AN ACT RELATIVE TO THE REGISTRY AND RETURN OF BIRTHS, MARRIAGES AND DEATHS.

Commonwealth of Massachusetts.

Notwithstanding the provisions of section 1 of chapter 444 of the Acts of 1897, in relation to the registry and return of births, marriages and deaths, any person who has been born in the Commonwealth of Massachusetts, and who has been domiciled in this Commonwealth for one year next preceding the date of his birth, and who is now residing in the Commonwealth of Massachusetts, shall be deemed to be a resident of the Commonwealth of Massachusetts for all the purposes of the said chapter 444.
