LIFE editors have your query about Loudon Wainwright's column, "The View from Here," published in LIFE May 22, based on your reading of Walter Winchell's column.

As you may know, Mr. Wainwright's column is a recent addition to LIFE. In introducing it, LIFE's Managing Editor George Hunt said in his Editors' Note, published March 27:

A second new department in ~~LIFE~~ ^{MAGAZINE} is The View from Here, a column by Loudon Wainwright. Wainwright has worked for LIFE for 15 years ^{N.Y.} as a reporter, staff writer and editor. His stories on the Astronauts, particularly the moving account of Annie Glenn during her husband's historic flight, are among his most memorable articles.

The new column will be one of personal comment, and its intent is to say how things feel, not to all of us but to one of us. Wainwright's feelings about the film Dr. Strangelove (not entirely shared by his editors) were the subject of his first column two weeks ago. Last week's column was called "A Dignified Loser Drops One More," the loser being Harold Stassen. The View from Here will usually appear every other week, alternating with the Special Report.

Just as this column is one of personal comment, intended to let our readers know how things feel to one of our staff members, so we're glad to have our readers' views in exchange. Sloan of the FBI Academy, Quantico and Joseph Cottstein a director of the Thoroughbred Racing Associations.

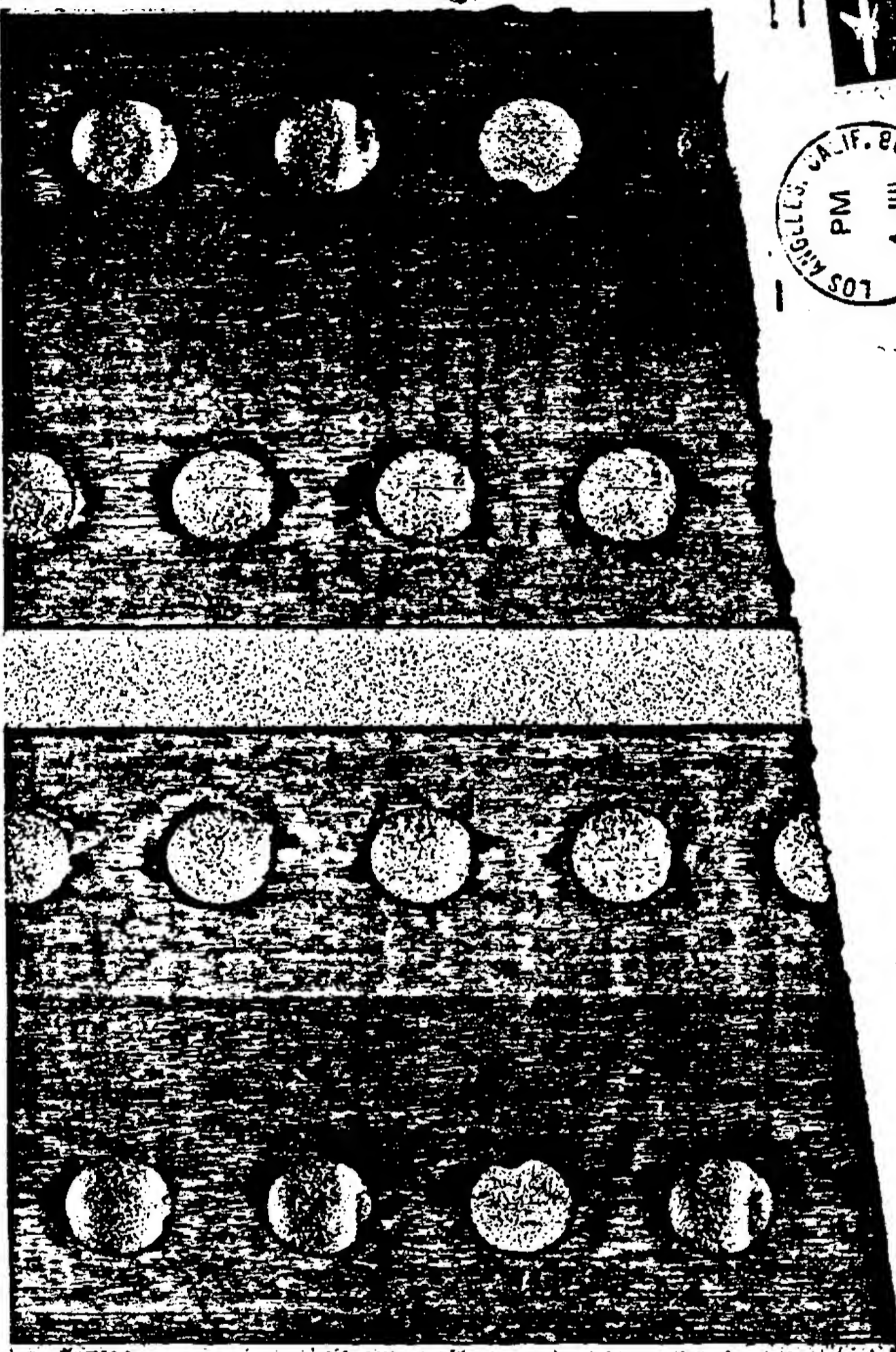

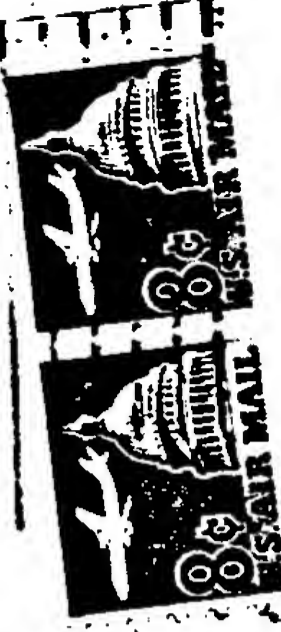

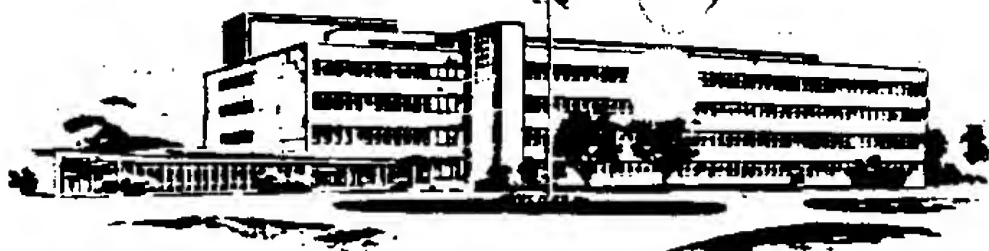

This letter and the attachments do not mean that you lost a subscriber because actually I cancelled my subscription to both of your magazines more than ten years ago due to the distorted, twisted and misleading articles published in your magazines on subjects, particularly concerning Latin America, about which I was familiar enough to at least recognize the work of something more than just a misinformed reporter or editor.

As an American, it is absolutely frightening to me to see that you now consider your position secure enough to attack a man like John Edgar Hoover using the same twisted, distorted tactics. I am reminded of the closing sentence of an article written by Henry J. Taylor and published on January 27, 1964 which states: "This nation (USA) is in absolute peril ". HENRY J. TAYLOR Says — *U.S.*

U.S. Failures In Panama Swept Under The Rug

NEW YORK

Secretary of State Dean Rusk, taken by surprise about events in Panama, told the House Foreign Affairs Committee on January 15 that his department had consulted the returned Ambassador Joseph S. Farland.

"Oh, yes, Mr. Farland has been completely de-briefed," he testified.

On Farland's statement to writer Victor Riesel this is absolutely untrue. He was asked about nothing. Farland sat around Washington for three solid weeks without even—or ever—being consulted ("de-briefed").

It is vital now for President Johnson to find out who in the State Department arranged to misinform the Secretary of State.

Repeated failures to be informed, failures of subordinates to level with their boss, calculated sabotage of information such as the Farland brushoff, and repeated denials of the undeniable mistakes confront us again with the same mysteries we faced in the days of Yalta and of Alger Hiss.

Each Crisis Was Surprise

Each crisis is a surprise—Soviet missiles in Cuba, Laos, the Berlin Wall, Nehru's invasion of Goa, the Dominican revolution, the Cambodian backlash, Zanzibar, Panama. Surprise, surprise, surprise. In the sacred name of the security of the United States, what's going on here?

Like Secretary Rusk, CIA Director John A. McCone also failed inexplicably to consult Farland when the ambassador returned from Panama, although Farland's dispatches bristled with information about the Castro buildup and mounting crisis.

An ex-FBI star, counter-espionage expert, the chief of missions, and admittedly the most successful ambassador we've had in Latin America for many years, Farland was utterly ignored.

Who in the CIA and State Department kept Farland away from the tops? And why was no new ambassador to Panama appointed for five critical months after Farland's return home last August?

Now, one of the things Farland knew, and that I knew, too, was that the CIA in both Cuba and Panama had been infiltrated wholesale by Soviet-trained Castro agents. This disclosure was proven by the systematic murders and tortures that greeted Cuban and Panamanian anti-Communists promptly after being recruited by the CIA.

Details? I repeat here the text of my article of February 27, 1963—11 long and decisive months ago—including the name of Castro's main agent in Panama, only to prove beyond any possible doubt that no surprise at the top of our government is permissible.

"Castro guerrilla fleet is moving fighters and their arms into Panama. Costa Rican Communist Julio Buel is in Havana directing this support in Costa Rica—on Panama's border. The chief disembarkation point is La Colma (Cuba), now a Soviet-occupied port. Castro's leading agent, [redacted] and cover in Pan-

ama's famous Panamanian Communist Thelma King— vicious, relentless, competent.

"By air these groups operate from the Soviet air base at San Julian, 90 miles southwest of Havana, and from San Antonio de Los Baños. They are headquartered in downtown Cienfuegos and the central radio tool is a very modern Russian-built station on Key Breton." February 27, 1963!

Endless Pattern of Surprises

Starting with the Bay of Pigs, after new teams entered the innards of the State Department and CIA, the endless pattern of surprises and failures we have would be utterly impossible unless our government has been infiltrated at the policy level.

The British, French, West German, Italian, Dutch, and Swedish governments have experienced such Soviet infiltration. As our American ambassador to Switzerland, I saw this happen even there. And we are seeing the success of deep-cover Sino-Soviet agents and fellow travelers planted here.

As it did to Chancellor Konrad Adenauer and Prime Minister Harold Macmillan, it must come as a tragic, horrible shock to President Johnson. But all legislation and other important duties fall to nothing compared with the heartbreaking, shifty, diabolic problem he confronts: the restoration of internal top-level security.

Moreover, he knows the enemy's self-serving alibi of "witch hunt" will automatically flare, as always and everywhere, the moment he moves.

May all intelligent citizens and thoughtful newspapers across our country help give him the strength to reach each discoverable truth, place security above every other consideration and let the chips fall where they may. This nation is in absolute peril—within Washington

On the evening of 7/22/64 WALTER WINCHELL telephonically contacted the Los Angeles Office and advised that he desired the Director to be aware that he was going to sign a contract with ABC Films, Inc., to do a television series of 39 thirty-minute programs which will be captioned "WALTER WINCHELL Narrates 'Headliners'".

Mr. WINCHELL advised that ABC Films, Inc. has accumulated 93,000,000 feet of old newsreel clips, which have been taken over the past 45 years. The format of the show will be showing portions of these film clips pertaining to famous incidents, particularly in the criminal field, with a narration by WALTER WINCHELL.

Mr. WINCHELL furnished no information concerning any contemplated date for starting production or any other details concerning the venture.

For the Bureau's information, it has been determined from other sources that ABC Films, Inc., 190 North Canon Drive, Beverly Hills, California, handles sales of American Broadcasting Corporation TV programs, which are offered for syndication to independent TV stations throughout the United States. "The Untouchables" is an example of a TV series which is now being offered to independent stations through ABC Films, Inc.

In the event additional information is received, concerning this contemplated TV series, the Bureau will be advised.

At 5:05 p.m., 7/23/64, WALTER WINCHELL telephonically contacted the Los Angeles Office to advise that King Features in New York had received a communication from "his editor in Anniston, Alabama", and that the editor has advised King Features that he received information from a Special Assistant Attorney General that the story by WINCHELL concerning WILLIE SMITH's house burning to the ground is without foundation. The editor in Anniston, Alabama, wants WINCHELL to print a retraction or correction.

As the Bureau is aware, Mr. WINCHELL wrote a story which appeared under his byline in many newspapers about 6/29/64, wherein he alleged that WILLIE SMITH, rising young Negro star for the Los Angeles Angels, American League baseball team, had told him about his house in the Carver Heights section of Anniston, Alabama, being "burned to the ground by suspected segregationists". Investigation by the Birmingham Office has disclosed that a small fire did occur in an unoccupied house which the SMITH family planned to purchase; however, interview with _____ and contact with the Anniston Fire Department disclosed no indication of any racial aspects in connection with this fire, which was of unknown origin.

He stated he was furnishing this information to the Los Angeles Office so that the FBI would be aware of the latest development in the WILLIE SMITH case.

The article rages on: "One gets the feeling that if Mr. Hoover departed the Bureau (FBI) would fold. The 170 million fingerprints would fade away on their cards, and the agents, mourning the retirement of their leader, would turn flabby. I don't think that either the Bureau or J. Edgar Hoover would suffer much from a separation."

The FBI chief has never contended he is indispensable. And it would be equally unrealistic to deny his importance to the nation's security. 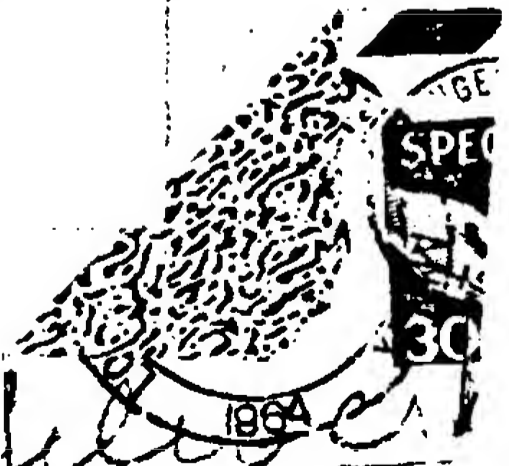

Dear John:

The enclosed speaks for itself. I was in court to hear the summations by both sides and the judge's charge.

The thing that eludes me is why Agent Geary solicited this man's assistance to apprehend fugitives and then failed him on the witness stand. Also I do not understand why Federal agents from the Treasury Department and the FBI did not arrest him.

The buzz among newspaper people in San Diego is that a new law was being tested for the first time and to quote some of them: "The State had to have a conviction or nobody could ever be held on that charge again". If this is true, it is a shameful thing in my opinion.

Also I am told by reputable newspaper people there that one of the high State lawmen confided to others "This is a tough one because so many important San Diegans and others are character witnesses for the defendant and if he is not indicted, we may be accused of being influenced by his important and famous friends". The District Attorney is alleged to have told others "We prosecute the guilty and raise hell with the innocent".

I was invited to meet the judge by Commissioner of Jurors Bowen but said: "No, thank you, not while he is presiding over this case". One of his staff also suggested (when I asked where a good restaurant was at lunch) "Why not go up to the cafeteria in the building" and I asked if judges, court attaches, prosecutors, and Federal people would be there. The reply was "Very likely" and I said "No, thank you, I will go to a restaurant down the street", which I did.

This letter to you, John, is to report my activities that day in San Diego and in the court house and in no way is this intended for any other reason.

NEW MYTH IN THE MAKING

Tricks Fail to Short-Sell FBI

THE LIBERAL-RADICALS have seized upon the Warren Commission report to renew their attack on the Federal Bureau of Investigation and its director, J. Edgar Hoover.

Before the report was released, the liberal-radicals had been conducting a rather desultory campaign to convince the American people that Robert Kennedy was the only attorney general since who knows when who had been able to exert authority upon Mr. Hoover.

They wanted the voters to believe that Robert Kennedy in his three and a half years as attorney general had found it necessary to impose his will on a man who far surpassed him in ability and in experience and in knowledge of law enforcement.

This is foolish, of course, but Mr. Kennedy is not without his friends in the field of communications, and they consider it necessary to create a myth as to his achievements to bring about his election as senator from New York State.

The Warren Commission report suggests that somehow the FBI should have gone beyond its authority in relation to its information regarding Lee Harvey Oswald, as if the FBI should have been able to perceive his intentions, though the Supreme Court of which Mr. Warren is Chief Justice has been particularly alert to protect the alleged civil liberties of known Communists and proved criminals.

As a matter of fact, among previous recommendations to the Justice Department by the FBI and Mr. Hoover were measures for stronger coordination and greater exchange of information among federal investigative agencies. The wisdom of these suggestions has been proved by the very case

which the Warren Commission had under consideration. But nothing had been done by either the Kennedy or Johnson Administrations.

The principal claim being made on behalf of the Robert Kennedy "legend" is that he had to order the FBI to "redirect" its major effort to place greater emphasis upon investigations of organized crime, even though this would mean a slackening of FBI operations against espionage agents and Communist activities in the United States.

This is hardly consistent with recommendations in the Warren report, which has so pleased the liberal-radicals.

The record, however, doesn't indicate any slackening of the efforts of the FBI in regard either to espionage or organized crime, and any attempt to conceal or deny the facts to embellish the record of Mr. Kennedy is dishonest on its face.

Much of the anti-crime legislation for which Mr. Kennedy is being given credit actually was recommended to him and the Justice Department by the FBI, and long before he assumed office the FBI was concerned with the enforcement of civil rights in all fields.

It is the practice of politics to give public credit to Cabinet officers or other politically-appointed office holders for the accomplishments of their departments or bureaus, and it taxes the mind to believe that the young Mr. Kennedy, with no experience in law enforcement or any meaningful experience in the practice of law, had to direct Mr. Hoover in the proper discharge of his duties.

But a new Robert Kennedy myth is in the making—and the White House looms in the distance.
