jocal as well as Federal, courts. During the last year, the FH
Laboratory received specimens of evidence from authorities in all
50 states and conducted over 240,000 examinations. Many of these
examinations resulted in the identification of wrong-doers for local
police agencies. Others were helpful in establishing the innocence
of persons considered suspects in particular crimes.
In the more than three decades since the FH
Laboratory was established, the use of the searching, probing light

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of science in the field of law enforcement has resulted in higher standards of performance, conduct and efficiency. Never has there been a deeper respect for the rights and privileges of all citizens-because now, as never before, agencies throughout the law enforcement profession recognize that far better and more reliable results can be obtained with the test tube and the comparison microscope than by threats, intimidation and duress.

science has truly become one of our most effective weapons in the battle against crime. With this in mind, the FBI

Laboratory is constantly on the alert to new developments in the scientific field and conducts continuing research to improve its techniques and equipment. It is of utmost importance that all law enforcement be afforded the latest advancements of science in its

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fight against crime.

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#### BANK ROBBERY

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Crimes against banking institutions--robberies, burglaries and larcenies--are increasing at an alarming rate. There were 91 percent more such crimes in 1963 than in 1960.

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This is an actual increase, not inflated by an extension of the Federal Bank Robbery and Incidental Crimes Statute to cover more institutions. The last change in the law was made in 1959. There are, however, far more opportunities for such crimes with the tremendous spread of branch banks and new institutions.

The FEI is charged with investigating violations of the Federal law relating to crimes against banking institutions. In 1960 it noticed a definite trend in these crimes, a trend which spelled trouble unless quick action was taken. To meet this threat, the FEI held a series of conferences on bank robbery throughout the country in 1961. It warned other law enforcement agencies and representatives

for the security of their institutions and the money entrusted to them. Various banking associations concurred in these suggestions. For various reasons many of these suggestions were ignored. The net result was a great influx of small banking institutions in lightly policed suburban areas with little or no security measures of their own--open invitations to robbers and other thieves. Statistics record that they are accepting the invitations in ever-increasing numbers. In 1960 there were 810 bank robberies, burglaries and larcenies; in 1963 there were 1, 548. And in the first five months of 1964 there were 687.

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on the bank robbery problem. A total of 258 conferences were held throughout the country with a total attendance of 26,964. Over 11,009 different agencies, divided about equally between law enforcement agencies and those associated with the banking industry, took part. Again the need for internal security was stressed.

Last year the FBI again called a series of conferences

Early this year the House Committee on Government Operations issued a report entitled "Crimes Against Banking

Institutions," which underscored the need for banking institutions to put the FBI's suggestions for security into practice and recommended

tighter control by Federal supervisory agencies to insure effective

internal security.

### In February, 1963, the FBI conducted a detailed

survey of all the 152 bank robberies committed in November and December, 1962. No burglaries or larcenies were considered. This revealed that almost half of the banks involved were branch banks. It also showed that about half of the robbed institutions had no protective system and less than half of them used bait money (a definite aid to tracing the criminal).

Law enforcement cannot force the banking industry to provide the protection needed to effect a reduction in crimes against banking institutions. It can only point the way. This the FBI has done and continues to do.





#### CIVIL RIGHTS

The jurisdiction of the FEI in the civil rights field is clearly defined by law and the FEI is specifically authorized to investigate violations of the Civil Rights Acts of 1957 and 1960. Every civil rights complaint receives the thorough, prompt, and impartial attention of the FEI. Where no Federal law within the FBI's jurisdiction is involved, the FEI will not and cannot investigate. The FEI neither exceeds its authority nor shirks its responsibilities.

Nowhere in civil rights legislation hutlining the jurisdiction of the FEI in civil rights cases does the FEI have jurisdiction to police demonstrations or to provide protection for demonstrators. Protection of the lives and property of individuals is and has been traditionally a matter for local police authorities. When FEI Agents are present at the scene of a civil disturbance, their primary responsibility is to collect evidence. It is not their duty to make a decision on the scene as to the possible violation of civil rights laws. This decision rightly falls on the Civil Rights Division of the



The FBI has conducted investigations involving more

than 100 counties where racial discrimination in voting allegedly exists. Thousands of interviews have been conducted in these cases, and photographic copies have been made of hundreds of thousands of pertinent records.

The results of these investigations have continually been furnished to the Department of Justice; and based upon them, the Department has filed plats 61 suits in counties of several southern states for the purpose of ending racial discrimination in voting. As a result of FHI investigations and court actions based thereon, additional thousands of previously disenfranchised Negroes have been enabled to register to vote in accordance with their rights under the Constitution and laws of the United States.

FBI Agents arrested Byron De La Beckwith on June 22, 1963, after identifying the right index fingerprint of Beckwith as being identical with the latent fingerprint found on the telescopic sight of a rifle which had been recovered by the Jackson, Mississippi, Police Department after the slaying of Medgar Evers, the Mississippi leader of the National Association for the Advancement of Colored People.

This was the culmination of an extensive investigation to identify the owner of a . 30'06 Enfield rifle which had a 6-power telescopic sight attached. This investigation involved most of the FBI's 55 field divisions and the sight was traced to an individual who stated he had sold it to Beckwith. The rifle was also traced to another individual in Mississippi who stated he had sold it to Beckwith. The second trial of Beckwith ended on April 17, 1964, with the jury being unable to reach a verdict and the second mistrial was declared.

A Greyhound bus containing members of the Congress of Racial Equality who were engaged in "Freedom Ride, 1961," was completely destroyed by fire and many of its passengers were hospitalized while it was en route to Birmingham, Alabama, from Atlanta, Georgia, on May 14, 1961. FBI investigation solved this case and 6 persons were convicted for their part in this crime, despite strong public sentiment against the "Freedom Riders" and the fact that a number of persons interviewed were reluctant to furnish information.

In August and September, 1962, 5 Negro churches were burned in Georgia and firearms were discharged into several homes. Based upon indications that the purpose of these acts were to discourage Negroes from voting, the FBI instituted extensive investigations which led to the prompt solution of the burning of a church in Terrell County, Georgia, on September 17, 1962, and to the charging of 2 persons with another church burning-one near Leesburg, Georgia, on August 15, 1962.





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

Mrs. Iona Godfrey, \$259 Gilmore Street, Jacksonville, Florida, was

dynamited. Extensive property damage resulted, but none of the occupants was injured. Mrs. Godfrey's son, Donald, was the only Negro in attendance at the Lackawanna Elementary School, having enrolled there in September, 1963, pursuant to an order issued by the U. S. District Court calling for the integration of Duval County schools. On March 4, 1964, FBI Agents at Jacksonville charged William Sterling Rosecrans, Jr., 30, of Jacksonville with the actual bombing of the Godfrey residence. And on March 12th, five additional individuals were arrested at Jacksonville and Smyrna, Tennessee, by the FBI, in connection with this bombing. All individuals concerned were charged with having conspired to threaten and intimidate Mrs. Godfrey and her son in the free exercise of their rights as

guaranteed under the Constitution of the United States.

Rosecrans was sentenced on April 17, 1964, to serve a term of seven years as a result of this crime. Trial has been set for June 29, 1964, for the five other men.

#### **FBI IDENTIFICATION DIVISION**


The FBI identification Division was founded in July, 1924, soon after Mr. Hoover was appointed Director of the FBI. R has grown from \$10,000 sets of fingerprints then to some 171,000,000 today. During fiscal year 1963 alone, a total of 5,720,537 sets of fingerprints were received, and it is estimated that some six million sets of prints will be received in 1965.

Of all the fingerprint impressions received and examined by the FEI, they have never found two fingerprints exactly alike in all details. Twins, triplets, quadruplets or even quintuplets may look, speak and act alike, but reference to their finger impressions establishes that their similarities do not extend to the patterns of the friction ridges upon their fingers.

While this national repository aids constantly in the fight

against crime--an all-time high of 19, 541 fugitives being sought by Federal, state and local law enforcement agencies were identified by

fingerprint searches in fiscal year 1963--it frequently is responsible for


received by the Identification Division concerning the whereabouts of the individual involved is furnished to the interested relatives. Along with the hundreds of requests for help in

locating missing persons which the identification Division receives each year, there are many warm human interest stories. For example, last September the FEI received an urgent plea from a mother in northem Michigan. Her son had suffered a head injury while serving in the Armed Forces and underwent brain surgery. She had heard nothing from him since February, 1961. Could the FBI render any assistance?

A thorough check of the files of the Identification

Division revealed that a man who appeared identical to the missing som had been arrested in Chicago in July, 1963. This information was furnished to the distraught woman in Michigan and she was also advised that a "Missing Person Notice" had been posted. The following month, the woman wrote to advise that she had contacted authorities in Cook County, Illinois, and was successful in locating her son. (Howard F. Norris, FBI #219 738 A)



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#### COMMUNIST PARTY, USA

#### Seldom in its history has the Communist Party, USA, been more

In this year of a national election campaign, the Party is laying careful plans to exploit the situation to its own partisan advantage. It is surveying various areas to see whether it can enter candidates either under a Party label or as independents. It is issuing propaganda publicizing the Party's views on the issues of the day -- hoping thereby to achieve attention for its views. The possibility exists that the Party might launch a program to publicize a write-in vote for Gus Hall, the Number One Communist in the United States, for President. To prepare itself for a dynamic, aggressive, hard-hitting 1964 campaign, the Party is now reorganizing its administrative structure. The Party established a small, hard-hitting Secretariat to run the Party on a day-to-day basis. This, however, is a mere reshuffling of names and faces with power still in the hands of the old clique, headed by Hall and Elizabeth Gurly Flynn. The Party has not held a National Convention (which, according to the Party's Constitution, should be held every two years) since 1959. National Secretary Benjamin Davis, Jr., is seriously ill and it seems that the Party is grooming Claude Lightfoot as his

replacement. Davis is chairman of the Party's Negro Commission and this also



### is an area of active interest for Lightfoot.

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
The Party is thrusting hard in the civil rights field. National Party

Headquarters has instructed all its Districts to urge members and sympathisers to bring pressure in this field through mass meetings, petitions, demonstrations, letters and telegrams to Congressional leaders. The Party's National Negro Commission is also active in this field. From the Party's point of view, the civil rights movement is a "revolution" and it (the Party) should use it to pursue its own aims. The Party is not sincerely interested in promoting the best interests of the Negro but only in making use of the social unrest to advance communism. The Party's instructions to its leaders are to "get in there and pitch." "Don't be scared off" by either Negro or while anticommunists. "We must give guidance to this

movement."

All the while the Party is continuing an aggressive campaign in the youth field, hoping very shortly to set up a national Marxist-oriented organization for high school and college youngsters. Party leaders during the past year also conducted a highly effective speaking campaign on college campuses.

No wonder the Party is today optimistic. It feels that it is on the move.

SOVIET-BLOC ESPIONAGE

The FBI is today fighting a hard, difficult but successful campaign against a dangerous, determined and highly professional Soviet-bloc espionage assault.

This Nation is today Soviet Target Number 1. The United States is a vast reservoir of scientific, technological, and military information--data the Russians and their allies desperately

would like to secure.

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The FBI's experience reflects that legally accredited Soviet-bloc officials, assigned to the Embassies in Washington, D. C. and the United Nations in New York City, form the backbone of the espionage assault. It has been estimated that some 70 percent of Soviet personnel in the United States have some kind of intelligence

assignment. The magnitude of the FBI's responsibilities is shown by

the fact that there are over 700 Soviet-bloc diplomatic officials in the

- 14 L United States at the present time. Their interests are all-inclusive--they are eager to lay their hands on any scrap of information they can secure. Soviet espionage can be likened to a vacuum cleaner--ready to pick up data wherever it

can be found.

For this reason, we find today a purposive effort by Soviet-bloc espionage to make personal and friendly contacts with Americans, especially engineers, scientists, members of the military and Government, businessmen. They hope in these contacts to develop a "friendship"--a "friendship" which can be exploited by them to possibly secure data.

In addition, the Soviets are visiting scientific and technical conventions (hoping to meet Americans there and also collect vital data), making reconnaissance trips throughout the country, purchasing Government documents and patents, subscribing to technical and scientific magazines, joining technical societies. They have large sums of money to spend--and they will spend them--to secure data.

FBI cases reflect that the Soviets will utilize any device, legal or illegal, to secure information. Blackmail, coercion, extortion are common Soviet methods of compromise.

Espionage represents a serious danger to our American

way of life. We can be thankful for the great work of the FBL

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### FBI NATIONAL ACADEMY AND OTHER POLICE SCHOOLS


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FBI Director John Edgar Hoover has always been convinced that trained personnel is synonymous with progressive law enforcement. Over the years since he has headed this famed organization, Mr. Hoover has put his belief on a practical working basis by constantly expanding the cooperative services the FBI accords other law enforcement agencies throughout the country. This dedication to enhancing the efficiency of law enforcement at all levels has resulted in the full facilities of the FBI together with trained instructors being made available without charge for any of the services.

One of the finest cooperative services offered by the FBI is the National Academy. Mr. Hoover established it in 1935 for the purpose of sharing with fellow officers the best techniques and the most modern strategy in police work known to the FBI. Its objective has always been that of sending highly trained instructors to both



Columbia, Puerto Rico and many foreign countries. Law enforcement officers from 41 states, the District of Columbia and 15 foreign nations made up the enrollment of the 196 officers who attended the Academy in 1963. Of the total number graduated since 1935, over 28 per cent

of those still active in law enforcement are executive heads of their respective agencies.

During the 12-week training course given at the Academy, police officers are provided with an understanding of different problems and techniques and a foundation for trust and cooperation which pay. handsome dividends in the fight against lawlessness. In no group will one find greater mutual respect and professional integrity than among the graduates of the FBI National Academy.

The FBI also has over 1,000 Special Agents who are qualified through training and experience to instruct other officers in various phases of law enforcement work. These men are assigned in all parts of the country and are available on request to assist in other training programs being conducted by local and state police agencies. In 1963, these Agents participated in nearly 4,000 local and regional police training schools. Many of these schools provided

basic training for recruits, while others offered advanced training for

supervisory personnel, command officers, detectives and experienced officers. Specialized instruction was given in such fields as searches and seizures, making arrests, fingerprinting, firearms, defensive -2-

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## tactics, photography and investigative procedures for various types of

major crimes. The total attendance at these schools ran over 100,000. All of these training services of the FBI are based of

As untrained or inadequately trained officer is a liability to a police force and a potential danger to the community he is assigned to protect. These FBI training programs give the police officer a better opportunity to successfully cope with modern-day crime.

#### FBI SERVICE MARTYRS

Since 1925, nineteen FBI Agents have lost their lives in the line of duty. Fourteen of these men were slain in gun battles, twelve of whom were killed by criminals who had been paroled, placed on probation or had received some type of lenient consideration from the courts.

The first FBI Agent killed in the line of duty was Special Agent Edwin C. Shanahan who was murdered in Chicago, Illinois, on October 11, 1925, by Martin J. Durkin. As Agent Shanahan attempted to arrest Durkin, a notorious car thief who had previously wounded four police officers to avert capture, the fugitive pulled a gun from his car and shot the Agent to death. Durkin had been arrested on numerous occasions for burglary, car theft, assault and escape; the most he had received was a \$10 fine.

Special Agent Raymond J. Calirey was one of the victims

of the "Kansas City Massacre" on June 17, 1933. Three Kansas City




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police officers were also killed, and two other FBI Agents wounded. The assassins, Verne Miller, "Pretty Boy" Floyd and Adam Richetti,

all had lengthy criminal records and were known killers. Richetti and Miller were paroled convicts. 62 - 3/6/5 - 1/94

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Special Agent W. Carter Baum was killed in performance

of duty on April 22, 1934, by Dillinger accomplice, "Baby Face"

Nelson, a thrice-paroled convict. - Seven months later, Special Agent

Herman E. Hollis and Inspector Samuel P. Cowley also met their deaths at the hands of Nelson near Barrington, Illinois.

In the middle and late 1930's, four more FBI Agents were killed by long-time criminals. These were Special Agents Nelson B. Klein, Wimberly W. Baker, Truett E. Rowe and William R. Ramsey, all mortally wounded while attempting to apprehend guamen who had previously been paroled, placed on probation, or had been the recipients of judicial leniency.

On July 26, 1952, Special Agent Joseph John Brock was gunned down in a New York City hotel during the apprehension of Gerhard Arthur Puff, one of the FBI's "Ten Most Wanted" fugitives. Puff, whose criminal career included theft, assault, and armed robbery, had been placed on probation in connection with one of his offenses.

On September 26, 1953, Special Agent John Brady Murphy

died as a result of wounds received in a gun battle with John Elgin Johnson the day before in a Baltimore, Maryland, movie theater.

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
served a term in Alcatraz for assault with intent to kill a Federal officer. His long criminal career also included convictions for

larceny, burglary and bank robbery.

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On April 18, 1957, Special Agent Richard P. Horna died at the hands of Francis Kolakowski, a fugitive wanted for Unlawful Flight to Avoid Prosecution for murder. With the slaying of Horan, Kolakowski culminated a violent criminal career marked throughout

#### OVERTIME

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In view of the fast-breaking aspects of certain cases investigated by the FBI such as bank robberies and kidnapings, overtime services are required by the investigative staff of the FEL. During the fiscal year 1963, FBI investigative personnel performed an average of 1 hour and 14 minutes a day overtime in excess of the 1 hour and 12 minutes per day for which fringe benefits were paid. The total overtime period performed was equal to the service of 1,526 Special Agents on a full-year basis. If it had been necessary for the FBI to hire the 1,526 Agents, the estimated cost would have been \$17, 293, 428. Under the fringe benefit regulations, however, the overtime was compensated only to the extent of \$5, 830, 630. This represents a saving to the taxpayer of \$11, 462, 798 when compared with the value of the total overtime performed.

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#### FBI PERSONNEL

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Experienced career employees greatly enhance the efficiency of the FBL. Of the 6,147 Special Agents on duty as of March 31, 1964, 76.6 per cent had served more than ten years. More than 21 per cent of the noninvestigative personnel also had over 10 years' experience.

Interest in their work and alertness for more efficient ways to perform their duties are traditional among FBI employees. Indicative of their dedication are the 1, 203 cash awards they earned during the 1963 fiscal year for valuable suggestions or outstanding achievements. The value of these awards totaled \$233, 295. As a career service, the FBI offers its employees ample opportunity and incentive for advancement. Promotions are

based on merit. All executive and supervisory positions are inter

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





As of now the initials, "M.J." hold no special significance and a file check to attempt to locate similar anonymous communications has not been productive.



I thought you would be interested in Mr. Winchell's observations.



LIFE MAGAZINE'S recent, article was directed at No. 1 G-Man John Edgar Hoover. Competence is described as cause for resignation—dedication is scorned as demagoguery —pride is derided as self-glorification—longevity, is dismissed as dangerous.



The bulk of the mag's indictment is encompassed in this paragraph: "But the most serious defect in this business of Mr. Hoover's continuing one-man rule centers around the Bureau's preoccupation with him. Evidence of the Hoover cult abounds. Perhaps the most startling signs appear in the documents put out by the FBI about the boss. In one, biographical handout Mr. Hoover's career is described with such unequivocal sentences as: 'During the past 30 years, the entire complexion of law enforcement throughout the United States has been for the prin-

ciples advocated by Mr. Hoover and successfully tried by law enforcement agencies.""

The rather obvious suggestion is that Mr. Hoover's accomplishments are mere personal propaganda . . . The truth is that they are matters of historical record . . . On May 10, . 1964 The N.Y. Times reported: "No one disputes Mr. Hoover's solid accomplishments. He eliminated political influence in appointments. He had the foresight to promote-on a scale never before attempted in America-high scientific standards in detective work. And he established a huge fingerprint collection, an indispensable resource in tracking down criminals. He also created a skilled laboratory to make scientific tests on minute physical clues. Mr. Hoover also founded the National Police Academy, which trains selected officers from departments throughout the country in the latest scientific methods" . . . The newspaper added: "Mr. Hoover has made an incalculable contribution to raising the standards of law enforcement in the U.S."

The primary problem with debunking the article is that so much of it is ludicrous—it is difficult to choose the most foolish paragraph. But this one comes close: "But I wonder if the loyalty of his staff and his own continuing efficiency, his remarkable popularity with Presidents and public officials.



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

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

#### LIFE MAGL. JE AND J. EDGAR HOOVER

Mr. MUNDT. Mr<sup>1</sup> esident, Life magazine is one of the 2 periodicals published in this country. I have subscribed to it for many years, and have received much enjoyment and benefit from reading it.

However, like any other periodical, it sometimes "goes off the beam." I must say that when it endeavors to mix prejudice with pictures and photography, and pulls a boo-boo, it does so with stupendous success.

I call attention to the fact that in a recent article in Life magazine a very prejudicial attempt was made to discredit one of our great American public servants-J. Edgar Hoover. The article is so patently wrong and so obviously prejudiced that it really defeats the purpose of the writer. But I do think it might be beneficial to include in the RECord at least one critique of that particular article. In the New York Journal American for Sunday, June 14, 1964, Walter Winchell in his inimitable style addressed to "Mr. and Mrs. United States" a communication in which he discussed the unfortunate article in Life magazine.

I ask unanimous consent to have Walter Winchell's article printed in the REC-ORD.

There being no objection, the article was ordered to be printed in the RECORD, as follows:

[From the New York Journal-American, June 14, 1964]

WALTER WINCHELL OF NEW YORK: ME. AND MRS. UNITED STATES

Life magazine's recent article was directed at No. 1 G-Man John Edgar Hoover. Competence is described as cause for resignation—dedication is scorned as demagoguefy—pride is derided as self-glorification longevity is dismissed as dangerous.

The bulk of the mag's indictment is encompassed in this paragraph: "But the most serious defect in this business of Mr. Hoover's continuing one-man rule centers around the Bureau's preoccupation with him. Evidence of the Hoover cult abounds. Perhaps the most startling signs appear in the documents put out by the FBI about the boss. In one biographical handout Mr. Hoover's career is described with such unequivocal sentences as: 'During the past 30 years, the entire complexion of law enforcement throughout the United States has been changed primarily because of the principles advocated by Mr. Hoover and successfully tried by law-enforcement agencies.""

The rather obvious suggestion is that Mr. Hoover's accomplishments are mere personal propaganda. The truth is that they are matters of historical record. On May 10, 1964, the New York Times reported: "No one disputes Mr. Hoover's solid accomplishments. He eliminated political influence in appointments. He had the foresight to promote-on a scale never before attempted in Americahigh scientific standards in detective work. And he established a huge fingerprint collection, an indispensable resource in tracking down criminals. He also created a skilled laboratory to make scientific tests on minute physical clues. Mr. Hoover also founded the National Police Academy, which trains selected officers from departments throughout the country in the latest scientific methods." The newspaper added: "Mr. Hoover has made an incalculable contribu-

tion to raising the si .rds of law enforcement in the United states."

The primary problem with flebunking the article is that so much of '' ludicrous-is is difficult to choose the a foolish paragraph. But this one comes close: "But I wonder if the loyalty of his staff and his own continuing efficiency, his remarkable popularity with Presidents and public officials and the confidence so many private citizens have in his ability, really qualify Mr. Hoover for a perpetual lock on the job."

If loyalty, efficiency, popularity, respect, and integrity don't qualify a man for a job—whatinell does? Disloyalty? incompetence? unpopularity? disrespect? dishonesty?

The obvious conclusion is simply this: When a man's record and reputation are unassailable you can abuse him by describing good as evil. This is to remind the magazine's editors that for more than 40 years the FBI has been unbiemished by scandal.

There is no function of our national existence-from the lonely blinking lights off the Florida Keys-to the signal towers of the Alaska Railroad-whose operations are not the responsibility of some very responsible person in 'our Nation's Capital. Tens of thousands of faithful Americans give the civil services the same aelfiess devotion-that the flag receives from the Armed Forces. Their heartbreaking role is that their effectiveness is taken for granted. And, in this case, a diligent and dedicated rublic servant is being reprosched for being successful.

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The blasphemy is apparent. The stupidity of the analogy is equally clear. Mr. Hoover has always functioned within his constitutional powers.

The article goes on: "One gets the feeling that if Mr. Hoover departed the Bureau (FBI) would fold. The 170 million fingerprints would fade away on their cards, and the agents, mourning the retirement of their leader, would turn flabby. I don't think that either the Bureau or J. Edgar Hoover would suffer much from a separation."

The FBI chief has never contended he is indispensable. And it would be equally unrealistic to deny his importance to the Nation's security. To suggest Mr. Hoover is too old during these critical days would be as recklessly foolish as demanding the resignation of General Elsenhower during the Normandy invasion. The FBI may or may not suffer from such a divorce. But we know that the American people would suffer—since it would represent a triumph for every spy, subversive, hoodium, corrupt politician, and traitor—here, there, and everywhere.

The picture weekly comments that Mr. Hoover "could take any one of a number of jobs that have been offered him in private business or he could just putter with his azaleas and play the horses at his favorite \$2 window."

WINCHELL telephonically contacted SAC WESLEY G GRAPP on the afternoon of 6/22/64 and stated that he felt the matter concerning the unavailability of disappearance of a San Diego FBI Agent could possibly be a "headline Story" He further advised Mr. GRAPP that his interest in MONTEVERDE is due to the fact that in the past, WINCHELL, while drinking and visiting the "Coronet" restaurant in Tijuana, became involved in an altercation with an individual and struck this individual on the head with a bottle MONTEVERDE intervened in WINCHELL's behalf, and WINCHELL felt that this saved WINCHELL considerable embarrassment and trouble. He felt as a result of this, he owed MONTEVERDE a favor and in fact has loaned MONTEVERDE an undisclosed amount of money to aid in his defense.

SAC GRAPP telephonically contacted SA JOSEPH L. GERRY, presently assigned to the San Diego Office, and while speaking both to ASAC JACK KEITH, JR., and SA GERRY, determined from SA GERRY that he is completely available, has not been out of touch or unavailable during the last several months, and SA GERRY has in fact been contacted as recently as about two weeks ago by BILL ENRIGHT (PH). Attorney for MONTEVERDE, SA GERRY has been subpoenaed by both the prosecution and the defense and was recently advised by Mr. ENRIGHT that the trial in this matter has been postponed until August, 1964, SA GERRY stated that to his knowledge, MONTEVERDE has never, in the past several months, made an attempt to contact him and, if he had attempted to contact him, SA GERRY would either have returned his call or spoken with MONTEVERDE.




I expressed appreciation to Mr. Winchell for his great interest in the above regard.






