His first wife was REBECCA BAYLES, and they probably lived for a short time in Jamaica, Long Island, where he owned some land, but the remainder of his life was spent at Gravesend. To this marriage a son, ELIAS STILLWELL, was born. The name ELIAS was a name used in the Bayles family, and this was its introduction into the STILLWELL family. NICHOLAS married second CATALYNTJE HUYBERTS, the widow of CHARLES MORGAN, with a license issued 29 Aug 1671, and the marriage service was performed 6 Feb 1671/2. The remaining children were born to CATALYNTJE. She died about 1695-6, and NICHOLAS married ELIZABETH probably CORNELL, with a license issued 6 Dec 1703. She had several daughters by a previous marriage.

Captain NICHOLAS STILLWELL was as active as his father, but his life-style was not as tumultuous. He was a man of integrity, ability, and was well educated. He served the public from youth to old age as a Captain of Militia, Sheriff of King's County, NY, member of NY Colonial Assembly for nine years, and Magistrate of Gravesend for almost fifty years. He frequently signed his papers with an abbreviation, Nicho, whereas his father always signed with an inverted N as his mark. It is probable that Lt. NICHOLAS could not write his name, whereas the son definitely was able to write.

CHAPTER 110

NICHOLAS STILLWELL AND HIS WIVES

Our first STILLWELL ancestor that was an American is of the third generation found in England. He was born about 1603 in the village of Dorking County Surrey, England and is most frequently referred to as Lt. NICHOLAS STILLWELL, "The Emigrant". He apparently had two wives, but their frequently bandied names, ABIGAIL HOPTON and ANNETJE VAN DYKE were probably figments of the imagination. Their real names have never been discovered.

John E. Stillwell, M.D., in his four volume series on "Lt. Nicholas Stillwell and his Descendants", has presented a strong case based on his extensive and thorough research as follows: NICHOLAS STILLWELL first appeared in America as a tobacco planter in Virginia about 1635. In 1639 he was appointed a Tobacco Viewer by Legislature for the lower side of Charles River County. His appointment indicates he must have had several years experience. He had several plantations on the peninsulas between the James and York Rivers, and another plantation on the north shore of the York River in Gloucester County.

NICHOLAS STILLWELL had served with WILLIAM CLAIBORNE on trading expeditions Kent Island and in several of Claiborn's attempts to recover his investments based on allotments to CLAIBORNE by the Virginia Legislature to trade with the Indians on Kent Island. CLAIBORNE had reached the conclusion that this gave him the right to colonize Kent Island as a proprietor. However, this dream was canceled when on 30 Jun 1662 the Colony of Maryland was granted to CECIL CALVERT, LORD BALTIMORE, and Kent Island was in the jurisdiction of the Maryland Colony. In fact it is believed that NICHOLAS may have been one of the participants in the raid made by CLAIBORNE'S friends on the abandoned Fort Nassau on the Delaware River. The Virginia men were captured by the Dutch and taken to New Amsterdam. They were released and transported back to Virginia by arrangement of the Dutch authorities with a trader.

In the bloody Indian uprising of Ope-chan-ca-naught in April 1644, the troops raised by the Virginia Legislature were under the command of WILLIAM CLAIBORNE as "General". Lt. NICHOLAS STILLWELL was one of the five officers selected to serve in this command. Several expeditions against the Indians were made, but the capture and death of Ope-chan-ca-naught in Nov 1646 occurred after NICHOLAS had departed from Virginia, never to return.

CLAIBORNE made another sally into Kent Island, and the Virginia Legislature, using a seldom used law, identified Lt. NICHOLAS STILLWELL to punish for leaving the colony without permission. STILLWELL decided to find another asylum among the Dutch on Manhattan. He thus appears in New Amsterdam in 1645/6. His Virginia plantations were

attached by his creditors to pay his debts. He never returned to Virginia, but started a new career and bought a house on a canal on Manhattan Island, and later at Deutil Bay 25 Nov 1646.

In 1648 NICHOLAS purchased property at Gravesend. He was nominated and confirmed as the Magistrate of Gravesend 8 Oct 1649. He was again confirmed as Magistrate in 1650 and 1651, but by 15 Apr 1653, he sold his Turtle Bay farm and moved to New Amersfoort (Flatbush) and lived with his son-in-law, NATHANIEL BRITTAIN. In 1654 he was made President of the Court Martial for the trial of Freeholders and Pirates, and was confirmed as the Magistrate of Flatbush. In 1657 he moved back to Gravesend and was confirmed as Magistrate. On 12 Apr 1660 NICHOLAS and 12 other residents of Gravesend petitioned the Director and Council for a minister.

The "Esopus War" broke out, and on 30 Jun 1663, NICHOLAS was commissioned Lieutenant. The campaign was concluded by 7 Sep 1663 when they defeated the Indians and recovered 23 captives.

Connecticut made an attempt to take over Long Island from the Dutch, and on 24 Sep 1663, NICHOLAS arrested the Connecticut Agent, JAMES CHRISTIE, and sent him to New Amsterdam. This angered his English neighbors, and since Governor Stuyvesant was unable to defend New Amsterdam, NICHOLAS realized the need to move. By the spring of 1664 he, his four sons: THOMAS, DANIEL, WILLIAM and JEREMIAH, and his sons-in-law: NATHANIEL BRITTAIN and SAMUEL HOLMES settled in Dover, on the southeastern shore of Staten Island. They were joined by other English families and several recently arrived Huguenots from New Rochelle, and constructed a fortified village, with their homes surrounding a central block house. A New Amsterdam merchant loaned them a small cannon (one pound ball) and the Director General of New Amsterdam supplied six superannuated soldiers for protection while the able bodied men were away.

In 1664 the English took over New Amsterdam and the long standing quarrel with Connecticut was settled. New laws and courts were established, and his sons RICHARD and NICHOLAS were appointed Justices of the Peace, RICHARD in Dover and NICHOLAS at Gravesend.

The will of NICHOLAS STILLWELL was written 22 Dec 1671 and reads as follows: "In ye name of God, amen. I NICHOLAS STILLWELL, of Staten Island in ye territories of his Royal Highness, James, Duke of York, an American, husbandman, being sick and weeke in body, but of perfect and sound understanding, thanks be rendered to Almighty God for the same, doe make and ordaine this my last Will and Testament in manner and forem following, viz. imprimis. I give and bequeath my soul unto ye hands of Almighty God, who gave it to me, in hopes to be saved in and through ye passion, marrits, and mediation of Jesus Christ, my only Savior and Redeemer, and my bodye to ye earth, to be buried in decent and Christian manner, according to ye discretion of my execu-

trix hereafter named. Item. I give and bequeath unto my well beloved and affectionate wife, ANNE STILLWELL, all my estate consisting of lands, cattle, corne, oxen, kine, horses, mares, sheep, swine, bee they of what nature or kind souever, as also all manner of household goods, movable and immovable whatsouever being and lying upon Staten Island aforesaid and right belonging to me. And I also constitute and appoint said wife to be my full and sole executrix of this my last Will and Testament, revoking all former Wills and test-aments made by mee formerly made.

"In witness whereof I have set my hand and seale ye 22nd day of December in Anno 1671".

"Nicholas Stillwell ((Seale))"

Sealed and delivered in the presence of N. deMoyer, Richard Clarkton, June 17th, 1672. Letters of administration were granted unto ANNE STILLWELL, ye widow and relict of ye deceased as executrix of his last Will and Testament above written." Book 1, Wills, New York, p. 161.

He died 28 Dec 1671. On 29 Dec 1672, ANN married WILLIAM WILKINS of Gravesend. He died a few years later and she married WILLIAM FOSTER, who, like her former husbands was the magistrate at Gravesend. It is believed that in July 1678 she went to England, where she died.

CHAPTER 111

JOHANNES (HONUS) QUICK AND JANNETJE CORTREGHT

JOHANNES (HONUS) QUICK was baptized 8 Oct 1749 at the Smithfield Church in the Pennsylvania portion of the Minisink area, the son of THOMAS QUICK and RACHEL EMMENS. He married second JANNETJE CORTREGHT, bpt. 1 Dec 1765, the daughter of HENDRICK W. CORTREGHT and CATHRINA MIDDAGH. JOHANNES died 6 Sep 1806 and is buried in the Van Tuyl Cemetery at Hillsdale, NY. His first wife has not been identified. His daughter SARAH, bpt. 1773, married HENRY QUICK 13 Oct 1787, son of THOMAS QUICK and MARY DeWITT. They are listed in the census of Mamakating and Lumberland Townships as living within two houses of her father. MARIA QUICK WILLIAMS and THOMAS are living in the 1800 census within two doors of HONUS.

Mamakating is the southwest corner of Ulster County and like the western end of Orange County, is in the Minisink area which includes the northwest corner of New Jersey, and that part of Pennsylvania along the Delaware River and the Neversink River. During the Revolutionary War, Mamakating Township of Ulster County was divided into two townships: Cumberland and Mamakating. Thus, JOHN was in Mamakating Township in the 1790 Census and in Lumberland Township in the 1800 Census.

JOHANNES or JOHN QUICK was badly wounded at Mingo (Menga) Creek 12 Oct 1778. He was called out 9 Oct 1778 under Lt. DECKER with the Fourth Regiment of the Orange County Militia to repulse JOSEPH BRANDT, his Iroquois warriors, and Tory soldiers at the burning of Minisink. JOHANNES was a farmer in Mamakating Twp. of Ulster Ct., but he served under Lt. Martin Decker and Col. ALLISON with the Orange Ct. Militia since his home was nearer to their assembly point than that of the Ulster Ct. Militia.

A.C. QUICK incorrectly identified and mixed the information on two men, both named JOHANNES QUICK, residents of Mamakating Twp. during the Revolutionary War. The JOHANNES QUICK who married MARY GEORGE was lost in a boating accident 1780-81 while being transported to a battlefield. His wife, MARY GEORGE, died in childbirth when their twins were born. JOHANNES never saw their only known children. The twins, JOHN and SARAH were placed under the care of WILLIAM FREY of Kent County, MD. The parents of this Johannes are unknown.

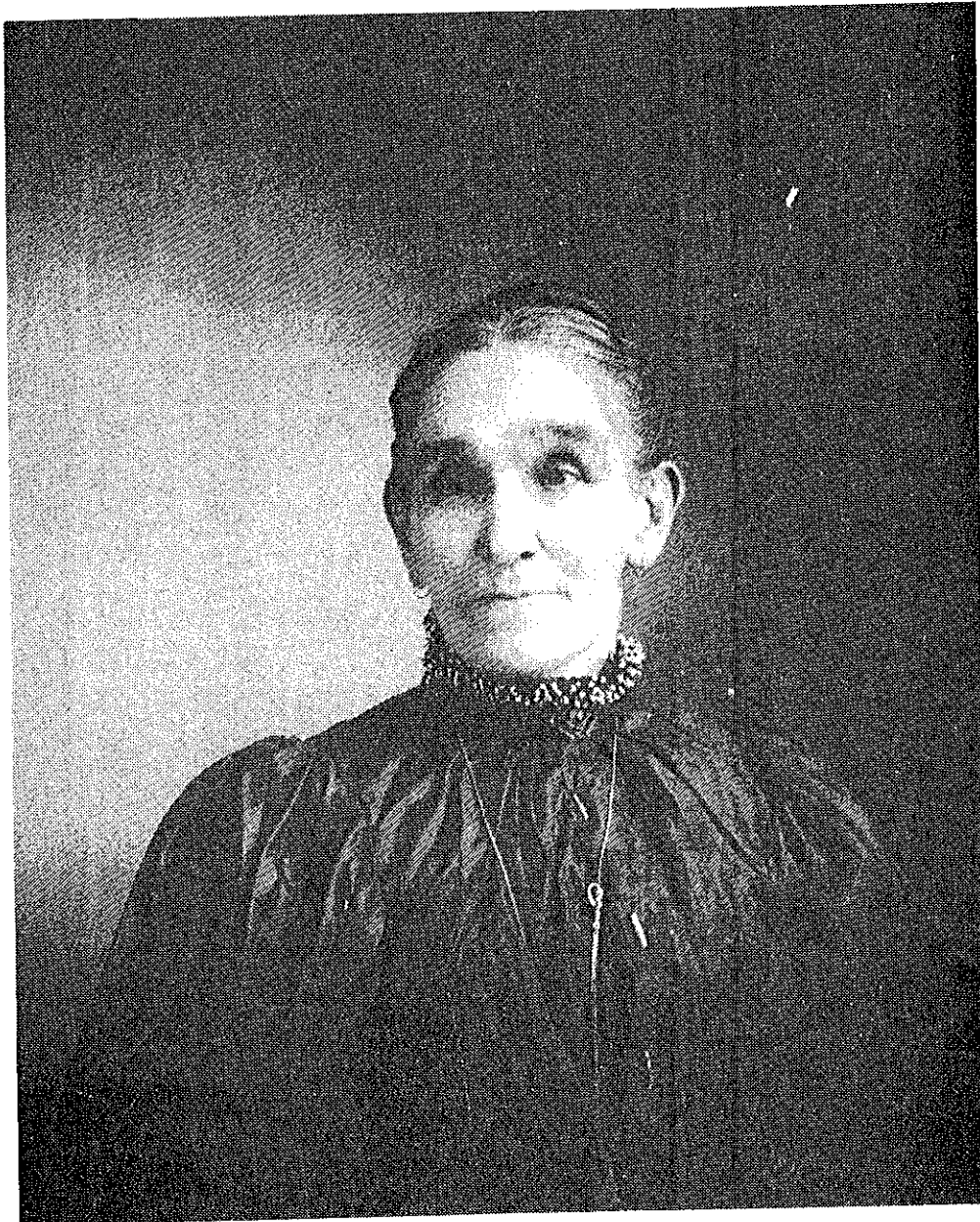
