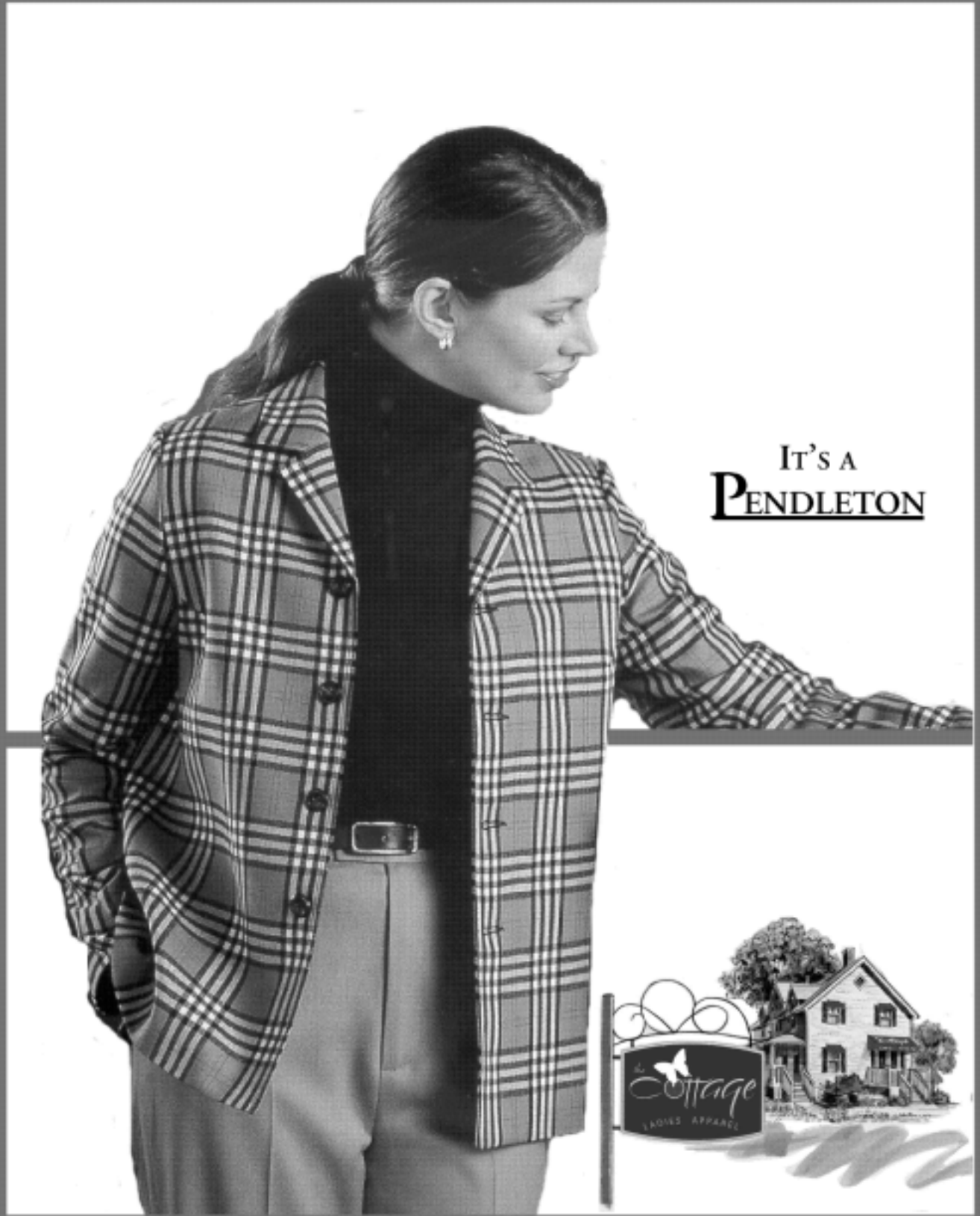

Ground Breaking

Rochester Embarks on Senior Center Project

Town and state officials, representatives of the architectural firm and contracting company, and members of the Rochester Council on Aging (COA) participated in an official ground-breaking ceremony for the new Rochester Senior Center last week, to be located on Dexter Lane adjacent to the equally-new and nearly-complete Police/Communications Building.

Town Administrator James F. Huntoon presided over the proceedings and introduced various people present who were instrumental in helping the town get funding from the Massachusetts Department of Housing and Community Development for the project. Among them were COA Past President Isabel Preston, who has been lobbying for a new Senior Center for many years; COA member Albert Alderson, who first approached the Board of Selectmen with the idea of a new Senior Center; COA Director Katherine Church; Senior Center Building Committee Chairman Jill Bodeau; and grant-writers Sharon Gay and Laurell J. Farinon, who persisted in submitting multiple applications for consideration.

"When Rochester wasn't included (the first time), I told Mr. Huntoon to be patient — it's a good project and your patience will be rewarded," said State Representative William Straus during the ceremony.

Mr. Alderson was pleased to see his idea finally come to fruition, and noted that the COA went on to form the Friends of the Rochester Senior Center to help raise some \$11,000 to fund the preliminary plans. With these in hand, the town was able to successfully submit a grant application to the state, which was approved earlier this year.

"This is a great step for Rochester seniors," Mr. Alderson said, borrowing the words from astronaut Neil Armstrong's historic walk on the moon.

The Rochester Senior Center is designed by Shevalier Architects of Taunton, MA and the contractor bid has been awarded to Kirker-Perry Construction, Inc.,

Rochester Girl in Dance Competition

At the Headliner's National Dance Competition in Norfolk VA, Rochester resident Johanna Wickemeyer, age 11, was chosen to represent the USA at an upcoming international dance competition this fall. Johanna Wickemeyer, a student of Kathy Medina's Studio of Dance for six years, received the second highest score in her age category for her solo jazz dance routine, "The Last Blues Song." She will represent the USA at the Children's Danceshow World Championships, which will be held in Lipstovsky Hradok, Slovakia, October 12 and 13. She is also a member of the junior dance team qualified to represent the USA for a competition in Slovenia in June, 2002.

The International Dance Organization sponsors the European competitions. The IDO is represented by over 55 nations across the world.

In addition to Johanna's accomplishment, three other routines from Medina's Dance Studio will compete in Europe this year and next. A senior group will perform "Bye Bye Life," a jazz dance number in the Fosse tradition, scheduled for competition in December in Germany. Steven Vaughn, age 14, will represent the USA

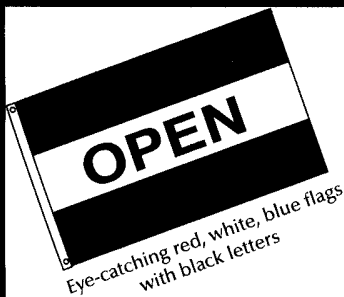

Marion Selectmen's Meeting

August 21, 2001

A regular meeting of the Marion Board of Selectmen was called to order on Tuesday, August 21 at 7:00 pm by Chairman Jonathan "Jody" Dickerson. Also present were Selectman Al Winters, Selectman Benjamin Bryant, Town Administrator Julia Enroth-Whitlock, and Secretary Helene Craver.

After unanimously signing and approving warrants #7, #8 and #8-02 for the week, the board voted to appoint Helen B. Sittler to the Marion Housing Committee for a term to expire in April, 2002.

Under incoming correspondence for the week, the board received a letter from Harbormaster Charles Bradley announcing and inviting them to attend a dedication ceremony for the newly-refurbished Sippican Harbor Memorial Park at Island Wharf to be held on Saturday, September 1 at 9:00 am. Members of the Arms and Coulson families will attend, along with Earnest Holland, a retired Navy Chaplain and member of the Harbormaster's staff.

"(The park) looks really great ... they've done a super job down there," Chairman Dickerson said.

Bernard Kummins next sent a letter to the board praising the efforts of Harbormaster Charles Bradley along with John Poeito and John Butterworth and other staff members of the Harbormaster's Office who were "of great assistance" to him during a recent boating trip. "They present a very positive impression to those coming in from the water," Mr. Kummins wrote. "The Town of Marion is most fortunate to have such fine employees."

Fire Chief C. Robert Davis sent a memo to the board informing them that on August 7 he met with neighboring Fire Departments in Mattapoissett and

Rochester and resolved the outstanding issues regarding future fire calls to Old Rochester Regional Junior and Senior High Schools. "Outstanding issues were resolved, Marion will be responding on a first alarm," Chief Davis wrote. "This matter is now closed."

Arleen Shaw sent a letter to the board in response to their comments about looking into changing the town's Emergency Medical Services (EMS) made at their August 7 meeting. Ms. Shaw felt the board members did not give specific reasons for suggesting changes, and made "vague phrases such as 'clear line of authority' and 'can it be improved.'"

"I think you owe us a fuller and more explicit explanation of 'sign of the times,' whatever that means,"

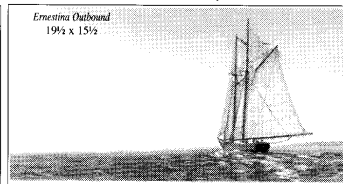
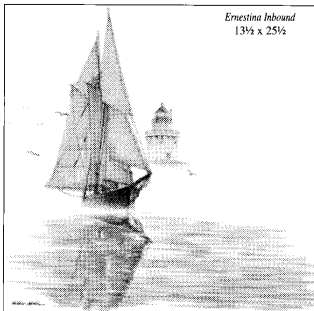

she wrote.

Loretta Schaefer, Chairman of the Southeastern Regional Planning and Economic Development District (SRPEDD) sent notification to the board that the Town of Marion has been allocated 20 hours of municipal assistance, which may be used as needed by February 28, 2002. Ms. Enroth-Whitlock noted there are "a few things" which could require the 20 hours of clerical assistance.

The Canton Board of Selectmen next sent a letter to the board seeking their support in petitioning the State Auditor to determine whether the State Legislature violated the anti-mandate provisions of Proposition 2 1/2 when enacting the Teachers Early Retirement Law.

"Apparently, this will incur additional monies in insurance costs," Ms. Enroth-Whitlock said. "They want communities to execute and return a sign-on form."

The board unanimously voted to send a letter of support to Canton officials. "This may be something which hits us particularly hard in the future," added Selectman Winters.

At 7:05 pm the board met with Animal Control Officer Susan Connor (formerly Susan King) to consider restraining orders against two dogs involved in attacks recently in town. Ms. Connor first noted that on July 17 she was called regarding an incident at Tabor Academy in which a boxer attacked a woman running at Tabor Academy's track. The woman claimed the animal was let out from one of the school's dorms. Upon contacting the owner and informing him of the town's leash law, Ms.

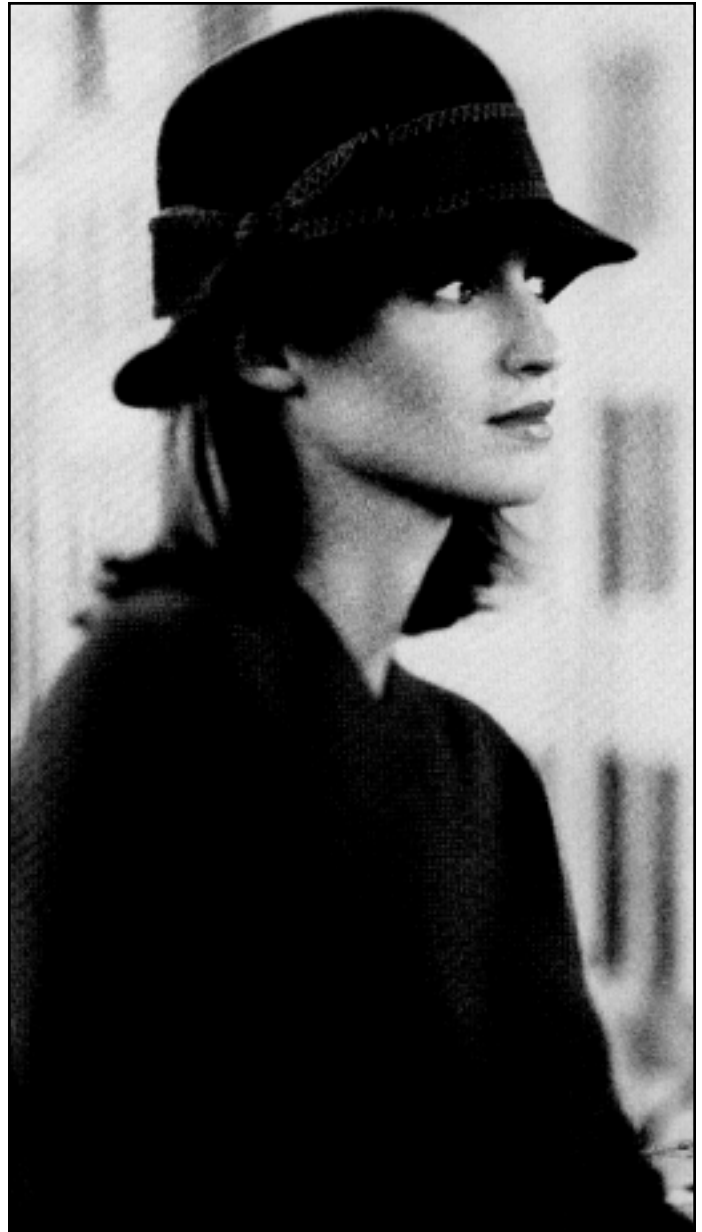

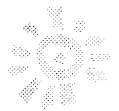

Connor said he felt the track was part of his "backyard" and didn't offer any remorse over the attack.

"I feel the dog's behavior presents a menace to the people of Tabor Academy and anyone using the (school's) track," Ms. Connor said. "Based on the demeanor of the dog and the owner, I feel a restraining order is the best way to go."

"You can't expect a dog to recognize who is a Tabor student and who isn't," Selectman Winters said. "The dog clearly is a threat to anyone using the track." With that, the board unanimously voted to place a restraining order on the dog as per Ms. Connor's recommendation.

On July 26 Ms. Connor said she was called regarding an Akita which attacked a Shelby in the Dexter Beach Road area. Although the Akita was under the owner's supervision, it attacked and seriously injured the Shelby before being called off.

"I recommend we restrain this dog — it's obviously animal-aggressive," Ms. Connor said.

"Looking at the severity of the attack, I feel any violations (of the restraining order) should warrant severe measures," Selectman Winters added. "I support the restraining order with the proviso that absolutely no violations will be tolerated." With that, the board unanimously voted issue a restraining order against the dog based upon Ms. Connor's recommendation.

At 7:15 pm the board met with members of the Personnel Committee to review their future goals and objectives. Ms. Enroth-Whitlock explained that this was

more of an informal meeting and they planned to have a follow-up "working meeting" at a later date.

Committee member Lee Hayes suggested the name of the group be changed from the Personnel Committee to the Personnel Advisory Board. "Our role is not to do, not to decide, but to advise," Mr. Hayes said.

Selectmen Chairman Dickerson then read the following statement regarding the town's recent signing of an "Administrative Consent Order (ACO)" with the Massachusetts Department of Environmental Protection (DEP):

"The Marion Board of Selectmen announced tonight that the town has entered into an Administrative Consent Order (ACO) with the Massachusetts Department of Environmental Protection (DEP) concerning the town's wastewater treatment facility and collection system. The primary objective of the ACO is to establish a schedule to bring the town into compliance with the treatment facility's discharge permit. The discharge permit was last reissued in September 1998 and added new water quality requirements for the treatment

facility's effluent discharge. The existing treatment facility does not have the necessary processes to meet these new requirements and, thus, has been unable to comply with the permit.

"For the past several years, the town has been planning for the sewer system improvements. In the ACO, the DEP notes the town's progress: 'The Department acknowledges that the town has undertaken many actions in the recent past ... (and) continues to pursue those actions that are necessary in resolving the remaining wastewater issues.' In fact, the Town of Marion had already developed a program to upgrade the facility to meet the discharge permit contained in the Comprehensive Wastewater Management Plan. The plan was developed with input from the town's Wastewater Planning Committee, as well as the Board of Selectmen and Department of Public Works.

"The ACO establishes a schedule for proceeding with the wastewater facility improvements, including several milestones. These include commencing preliminary design of the upgrade by December 31, 2001 and executing a contract for construction of the improvements by June 15, 2003. The schedule is consistent with that laid out in the town's plan.

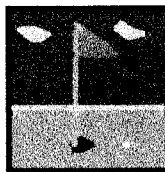
"The ACO addresses two additional wastewater system items. The town will research and submit information to DEP on sewer system extensions (new sewers) that were constructed in the 1990s and, if necessary, file any outstanding permits. The town also will participate with DEP in a review of the treatment facility and collective system operations to identify any needed areas for improvement.

"Under the terms of the ACO, the town will conduct an environmental project valued at approximately \$10,000 aimed at improving town-wide septic system management. The town will also pay a penalty of \$3,575

When Chairman Cutler asked what the anticipated date for obtaining a Certificate of Occupancy was for the Police/Communications Building, Mr. Huntoon said the architect is hoping to get one by the first week of September, but they most likely won't move in until mid-October to allow for the communications system to be fully up and running.

At 7:05 pm the board met with members of the Rochester Senior Center Building Committee and Clerk of the Works Norene Hartley to discuss pending plans for the construction project. Chairman Cutler said now that the project is moving briskly forward, they need to establish regular meetings and keep everyone informed.

"We have a reasonably large group and (Ms. Hartley) is going to be the point person," he said. "We need to have a mechanism in place to get all the comments agreed to before going to the contractor. We're hoping this project goes rapidly ... but just so we're all on the same wavelength, none of us will talk individually to the contractor. I just want everyone to get together so we're all on the same page."

The board wanted to make it clear that decisions on the Senior Center should be made via a vote of the entire committee, and regular meetings should be scheduled and duly posted so that all committee members are given the opportunity to provide input. Individual committee members should not be giving directives — those should all go through either Clerk of the Works Norene Hartley or Town Administrator James Huntoon, either of whom can relay that information to the contractor.

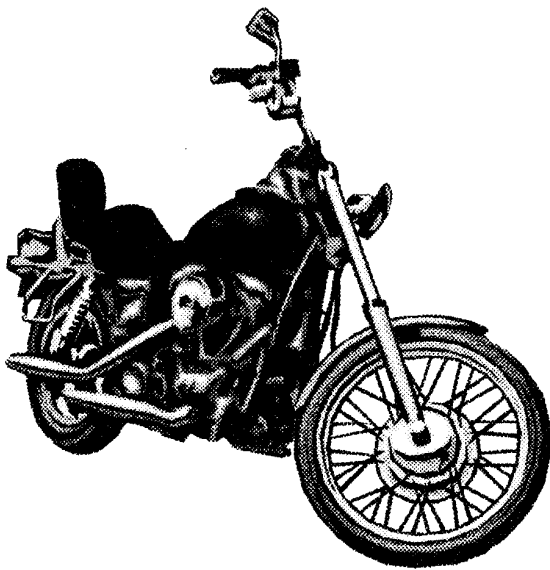

According to Mr. Francis, he has been using his personal vehicle for the past 21 years to attend meetings and conduct inspections. At first he was paid compensation for mileage, but he has since been put on a compensation plan which does not include mileage reimbursement. Since 60 to 70 percent of his mileage is being used for town business, he was hoping to obtain a vehicle to conduct town business — either an out-of-service police cruiser or a newly-acquired four-wheel drive mode of transportation.

"I'm doing more and more mileage each year," Mr. Francis said. "I average about 500 miles a month ... at 32 cents per mile, that's about \$175 a month."

in front of the (Mattapoisett) Zoning Board of Appeals. The Massachusetts Housing Finance Agency has granted the developers site approval to build an affordable housing project. There are some misconceptions about the process for permitting such projects. Many think that this is a done deal and will be built as presented. It is true that the state will not let the project be stopped, but the ZBA has the authority to take input from the town and to reshape these plans within guidelines.

If you feel as I do that this project is too large and out of scale with Mattapoisett, then you should make your feelings known to the ZBA. If you have others issues about the land or how this project negatively affects the town, they should be brought to the ZBA.

The state's focus is to have affordable units built, since most towns have ignored this issue. The Mattapoisett ZBA's focus has to be to keep the project reasonable to the standards of the community. Financial feasibility is the single most important issue under review. The state will look hard at the ZBA's recommendations to ensure that their criteria does not try to kill the project, in which case the ZBA will be overruled.

I do not think that one building the size of Old Rochester Regional High School on this property is a reasonable answer for adding to the housing stock of Mattapoisett. Please attend the ZBA's hearings and I believe we can have a smaller project that fits the rural flavor of Mattapoisett.

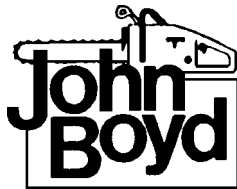

CANINE ALLERGIES

My dog spends lots of time chewing and licking at his feet. What does this mean?

Your dog is showing signs of allergies. People with allergies tend to cough and sneeze. Dogs tend to chew, lick and rub.

What can my dog be allergic to and what should I do?

Your dog can be allergic to food, fleas, articles that he contacts such as wool rugs and all of the pollens, molds and dusts that affect people. Try to keep a diary of your dogs itchiness to determine if it occurs all year round or if it is seasonal. Food allergies tend to be constant throughout the year while allergies to pollens tend to be seasonal. Talk to your veterinarian about diet changes, medications and allergy testing to determine what may be most helpful for your pet.

Dynamic Duo

Jay & Silent Bob Strike Back. Starring Jason Mewes and Kevin Smith. Directed by Kevin Smith. Running time: 105 minutes. MPAA rating: R. At Cinema 12 at the North Dartmouth Mall and Flagship Cinemas in New Bedford.

Watching *Jay & Silent Bob Strike Back*, I was having too much fun to be sad; it was only afterward that I got a little melancholy. This, after all, is the final film of writer-director Kevin Smith's "New Jersey Trilogy" — the fifth film, actually, which puts this "trilogy" on a par with Douglas Adams' five-volume *Hitchhiker's Guide* "trilogy." No more Jay and Silent Bob? In retrospect, the enterprise does have the feel of a fond goodbye — characters or actors from Smith's previous films (*Clerks*, *Mallrats*, *Chasing Amy*, and *Dogma*) keep turning up. But if it's a farewell, it's more of a farewell party. I have no idea how it'll play for people unfamiliar with Smith's work, but I rolled with it. Smith has earned this valentine to his fans.

Jay (Jason Mewes, as blinkered and profane as ever) and Silent Bob (Smith himself, as Jay's large, eternal, near-wordless stooge) learn that two comic-book characters based on themselves — *Bluntman and Chronic*, which we saw the Ben Affleck and Jason Lee characters in *Chasing Amy* working on — are now the subjects of a major Miramax movie. Offended by the "Ain't It Cool News"-type Internet posts by disgruntled losers predicting that the film will suck, Jay and Silent Bob take off for Hollywood to sabotage the *Bluntman and Chronic* movie (wherein they are being played by *American Pie*'s Jason Biggs and *Dawson's Creek*'s James Van Der Beek, a towering indignity in itself).

The movie, like Smith's *Dogma* — well, pretty much like every other Smith movie — is a loosely plotted excuse for creative inventive, cheerfully crude humor, and, in this case, celebrity cameos a-go-go. Those who remember my observation in my *Mallrats* review — that Smith got Marvel Comics icon Stan Lee to do a cameo and would possibly find a way to get George Lucas in a future film — will be amused to see that Smith has achieved the next best thing here; Smith's love of *Star Wars*, comic books, past collaborators (Affleck, Matt Damon, George Carlin, Chris Rock, the two guys from *Clerks*), and even his family (his wife Jennifer and daughter Harley make appearances) suffuses the movie.

Does it help to be a fan — the kind of rabid Kevin Smith fan who visits viewaskew.com religiously and leaves posts on its message board — to appreciate *Jay & Silent Bob Strike Back*? I wouldn't go that far. I've seen all four previous Smith films, but not since they came out; this isn't a movie that you need to prepare for with a Kevin Smith DVD marathon the day before. The motor of the movie is Jay and Silent Bob on the road, meeting colorful characters like a foxy jewel-thief quartet (Eliza Dushku, Ali Larter, Smith's wife, and Shannon Elizabeth, who falls for Jay's dubious charms), a road-wise hitchhiker, a nun, an inept cop (Will Farrell), and even the cast of a beloved cartoon series — how devious of Smith to spoof one of next year's movies before it even comes out.

At one point, Smith has Ben Affleck (in his *Chasing Amy* incarnation, that is — he also plays himself later on) ask why a creator would want to continue telling stories about a stoner duo like Jay and Silent Bob. This may be Smith's way of saying he's finally ready to move on (his next project is said to be a seriocomic look at parenthood, à la *Chasing Amy*, only without Jay and Silent Bob). I applaud his decision even as I fight pangs of sorrow that this is the last time the crass stoner Jay and his beefy sidekick will grace the big screen (I'm sure they'll continue to turn up in Smith's comic books). But if this comedy duo had to go out, at least they've gone out with a bang. Kevin Smith even gets to have a lightsaber duel with Mark Hamill — how cool is that? By the time Jay and Silent Bob are sharing the stage with one of their favorite bands, you'll either appreciate Smith's desire to make his farewell to the boys as fun as possible, or you'll be completely lost. My guess is, if you care enough about Kevin Smith to have read this far, you won't be lost.
