

WINCHELL:

New York City: Federal Judge Sylvester Ryan 1s expected to send the Frank Costello case to the jury on Tuesday.

Federal Court House, New York: The lawyer for Frank Costello may pull a big surprise tomorrow: Lawyer George Wolff may call a number of newspaper men who covered the Senate Crime Committee hearings.



WINCHELL:

San Francisco: The next big demonstration by Communists in San Francisco will take place on January 16. They will go from house to house passing out leaflets protesting the arrest of Red leaders by the FBI.

COMMENT:

Information has been received from time to time from San Francisco and Los Angeles that the Communists on the west coast are distributing leaflets and agitating otherwise in protest to the arrest by the FBI of west coast Communist leaders who are presently awaiting trial under the Smith Act. 





MR. LADD MR. NICHOLS

Irving Holiman called me from New York to advise that the Post series on Walter Rinchell are being syndicated and are to start running in the Los Angeles Mirror on Monday. He stated he is going to do quite a strong piece on these Articles which obviously do not give the Irve picture. Mr. Holiman told me that today they have a picture of Winchell with Johannes Steel with the comment that "there was a time when Johannes Steel, one of the Communist's pet Commie pet writers on international alfairs, had Winchell's ear as above" but according to Mr. Holiman they do not say that Johannes Steel was writing for the New York Post.

Mr. Holiman stated that with reference to the piece he was going to write he was interested in the item the Post ran on the gangster in the Stork Club on New Year's Eve and he would like to know the background on this if possible. He stated he had checked on this and he believed it had come from McKelway's book in 1940 which was a series of profiles put out by the New Yorke I told Mr. Hoffman that I had checked all our files in the Bureau, our regular cal files and identification files and fingerprint files and we have no one by that name I stated, of course, I would not say that no one by that name exists, but certainly if we were in pursuit of a man, or a man had impersonated a federal officer, or we had prosecuted him or he was a fugitive we would have him listed. I stated we had no record of any Terry Riley and I surmised that Lyle Stuart had probably picked it up from McKelway. J. Mr. Hollman stated he thought he could challenge Stuart and say he would like to see them produce the man, as he felt if we could not they certainly could not, and he wondered if he would be safe in doing this. I told him I believed they could not produce such a man unless, of course, they had some take one show up. I further told Mr. Holfman that I recalled this particular evening very well at the Stork Club; that I did not recall this incident at a that I was there with Walter Winchell and at the time Jim Braddock was the heav weight champion of the world and Jim was at some other table with a group of Iriends and at midnight when the New Year came in someone suggested that Jim



say that he checked with me and that in the files of the FBI there is no such person. COMMENT:






WINCHELL:

Unfortunately, there is no way that Judge Medina can get back the years they took from his life.



THERE ARE ALSO INTERVALS WHEN CONGRESSIONAL CURIOSITY OVER THE EXTENT OF WINCHELL-S INTIMACY WITH THE AFFAIRS OF THE FBI CREATES A DISCREET COOLING-OFF PERIOD IN THE HOOVER-WINCHELL ASSOCIATION. BUT THE CHILL HAS NEVER BEEN PROLONGED OR FATAL.

TO READ AND HEAR WINCHELL OVER THE COURSE OF THE YEARS IS TO GET THE KIND OF IDEALIZED BIOGRAPHY OF HOOVER USUALLY RESERVED FOR SUCH IMMORTALS AS BABE RUTH. NO WORD OF CRITICISM EVER INTERRUPTS THE FLOW. WINCHELL IS NOT MERELY DEDICATED TO THHE PUBLIC WORKS AND HISTORIC UTTERANCES OF THE TOP G-MAN. HE DISPLAYS A FANATICALLY DE-TAILED PREOCCUPATION WITH HOOVER-S LITTLE JOYS AND SORROWS, HIS ILLS AND RECOVERIES, HIS FURIES AND HIS FLUTTERS.

IRONICALLY, IN HIS ZEAL FOR HIS TASK THERE IS SOME QUESTION AS TO WHETHER WINCHELL HAS ALWAYS BEEN HELPFUL AND WHETHER, IN THE LONG RUN, HOOVER FULLY EMERGES FROM WINCHELL-S WORD-PICTURES AS THE MAN OF DISTINCTION HE IS ALLEGED TO BE. THERE ARE MOMENTS, AT LEAST, WHEN WINCHELL-S EXPRESSION OF BOYISHLY BOISTEROUS ESTEEM FOR OUR TOP COP HAVE MADE BOTH OF THEM LOOK DOWNRIGHT COMIC.

TAKE THE CASE OF THE MISSING COMMUNIST LEADERS.

BACK ON NOV. EIGHT, NINETEEN FORTY EIGHT, WINCHELL GAVE THE COUNT THIS REASSURING NEWS- "THE FBI CAN PICK UP EVERY COMMUNIST CHIEF WITHIN AN HOUR VIA ITS UP-TO-DATE LIST." SEVEN DAYS LATER HE REPEATED THE ASSURANCE-"MANY TOP MEN IN THE COMMUNIST PARTY HERE ARE IN HIDING. ... THE FBI KNOWS ALL THE LEADERS AND IF AN EMERGENCY COMES UP THEY WILL BE COLLARED WITH THE SAME DISPATCH USED ON PEARL HARBOR DAY." ALL THIS SOUNDED LIKE CLEAR REASSURANCE FROM THE FBI THAT THE COMMUNIST CHIEFTAINS COULDN-T MAKE A MOVE WITHOUT SOMEBODY CALLING HOOVER. THE MYTH MIGHT HAVE SURVIVED IF EIGHT RANKING COMMUNISTS HADN-T JUMPED BAIL ON THE EVE OF SENTENCING LAST JULY.

SEVEN ARE STILL MISSING AND THE EIGHTH WAS CAUGHT BY THE MEXICAN COPS.

SINCE THE EPISODE OF THE VANISHING UN-AMERICANS WINCHELL HAS BEEN RELATIVELY SILENT ON THE EMBARRASSING SUBJECT OF FBI SURVEILLANCE. HE DID REPORT ON JULY NINE THAT THE FBI "FEARS" THAT ROBERT G. THOMPSON, ONE OF THOSE STILL A W O L, IS "ARMED AND SEEKS TO BECOME A MARTYR." HOOVER-S REPUTATION FOR MMNIEIKN OMNISCIENCE KK MAY BE DAMAGED ON A LESSER SCALE BY SUCH ITEMS AS WINCHELL-S BLEAK REPORT ON JULY FOURTEEN,

MATTERS, WINCHELL SOMETIMES OFFERS BEWILDERING HIGHLIGHTS OF HINDSIGHT THUS, AFTER THE ATTEMPT TO ASSASSINATE PRESIDENT TRUMAN LAST YEAR, HE WROTE-

"THE WASHINGTON RUMBLINGS THAT THE FBI HAD NO ADVANCE NOTICE OF THE PUERTO RICAN INSURRECTION DOESN-T IMPRESS THE K GOVERNMENT AGENCIES WHICH GOT DETAILED ADVANCE NEWS /FROM THE G-MEN/ ON THE SAN JUAN NATIONALISTS- PLANS."

THE PARAGRAPH WAS OBVIOUSLY INTENDED TO SHOW THAT J. EDGAR HOOVER ALWAYS HAS HIS FNGER ON THE PULSE OF THE PLOTTERS. IF THAT WAS TRUE, THE OBVIOUS QUESTION- UNASKED AND UNANSWERED BY WINCHELL- IS WHY THE G-MEN DIDN-T FOIL THE PLOT BEFORE THE SHOOTING STARTED.

SUCH MISFORTUNES ARE LIKELY TO AFFLICT ANY PUBLIC FIGURE WHO BARES HIS CERTITUDES AND PROPHECIES AS OFTEN AS HOOVER-S ARE UNFOLDED BY WINCHELL.

THEIR RELATIONSHIP GOES WAY BACK. IN NINETEEN THIRTY FOUR-ALTHOUGH THEY HAD NOT YET MET, HOOVER ASSIGNED TWO G-MEN AS WINCHELL BODYGUARDS WHEN THE COLUMNIST TOOK A TRIP TO MOB-RIDDEN CHICAGO. A NIGHT BECAUSE TERRY REILLY, A NOTORIOUS GUNMAN OF THE ERE, WAS


ALSO ON HAND AND HOOVER /NOT RECOGNIZING REILLY JOINED OTHERS IN TRYING TO PERSUADE HIM TO POSE FOR THE PHOTOGRAPHERS WITH A TOY MACHINE GUN. REILLY WAS ON PAROLE AT THE TIME, HAVING BEEN CONVICTED OF EXTORTION AND IMPERSONATING A G-MAN.

ALTHOUGH WINCHELL-S PALSHIPS WITH UNDERWORLD FIGURES HAVE FLUCTUATED, REACHING A GAUDY CLIMAX WITH HIS RECENT PUBLIC ENNOBLING OF FRANK COSTELLO, HOOVER HAS APPARENTLY NOT SEEN FIT TO TELL WINCHELL TO CHANGE HIS CIRCLE OF FRIENDS. THERE IS SOME EVIDENCE, HOWEVER, THAT GOSSIP ON THE POINT HAS WORRIED THE G-MAN. HOOVER HAS SHOWN INCREASING DISCRETION ABOUT BEING SEEN IN UNDUE PROXIMITY TO MOBSTERS.

IN RECENT YEARS THE STORK CLUB HAS BECOME THE CHIEF RENDEZ-VOUS FOR HOOVER AND WINCHELL, PERHAPS BECAUSE OF THESE PRIOR EMBARRASS-MENTS AT OTHER PLACES OR POSSIBLY BECAUSE WINCHELL LEAVES THE STORK LESS AND LESS FREQUENTLY WITH THE PASSAGE OF TIME EXCEPT TO MAN HIS OCEANSIDE FLORIDA BASTION.

IF THE CURIOUS DUALITY OF WINCHELL-S TIES WITH THE G-MEN AND FRANK COSTELLO HAS BROUGHT ANY PAIN TO HOOVER, IT MUST BE WEIGHED AGAINST THE CONSTANT STREAM OF ADULATION AND ANXIETY WITH WHICH HOOVER-S LIFE IS RECORDED BY WINCHELL.

THERE ARE DAYS WHEN IT SOUNDS AS IF WINCHELL RECEIVES A DAILY



- SEPT. FOUR, NINETEEN FORTY FOUR-- WI GOT THE OMINOUS WORN THAT "JOHN EDGAR HOOVER WAS SO ILL RECENTLY HE THOUGHT HE WOULD DIE." BY NINETEEN FORTY FIVE WINCHELL IS SOLICITOUSLY REPORTING THAT "CERTAIN POWERFUL ENEMIES IN WASHINGTON ARE TRYING TO WORRY HIM /HOOVER/ INTO LOOKING OLDER."


THE G-MAN-S ARRIVALS AND DEPARTURES AT THE STORK CLUB ARE FAITHFULLY ANNOTATED, AT NO TIME HAS IT APPARENTLY OCCURED TO WINCHELL THAT A NERVOUS, SECURITY-CONSCIOUS AMERICA MIGHT BE TROUBLED BY THE KNOWLEDGE THAT OUR CHIEF G-MAN IS FOREVER /ACCORDING TO WINCHELL/ SLIPPING IN AND OUT OF NEW YORK NITERIES. UNDOUBTEDLY HOOVER SPENDS MANY LONG HOURS AT HIS DESK, BUT THE ACCUMULATIVE EFFECT OF WINCHELL ITEMS IS TO SUGGEST THAT THE G-MAN CAN-T STAY AWAY FROM NEW YORK.

THE CRUELEST THING THAT WINCHELL HAS DONE TO HOOVER- WITH THE BEST OF INTENTIONS-- IS TO TRY TO "HUMANIZE" HIM. 



WINCHELL OBVIOUSLY REGARDS IT AS ONE OF OUR REPUBLIC-S WORST OVERSIGHTS THAT J. EDGAR IS CONFINED TO THE ROLE OF FBI CHIEF WHILE LESSER MEN ARE DESIGNATED TO RUN FOR OFFICE. 





DR. HAWKINS, UNDER OATH, TESTIFIC THAT BOTH HE AND HIS WIFE WERE CARD CARRIERS. HIS BROTHER-IN-LAW IS WILLIAM SLOAN OF WM. SLOAN ASSOCIATES -- THE PUBLISHERS OF MAX

SUPREME EXAMPLE OF GUILT BY INVOLUNTARY ASSOCIATION WITH A BROTHER-IN-LAW WAS UNFURLED BY WINCHELL AS THE LAST WORD ON THE SUBJECT. IT WAS SUPPOSED TO RING DOWN THE CURTAIN ON ANY REAL DISCUSSION OF THE BOOK.



YET IN VIEW OF THE SERVICES WINCHELL HAS RENDERED ONE WONDERS WHETHER THE BARGAIN HAS FULLY PAID OFF. New York Police Headquarters: The latest news on the murder of the Willie Sutton fingerman, Arnold Schuster - the police are now looking for a triggerman connected with the Jersey waterfront mob. The assassination, they now say, might not be a Willie Sutton vengeance. It might not be a Willie Sutton vengeance but a warning to John De Venuta not to sing about the waterfront activities of "Scup" Kling. Kling, one of Sutton's partners in the Sunnyside" holdup, is a top man in the Jersey waterfront rackets.

New York City: The killing of young Schuster has already cleaned the town of most hoodlums. Veteran detectives report that they have not seen a single mobster in their usual haunts since 10:15 last night.

New York City: The police have just debunked the report that Fred Tenuto, a Sutton pal, was seen in Brooklyn shortly before the Schuster murder.

To the New York Mirror: John De Venuta, one of the Willie Sutton gang, will take the stand for the State against his pals. De Venuta, in a deal with the District Attorney, will not be prosecuted.



CONTENT:

As you are aware, Arnold Schuster, age 24, was the individual who made the identification of William Francis Sutton which led to his arrest in Brooklyn, New York. Shortly thereafter Thomas Anthony Kling, alias "Scup" Kling, was also taken into custody. Schuster was slain on the street near his home in Brooklyn on the night of March 8, 1952. Nine possible extortion letters, received by Schuster, which had previously been referred to the New York City Police Department and turned down by them as "crank letters" were made available by Schuster's attorney to the New York Division of this Bureau on February 25, 1952. The New York Division is conducting an investigation of these letters at this time. Frederick J. Tenuto is one of the Ten Most Important Bureau Fugitives and is wanted for Unlawful Flight to Avoid Confinement-Hurder. He escaped in February, 1947, from the Philadelphia County Prison at Holmesburg, Pennsylvania, with four other men, one of whom was Willie Sutton.

He stated that he personally did not attach much significance to the comment, primarily because he felt that the relations between the CIA and the FBI are not of a nature to give rise to any such statements. He added that he knew of no situation or incident which might have given rise to Winchell's statement. (5-1) (*)u1 Declassify Classifier General Smith advised that he appreciated very greatly the Director's attitude as reflected in the letter directed to Winchell. He stated that CIA was not making any type of inquiry in order to ascertain the basis for Winchell's comment. He advised that, if the Bureau developed any information indicating that CIA personnel might be responsible in any way, he would appreciate receiving the pertinent details. Barry Gray Yells Foul

BARRY GRAY, a night club disc jockey who last Winter opened his microphones to anyone who wanted to savage Walter Winchell, then ailing in Florida, is in the curious position of crying foul now that the rebuttal from the hale and hard-hitting columnist has started.

Mr. Winchell did little to defend himself while one ancient enemy after another was resurrected by Mr. Gray to pour venom on his record. Feuds dormant for years were stoked over by the disc jockey in a bid for notoriety apparently based on the belief that Walter would hold still indefinitely for a campaign of character assassination without parallel in the long history of Broadway.

Nor did the columnist arouse himself when Broadway and Hollywood characters who had sought his help and favors for years allowed themselves to be herded by press agents to the Gray microphones for cheap plugs about their plays, movies and lay-offs.

The "Worst Offender"

Mr. Winchell bided his time and now his time evidently has come. It seems that Mr. Gray's employer, Chandler's restaurant, is the "worst offender"—in the words of U. S. Attorney Myles Lane—among the local eateries which have been price-gouging and over-charging customers in violation of Federal regulations. A lien of \$300,000plus has been slapped on the restaurant and Mr. Winchell has begun to keep his readers informed on all angles as they develop.

More than that. Walter has widened his rebuttal to include a few ripe details from the past of the Chandler owners. He charges that one of the bosses is "no stranger to the authorities," that he was investigated as to harboring jall-breakers and that he has been involved in "tax trickery" costing him \$200,000 to square. All this has pained and saddened Mr. Gray, who plaintively asked his audience: This naive query amused Broadwayites who could give Mr. Gray the answer without a second's hesitation. Mr. Winchell has very little interest in the other joints charged with price-gouging and chiseling. But he will always find a spot in the column for Chandler's and its owners, who provided a forum for months on end from which those with a grudge against the columnist could vent their spleen without the slightest screening for truth, slander, or the personal health of the victim.

An Empty Gesture


Mr. Gray has excused this smear barrage by saying he has also invited Mr. Winchell to appear—as if the columnist, who is a valuable TV and radio personality, should help build up business for a hashery that now stands arraigned as the worst offender" among all New York pricechiselers.

Mr. Gray is alarmed over one other feature of his present situation and I believe he should be. Press agents and theatrical tycoons are no longer anxious to have their properties brace the Gray microphones. The price for a cheap puff or two is coming a little high this season. Whether Mr. Gray realizes it or not, his controversial attacks on a wide variety of people have made him a "hot" character and we do mean "hot."

The disc jockey mutters darkly about "reprisals" and other sinister gambits but this is patent nonsense. It is only human nature not to have an excess of affection for theatrical personalities who give aid and sustenance to a disc jockey dedicated to destroy the reputation of columnists who do not happen to see eye-to-eye with his own political beliefs. We say to these press agents and producers and personalities who give their support to Mr. Gray: That's just dandy. But surely don't be surprised if we here at the Journal-American invite you to keep getting your plugs from him and not to expect very much from us. Mr. Gray is hot, red-hot, and he is all yours,



LADD FROM : WALTER WINCHELL TELECAST AND BROADCAST SUBJECT: **OF** OCTOBER 5, 1952 Falter Winchell in his telecast and broadcast of October 5, 1952, made the following statements of interest: (1) The Kluxers in Southern Florida will get the surprise of their lives when the rederal Grand Jury convenes as the FBI knows of their activities. Comment: He was referring to the Florida bombing cases which are being presented to a Federal Grand Jury convening at Miami, Florida, on October 6, 1952. Forty-seven individuals have been subpoended, among them members of the John B. Gordon Klan of Hialeah, Florida. (2) The Communists in the schools will be exposed by a Senate Committee report on October 11, 1952, Comment: The McCarran Committee has been holding hearings in New York regarding subversive influence in the educational process and a copy of some of the hearings held thus far has been furnished to the Bureau. It is being reviewed.

(3) A feud is in progress between President Truman and Secretary of Commerce Charles Sawyer over Mrs. Leon Keyserling, who was fired on charges of disloyalty. The President wants her reinstated and the Secretary has refused.

<u>Comment</u>: The fact that <u>Wrs</u>. Keyserling has been suspended has been brought to the Bureau's attention confidentially by the Department of Commerce.

<u>Comment</u>: For some time the Subcommittee of the House headed by Representative Frank L. Chelf of Kentucky has been investigating the Department of Justice and among other things has been inquiring into the Kansas City vote fraud case and its handling by the Department. The question has been raised concerning the use of a sub-B file wherein administrative data was placed upon instructions of Tom Clark, the then Attorney General.

It is noted that the Washington Star of October 5, 1952, carried an article that Congressman Chelf said no "new or startling evidence" had been developed. Chelf stated that Clark used "exceedingl: improper judgment" in handling the case in not ordering a more extensive FBI probe of charges.



COMMENT:

Currie appeared before the House Committee on Un-American Activities in connection with the Gregory espionage case.

WINCHELL:

Secretary of State Dean Acheson approved a loan to Red Poland on April 24, 1946. Poland paid a \$52,000 fee to Acheson's law firm and the brother of Alger Hiss.

COMMENT:

WINCHELL:

J. Wechsler, Editor of the "New York Post," once a top official in the Young Communist League, claims he quit this organization in 1937 and that he was too young to be a Communist. Wechsler's paper, the "New York Post," has attacked J. Edgar Hoover, the FBI and Walter Winchell for prosecuting the Communists. It has also defended Alger Hiss, William Remington and other "pinks." Page 283 of the record of the espionage trial at which the Rosenbergs and Morton Sobell were found guilty shows that Max Elitcher testified that Rosenberg tried to get him to join the Young Communist League in 1937 and that after he joined in 1939 he found that Wechsler's Red outfit was still an important cell in the Communist Party.
