Your Health

Misdirected Weight Loss May Cause Goiter

WHEN the food burns up in the body faster than it is eaten, the body begins to lose weight. This is the condition we see when the thyroid gland becomes diseased and works faster than normally. This disorder is called toxic goiter or thyrotoxicosis (thi-ro-toks-ik-OS-is).

A person who has this condition becomes weak, sweats a great deal, and the heart beats rapidly. He is extremely nervous and irritable. Sometimes the thyroid gland in the neck is enlarged; the eyeballs may protrude.

Poor nutrition may lead to the development of toxic goiter. That is the opinion of Dr. J. H. Means of Boston and his co-workers, who have noticed this condition in thirty-five different patients.

This is what happens. A person wants to reduce weight. So, he puts himself on a diet which is greatly limited in foods. Then, a loss of weight takes place.

After they have lost the desired amount of weight, they begin to eat more food, but they find that the weight loss does not stop. In fact, they seem to lose weight even faster than before. This person has reduced his intake of the fuel foods which make fat. But at the same time he has eliminated the vitamins and minerals which regulate the body chemistry and thus has thrown the delicate life-mechanism out of order.

Among the patients Dr. Means studied, he discovered symptoms of toxic goiter. These

persons were weak, and the muscles seemed to lose their strength and actually to become smaller. In addition, the bones lost part of their minerals, such as lime, particularly the bones of the spine, and those of the legs and arms.

There seemed to be a shortage of iron in the body. The nails became spoon shaped and lost their luster. There were other symptoms, such as lack of acid in the stomach, and the development of a smooth tongue.

When these symptoms occur, there is need to combat them vigorously and quickly. To begin with, it is well to give a diet rich in lime-containing foods, such as milk and its products; to give some preparation of lime or calcium such as calcium glycerophosphate (gliis-er-o-FOS-fate), as well as viosterol for its vitamin D, needed so the body can use the lime. Also, some preparation containing iron, such as iron and ammonium citrate, is advisable, and its use often will bring rapid improvement in the anemia.

It also is shown in these individuals that there may be a lack of vitamins, particularly vitamin B. Even in persons who develop toxic goiter from other causes, giving vitamin B, in the form of yeast, has been noted to bring about rapid improvement.

In any event, these observations show how important it is that when a person is reducing, that he keeps under the care of a doctor. Improper reducing, particularly, may lead to the development of serious disorders, and while weight may be lost quickly, the health may be damaged beyond repair.

The proper reducing diet is one which is well balanced, furnishing all of the necessary food parts.

Weight loss should not be allowed to occur too rapidly. A loss of one or two pounds a week is ample.

SHORTNESS OF BREATH.

I have been bothered with my breathing. I have to yawn continually to catch my breath.—
M. H. G.

Shortness of breath may be due to a number of conditions, such as heart disease or lung disease. Asthma is also a frequent cause.

It would be advisable for you to have a thorough examination by a physician.

LOSS OF PIGMENT IN SKIN.

I have noticed white spots on my neck and chin. I have been informed that it is only a loss of pigment. What can this be? What can be done?—W. F.

It is possible you are suffering from vitiligo (vit-i-li-go), a disease of the skin in which the pigment is destroyed, causing white patches of various sizes.

Treatment is not always successful. Arsenic and thyroid extract have been given internally

for loss of pigment. Recently it has been reported that injections of cold sodium thiosulfate into a vein will cure this condition. The spots can be rendered less noticeable by applying walnut juice.

CHANGE THE POWDER.

My skin is oily and, whenever I put powder on my face, the next day red scabs form. Can you tell me what causes this?—MISS L. L.

It is possible that your skin may be allergic, or sensitive, to the type of powder that you are putting on your face. I would suggest that you change powders.

He had led the first pioneers, in their buckskins and moccasins and carrying their long rifles, which could hit a sq... rel in the eye at 200 yards, over the Cumber- land Mountains into the Dark and Bloody Ground, to open an em- pire.

The loneliest of lone- ly men, who could not breathe freely when he had an ordinary neighbor nearer than ten miles or a Yankee within a hundred miles, must be thinking likely over on the other side of the Styx of his youthful days when he marched with Braddock's troops to their bitter defeat in the Pennsylvania forests; of his first breath-taking sight of the plains of Kentucky; of the days when the buffalo, the Shawnee and the Chero- kee still roamed south of the Ohio River; of his battles and captivities; of the wild, intoxicating freedom of all those lost, forever-unrecapturable moments of history.

It is well, he would agree, that Kentucky, with sixty-five inhabitants to the square mile, should remember what manner of men it was who first sought the Blue Grass country, hardly more than a century and a half ago, because it was a dangerous and lovely wilderness.

Poor Boone, remembering how he lost his own Kentucky lands because he lacked the money to pay the taxes on them, would allow, as present-day Kentuckians do, that the commonwealth owes him a party.

Born in 1734, near Reading, Pa., he knew from boyhood that, as Kipling was to write: there was "something lost beyond the ranges." When he came home in 1755 from Braddock's defeat, with his scalp still luckily on his head, he fell in love with 15-year-old Rebecca Bryan

... was... into Kentucky. He was tanned by outdoor liv- ing, thin, wiry, moving with the lithe grace of the hunter which is as beautiful in its way as the grace of a dancer.

A high forehead under a dark mop of hair might have suggested the scholar; the promi- nent chin and the firm, thin lips showed his calm and resolute nature. His eyes were a clear blue that could be chilly, but ordinarily were mild and friendly.

When he stood up against the light from the blazing logs he would have seemed a tall man, though many of his forest companions would have overtopped his five feet, ten inches of bone and muscle. His voice was soft, partly because men had to speak softly when they were hunting, or being hunted.

He won Kentucky in years of fighting from the Shawnee Indians, whom he hated like rat- tlesnakes; but his lands slipped through his unbusinesslike hands, and were sold for taxes. West he drifted to Missouri, where the Span- ish at St. Louis received him amiably and gave him a small office. But when the Amer- icans took over in 1813, he lost his post and was again the lone hunter with barely a dollar in his pocket.

Almost to the end he kept on hunting. At 82, he made an excursion to the plains of Nebraska. When Chester Harding went out to make his picture in 1819, he found the old pioneer in a cabin, broiling venison over an open fire, on the tip of a ramrod. A year later he died, at 88.

A quarter of a century after that, his body and that of his faithful Rebecca—whom he had loved since her young girlhood—were brought back to Kentucky soil, to Frankfort, Kentucky. He had at last found a little land that could be all his own, forever free of taxes.

Life's ironies touch even the simple souls of frontiersmen. Daniel Boone found a para- dise he could not keep, saw his beloved wilder- ness, just before his death, reach a population of more than half a million and never had mate- rial reward for what he did.

He loved the wilderness as he loved his Re-becca—perhaps a little more—and because he and so many others of his breed loved it, it ceased to be a wilderness.

Walter Winchell ON BROADWAY

Crime Doesn't Pay

BY J. EDGAR HOOVER.

THE Federal Bureau of Investigation observes its 30th anniversary today. It was created by an executive order issued by Attorney General Charles J. Bonaparte, who was related to Napoleon Bonaparte. In 30 years the personnel has increased from less than 100 to over 1,800. In 1908, the FBI investigated only twenty-four types of offenses—today it has primary jurisdiction over 100 different federal violations.

The growth of the Federal Bureau of Investigation has followed the growing complexities of modern life and rapid means of transportation. At the time FBI was created, training of law enforcement officers was unknown, fingerprinting has been used only five years and then only in a most haphazard and superficial manner, science in crime detection was regarded as a folly, and one could venture no more than a guess as to the extent of crime. Today, the picture of law enforcement has changed completely.

Thirty years ago, the average police officer, when he entered on duty, was assigned a badge, baton, revolver, and a beat with the admonition that if he wished to succeed he should walk his beat and "do nothing and do it well." Contrast this with the trend today—young college men regular police training schools, inspectors, and a new public viewpoint.

Agents Know Law

THE first training school of special agents of the FBI was not created until in January, 1928; previously agents only had been given instruction in the field.

It has only been since 1924 that applicants for appointments as special agents were required to be graduates of recognized law schools, expert accountants, or to have had extensive experience in investigation. Today, over 85 per cent of the G-men are either accountants or law school graduates. Approximately 1,000 applicants are considered for each special agent appointed.

During the past several years, the FBI has demonstrated that modern methods of efficiency and science can be applied to law enforcement and still pay good dividends. For every \$1.00 spent on the FBI, its special agents have affected savings to the government, property recoveries, and the

the taxpayers of the United States amounting to over \$41,000,000.

Employees of the bureau voluntarily put in over 700,000 hours of overtime last year, for which they received no additional compensation. Unfortunately, a special agent cannot go home at 5:00 p. m. when he is on the trail of a criminal. There is no moratorium in crime.

Law enforcement, like the medical profession, has no control over its hours, if its duties are to be discharged and society protected.

All rules and regulations governing the conduct and activities of special agents and the policies of the FBI are suggested by the employes themselves. Once each year every employe is requested to submit suggestions, ideas and criticisms for the improvement of the service.

Work as One

THE FBI is a "We" enterprise and no one agent ever solved or "broke" a case by himself. The accomplishments of the bureau are the results of the unified efforts of the men of the FBI.

I consider that one of the most potent forces back of the men of the FBI are their wives, mothers, sisters, and sweethearts. They are the ones who make the real sacrifices—loneliness, long sleepless hours of waiting, the apprehension that their loved ones might be the prey of some human rat. And to borrow Walter Winchell's phrase "Orchids" to the women who are back of the men of the FBI—they truly exemplify its motto—Fidelity—Bravery—Integrity.

Twelve special agents have lost their lives in the line of duty by violence since 1925. Nine have been killed in gun battles with desperate and confirmed criminals, all of whom had a long record of criminal activity and all but one of whom had previously been the recipient of parole or

widows have accepted clerical positions in the bureau and are carrying on their ideals.

Special agents of the bureau are retired at age 62. The maximum retirement pay which an average field agent can expect to receive is \$135 a month and then only if he has had thirty years of service.

If a special agent is injured in the performance of his duties to the extent that he is fully in-

capacitated, under the law he receives no more than \$116.6 month.

Because of the inadequate benefits available to the Special Agents killed in the line of duty, the FBI has a practice whereby each Agent contributes \$1.00 a month for the benefit of the family of any slain agent.

Now that Mayor Kelly has found out that Courtesy is such a fine thing that he has set aside a week for it, what's keeping us from having a permanent supply of the stuff on hand for daily use?

Maybe, as the Keep Chicago Safe Committee hopes, the auto drivers who have it will be more careful. Maybe, as the Chicago New Century Committee hopes, it will begin a new era for workers in industries, pedestrians on the streets, children who ride bicycles, and all citizens who have to depend on the consideration of others.

Here, at least, is the idea for a new attitude. Nothing fancy about it. Plain as bread and butter. But there's something about it, like wearing one's Sunday clothes every day of the week, that's extra-special. Like it? Thank you.

Toy Pistol Ban

The city council is urged to ban the sale of toy pistols that look like real pistols.

The suggestion comes from a good source. It is made by Lieut. Otto Erlanson, head of the homicide squad and a detective of rare ability.

It is true that, on occasion, successful holdups have been staged by robbers flourishing nothing more dangerous than toy pistols.

But the thought occurs that a man who has banditry in his heart is not going to be thwarted in his low purpose by inability to buy a toy pistol with which to fool his intended victim.

REAL GUNS are all too easily obtainable, for one thing.

We believe there is a more direct and more effective way to reduce the holdup peril in Chicago. It is this:

Persuade the state board of pardons and paroles to KEEP IN PRISON, to the LIMIT of their SENTENCES, every gunman who was ever convicted of robbery with a gun (real or toy).

MEMORANDUM FOR MR. TOLSON

Last evening about 10 p.m. Mr. Morgan Beatty of the Associated Press feature service called stating that a friend of his, [redacted]

[redacted] had a friend, a Mr. Platt, of Cleveland who is in the automobile accessory business, who desired to visit the Bureau this morning.

[redacted] and Mr. Platt called at my office this morning, at which time [redacted] stated that it would not be possible for him to go on the tour personally and arrangements were made for Mr. Lindsay to take Mr. Platt on a tour.

In the course of my visit with [redacted] who appeared to be very much interested in the Bureau, he pointed out that he had met the Director in Toledo following the apprehension of Harry Campbell and if for no other reason, the Director had ample excuse for condemning certain newspaper men by reason of the fact of an incident which arose from that meeting. [redacted] stated that the Director very specifically furnished reporters off-the-record information which was to have been kept in confidence, dealing in primary with Sheriff O'Reilly. Late that evening, [redacted] who was working with the Toledo Blade and the AP at the time, was called on the carpet because of an International News Service flash which quoted the Director as having stated that Sheriff O'Reilly was an associate of Campbell's and indicated that the Director had stated that he was crooked. [redacted] stated that he told his Bureau chief that Mr. Hoover had furnished certain off-the-record information that he considered confidential, for which reason he did not turn it in to the Bureau chief and the Bureau chief upheld him in this, stating that he did the right thing, whereupon information was furnished quoting the INS statement but not [redacted]

[redacted] stated when he came to Washington a few years ago he was very much disappointed to learn of the antagonism on the part of certain newspaper men against Mr. Hoover. I asked him why. He stated that Mr. Hoover does not hold press conferences and when he does, it is on about ten minutes notice and only the newspaper representatives covering the Department building can be present. I asked [redacted] if he was familiar with the Department policy dealing with the release of news. He said he was not thereupon I explained to him that Mr. Hoover's hands were tied so far as relations with the press were concerned; that everything pertaining to the Bureau was released through the Attorney General's office and Mr. Hoover carried out his instructions as did [redacted] seemed

seemed amazed at this and asked why the Director didn't come out with a public statement sometime when he was being criticized. I told [redacted] that that was not the Director's fashion, that he was devoted to duty and carried out his duty. He stated that this certainly shed a different light on the situation and that he for one would take it upon himself to tell a few "wise guys."

He then talked of Pearson and Allen in a very vitriolic manner, stating that both of these men had discredited journalism to a certain extent. He told me an amazing story of how Pearson is writing a daily column which is being furnished to all newspapers in the state of Maryland and various other newspapers throughout the country attacking Senator Tydings. He stated that the background of this was several years ago, at which time Pearson's father who was Governor General of the Cirgia Islands was brought before the Committee on Insular Affairs of which Tydings was Chairman. Pearson went to Tydings and asked him to take care of his father and Tydings allegedly agreed to do this and when the Committee took action against Pearson's father, he vowed to get Tydings if it was the last thing he ever did. He also stated that Allen was one of the most vindictive men that he had ever known and that he believed that the Pittsburgh paper which scooped the Justice Black K K K affiliation would eventually teach Allen and the Nation magazine a lesson that they had needed for years.

Secondly, he stated that he understood that there was a great deal of antagonism among newspaper men because they felt that the Director was feeding Walter Winchell advance information. I told him this was a lie and that the Director treated Winchell like he would any other newspaper man insofar as spot news was concerned and further, that if a lot of newspaper men were on their toes like Winchell was they too would get scoops that Winchell gets. Because Winchell gets information about cases in which the Bureau might be interested is no indication he is getting information from the Bureau. [redacted] stated that he never thought of this angle and again he believed that this dissension was possibly due to some of the Director's enemies in the newspaper fraternity who misrepresented him.

He stated that he had read the article in Collier's Magazine and the only criticism he has of it is that it is not strong enough and that the papers and individuals involved were not put on the spot as they should have been. I, of course, thanked him for his views. He had not seen the article in Editor and Publisher so I told him about this. He stated that while he does not believe in purges as a general thing, nevertheless the journalistic field has a purge coming to it and needs one badly.

[redacted] stated that if at any time he could ever be of assistance to the Bureau either personally or in an official capacity, do not hesitate to call upon him. [redacted] has been on several tours of the Bureau but has never seen the range. Accordingly, he will return to the Bureau in one hour after he has gone to his office and I will personally take him to the range.

SAC Brantley of New York called with reference to Halter Winchell's broadcast last evening, February 5th, and advised that Winchell had said that during this coming week Dewey will proceed against two judges—one in New York and the other in Brooklyn—for bribery. Winchell did not say, however, whether the accused were Federal judges. Mr. Brantley also informed that Winchell commented that the President will officially, today, notify Mr. Cahill of New York as to his appointment to a United States Attorney Position.

Brantley further informed that Agent/Starr's informant, who had been in the company of [redacted] all day Saturday, spent Saturday night with him and who left [redacted] before the above mentioned broadcast, called [redacted] after Winchell's radio talk. [redacted] however, was very distant toward the informant when he called, and his attitude toward the informant made it appear that he suspected the informant's having made known to others about what they had been discussing.

Your reference to the book by Henry Thomas, in which he describes the struggle of the United States for its freedom; not from England, but from an "imported German King."

I judge that this so-called "Henry Thomas" is a lousy Jew, like yourself, parading under an American name---like yourself. I also gather that he, like yourself, is ignorant of American history---and sees things only through the eyes of a Jew.

Why, you lousy ignoramus, didn't you know that England was originally settled by Germans?

Another thing: Where were the Jews when we, the American people, were fighting for our freedom? I can tell you. You were in the cellars of any European country that would keep you---and in countries where no war was going on. Only after things were settled in the U.S.A. did the Jew come over.

Democracy? Why, you lousy Jews don't know what the word means. When the American people wake up---which I hope is soon---propagandists like yourself will get theirs.



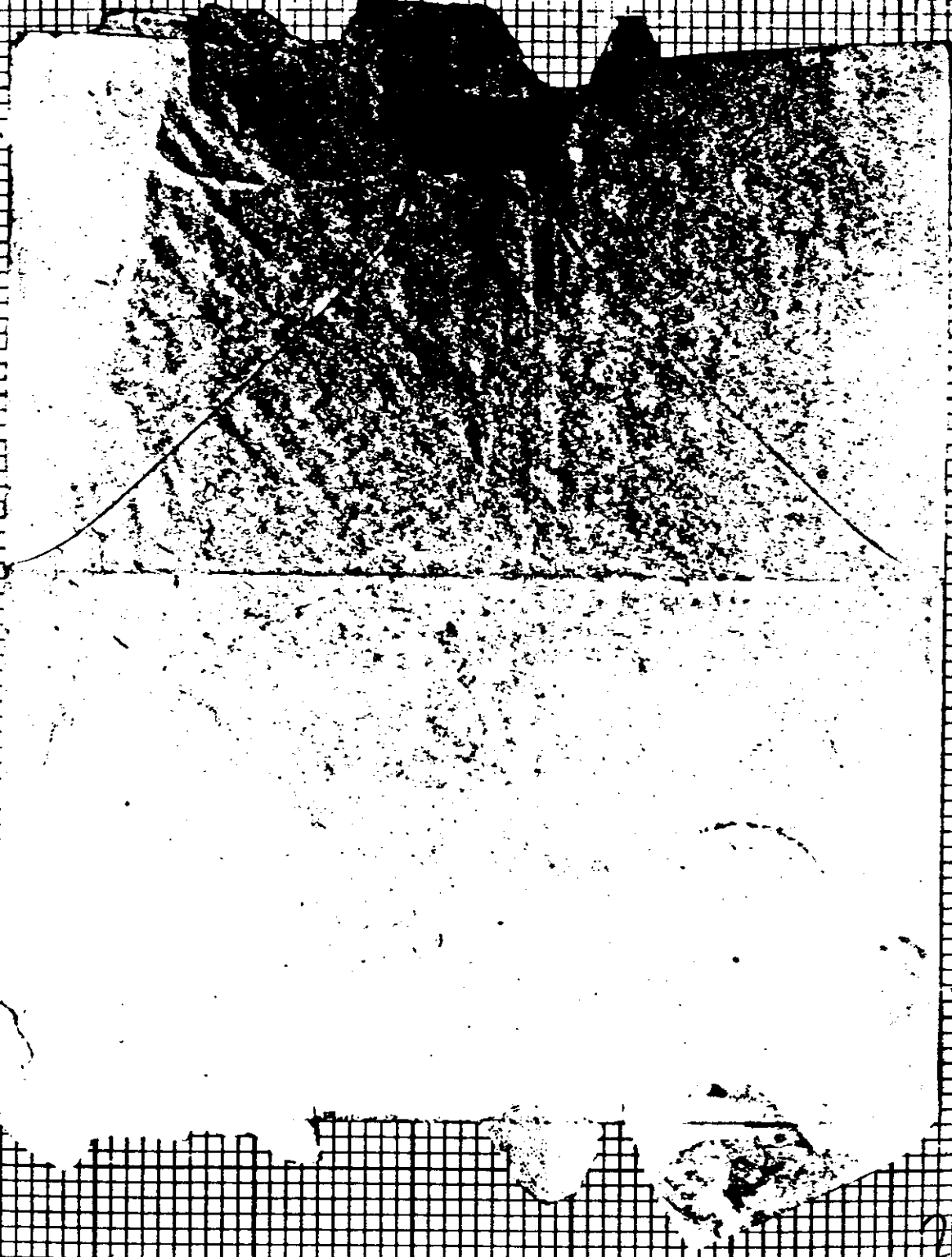

MEMORANDUM FOR MR. NATHAN

Re: Anonymous communication
to Walter Winchell.

At the request of the Director's Office an envelope addressed to Walter Winchell, postmarked "New York, N.Y., Apr. 29, 1939, 9:30 A.M. Sta. G" together with a small box containing an unexploded .38 S & W cartridge manufactured by the Winchester Repeating Arms Co. were examined in the Laboratory.

The examination has been made and all of the specimens were treated for the development of latent fingerprints and one fingerprint of value for comparison purposes was found on the inside of the flap of the envelope. In this connection it is noted, however, that the appearance and location of this fingerprint indicates that it was probably placed on the flap after the envelope had been opened. This fingerprint was compared with the fingerprints of Walter Winchell on file but no identification was effected.

The envelope is made of plain white bond paper containing no watermark and measures approximately 3 1/2" by 6". The two cent stamp on the envelope contains perforations on the top and right hand side only, those on the left and bottom having been cut off with a sharp instrument.

There is pasted to the front of the envelope a small piece of paper containing the typewritten address "Walter Winchel, Daily Mirror, New York" which is concluded to have been written on a typewriter equipped with Corona or Smith Corona Elite type. Slightly under the words "Daily Mirror" and inverted in position is the typewritten word "Ninow" written on the same typewriter. The meaning or significance of this word is not known.

The small cardboard box in which the bullet was enclosed is such as is used to pack toys or novelties. It contains a rubber stamp mark "Made in Germany" across the center of the top of the box. Slightly above this has been pasted a piece of paper cut from a magazine or periodical on which are found representations of five swastikas. Below the rubber stamp is pasted a piece of paper on which is typewritten the words "IF FFIF"



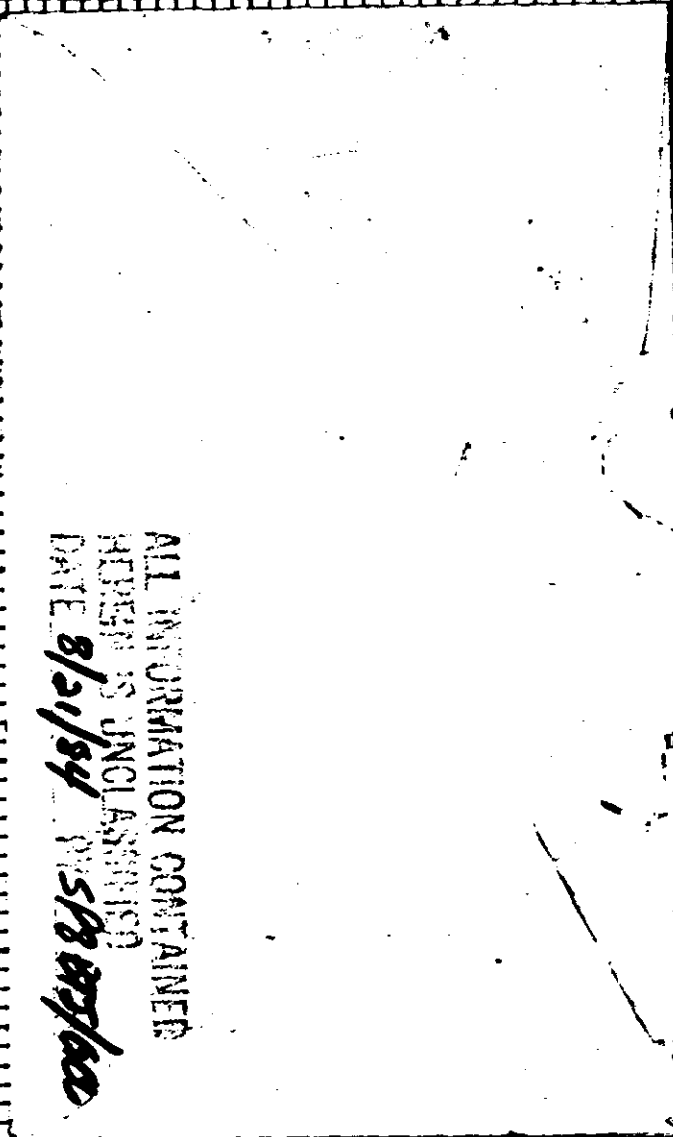

MEMORANDUM FOR MR. TOLSON

23

On May 11, 1939, I saw Mr. George R. Reedy of the Philadelphia Inquirer, who was taken on a special tour of the Bureau on May 9, 1939, by Mr. Holloman. During the tour Mr. Reedy advised Mr. Holloman as follows:

He stated that practically all of the writers today who write special articles are on salaries from the newspapers which they represent and there are very few free-lance writers. That until May 8, 1939, he was the Washington representative of the Philadelphia Inquirer covering the U. S. House of Representatives and that he knew all of the members of the House and was well acquainted with their activities. He was taken off of this assignment so that he might work on a special assignment writing special articles concerning the FBI, based on closed cases of the Bureau. He explained that the reason he was given this assignment was that his salary was more than \$5200 a year and all employees of the Inquirer who received a salary of more than \$5200 were required to do overtime work without extra compensation, whereas an employee making \$5199 a year or less would have to be paid time and a half for all overtime. Another reason was that he had been engaged in covering police departments in the past and had a good working knowledge of criminal activities. He stated he had done quite a bit of crime work in regard to newspapers and had come in direct contact with criminals. Mr. Reedy asserted very emphatically that he was not a free-lance writer but that he was on a regular salary from the Philadelphia Inquirer.

During the entire tour Mr. Reedy was profuse in his praise of the work done by the FBI and attributed the entire success of the Bureau to the leadership of Mr. Hoover. He advised Mr. Holloman that he believed a series of articles written by him would do much good in bringing before the public the activities of the FBI and although numerous stories had been written concerning the work of the FBI additional stories would further aid the progress of the Bureau. He mentioned that on one occasion he had written a series of articles with the Commissioner of the War Department on the U. S. Aeronautics; that he had gone to the War Department and exhibited his desire to write these articles and they had granted him permission. He said that as a result of his article the War Department was able to obtain an increase in appropriations because he had brought this branch of the service before the public.

Mr. Reedy informed the writer that he had been commissioned by the Managing Editor of the Philadelphia Inquirer, Mr. J. J. Fitzpatrick, who was formerly with the Washington Times, to do a series of at least fifteen articles on the FBI. This commission originally came from Mr. Curtis, Executive Director, who has been associated with the Inquirer for several years.

He stated he would like to get several outstanding cases, that it would not appear in the articles that the material was from the Bureau, and that it was his plan to go to some of the citizens in the communities wherein these cases occurred, and to go to some of the law enforcement officials and get their comments -- which would doubly emphasize the Bureau's work.

He will do one article on the National Police Academy, one on the Technical Laboratory, probably one on fingerprinting, and the others on cases. He stated that he had spoken to Mr. Gordon Dean about this and Mr. Dean approved of the Bureau furnishing him with the information. He advised that the series would open by two columns appearing in his paper discussing the work of the Bureau. The columns would be written by General Hugh Johnson and Walter Winchell. He stated that he had already approached General Johnson to write the column and General Johnson said that he would do anything for the Bureau, but that he wanted to be sure about the commission coming from the front office, and that accordingly he had called Mr. Reedy, who made some arrangements for word to come from Fitzpatrick.
