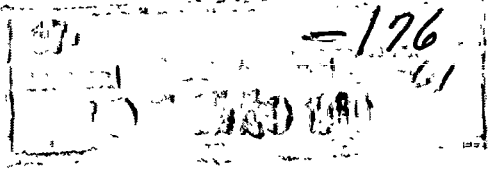

It is believed extremely meritorious record of Agent Wannall and his responsibilities as Number One Man of Nationalities Intelligence Section warrant consideration for promotion to GS-15.

SA Wannall EOD Bureau 7/27/42; has served in Oklahoma City, St. Louis, Philadelphia, Washington Field, and at SOG; and is presently in GS-14 (\$12,555) having originally been reallocated to that grade on 7/20/52.

After an excellent field record Agent Wannall was transferred to the SOG as a Bureau Supervisor 7/24/47. His administrative and leadership qualities were soon evidenced and by 9/1/51 he had become Supervisor in Charge of a large unit. His excellent record at the SOG is best demonstrated by the fact that his performance has merited letters of commendation on nine occasions and the spacing of those letters indicates the consistency of his work record (4/19/52, 6/2/53, 9/11/53, 6/22/55, 7/26/56, 1/4/57, 2/19/58, 11/5/58 and 2/10/59) for they have been received on varying assignments.

In addition to serving as Supervisor in Charge of a large unit, Wannall functioned during the initial stages as over-all coordinator of the controls and operations of the various counter-intelligence programs referred to in the past as Intensification Program. He initiated many of the policies and procedures utilized so effectively therewith.

The record of Agent Wannall has been marked by assignments of increasing responsibility and since 2/13/58 he has served as Number One Man of the Nationalities Intelligence Section. In this assignment he has not only accepted but has reached out and assumed additional responsibilities and has discharged them with characteristic efficiency. In a Section dealing with security and intelligence work relating to several communist countries including Communist China but also regarding all countries outside

the Soviet bloc, the policies and procedures applicable to each supervisory desk are diverse and complex since they are necessarily responsive to political orientation of countries and world situations. SA Wannall brings to this work skillful coordinating talents and diverse supervisory knowledge. He has been a substantial bulwark in dealing with situations involving increased world tensions where Bureau contributions have been material including those involving the Middle East-Suez Canal crisis, the French-Algerian struggle, and the Cuban and Latin-American situations. He is largely responsible for many of the administrative operations attendant to making a Section of over 55 employees an efficient operation.



Agent Wannall has performed as Number One Man in full partnership with the Section Chief. He is a man in whom responsibility can be placed with complete confidence. He has served most effectively during necessary absences of the Section Chief and has welcomed the responsibilities of action and decision. He is an alternate lecturer before In-Service classes. His attitude in sharing work responsibilities is exemplified by fact that he has voluntarily worked on 40 weekends during past 18 months; his overtime has exceeded the Section average during 10 months of the same period; and his overall overtime has consistently been substantially above average. He has been the subject of censure action only twice in almost 18 years as an Agent.

He is well qualified for advancement and is available without reservation. He is doing an outstanding job in his present position for which he is particularly qualified. While he is on leave as of writing of this memorandum, his weight is entirely satisfactory. Record shows he was 16 pounds within desirable range at time of last physical (9/15/59, 154 pounds, 5 feet 9 inches, large frame, desirable range, 151-170).

RECOMMENDATION:

Recommend SA Wannall be favorably considered for reallocation to GS-15 at this time.

SA Wannall, Number One Man of the Nationalities Intelligence Section, Domestic Intelligence Division, has been recommended for promotion to Grade GS 15. Mr. Belmont and Mr. Parsons concur. Section Chief Sterling B. Donahoe of the Nationalities Intelligence Section is in Grade GS 16. Wannall served in several field divisions and has been assigned to the Domestic Intelligence Division since 1947 and served as Supervisor in Charge of a large unit from 1951 until his designation as Number One Man of the Nationalities Intelligence Section in February, 1958. He has been in Grade GS 14 since 1952. The Nationalities Intelligence Section has over 55 employees and handles security and intelligence work relating to countries outside the Soviet Bloc as well as several communist countries. Donahoe states that Wannall has skillful coordinating talents, is a man in whom responsibility can be placed with complete confidence, is doing an outstanding job in his present position, reaches out for additional responsibility and his overtime has consistently been substantially above average. He is within desirable weight limits.

Wannall entered on duty 7/27/42, is in GS 14, \$13, 510, 42 years old, married with 2 children and has a Bachelor of Laws Degree. He has had an excellent Bureau record and has been commended on a number of occasions, the last being on September 7, 1960. He has been censured on only three occasions during his entire career, the first being in December 1957, the second in November 1959, and the last being on September 16, 1960, all these censures having been for errors in correspondence. Comments in his ratings reflect that he has a sound knowledge of Bureau policies and a wealth of knowledge in the counterintelligence and intelligence phases of the security work. He has afforded aggressive and constructive direction to the over-all objectives of the section, is a capable lecturer before In-Service classes, and he is considered fully qualified for advancement with his qualifications being rated as Excellent.

Mr. E. C. Williams, who is inspecting the Domestic Intelligence Division, states that the inspection of the operations for which SA Wannall is responsible has been substantially completed. This reveals that Wannall is doing an excellent job and nothing has been found which would subject him to criticism. He feels Wannall is one of the best Number One Men to Section Chiefs in the Domestic Intelligence Division.

I interviewed Wannall for the Screening Committee on 9/22/60, Inspector Edwards being on leave and Chief Inspector Sullivan being absent from the city. Wannall makes an excellent personal appearance, has a quiet but effective personality, and has a polished and businesslike manner which reflects considerable poise. He is obviously intelligent, serious minded and inspires confidence in his ability. He stated he is very much interested in any type of administrative advancement, either at the Seat of Government or in the field, has no personal problems which would interfere with transfers or assignments involving extensive travel, is in good health and feels that his investigative experience in the field was sufficiently varied to enable him to perform the duties of ASAC with no difficulty. He has had considerable experience lecturing before In-Service, and from his ease of conversing in the interview I feel would be well qualified in this respect. He has had considerable experience in handling personnel as No. One Man of the Nationalities Intelligence Section, and his attitude during the interview reflects that he recognizes the need for tight discipline and I believe would be firm but fair in exercising it. On an over-all basis, I feel Wannall is one of the better prospects interviewed by the Screening Committee.

**POSSIBLE VIOLATIONS OF U.S. LAWS
BY CUBAN GOVERNMENT
INTERNAL SECURITY - CUBA**

Utilizing data developed by Bureau, Agriculture Department was able to have Customs Bureau on 9-3-60 seize 280 pounds of tobacco seed the Cubans were attempting to export in violation of our laws. By letter 9-16-60 (attached) Special Agent in Charge, Washington Field Office (SAC, WFO) has explained participation of office personnel in developing and pursuing this matter and submitted recommendations for commendation.

[redacted] during [redacted] provided several remarks and veiled references by Cuban officials to a large shipment to be sent to Cuba by diplomatic pouch. Thereafter persons discussing the unidentified shipment concluded shipment by pouch was impractical. This alerted

WFO Agents [redacted] to the fact the Cubans were probably trying to circumvent United States laws in some manner. Through careful attention to details and their ability to properly interpret innuendo, double talk and other veiled comments, these agents established that the Cubans were trying to [redacted]

[redacted] Agents [redacted] referred all minute details they were able to glean from the source to WFO Agent [redacted] whose duty it is to correlate data from this source and related investigations and prepare it for dissemination. With respect to instant information, SAC, WFO, commented Agent [redacted] demonstrated the ability to do this not only with speed and dispatch, but also with the necessary accuracy and attention to pertinent detail.

Memo Donahoe to Belmont
re: POSSIBLE VIOLATIONS OF U.S.
LAW BY CUBAN GOVERNMENT

JAO, WFO, pointed out Staff Supervisor [redacted] WFO, recalled a 1957 investigation wherein it had been established that exportation of tobacco seed in any appreciable quantity was violation of statute under jurisdiction of another government agency. Full exploitation of instant information was possible, therefore, due to Agent [redacted]'s recollection and vigorous direction of further investigation.

Other WFO personnel involved in this matter were Agents [redacted], who through probing investigation physically located the seed shipment, secured detailed description of it, which assisted customs agents in seizing it, and in doing so developed a valuable source of information for WFO; and Special Employee [redacted] who rendered valuable services in handling material from [redacted] and demonstrated a fine knowledge of the Spanish language as well as an alertness for information pertinent to this investigation.

JAO, WFO recommended letters of commendation for Agents [redacted] and general letter of commendation to WFO in order that copies may be placed in personnel files of Agents [redacted] and Special Employee [redacted].

The data developed on the tobacco seed shipment made it possible for Bureau of Customs at the behest of Department of Agriculture, to seize the shipment as it was placed in foreign commerce. This was subject of highly commendatory letter dated 9-9-60 from Agriculture (attached) in which [redacted] commented on the cooperation and speed of the Bureau in furnishing all details necessary to make the seizure possible. This cooperation and speed were the joint efforts of Supervisor [redacted] of this Section, to whom case is assigned and who persistently pushed the matter to establish that jurisdiction lay with Agriculture; Liaison Supervisor [redacted] who prior to seizure laid groundwork with [redacted] to permit immediate action when details became available; and W. Raymond Jannell, Number One Man in this Section, who on the day the shipment moved from Washington to New York City was in constant contact with WFO and [redacted] to assure that through Bureau control [redacted] would get detailed data to permit him to get the shipment stopped before it left the country.



Special Agent in Charge (SAC) Marlin W. Johnson of Washington Field Office (WFO) has submitted his recommendations as to recognizing excellent services of individual personnel of that office in handling this case.

Case was initiated 6-27-61 at request of Attorney General on behalf of President in view of grave leak of "Top Secret" security data. This top priority investigation was a sensitive and sweeping inquiry requiring extensive utilization of personnel and careful planning to get the job done properly. WFO was under instructions to complete the inquiry by 7-5-61 and to submit complete, comprehensive report by 7-6-61.

The fact that WFO fulfilled this commitment and did an excellent job in doing so, is a tribute not only to the highly competent performance of its personnel but also to the outstanding loyalty and attitude displayed by these employees who had to get the job done during the July 4th holiday period. This holiday situation added to the investigative problem since key people had to be located and interviewed. Some idea of the scope of the investigative and stenographic problem is found in the excellent 361-page report showing results of over 250 interviews conducted in this short period. Considerable work was required outside normal work hours.

SAC Johnson recommends individual letters of commendation be directed to 24 key Special Agents for their performance in this case. These men did a particularly noteworthy job and their average overtime ranged from 4 hrs. 33 mins. to 10 hrs. 43 mins. per day during the pertinent period.

He also recommends individual letters of commendation to 21 stenographers who did outstanding work, were exceptionally

cooperative and worked outside normal hours for period ranging from 4 hours to in excess of 30 hours.

He also cites the fact that 9 other Special Agents participated in the interviews to a lesser extent and 6 other Special Agents handled a delicate surveillance problem in flawless fashion. He points to the exceptional efficiency of the Chief Stenographer and Assistant Chief Stenographer. With regard to this group he recommends an over-all letter of commendation to the office where a copy will be placed in respective personnel files.

At the Bureau I feel the individual efforts of SA John F. Wacks, who supervised the case, and SA W. Raymond Wannall, Jr., Number One Man of this Section, deserve recognition. The report in this case was received at 7:35 p.m., Thursday, 7-6-61, and was to be sent to the Attorney General on Friday, 7-7-61. Both of these men had worked all Thursday but nevertheless worked all through that night and the following day in order to conduct a thorough and minute check of accuracy and quality of the report and to digest its contents in preparation for a written analysis of the results and transmittal to the Attorney General. The fact that this SOG aspect was handled with maximum efficiency is attributable to the loyal, hard-working performance of these men.

RECOMMENDATIONS:

1. Recommend individual letters of commendation be directed to personnel enumerated by SAC Johnson. While this will require a considerable number of letters it is believed the loyal and efficient efforts of these employees should be individually recognized.

2. Recommend over-all letter be directed to SAC Johnson taking cognizance of excellent efforts of other participants and also particularly commending personal efforts of SAC Johnson who gave this matter strong personal leadership and firm direction from the start.

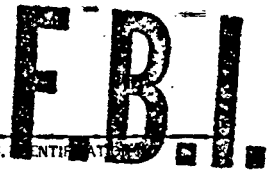

This is a brief summary of Mr. Wannall's record for the Director's use. By letter dated 3-1-62, Mr. Wannall was designated as Section Chief of the Nationalities Intelligence Section in the Domestic Intelligence Division.

Mr. Wannall entered on duty 7-27-42, as a Special Agent and subsequently served in four different field offices. On 7-24-47, he was transferred to the Seat of Government and was assigned to the Domestic Intelligence Division. He has been assigned to that division since that time and has served as Number One Man in the Nationalities Intelligence Section, Domestic Intelligence Division, since the date of its creation, 2-13-58. He is in Grade GS-15, \$14,055 per annum, having been promoted to that grade and salary on 11-13-60. He is 43 years of age, is married, and has two children. The Seat of Government is his office of preference.

On 9-22-60, he was interviewed by the Screening Committee and on an over-all basis, it was felt he was one of the better prospects interviewed by that Committee. He made an excellent personal appearance, had a quiet but effective personality and had a polished and business-like manner which reflected considerable poise. He was obviously intelligent, serious minded and inspired confidence in his ability.

On his 1961 Annual Performance Report Mr. Donahoe rated him **OUTSTANDING** and in recognition of this rating he received an **INCENTIVE AWARD** in the amount of \$300.00. He expressed appreciation for this award.

When the Domestic Intelligence Division was last inspected in December, 1961, the Inspector commented that Mr. Wannall presented an excellent personal appearance and was an alert and intelligent agent. He was an above-average administrator and had a thorough knowledge of the work under his supervision. He was described as having excellent potential for administrative advancement.

He was last **CENSURED** on 9-16-60, for an error in correspondence. He has been **COMMENDED** on three occasions since that date, the latest being on 8-25-61, for his valuable services in connection with the

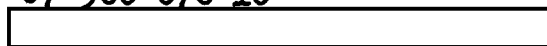

This memorandum recommends the granting of three incentive awards and letters of commendation for various Washington Field and Seat of Government (SOG) personnel in view of their performance in handling matters related to captioned investigation.

Facts of Case:

Investigation of this unauthorized disclosure of classified information (leak) was instituted 7/26/62 at request of Attorney General, first report submitted dated 8/18/62 and second (final) report dated 8/29/62. A total of 248 persons were interviewed, a great many of whom were high-level Government officials. Investigation resulted in determining Baldwin's probable sources for his articles in "New York Times" on 7/28 and 29/62 and also indicated that [redacted] was possibly his source for the 7/26/62 article. Case now closed.

Recommendation of Special Agent in Charge, Washington Field (SAC, WFO):

In view of outstanding manner in which investigation was handled in WFO, the SAC by letter 8/31/62 made the following recommendations:

(1) Incentive awards of \$200 for Special Agent (SA) [redacted], who directed the investigation; SA Robert C. Byrnes to whom the case was assigned; and three other SAs who conducted certain interviews.

OBSERVATIONS:

This case was supervised at the SOG by SA John F. Wacks. From its inception it was necessary for him to keep the Attorney General daily informed of pertinent developments. Shortly after its inception, he included the White House in his daily dissemination and prior to the completion of the case The Secretary of Defense was also included. To accomplish this it was necessary for SA Wacks to prepare 41 high-level letters, totaling 129 pages. An additional 17 communications of 36 pages were prepared by SA Wacks in giving instructions and directions to the field and keeping Bureau officials advised of progress. During the period he was handling this heavy dissemination responsibility, SA Wacks was twice censured for correspondence errors. One such instance concerned a case unrelated to instant matter wherein a letter to Assistant Attorney General Yeagley contained a misspelled word (Ft. Myer misspelled Ft. Meyer). The other was in the Baldwin case dissemination letters wherein he dictated the word "letter" rather than the word "article." In both instances the errors were detected and corrected prior to the time the letters left the Bureau.

While the dissemination requirements in the matter were very great, SA Wacks performed his most notable services in submitting recommendations as to the course the investigation should follow and the persons who should be interviewed. In order to keep his other work assignments current and devote required attention to captioned matter, it was necessary for him during the period 7/26/62 through 8/20/62 to perform overtime at the daily average rate of 5 hours and 43 minutes. He demonstrated an outstanding attitude when he found it necessary to cancel his family's vacation plans and forego his scheduled 2 weeks' leave during this period.

In addition, Section Chief W. Raymond Wannall, Jr., gave this investigation close personal attention, saw that necessary communications were prepared promptly and properly, and personally reviewed the first detailed report on Saturday and Sunday, August 18 - 19, so that it could be promptly disseminated. Also various clerical personnel assisted SA Wacks and demonstrated outstanding attitude, industry and interest in getting the job done, often reporting for duty outside regular working hours and foregoing personal conveniences.

Both of these agents on a daily basis demonstrated complete disregard for personal convenience and selfless attitudes. (Forms FD-255 on [redacted] and Byrnes attached.)

(2) Incentive awards are not being recommended for the 3 other WFO Agents on the basis of the results of the interviews which they conducted, as recommended by SAC, WFO. Although the interviews were conducted properly with excellent results, there does not appear to be present elements which would merit incentive awards. These three agents are included in the third recommendation.

(3) Separate letters of commendation be sent to the following WFO SAs: [redacted]

These 3 SAs conducted the delicate interviews with high-level Government officials in an exemplary fashion demonstrating initiative, industry and planning ability. Each of these agents conducted himself throughout the investigation of this case in a manner demonstrating that the objectives of the investigation and that the good of the Bureau took precedence over all personal considerations.

(4) A letter of commendation be directed to SA [redacted] WFO, (as recommended by SAC, WFO) who in an exemplary fashion discharged his responsibilities for the paper work and administrative functions involved in the case.

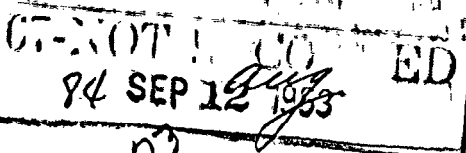

Dear Mr. Hoover:

Now that the case of United States v. Igor Cassini and R. Paul Englander has been disposed of by pleas of nolo contendere and only awaits imposition of sentence on the defendants, I wish to express to your Bureau our appreciation for the outstanding manner in which the investigation was conducted in this case. Although we have come to accept as customary the highest caliber of performance from F.B.I. agents, I do not want to let this opportunity pass to call to your attention the excellence demonstrated by the Special Agents who worked diligently and effectively throughout the detailed investigation which led to the successful prosecution of Cassini and Englander.

I wish to mention particularly the work of Special Agent Nick Stames of your New York field office. Agent Stames was both resourceful and thorough. He demonstrated courtesy and tact in dealing with the numerous witnesses and a persuasive and effective manner in handling those who initially were inclined to be uncooperative. His assistance to the Departmental attorneys who interviewed the prospective witnesses was invaluable and was freely given even as to the long hours of extra time he was required to work. In short, Agent Stames exemplified in every way the high standards required of Special Agents.

Mention should also be made of Special Agent Thomas Dowling who conducted the detailed and demanding financial investigation in New York, which was an important part of the government's case. Agent Dowling exhibited enthusiasm

and a great deal of persistence. His investigation of the complicated and purposely confused financial transactions was exhaustive and extremely productive.

The Agents in the Washington headquarters who supervised the Bureau's investigation and who worked closely with my staff throughout this case also deserve particular mention. Special Agents W. Raymond Wannall, Jr. and [redacted] performed exceptionally well in coordinating and expediting what proved to be a far-flung investigation, involving prospective sources of information not only in the New York area, but in California and other places in the United States, and in Canada, the Dominican Republic, the Bahama Islands, Europe and South America as well. They were most ably assisted by Special Agent Howard W. Little. b6

The excellent job of the Bureau, and particularly of Special Agent [redacted] in securing from Dominican officials the original Cassini file unquestionably contributed substantially to the decision of the defendants in this case as to the uselessness of proceeding to a trial of the merits.

The Attorney General was most desirous that the investigation in this case be thorough and complete. The efforts of the Bureau which insured this result, and which led to the successful development of a strong case for trial, were outstanding in every way.

Although an investigation of this kind depends on the dedication and efficiency of many, I wish again to commend to your special attention the highly praiseworthy performance of the above named Special Agents.

Payment will be made for death by self-destruction after the Agent has been a member of the fund for a continuous period of two years. It is understood and agreed that the sum tendered herewith is a voluntary, gratuitous contribution to said fund which I understand is to be administered in the following manner.

The Director of the FBI will appoint a committee which shall consider all matters pertaining to the acquisition, safe keeping and expending of said fund, which committee will recommend appropriate action to the Director in pertinent matters. The Assistant Director of the Administrative Division of the FBI shall receive all contributions and account for same to the Director. Upon the death of any Special Agent who is a member of said fund the appointed committee will consider the case and submit a recommendation to the Director as to its conclusions. Appropriate instructions will then be issued to the Assistant Director of the Administrative Division, directing him to pay to the designated beneficiary the sum of \$10,000. The liability of the fund shall not under any circumstances exceed the amount of monies in the fund at the time any liability shall occur.

DOMINICAN INTELLIGENCE

As the Director has rightly pointed out, we are completely immersed in the Dominican situation as a result of President Johnson's specific request. This has a tremendous significance over and above basic investigation, as I am sure all realize. By this I mean that President Johnson's Administration is being put to a severe test in the Dominican Republic. If he fails, it will not only damage his Administration politically, but it would undoubtedly cause an entirely different course of action to be chartered in such matters. If he succeeds, then what the President did in the Dominican Republic may well become the established course of action for all other countries in Latin America threatened with communism. We are charged with keeping the communists out of the new Dominican coalition Government to be formed. The outcome of this will largely decide the success or failure in the Dominican Republic. Therefore, the FBI has on its shoulders perhaps the heaviest and most far-reaching burden it has ever been asked to assume. The FBI must be completely successful in this matter, and we will be.

To guarantee this success, I have been re-thinking our entire responsibilities and activities to date in this area. We cannot afford to leave one stone unturned to guarantee the successful carrying out of the requests made to us by President Johnson. In view of this fact, I recommend the immediate establishment of a special section to handle the Dominican Republic. Apropos of this, the following specifics are submitted for approval:

(1) That on the establishment of this new special section, Mr. W. Raymond Wannall, Jr., presently Section Chief of the Nationalities Intelligence Section, be designated the Chief of the new section; that [redacted] currently a Supervisor of Dominican Republic matters in Mr. Wannall's present section, be designated as the Number One Man of the new Section.

(2) That [redacted] presently Number One Man to Wannall, be designated Section Chief of the Nationalities Intelligence Section, and that [redacted] Night Supervisor on the 4 to midnight shift, be designated as Number One Man to [redacted]

In order to handle the operational and dissemination responsibilities concerning the Dominican situation, 12 Agents, 6 experienced stenographers, and 2 clerical employees be immediately assigned to the special section on a temporary basis. In addition, it is recommended that [redacted] currently Secretary to Mr. Wannall, be assigned to this section and [redacted] clerical employee in the Nationalities Intelligence Section, be assigned to the new special section. With regard to the 12 additional Agent personnel recommended, it is suggested that personnel be selected, insofar as possible and feasible, from Washington Field Office personnel familiar with intelligence-type investigations, and some of whom are familiar with Seat of Government operating procedures. This will enable rapid initial handling of work in the Dominican field. b6

4. That more space at once be acquired. Space is extremely hard to get at the Riddell Building, but it so happens that there is available right now 4,000 square feet. This space could, of course, disappear at any time for it is in great demand. It is to be noted that the Peace Corps has already negotiated for 1,500 feet of this space. However, if the FBI wants all of it, it is quite likely this could be effected. It is recommended therefore that, if this Division is not to return to the Department of Justice Building, we acquire at once the entire 4,000 square feet. This will give us enough space immediately for the special section, as well as alleviating the current crowded conditions and allowing for further expansion of this special section, which will undoubtedly grow not only because of the Dominican situation but because of the entire Latin American situation.

We are, at the present time, utilizing on a temporary basis stenographers from various Sections of this Division and from other Divisions and it is anticipated that it will be necessary to continue to use these extra personnel on a loan basis.

For inclusion in the fund to be paid to the designated beneficiary of any Special Agent of the FBI who has previously contributed to this fund and who dies from any cause except self-destruction while employed as a Special Agent, I am forwarding herewith (by Check - Money Order) the sum of \$10, payable to S.A.I.F., to be included in said fund. Payment will be made for death by self-destruction after the Agent has been a member of the fund for a continuous period of two years. It is understood and agreed that the sum tendered herewith is a voluntary, gratuitous contribution to said fund which I understand is to be administered in the following manner.

The Director of the FBI will appoint a committee which shall consider all matters pertaining to the acquisition, safe keeping and expending of said fund, which committee will recommend appropriate action to the Director in pertinent matters. The Assistant Director of the Administrative Division of the FBI shall receive all contributions and account for same to the Director. Upon the death of any Special Agent who is a member of said fund the appointed committee will consider the case and submit a recommendation to the Director as to its conclusions. Appropriate instructions will then be issued to the Assistant Director of the Administrative Division, directing him to pay to the designated beneficiary the sum of \$10,000. The liability of the fund shall not under any circumstances exceed the amount of monies in the fund at the time any liability shall occur.

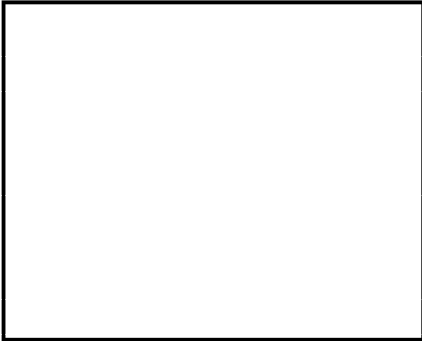
