Dear Mr. Clutter:

As you know we indicated in our negotiations for the history sponsorship that we would ask for the assignment of two additional research workers in your county. We did not know at that time, however, that a ruling would come through to the effect that no new assignments could be made after April 1 without special approval of the State Administrator.

Since the Board of Education and the County Court have jointly signed the application for sponsorship, we are going to request special approval of requisitions for two more field workers in your county.

Meanwhile we should like to have the names of suitable persons, preferably male, whom we might suggest to the area employment office for assignment.

The qualifications are: At least a high school education, a knowledge of the history and general background of Pocahontas county, and ability to do research and interview people. Of course, they should be certified persons, or those who can be certified.
