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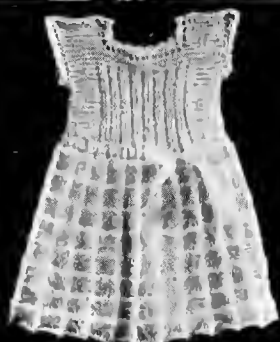
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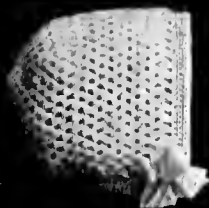
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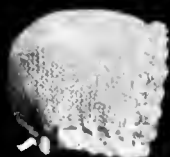
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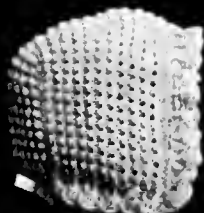
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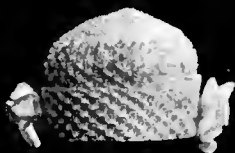
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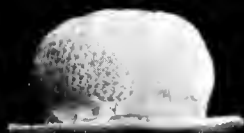
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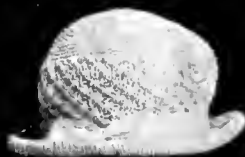
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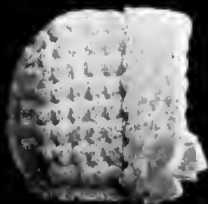
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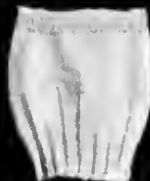
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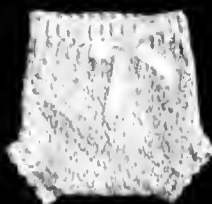
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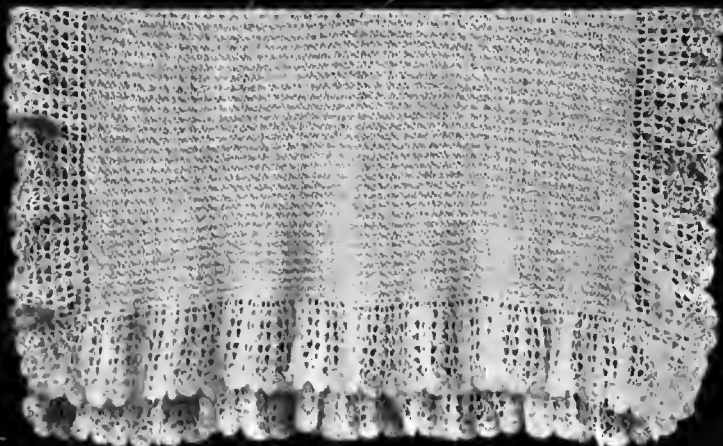
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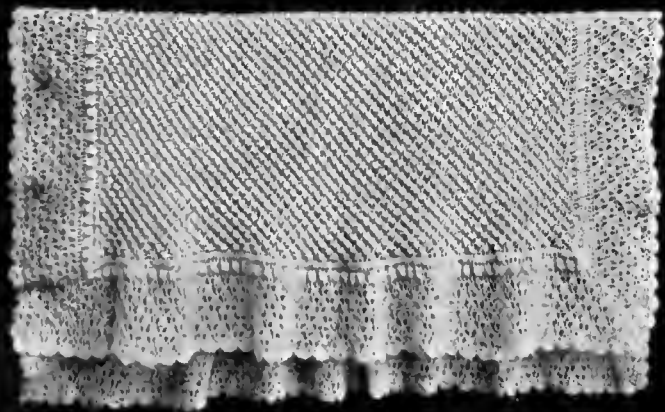
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EXPLANATION OF CROCHET STITCHES

Chain—Make a slip knot on needle, draw thread through this loop. Draw wool through second loop and continue for whatever length of chain is required.

Single Crochet—Put hook through work at stitch indicated in directions; draw thread through work and through loop on needle at same time. This is sometimes called Slip Stitch.

Double Crochet—Put hook through work, thread over hook and draw through, making two loops on needle; thread over again and draw through both loops.

Treble—Thread over the needle; hook through work; thread over and draw through, making three loops on needle; thread over, draw through two loops; thread over again and draw through remaining two.

Double Treble—Thread over hook twice; hook through work, thread over and draw through, making four loops on needle; thread over and draw through two loops, then the second two, and lastly the remaining two.

Long Treble—Thread over hook three times; hook through work; thread over and draw through, making five loops on needle; thread over and draw through two at a time.

Picot—A Picot stitch is made by working 4 chain, then making a double crochet in the fourth chain from needle.

Star Stitch—On a given number of chain pick up four in addition to the loop on needle, thus making five stitches; draw wool through all five together; then make one chain. For next star draw thread through the hole under the one chain; then through the back thread of former star and pick up two more chain and draw through all five loops together. In second row—make three chain to commence. Pick up the second and third of these, then the back thread on top of star below, and lastly draw thread through eye of star below, and draw wool through all five loops together; 1 chain, and proceed as before.

*is used to indicate repetition of preceding instructions.

Balls for finishing off cords at waist, etc. Work 4 chain and join into a ring, into which put 14 treble (3 chain to begin counts as first treble), then make 1 double crochet into each alternate treble (this will draw it almost close up). Break off end of thread, and sew on to end of cord.

Abbreviations in Crochet—Chain—ch. Double Crochet—d.c
Treble—tr.

Abbreviations in Knitting—Knit—k. Purl—p. Together—tog.

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What to make for Baby

PART ONE in New Form

This Edition has been entirely rewritten

Many of the patterns are new and all previous designs much improved.

No. 1. **KNITTED COAT.**

Materials.—4 oz. Ivorine wool. No. 8 and No. 7 bone needles.

Cast 88 stitches onto No. 8 needles, and knit in ribbing of 2 plain, 2 purl, for 5 rows.

Next Row.—Knit 1, * wool over needle, knit 2 tog. Repeat from * to end, last stitch singly. Next 3 rows in ribbing.

Next Row.—Knit 28.

Next Row.—Turn and knit 1, purl 1, alternately, 4 times.

Next Row.—Turn, purl 1, knit 1, alternately, 4 times. Work backward and forward on these 8 stitches in these 2 rows until you have 34 rows in little strap. Cast off. Begin again at neck and knit 40. The last 8 stitches work a strap the same way as before. Begin again at neck, and knit remaining 20.

Next Row.—With No. 7 needles, knit 5, purl 15, then pick up and purl 18 on side of strap.

Pattern: 1st Row.—*Knit 2, wool over needle, slip 1, knit 1, pass slipped stitch over knitted one. Repeat from *, knit last 5 stitches.

2nd Row.—Purl.

3rd Row.—Plain.

4th Row.—Purl.

5th Row.—Plain.

6th Row.—Purl.

Repeat these 6 rows 4 times more, cast on 6 stitches

at underarm, and leave stitches on a needle. Now, with wrong side of work towards you, pick up and purl 18 stitches up other side of strap just worked on, purl across back and down opposite shoulder strap. Knit in pattern as for front, but omitting the 5 plain stitches at end. Work the final row onto same needle as the worked front, cast on 6 stitches for 2nd underarm.

Now work left front to correspond with right, but no extra stitches will be cast on at end. Knit final row onto same needle as other front and back.

You are now at edge of left front. Knit 1 row plain right across.

Next Row.—Knit 1, * wool twice over needle, knit 2 tog. Repeat from * to end.

Next Row.—Knit plain, into the twice over needle first knit, then purl. You should have 239 stitches on the needle.

Pattern: 1st Row.—Knit 7, * knit 2 tog., knit 5, wool over needle, knit 1, wool over needle, knit 2, wool over needle, knit 1, wool over needle, knit 2, knit 2 tog., purl 1, knit 1, purl 1, knit 1, purl 1. Repeat from * to end, last 7 stitches plain.

2nd Row.—And all even rows. Knit 7, *purl 2 tog. (through back of loops), purl 13, p 2 tog., p 1, k 1, p 1, k 1, p 1. Repeat from * to end, last 7 stitches plain.

3rd Row.—Knit 7, *knit 2 tog., knit 4, wool over, knit 1, wool over, knit 4, wool over, k 1, wool over, k 1, k 2 tog., p 1, k 1, p 1, k 1, p 1. Repeat from * last 7 plain.

5th Row.—Knit 7, *knit 2 tog., knit 3, wool over, knit 1, wool over, k 6, wool over, knit 1, wool over, k 2 tog., p 1, k 1, p 1, k 1, p 1. Repeat from *, last 7 plain.

7th Row.—Knit 7, * k 2 tog., k 2, wool over, k 1, wool over, k 2, wool over, k 1, wool over, k 5, p 1, k 1, p 1, k 1, p 1. Repeat from *, last 7 plain.

9th Row.—Knit 7, *k 2 tog., k 1, wool over, k 1, wool over, k 4, wool over k 1, wool over, k 4, k 2 tog., p 1, k 1, p 1, k 1, p 1. Repeat from *, last 7 plain.

11th Row.—Knit 7, * k 2 tog., wool over k 1, wool over, k 6, wool over, k 1, wool over, k 3, k 2 tog., 1 p, 1 k, 1 p, 1 k, 1 p. Repeat from *, last 7 plain.

12th Row.—Like 2nd. Repeat these 12 rows until

coat is desired length, then knit 10 plain rows (5 ribs) and cast off loosely.

Sleeve.—Cast on 49 stitches and knit 1 row plain, 1 row purl. Work as for yoke.

Pattern: 1st Row.—*Knit 2, wool over, slip 1, knit 1, pass slipped stitch over. Repeat from * to end, knit last stitch.

2nd Row.—Purl.

3rd Row.—Plain.

4th Row.—Purl.

5th Row.—Plain.

6th Row.—Purl.

Repeat 6 rows five times, then 1st and 2nd rows of pattern. In 3rd row knit 2 tog., anywhere, to bring stitches to 48. Purl 4th row as usual.

Next Row.—Knit 1, * wool over, knit 2 tog. Repeat from * to end, where knit last stitch singly.

Now knit in ribbing of 2 plain, 2 purl for 7 rows, and cast off loosely. Sew up sleeves and insert. Sew on buttons. Thread ribbon at neck, cuffs, and underarm.

No. 2.

LONG COAT.

Tufted.

Materials.—7 balls Ivorine wool, crochet hook, No. 10 (Strathnoid).

Commence with 68 chain, turn, and make 1 treble in 6th stitch from needle, then 1 chain, 1 treble in each alternate chain to end (32 holes).

Turn with 2 chain, and make 1 d c in each hole and each treble to end.

Turn with 2 chain, and make 1 d c in each double crochet of former row (taking through back thread only), except the 16th, 21st, 45th, and 50th, where make 3 d c, taken through both threads. These increases will form armhole.

Repeat last row, making the increase in centre of each d c group always, until you have 20 rows.

Next Row.—Turn with 2 chain, and work as usual to centre of increase, 3 chain, join over to centre of 2nd increase, work across back to 3rd increase, 3 chain, join over to centre of 4th, and work on to end. Turn with 4

chain, and work 1 treble 1 chain, in alternate stitches to end.

Next Row.—Turn with 2 chain, *1 d c in 1st hole, 1 d c on treble, 1 d c in 2nd hole, 1 d c on treble, 2 d c in 3rd hole, 1 d c on treble. Repeat from * to end.

Pattern.—Turn with 3 chain, 1 treble in next stitch, *4 treble all in next stitch, draw needle out, and put through top of 1st treble and loop whence you drew needle, and draw wool through both together (this forms a raised tuft), 1 treble in each of next 2 d c. Repeat from * to end.

2nd Row.—Turn with 3 chain, and make 1 treble in each treble, and in each tuft to end.

Repeat these two rows 15 times more, or length desired, work row of tufts, and break off thread.

Sleeves.—Begin at centre of underarm, and work the 2 rows the same as coat, having 15 tufts. Have 8 tufted rows. Now work 1 d c into each treble, omitting the tufts. Three more rows of double crochet taken through both threads.

Next Row.—*1 d c in 1 d c, miss 1, 2 tr, 2 long tr, 2 tr, all in next, miss 1. Repeat from * to end. Sew up sleeves.

Collar.—With right side of work towards you, make 1 d c in each tr, and 2 d c in each hole to end.

Turn with 3 chain, and work row of tufts as usual.

Turn with 3 chain, and work as usual, except where the increases were made on yoke. Here make 3 tr extra by putting 1 tr **between**, as well as **on**, three treble stitches.

The following row there will be an extra tuft over each of the 4 increases. Work 6 rows of tufts, or more if deeper cape is liked, fasten off.

Begin at top of right side, and work a row of double crochet around to top of left side, turn with 2 chain, and work 2 tr, 1 long tr, 1 tr, all in 1 d c, miss 1 (sometimes 2, if too full), 1 d c in next, all the way to foot of coat, across which have an extra long tr, in centre of group; then right side as for left. Now work a row of double crochet around collar (with wrong side towards you), then edge as for foot of coat. Edge with silk, 1 d c, 1 ch in each stitch, except long tr, where

have 2 d c, and omit chain on d c of former row. Edge sleeve the same. Thread ribbon at neck and under arm.

No. 3.

CARRYING COAT.

Crochet.

Materials.—4 oz. 2-ply fingering wool, crochet hook, No. 10 (Strathnoid).

Commence with 72 chain, turn, and make 1 tr in 6th stitch from needle, then 1 ch, 1 tr, in each alternate chain stitch, 34 holes. Turn with 2 chain, and make 1 d c in each tr and each hole to end.

Next Row.—Turn with 2 ch, and make 1 d c in each d c of previous row, taking up back thread only, except in 16th, 22nd, 48th, and 54th stitches, in which make 3 d c, taken through both top threads; these increases from armholes. Repeat this row 23 times, making 3 d c in centre of each 3 d c of previous row. You will have 12 raised ribs.

Next Row.—Work as usual to centre of 1st increase, where make 1 d c instead of 3, 4 chain, pass over to centre of next increase, and work across back, 4 chain, pass over to last increase, and work to end.

Next Row.—5 chain to turn, then 1 tr, 1 ch, in each alternate stitch to end.

Next Row.—Turn with 2 ch, and make 1 d c in each tr and each hole to end.

Pattern: 1st Row.—Turn with 3 ch, 3 treble in same stitch, miss 1, slip in next stitch, *1 ch, 3 tr in same stitch, miss 1, slip into next. Repeat from * to end, the last time make 1 d c instead of slip stitch.

2nd Row.—Turn with 2 ch, 3 tr in same place, slip stitch into hole made by 1 chain in previous row, *1 ch, 3 tr in same place, slip stitch into next hole. Repeat from *, ending with 1 d c instead of slip stitch.

Repeat 2nd row until coat is the length desired.

Sleeves.—Slip stitch into end of double crochet on yoke, 2 chain, 3 tr in same stitch, *miss 3 d c, slip into next, 1 chain, 3 tr in same stitch. Repeat from *. You will have 13 shells. Leave the holes under arm unworked. Work the pattern backward and forward for 17 rows more.

Next Row.—Make 1 d c in 1st and 2nd tr of each shell. Now work 5 rows of double crochet, taking through both top threads.

Edge.—1 d c in 1st d c, then 3 tr in next d c, alternately to end. Sew up sleeves. Begin at end of row of holes under yoke, and work double crochet up front to neck, then in every hole, and tr along neck and down other front to end of row of holes.

Collar.—Begin at neck, and slip into 1st stitch, 2 ch, 2 tr in same place, miss 1 stitch, slip into next, *1 ch, 2 tr, in same place, miss 1, slip into next. Repeat from *, ending with double crochet instead of slip stitch.

2nd Row.—Turn with 2 ch, 3 tr in same place, miss 1, slip into next, *1 ch, 3 tr in same place, miss 1, slip into next. Repeat from * as usual. Work 7 more rows like 2nd, then 4 rows with 4 tr instead of 3 each time, then 1 row with 5 tr each time. Break off. Begin at neck, and work 1 row with 5 tr around entire collar. Now begin at neck, under collar, and work a row with 5 treble all around coat to opposite end of neck.

Edge entire coat, collar, and cuffs with silk, 1 d c, 1 ch, alternately, all the way, using Carlson, Currier's crochet silk, shade 90, and hook No. 13.

No. 4. **CARRYING COAT.**

Materials.—4 balls Ivorine wool, crochet hook. No. 10 (Strathnoid).

Commence with 72 chain, turn, and make 1 treble in 6th stitch from needle, then *1 ch, miss 1, 1 tr in next. Repeat from * to end of row. You will have 34 holes.

Next Row.—1 d c in each tr and each hole to end.

Next Row.—1 d c in each d c of former row, taking up back thread all along, except in 16th, 22nd, 47th, and 53rd stitches, in all of which make 3 d c, taken through both threads. This forms increase for armholes. Work in this way 19 times more, increasing each time in centre stitch of each former increase. Turn as usual with 2 ch, and work to centre of 1st increase, 4 chain, then work on from 2nd to 3rd increase, 4 chain, and work on from 4th increase to end of row.

Turn with 4 chain, and make 1 tr, 1 ch, into each alternate stitch to end, taking through both top threads.

Turn with 2 ch, *1 d c in 1st hole, 1 d c in treble, 2 d c in 2nd hole, 1 d c in treble. Repeat from * to end of row.

Pattern: 1st Row.—Turn with 3 ch, pick up stitch in 2nd and 3rd chain, and 1 in each of next 2 d c on work, then draw through all 5 loops on needle at once, 1 chain. For 2nd star *take 1 stitch in eye (hole made by 1 chain), 1 stitch through back thread of previous star, then pick up 2 more on d c below, and draw through all 5 loops together, 1 ch. Repeat from * to end of row, omitting last 1 ch, and making 1 tr in last stitch.

Next Row.—Turn with 2 chain, and make 1 d c in each stitch (taken through both threads) to end.

Repeat last two rows until coat is desired length.

Sleeve.—Begin at underarm, and work a row of stars all around. You should have 24. Turn, and work the double-crochet row, then work on with the two rows until you have 9 rows of stars.

In the following double-crochet row omit making a stitch in the eye every second time to draw sleeve in a little. Work 2 more rows of double crochet.

Next Row.—1 treble, 1 chain, alternately all the way.

Next Row.—1 d c in each treble and each chain to end.

Next Row.—*1 d c in 1 d c, miss 1, 4 treble in next. Repeat from * to end. Now work one row of double crochet around entire coat.

Next Row.—*1 d c in 1 d c, miss 1, 5 treble in next. Repeat from * to end.

Edge entire coat with silk, 1 d c, 1 chain in each treble, and with chain omitted in each double crochet all around coat and sleeves. Thread ribbon at neck, sleeves, and under arm.

No. 5. **KNITTED COAT.**
(Walking.)

Materials.—4 balls Ivorine wool, wooden needles, No. 8.

Cast on 88 stitches, and knit in ribbing of 2 plain, 2 purl, for 5 rows.

Next Row.—Slip 1, *wool twice over needle, knit 2 together. Repeat from * to end, knit last stitch singly.

Next Row.—Knit 1, purl 1, taking the twice-over-needle as one stitch, then two more rows of ribbing.

Next Row.—Knit 28, *turn, purl 1, knit 1, alternately 4 times, turn, knit 1, purl 1, 4 times. Repeat from * until there are 34 rows in little strap. Cast off the 8 stitches.

Begin again at neck, knit 40, turn, and knit strap on last 8 stitches as before.

Begin again at neck, and knit remaining 20.

Next Row.—Knit 5, purl 15, pick up and purl 19 down side of strap.

Pattern: 1st Row.—Knit 2, * wool over, knit 2, slip 1, knit 2 tog., pass slipped stitch over knitted one, knit 2, wool over, knit 1. Repeat from * 3 times, knit 5.

2nd Row.—Knit 5, purl 34.

3rd Row.—Plain.

4th Row.—Knit 5, purl 34.

Repeat these 4 rows 6 times more; cast 6 stitches on at end of last row for underarm, and leave this part on separate needle.

Begin again at other side of strap, pick up, and purl 17, purl across 32 stitches of neck, pick up and purl 18 on other strap (67 on needle).

Next Row.—Knit 2, *wool over, knit 2, slip 1, knit 2 together, pass slipped stitch over, knit 2, wool over, knit 1. Repeat from * 7 times more, knit 1.

2nd Row.—Purl. 3rd Row.—Plain. 4th Row.—Purl.

Repeat these 4 rows 6 times more.

Cast on 6 stitches at end, and leave on separate needle.

Now pick up and purl 19 up side of strap, purl 15, knit 5. Knit the same as opposite front. Do not break thread.

You are now at front. Knit to end, then right along, cast on stitches, back and opposite front.

Next Row.—Slip 1, *wool twice over needle, knit 2 together. Repeat from *.

Next Row.—*Knit 1, then first knit, then purl into the twice-over-needle. Repeat from * to end of row.

Next Row.—Purl. You should have 235 stitches on needle.

Pattern: 1st Row.—Knit 8, *wool over, knit 2, knit 2 tog. through back of loops, purl 1, knit 2 tog., knit 2, wool over, knit 1. Repeat from * to end, the last time put wool over, knit 8, instead of 1.

2nd Row.—Knit 8, purl 219, knit 8.

Repeat these 2 rows 5 times more, then change.

1st Row.—Knit 8, *knit 2 tog., knit 2, wool over, knit 1, wool over, knit 2, knit 2 tog. through back, purl 1. Repeat from *, omit purl the last time, knit 8.

2nd Row.—Knit 8, purl 219, knit 8.

Repeat these 2 rows 5 times more, then change again.

Work the 2 sets of patterns 6 times more. You will have 6 open leaves. Knit 12 rows plain (6 ribs), and cast off.

Sleeves.—Pick up and knit 56 stitches around armhole, 16 on each of 2 needles, and 24 on the 3rd. Knit 1 plain round, and then work as for yoke.

Wool over, *knit 2, slip 1, knit 2 tog., pass slipped stitch over, knit 2, wool over, knit 1. Repeat from * to end of round.

Next 3 Rounds.—Plain.

Repeat these 4 rows 10 times more.

Next Row.—*Wool over, knit 2 tog. Repeat from * all around, then knit 8 rows of ribbing, 2 plain, 2 purl, and cast off. Run ribbon at neck, underarm, and cuffs.

No. 6.

JACKET.

Materials.—4 oz. 4-ply fingering wool. No. 7 and No. 10 bone needles.

Cast onto No. 10 needles 88 stitches, and knit in ribbing of 2 plain, 2 purl for 4 rows.

Next Row.—Knit 1, * wool over needle, knit 2 together. Repeat from * to end last stitch plain. Now 3 more rows of ribbing.

Next Row.—Knit 28, turn, and knit 1 and purl 1 four times.

Next Row.—Purl 1 and knit 1, four times. Repeat these 2 little rows 14 times. Cast off. This is right side of neck and shoulder strap. Begin again at neck and

knit 40. Turn and knit backward and forward as for other shoulder strap. Cast off. Begin again at neck and knit final 20 stitches. Turn.

Next Row.—With No. 7 needles. Knit 4, then purl 2, knit 2 alternately to end of row, pick up, and purl 2, knit 2 seven times (14 stitches) down side of little strap.

Next Row.—Purl 2, knit 2, alternately, to last 4 stitches, which knit plain. Repeat these 4 rows until you have 30 ribs at front. Cast on 4 at end of needle for underarm and leave this part.

Now pick up 14 at other side of same strap, then along neck, then 14 stitches down side of 2nd strap, and knit in the pattern for the same depth as front. Cast on 4 for underarm. Now knit right front to correspond with left, except after every 5th rib in ending row at front, work on last 4 stitches this way, wool over, slip 1, knit 1, pass slipped stitch over knitted one, knit 2. This forms button holes.

Begin at right front with right side of work towards you. Knit plain right across, taking all the stitches on to one needle.

Next Row.—Knit 3, * wool twice over needle, knit 2 tog., knit 1. Repeat from * to underarm, where knit the 4 stitches plain, then repeat to end, when wool over needle once, last 3 stitches plain.

Next Row.—Knit plain except at wool twice over needle when first knit, then purl.

Pattern: 1st Row.—Knit 6, purl to within last 6 which knit plain.

2nd Row.—Knit 6, then knit 1, * knit 2 tog. Repeat from * to last 7, which knit plain.

3rd Row.—Knit 8, then *knit the loop which lies before next stitch, then the stitch. Repeat from * to end, last 6 plain.

4th Row.—Plain. Repeat these 4 rows until coat is desired length, then knit 5 ribs (9 rows) and cast off.

Sleeve.—Cast on 24 stitches, and knit 1 row plain and 1 row purl.

Pattern: 1st Row.—Knit 1st into front, then into back of 1st stitch, * knit 2 tog. Repeat from * to end. Knit last stitch.

2nd Row.—Knit 2, then 1st the loop, then the stitch to end.

3rd Row.—Knit 1st into front, then into back of 1st stitch, then plain to end.

4th Row.—Purl. Repeat these 4 rows until you have 36 stitches on needle (you have 6 rows of dots). Knit on without the increase at top until you have reached the 15th row of dots, then decrease by knitting 2 tog. at beginning of each top row until reduced to 24. Cast off. With the fine needles pick up and knit 44 stitches at cuff, and knit in ribbing of 2 plain, 2 purl, for 6 rows, and cast off.

Sew up sleeves and attach to coat. Sew buttons on yoke. Ribbon at neck and underarm.

No. 7.

CROCHET JACKET.

Materials.—2 oz. 2-ply fingering wool, crochet hook No. 10 (Strathnoid).

Commence with 66 chain, turn, 2 treble in 4th stitch from needle. *Miss one, 1 double crochet in next, miss one, 3 tr in next. Repeat from * to end, finishing with a double crochet stitch.

2nd Row.—Turn with 3 chain and work 3 tr in each double crochet, and 1 d c in centre of each treble group.

Repeat 2nd row until work is $7\frac{1}{2}$ inches long. Break off. Make 20 chain, then 1 tr into double crochet where you broke off, *1 chain, 1 tr in centre of next treble group, 1 ch, 1 tr in next double crochet. Repeat from * to end, then add 23 chain. Turn and make 2 tr in 4th chain from needle, then work pattern as usual (making 1 d c on one treble and 3 tr on next tr across back). Work on full length 12 times more.

Next Row.—Work over 11 patterns, turn and work back to cuff, then forward to neck. Break off wool. Make 15 chain, then, commencing in stitch where you broke off, work pattern as usual to end. Work back and along chain, then 12 more rows. Leaving 5 patterns unworked at cuff, make 1 tr in each d c and centre of each treble group, as on back. Now work pattern backward and forward until front, from line of holes, is the same as back. Sew up sleeves and sides, leaving

2½ inches open at foot. Now work all along at foot alternately 5 tr in d e stitch and 1 d e, in centre of each group. On sides and neck work alternately 4 treble and 1 double crochet.

Edge with silk, 1 d e in each stitch, 1 d e, 1 eh, 1 d e, in centre at foot, and 1 ch between 3rd and 4th trebles along neck and fronts. Turn back points of neck and sew to yoke.

Thread ribbon at underarm and wrists.

No. 8. **KNITTED JACKET.**

Materials.—4 oz. 4-ply super. fingering wool. No. 8 bone needles.

This jacket is knitted sideways.

Begin at left foot. Cast on 44 stitches, and knit 8 rows plain (garter stitch).

9th Row.—Purl.

10th Row.—Knit 2, *, wool over, knit 2 tog., knit 1. Repeat from * to end of row.

11th Row.—Purl.

Next 7 Rows.—Plain.

Repeat from 9th to 18th rows 3 times more, then from 9th to end of 14th row. Here cast on 12 for shoulders. Knit 4 rows plain, the fancy stripe, as usual (9th to 11th rows), then 3 rows plain. From top of shoulder cast off 18 and knit to end.

Next Row.—Knit, taking last 2 stitches tog.

Next Row.—Plain.

Next Row.—Plain, last 2 stitches tog. Now knit fancy stripe again. Increase at undearm (knit 1st into front, then into back of stich) in next 2 rows.

At end of 3rd plain row after fancy stripe, cast on 18 stitches. Knit 4 rows plain, then fancy stripe, then 3 rows plain. Cast off 12 at shoulder, and finish plain row, then knit 3 plain rows. Now work 9 fancy stripes with plain stripes between, as usual. When you come to 3rd plain row after 9th fancy stripe, cast on 12 for 2nd shoulder, and work on as for 1st shoulder and front. In final plain stripe work 4 plain rows, then row for button holes thus: Knit 3, * wool over, slip 1, knit 2 tog.,

pass slipped stich over knitted one, knit 5. Repeat from * to end of row.

Next Row.—Knit plain except at wool over needle, where first knit, then purl. Now knit 2 plain rows and cast off. Sew shoulder straps together.

Yoke.—With right side of work towards you, pick up and knit every stich from right to left fronts, taking 3 stitches tog. at all 4 corners.

Next Row.—Plain.

Next Row.—Plain, 3 tog., at all corners. Repeat last 2 rows until reduced to 1 stich between decreases at corners.

Next Row.—Plain.

Next Row.—Knit 2, * wool over needle, knit 2 tog., knit 1. Repeat from * to end. Now 8 rows of ribbing, 2 plain and 2 purl. Cast off.

Sleeve.—Cast on 28 and knit 4 plain rows, then fancy stripe, then 7 plain rows as for body of coat until you have completed the 7th fancy stripe, then 4 plain rows and cast off.

Increase at top every 2nd row until you have 38 stitches, then after completing the 4th plain row after 5th fancy stripe, decrease every 2nd row at top, when you will have 28 as at beginning. Pick up and knit all the stitches at cuff (38).

Next Row.—Knit 1, * wool over, knit 2 tog. Repeat. Now knit in ribbing of 2 plain, 2 purl for 8 rows, and cast off. Sew up sleeves and insert.

Now pick up and knit all the stitches at waist. Work row of holes as at cuff, then 12 rows of ribbing, 2 plain, 2 purl, and cast off. Sew buttons down front and thread ribbon at neck, cuffs, and waist.

No. 9.

KNITTED COAT.

Materials.—3 oz. 3-ply fingering wool. No. 8 bone needles.

Cast on 88 stitches for yoke and knit in ribbing of 2 plain, 2 purl for 5 rows.

Next Row.—Knit 1, * wool twice over needle, knit 2 tog. Repeat from * to end, last stich singly.

Next Row.—Knit plain, taking the wool twice over needle as one stitch.

Now 3 more rows of ribbing, 2 plain, 2 purl.

Next Row.—Knit 28, turn, knit 1, purl alternately 4 times, turn, purl 1, knit 1 alternately 4 times.

Repeat these two little rows until you have 32 rows in small strap. Cast off 8 stitches.

Begin again at neck and knit 40. Turn, and knit another little strap on final 8 stitches, as before.

Begin once more at neck and knit remaining 20 stitches.

Next Row.—Turn, knit 4, purl 16, then pick up and purl 19 down side of strap.

2nd Row.—Knit 1, * wool over, slip 1, knit 1, pass slipped stitch over knitted one. Knit 3. Repeat from * to last 8 stitches, where wool over needle, slip 1, knit 1, pass slipped stitch over, knit 6.

3rd Row.—Knit 4, purl 35.

4th Row.—Knit 2, *wool over, slip 1, knit 1, pass slipped stitch over, knit 2 tog., wool over, knit 1. Repeat from * to last 7; here wool over, knit 1, slip 1, pass slipped stitch over, knit 5.

5th Row.—Knit 4, purl 35. 6th Row.—Knit 39. 7th Row.—Knit 4, purl 35.

Repeat 2nd to 7th rows inclusive 4 times more, then 2nd to 5th rows. Cast on 3 stitches for underarm. Leave this part on separate needle.

Begin on other side of same strap. Pick up and purl 18 on side of strap, then purl 32 along neck, then pick up and purl 18 down side of 2nd strap.

1st Row.—Knit 3, *wool over, slip 1, knit 1, pass slipped stitch over, knit 3. Repeat from * to end of row.

2nd Row.—Purl 68.

3rd Row.—Knit 1, knit 2 tog., wool over knit 1, *wool over slip 1, knit 1, pass slipped stitch over knit 2 tog., wool over knit 1. Repeat from * to last 4 stitches, here wool over, slip 1, knit 1, pass slipped stitch over, knit 2.

4th Row.—Purl. 5th Row.—Plain. 6th Row.—Purl.

Repeat from 1st to 6th rows 4 times more, then 1st to 4th. Cast on 3 at end. Knit the final row onto same needle on which you left first front.

For 2nd front, pick up and purl 19 on side of strap, purl 16 along neck and knit final 4.

1st Row.—Knit 5, *wool over, slip 1, knit 1, pass slipped stitch over, knit 3. Repeat from *.

2nd Row.—Purl 35, knit 4.

3rd Row.—Knit 6, *wool over, slip 1, knit 1, pass slipped stitch over, knit 2 tog., wool over, knit 1. Repeat from * to last 4 stitches, here wool over, slip 1, knit 1, pass slipped stitch over, knit 1.

4th Row.—Purl 35, knit 4. 5th Row.—Plain. 6th Row.—Purl 35, knit 4.

Work on until left front corresponds with right; do not add any stitches at end.

Next Row.—Knit right across to end of opposite front.

Next Row.—Knit 4, purl 144, knit 4.

Next Row.—Knit 2, *wool twice over needle, knit 2 tog., knit 1. Repeat to end of row.

Next Row.—Purl. Into every twice over needle first purl then knit.

Next Row.—Knit 202. Next Row.—Knit 7, purl 188. Knit 7.

Skirt of Coat.—1st Row.—Knit 8, *wool over slip 1, knit 1, pass slipped stitch over knit 3. Repeat from * until 9 stitches from end; here wool over, slip 1, knit 1, pass slipped stitch over, knit 7.

2nd Row.—Knit 7, purl 188, knit 7.

3rd Row.—Knit 9, *wool over, slip 1, knit 1, pass slipped stitch over, knit 2 tog., wool over, knit 1. Repeat from * to last 8, which knit plain.

4th Row.—Knit 7, purl 188, knit 7. 5th Row.—Plain. 6th Row.—Knit 7, purl 188, knit 7.

Repeat these 6 rows until coat is about length desired, then instead of 6th row, knit plain, then 8 more plain rows, and cast off.

Sleeve.—Cast on 52 stitches and knit 1 plain row, then 1 purl row.

Pattern: 1st Row.—Knit 3, *wool over, slip 1, knit 1, pass slipped stitch over, knit 3. Repeat from * to end, the last time knit 2 instead of 3.

2nd Row.—Purl.

3rd Row.—Knit 1, knit 2 tog., wool over, knit 1, *wool over, slip 1, knit 1, pass slipped stitch over, knit 2 tog., wool over, knit 1. Repeat from * until only 3 stitches

remain; here wool over, slip 1, knit 1, pass slipped stitch over, knit 1.

4th Row.—Purl. 5th Row.—Plain. 6th Row.—Purl.

Repeat these 6 rows 7 times more, then from 1st to 4th rows, then knit in ribbing of 2 plain, 2 purl for 11 rows, and cast off. Sew up sleeves and insert thread ribbon at neck and underarm.

No. 10. **KNITTED JACKET.**

Materials.—4½ oz. 4-ply super. fingering wool. No. 9 bone needles.

Commencing at side of left front, cast on 58 stitches and knit 8 rows plain (garter stitch).

9th Row.—Purl.

10th Row.—Plain.

11th Row.—Purl 2, * purl 3 tog., into next stitch, knit 1, purl 1, knit 1. Repeat from * until 12 stitches remain, purl 2, knit 10.

12th Row.—Knit 12, purl to within last two, which knit plain.

13th Row.—Purl 2, * in next stitch knit 1, purl 1, knit 1; purl 3 tog. Repeat from * to last 12, purl 2, knit 10.

14th Row.—Plain.

15th Row.—Purl to last 10, which knit plain.

Next 7 Rows.—Plain.

Repeat from 9th to 22nd rows twice more, then from 9th to 18th. At end of 18th cast on 12 stitches for shoulder strap. Knit 4 plain, then from 11th to 18th row. Cast off 18 and knit to end. Knit to end of row, where knit final 2 tog.

Next Row.—Plain.

Knit to end, taking final 2 tog. Now knit from 11th to 17th row, increasing at underarm in 13th and 15th rows.

Knit next row and cast on 18 for 2nd shoulder strap. Work from 19th row to 22nd, then from 11th to 18th. Now cast off 12 to end shoulder strap, and continue working the two stripes of pattern until you have 7 fancy stripes, with plain stripe between, completed. After working last of the fancy stripes, knit the 3 first plain rows, then cast on 12 for right shoulder, and work

the same as for left shoulder. In knitting the final plain stripe work the button holes in this manner.

After knitting 4th plain row, knit 12, * wool over needle, knit 2 tog., knit 6. Repeat from * the last time, knit 4. Knit 3 plain rows and cast off.

Sew shoulder straps together.

Pick up and knit all the stitches on top of jacket, taking 3 tog., at 4 corners. Knit back plain.

Next Row.—Plain, taking 3 tog. at corners. Repeat last two rows until reduced to 1 stitch between decreases on each shoulder. Knit next row plain as usual. Have a button hole in 5th and 18th rows the same as in front.

Next Row.—Knit 2, * wool over, knit 2 tog. Repeat from * to end. Now work 5 rows of ribbing, 2 plain, 2 purl, and cast off.

Sleeve.—Cast on 30 stitches and knit 4 rows plain. Increase at top of sleeve by knitting 1st into back and then into front of the stitch before the final one, until you have 40 stitches on needle.

5th Row.—Purl.

6th Row.—Plain.

7th Row.—Purl 2, * knit 1, purl 1, knit 1, all into next stitch, purl 3 tog. Repeat from * to end, purl last 2 singly.

8th Row.—Knit 2, purl 31, k 1st into front then into back for usual increase. Knit 1.

9th Row.—Purl 3, * purl 3 tog., k 1, p 1, k 1, all in next stitch. Repeat from *, purl last 2 singly.

10th Row.—Plain.

11th Row.—Purl.

Next 7 Rows.—Plain.

Now work from 5th to 18th rows. (At 5th row this time you will have reached 40 stitches on needle), 3 times more, then from 5th to 15th rows, and cast off. You will decrease by knitting 2 tog. at top of sleeve from 10th row of 4th fancy stripe, when stitches will be reduced to 30.

On right side of work pick up and knit (38) all along cuff.

Next Row.—Knit 1, * wool over, knit 2 tog. Repeat

from * to end, last stitch singly. Now 6 rows of ribbing, 2 plain, 2 purl, and cast off.

Sew buttons down front and thread ribbon at neck and wrists.

No. 11. CROCHET JACKET.

Materials.—3 balls Ivorine wool, crochet hook, No. 10 (Strathnoid).

Commence with 68 chain, turn, and make 1 tr in 6th chain from needle, then 1 chain, 1 treble in each alternate stitch to end. Turn with 2 chain, and make 1 d e in each tr and each hole to end.

Next Row.—Turn with 2 chain (which counts as 1 d e), and make 1 d e in each d e of former row (taken through back loop only), except in 16th, 20th, 46th, and 50th, where make 3 d e through both back and front threads. Repeat this row 18 times more, putting 3 d e in centre of each group of three, in former row.

Next Row.—Turn with 2 chain, and make 1 d e in each stitch to centre of 1st increase, 4 chain, join to centre of 2nd increase, then on to 3rd increase, 4 chain, join to centre of 4th, and work to end.

Next Row.—Turn with 4 chain, and make 1 tr, 1 ch into every alternate stitch of last row, taking through both back and front threads.

Pattern: 1st Row.—Turn with 3 ch, and make 2 tr in same place, *miss 1, 1 d e in next, miss 1, 3 tr in next. Repeat from * to end of row, end with a d e stitch.

2nd Row.—Turn with 3 ch, 2 tr in stitch, then 1 d e in centre of each treble group, and 3 tr in each d e of former row.

Repeat 2nd row until jacket is length required. Break off wool. Begin again at foot at about underarm, and make 1 d e in centre of each tr group, and 2 tr, 2 long tr, 2 tr on each d e, all along foot; at sides and neck have 2 tr, 1 long tr, 2 tr in each d e. Edge with silk, 1 d e, 1 ch in each tr, omitting ch each side of d e.

Sleeves.—Begin at underarm, and work backward and forward as for jacket. Have 11 groups with the d e between. Work 16 rows, then a row of d e, 1 in each tr, but omitting the d e, then 1 row of double crochet,

then 1 d c in 1 d c, miss 1, 2 tr, 1 long tr, 2 tr in next, miss 1. Edge with silk as for jacket. Thread ribbon at neck and under arm.

No. 12. **KIMONO JACKET.**

Materials.—2 oz. 2-ply fingering wool. Crochet hook No. 12 (Strathnoid).

Commence with 74 chain, turn and make 2 treble in 4th stitch from needle, *miss one chain and make 1 double crochet in next, miss one and make 3 treble in next. Repeat from *, finishing with a double crochet stitch. Turn.

2nd Row.—3 chain and 2 treble in double crochet last made, 1 double crochet in centre of next 3 treble, *3 tr. in next d c, 1 double crochet in centre of next 3 treble. Repeat from * to end of row.

Repeat 2nd row until work is 8 inches in length. Break off wool.

Make 23 chain, then making 3 tr in double crochet stitch where you broke off. Work row as usual, then add 27 chain. Turn and make 2 treble in 4th stitch from needle, then pattern as usual along chain, across back and along other chain. Work right across backward and forward for 15 rows.

Next Row.—Work 6 each groups of 3 tr and 1 d c alternately. Turn and work backward and forward for 6 more rows, then add 19 chain for half a front. Turn and make 2 treble in 4th stitch from needle, miss one, 1 d c in next and continue in pattern along chain and to end of sleeve for 15 rows. Leave 6 each groups of 3 tr and 1 d c unworked, then continue working on the front until work is the same length as back from the beginning of sleeve. Break off.

Work opposite front to correspond. Sew up sleeves.

Join wool at right hand corner of neck, and make 1 treble, 1 chain alternately to form row of holes for ribbon; then work a row of shells (5 treble instead of 3 in each group) around entire jacket and sleeves. Edge with silk, 1 double crochet, 1 chain into each stitch. Sew ribbons midway at sides, and tie.

Materials.—3 oz. 4-ply super. fingering wool. No. 7 bone needles.

Cast on 60 stitches, and knit in ribbing of 2 plain, 2 purl for 12 rows.

Next Row.—Knit 1, * wool over needle, slip 1, knit 1 pass slipped stitch over, knit 1. Repeat from * to end.

Next Row.—Plain, except at wool over needle, when first knit, then purl.

Pattern: 1st Row.—Plain.

2nd Row.—Knit 3, purl 3, alternately to end.

3rd Row.—Plain.

4th Row.—Purl 3, knit 3, alternately to end.

Repeat these 4 rows 6 times more, then increase by knitting 1st into front, then into back of 2nd stitch from each end of needle in the next 4 plain rows. You have now 68 on needle. Cast 20 stitches on to loose needle, knit across back (no increase, and taking care to have pattern correct all the way), then cast on 20 at end. Continue in the pattern until sleeves measure 4 inches at cuff.

Next Row.—On a plain row knit over 45 stitches, cast off 30, then knit over final 45. Now knit backward and forward on last 45 stitches for 8 rows. Cast on 13 stitches at neck end, and continue in the pattern as usual, except have 4 stitches (which are extra to overlap at front), at front in plain garter stitch all the way. Work button holes down one front this way. In plain row going towards opening on right front, 3 stitches from end wool over needle, slip 1, knit 1, pass slipped stitch over, knit 1. Returning knit the 4 stitches plain as usual. Do this every 6th plain row.

When sleeve is the same width front and back of neck opening cast off 20 stitches, then continue until front is the same length as back from underarm. You will decrease at underarm by knitting 2nd and 3rd stitches together every plain row four times, when you will have 34 stitches on needle. Work row of holes as for back, then the 12 rows of ribbing. Work 2nd front to correspond.

Pick up and knit 40 stitches at end of cuff.

Next Row.—Knit 1, * wool over, knit 2 tog. Repeat to end, where knit 1. Now 6 rows of ribbing, 2 plain and 2 purl. Cast off. Pick up 66 stitches around neck and work as for cuffs.

Sew up sides and sleeves. Sew buttons down front, and thread ribbon at neck, waist, and sleeves.

No. 14.

KNITTED COAT.

(Walking.)

Materials.—6 oz. 4-ply fingering wool. No. 7 and No. 10 bone needles.

Cast on 88 stitches, and knit in ribbing of 2 plain, 2 purl for 4 rows.

Next Row.—Knit 1, * wool over needle, knit 2 tog. Repeat from * to end, last stitch singly. Now 3 more rows of ribbing.

Next Row.—Knit 28, turn and knit 1, purl 1, alternately 4 times.

Next Row.—Purl 1, knit 1, four times. Repeat these 2 little rows 15 times. Cast off. This is right side of neck and shoulder strap. Begin again at neck and knit 40. Turn and knit backward and forward as for other shoulder strap. Cast off. Begin again at neck and knit final 20 stitches. Turn.

Next Row.—With No. 7 needles, knit 4, then purl 2, knit 2, alternately to end of row, pick up 16 stitches down side of little strap, purling 2 and knitting 2 alternately.

Next Row.—Purl 2, knit 2, alternately to last 4 stitches, which knit plain.

Next Row.—Knit 4, then knit 2, purl 2, alternately to end.

Next Row.—Knit 2, purl 2 to last 4 stitches, which knit plain. Repeat these 4 rows until you have 30 ribs at front. Cast on 4 at end of needle for underarm and leave this part. Now pick up 16 at other side of same strap, then along neck, then 16 stitches down side of 2nd strap, and knit in the pattern for the same depth as front. Cast on 4 for underarm. Now knit right front to correspond with left, except after every 5th rib in ending row at front work on last 4 stitches this way; wool over,

slip 1, knit 1, pass slipped stitch over knitted one, knit 2. This forms button holes. With right side of work towards you begin at right front. Knit plain, taking all the stitches onto one needle.

Next Row.—Knit 3, * wool twice over needle, knit 2 tog., knit 1. Repeat from * to underarm, where knit the 4 stitches plain, then work on as before to other underarm, where knit the 4 stitches plain. Then repeat to end, where have wool once over needle, last 3 plain.

Next Row.—Knit plain, except at wool twice over needle, into this first knit, then purl each time. You should have 189 stitches on needle. If by any chance you have not this number, either increase or decrease in next row to get it correct.

Pattern: 1st Row.—Knit 7, purl 3, * knit 1, purl 6. Repeat from * to end, the last time purl 3, knit 7.

2nd Row.—Knit 10, * purl 1, knit 6. Repeat from * last time knit 10. 3rd Row.—Plain.

4th Row.—Like 2nd. Repeat these 4 rows until coat is desired length, then after 3rd row, knit plain for 10 rows more, and cast off.

Sleeves.—With fine needles cast on 50 stitches, and knit in ribbing of 2 plain, 2 purl for 11 rows. Take No. 8 needles.

1st Row.—Knit 3, * purl 1, knit 6. Knit 2 together anywhere in this row to bring stitches to 49.

2nd Row.—Purl 3, *knit 1, purl 6. Repeat from * to end, where purl 3.

3rd Row.—Like 1st.

4th Row.—Plain. Repeat these 4 rows 8 times more, then increase 1 at each end of every 4th row 3 times. Now knit 2 tog. at beginning of every row until reduced to 20 stitches. Cast off. Sew up sleeves and attach to coat.

Sew buttons down front and thread ribbon at neck and underarm.

No. 15.

CROCHET JACKET.

Materials.—3 oz. white and 2 oz. coloured 4-ply Lady Betty wool. Needle No. 10 (Strathnoid).

Commence (using white wool) with 48 chain, turn,

and make 1 d c in 4th stitch from needle, then alternately 1 tr, 1 d c in each chain to end.

2nd Row.—Turn with 3 chain and make 1 d c in each tr, and 1 tr on each d c to end. Always begin row with 3 ch and end with 1 d c. Repeat 2nd row until work measures 10 inches. Then work over 12 stitches backward and forward until strap measures 11 inches and break off wool.

Work other strap the same. This now resembles a sailor collar. Take coloured wool and work all around entire piece of work in the same pattern, making 3 stitches in centre of all 8 corners. Join each round with a slip stitch, then turn, and work the opposite way, as the pattern does not look so well worked around and around. Work 5 rows with the colour, then 7 rows of white. Break off. Sew up sides, leaving $3\frac{1}{2}$ inches at foot open, and $4\frac{1}{2}$ inches at top open for armholes.

With white wool work 24 rows of the pattern around the armholes, turning each row. Break off.

Take colour and work 1st row 1 d c in each of 2 stitches. Repeat all around, then, without turning, 5 rows of 1 d c in each stitch.

Edge.—1 d c in 1 d c, 3 tr in next d c, alternately all round.

Now, with colour work around entire jacket, first a row of the pattern, then, without turning, 1 d c in one d c, 4 tr in next d c, alternately all round.

Turn collar back, and sew on ribbons to tie.

No. 16. **KNITTED PETTICOAT.**

Materials.—2 balls Ivorine wool. 4 bone needles, No. 7, pointed at both ends.

Cast on 220 stitches, 70 on each of two needles and 80 on the third. Knit 1 plain row.

Pattern: 1st Round.—*Knit 9, purl 1. Repeat from * all around.

2nd Round.—*Knit 8, purl 2. Repeat from * 3rd round.
*Knit 7, purl 3. Repeat.

4th Round.—Knit 6, purl 4. Repeat from *.

5th Round.—*Knit 5, purl 5. Repeat from *.

6th Round.—*Knit 4, purl 6. Repeat from *.

7th Round.—*Knit 3, purl 7. Repeat from *.

8th Round.—*Knit 2, purl 8. Repeat from *.

9th Round.—*Knit 1, purl 9. Repeat from *.

Repeat these 9 rows until length required for skirt.

Eight times is a nice length.

Divide for waist, taking 110 on first needle.

1st Row.—Knit 110. 2nd Row.—Turn, knit 1, then knit 2 tog. to end of row, finishing with knit 1. 3rd Row.—Knit 56.

4th Row.—Knit 1, * wool over knit 2 tog. Repeat to end, where knit 1 singly.

5th Row.—Knit 56.

Waist Pattern.—Knit 10, purl 2, knit 2 over 36, knit 10. Repeat last row for about $4\frac{1}{2}$ inches, then knit 6 plain rows.

Next Row.—Knit 10, cast off 36, knit 10. On last 10 knit backward and forward for shoulder strap for 16 rows (8 ribs), and cast off loosely. Knit opposite strap the same way. Now knit back of waist exactly the same as front. Sew shoulders together, then sides, leaving space for armholes.

Work all around neck alternately 1 treble, 1 chain, taking 3 stitches together at corners.

Next Row.—1 double crochet in one treble, 4 treble in next treble alternately all around.

Around armholes work one row of double crochet, then alternately 1 double crochet, 3 treble.

Run ribbon through holes at neck and waist.

No. 17 **CROCHET PETTICOAT.**

(Winter.)

Materials.—3 oz. 4-ply Lady Betty wool. Hook No. 10 (Strathnoid).

Commence with 110 chain. Turn and make 1 double crochet in 4th stitch from needle, and every chain to end.

2nd Row.—Turn with 3 chain and make 1 tr in each c, working through both top threads.

3rd Row.—Turn with 3 chain, 2 tr in same stitch, * miss one, 1 d c in next, miss one, 3 tr in next. Repeat from * ending with double crochet.

4th Row.—Turn with 3 chain, 2 tr in same stitch, then

make 1 d c in centre of each treble group, and 3 tr in each double crochet to end. Repeat 4th row twice more, then work around and around.

Before joining to begin the 1st row around make 1 tr in same place as d c which ends rows, then 1 d c in centre of 1st group, and work on as usual for 20 rows, or longer if required.

Last 2 Rounds.—5 tr in each d c, and 1 d c in centre of treble group.

Waist.—Work 1 tr 1 chain in alternate stitches.

2nd Row.—Turn with 3 chain (this stands for 1 tr), then 3 tr in next treble, 1 tr in next, alternately to end. You may have 1 extra stitch, make a treble in it.

3rd Row.—1 tr in each single tr, and 3 tr in centre of each tr group.

Repeat 3rd row 5 times more.

Turn and work as usual until single tr after 2nd group. Work 5 rows more, and break off wool.

Next Row.—Turn and work as usual until single tr after 7th group. Work 4 rows more.

Turn and work as usual until single tr after 2nd group.

Work 5 rows more, and break off wool. This is one side of back and shoulder strap.

Begin again in same single tr as ended 1st row at underarm, and work across front, leaving 7 groups unworked.

Now work backward and forward for 5 more rows, and work shoulder strap at each end. Work 2nd back to correspond with 1st. Sew shoulders together.

Begin at right hand corner of neck, and work alternately 1 tr 1 ch, making a treble in each single tr and in centre of each group, and taking 3 stitches together at corners. When you come to opposite side of neck work 2 d c in every space right down left side and up the right to neck again.

Edge with 4 tr in 1 treble and 1 d c in next treble all around neck.

Finish sleeves with the 2 rows in the same manner.

Run ribbon at neck and waist, and sew buttons down back.

No. 18.

KNITTED PETTICOAT.

Materials.—3 balls Ivorine wool. Bone needles, No. 7.

Cast on 110 stitches, and knit 2 plain rows.

Pattern: 1st Row.—Knit 1, knit 2 together, twice, * wool over the needle, and knit 1, four times, knit 2 together, four times. Repeat from * until you have only 5 stitches remaining on needle. Knit 2 together, twice, knit 1.

2nd Row.—Purl. 3rd Row.—Plain. 4th Row.—Purl. Repeat these 4 rows until skirt measures 9 inches.

Next Row.—Knit 1, then knit 2 together at end of row, last stitch singly.

Next Row.—Purl. Next Row.—Knit 1, * wool twice over needle, knit 2 together. Repeat from * to end, last stitch singly.

Next Row.—Purl, taking off the wool twice over needle as one stitch.

Waist.—Knit 11, purl 2, knit 2 alternately over 34 stitches, knit 11.

Next Row.—Knit 11, knit 2, purl 2 alternately over 34 stitches, knit 11. Repeat these 2 rows for about 4 inches, then knit 6 rows plain.

Next Row.—Knit 11, cast off 34, knit 11. On last 11 knit backward and forward 15 times (8 ribs), and cast off loosely.

Knit opposite shoulder to correspond.

Knit other side of petticoat exactly in the same way.

Sew shoulders together, and then sew up sides, leaving space for armholes.

Around neck work 1 row of 1 treble 1 chain alternately, taking 3 stitches together at corners.

Next Row.—Slip stitch into 1 treble, * 3 chain, 3 tr, all in same stitch, slip stitch into next treble. Repeat from *.

Edge sleeves to match, omitting row of holes.

Thread ribbon at neck and waist.

No. 19.

KNITTED JUMPER.

Materials.—2½ oz. white and ½ oz. blue 4-ply fingering wool. No. 8 bone needle. With blue cast on 60 stitches.

1st Row.—Knit 1, purl 1, alternately to end; 2nd row like 1st.

3rd Row.—Purl 1, knit 1, alternately to end; 4th row like 3rd.)

Repeat 1st and 2nd rows.

Take white wool and knit 1 row plain, then 4th row, then 1st and 2nd row. Now take blue and knit 1 row plain, then 4th row, then 1st and 2nd row. Now white, knit 1 plain row, then all the time with white, knit alternately 3rd and 1st row until jumper is 8 inches long from beginning.

Cast 20 stitches on to loose needle, then knit in pattern to centre, where cast on 3 stitches. These are to form a tiny flap on which to have buttons. Turn and knit backward and forward (keeping the 3 extra stitches at centre plain all the way) for $4\frac{1}{2}$ inches. Now from centre cast off 13 stitches, and knit in pattern to end of row. Knit 5 more rows, and leave this part without breaking wool.

Take another ball of wool. Cast 2 stitches on to loose needle, and then knit from other centre of front to end of row, where cast on 20 stitches for sleeve. Knit backward and forward the same as left side, except when going from centre, the 4th, 7th, 11th, 15th and 19th times knit 2, wool over, slip 1, knit 1, pass slipped stitch over knitted one, then to end as usual. This is to form button holes. When the same length as left front cast off 12 and knit to end, then 5 more rows.

On the other side cast 20 stitches for back of neck, then knit across side again. Now knit on the full width until when doubled from centre of shoulder both sides of sleeves are alike. Cast off 20, then knit across as usual, and cast off final 20. Begin again at underarm and knit until back is the same length from under arm to beginning of blue line. Now, with the right side of work towards you, knit 1 plain row, and knit border in the same way as before.

Take No. 12 needles and white wool, and pick up and knit 40 stitches across end of sleeve, then knit in ribbing of 2 plain, 2 purl, for 3 rows. Take blue wool and knit 1 row plain, then 4 rows in ribbing of 2 plain, 2 purl. Cast off.

Around neck work 1 row of treble and finish this way, 3 ch, 1 tr in end stitch; miss 1 treble, slip stitch into

next; * 3 ch, 1 tr in same stitch. Miss 1 tr and slip into next. Repeat from * to end. Sew buttons down front. Make a length of chain and run through holes at neck, and finish off with little balls or tassels.

No. 20.

CROCHET PETTICOAT.

Materials.—3 oz. 4-ply Lady Betty wool. Hook No. 10 (Strathnoid).

Commence with 39 chain, turn and make 1 double crochet in 4th stitch from needle, and in every chain to end.

2nd Row.—Turn with 3 chain and make 1 treble in back thread (all the time) of every stitch to end.

Work alternate rows of double crochet, and treble until the 8th row of treble is complete. Here make 14 chain, turn and make 1 d c in 4th stitch from needle, and in each stitch to end of row. Work 3 more rows of treble, alternated with double crochet.

Next Row.—Turn and work 27 tr (counting 3 chain to turn as one always).

Turn without chain, and work double crochet to end.

Turn, 23 tr, 3 d c. Turn with 2 chain, 1 double crochet in the 1st stitch, and to end.

Turn, 27 tr, then make 24 chain. Turn, 1 d c in 4th stitch from needle and on to end.

Work 3 more rows each of treble, and double crochet.

This completes shoulders and underarm.

From here work 36 treble, turn with 2 chain and work double crochet row, alternately, until you have completed the 14th row of treble. Make 14 chain and follow directions for other shoulder and armhole. Then work other back, completing 8 rows each of treble and double crochet on 36 stitches. Sew shoulder straps together.

Skirt.—1 tr, into end of double crochet row, * 2 chain, 1 tr in next d c row. Repeat from *.

2nd Row.—Turn with 5 chain, 1 tr in end stitch, then 1 tr, 2 ch, 1 tr in every treble to end.

3rd Row.—Turn with 3 chain, * 2 tr, 1 ch, 2 tr in 1st space formed by 2 chain in previous row, 1 tr, 1 ch, 1 tr in next space. Repeat from * to end.

4th Row.—Turn with 3 chain and make 2 tr, 1 ch, 2 tr in centre of each like group below, and 1 tr, 1 ch, 1 tr in

centre of group between. One more row like 4th, then work around and around.

Repeat 4th row until length desired, then edge as follows:—2 tr, 3 long tr (wool twice over needle), 2 tr in centre of each larger group, and 1 d c in centre of each small group to end.

Begin at row of holes at right side of waist, and work 2 double crochet into hole, then up back work 1 d c on each of next 4 *, 2 chain (tight), miss one, 1 d c in each of next 6. Repeat from *.

At end of row make 3 chain, 1 tr, into top of d c row, then alternately 1 ch 1 tr all around to other end of neck, taking 3 stitches together at corners.

2nd Row.—Turn and make 1 d c on each tr and in each hole to end.

Edge.—Turn with 3 chain, 3 tr all in same place, then alternately 1 d c and 4 tr into stitch which comes on treble below all around. For sleeves work one row of d c, and edge the same as neck. Sew buttons down back, and thread ribbon at neck and waist to tie.

No. 21. **KNITTED PETTICOAT.**

(Winter.)

Materials.—3 oz. 4-ply Lady Betty wool. Four bone needles, No. 7.

Cast on 24 stitches, and knit 1st row plain.

2nd Row.—Purl. 3rd row, knit 1, * wool over needle, knit 2 together. Repeat from * to end, where knit 1.

4th Row.—Plain. 5th row, knit. 6th row, purl. Repeat these 6 rows 51 times more. Cast off and sew ends together.

Now pick up and knit 4 stitches between each row of holes, having 70 stitches on each of 3 needles.

2nd Round.—*Wool over, knit 2 together. Repeat from * all around.

3rd Round.—Purl. 4th and 5th rounds, plain. Repeat last 3 rounds.

Next Pattern: 1st Round.—*Knit 1, purl 1, knit 3, purl 1. Repeat from * all around.

2nd Round.—Like 1st. 3rd round, purl.

4th Round.—*Knit 1, purl 5. Repeat from * all around.

Repeat these 4 rows 8 or 9 times until skirt is length you wish it to be (about 10 to 11 inches).

Next Round.—*Knit 1, knit 2 tog., knit 2 tog. Repeat from * all around.

Now divide in equal parts, 64 on 1st needle (front) and 32 on each of other two needles.

Now knit across front, knit 1, * wool over, knit 2 tog. Repeat from * last stitch singly.

Next Row.—Purl. Next row, knit in ribbing of 2 plain, 2 purl over 16 stitches, 32 plain, 16 in ribbing.

Next Row.—Knit in ribbing over 16 stitches, 32 purl, 16 in ribbing.

Pattern: 1st Row.—Knit in ribbing over 16 stitches. Knit 1, *wool over, knit 2 tog. Repeat from * 14 times more, knit 1, knit in ribbing over 16.

2nd Row.—Knit in ribbing over 16, plain 32, ribbing 16.

3rd Row.—Like 2nd. 4th row, 16 in ribbing, purl 32, ribbing over 16.

5th Row.—Like 2nd. 6th Row.—Like 4th.

Repeat these 6 rows 3 times more, then 1st row, then 4 rows like 2nd.

Next Row.—Knit over 16 in ribbing, cast off 32, knit last 16 in ribbing.

Now knit 2½ inches in ribbing for shoulder strap. Cast off.

Knit other shoulder strap the same.

Now knit the back of waist exactly in the same way as the front. Sew shoulder-straps together. Sew up sides, leaving space for armholes.

Around neck work a row of 1 tr, 1 ch, into each alternate stitch, taking 3 together at corners.

Edge.—1 d c in treble, 4 treble in next tr, alternately all around. Add the same edge to sleeves.

At foot, slip stitch into centre of stripe, between rows of holes, *3 chain, 4 tr, all in same place, slip stitch to centre of next stripe. Repeat from * all around. Thread ribbon at neck and waist.

No. 22.

CROCHET BONNET.

Materials.—One ball Ivorine wool, hook No. 10 (Strathnoid).

Commence with 4 chain and join into a ring. Draw the loop up on needle, *wool over and draw a loop up through ring, wool over again and draw loop up; then draw wool through all threads on hook together, 1 chain. Repeat from * until you have 8 clusters. Join.

2nd Round.—Drop the loop and draw it through space after join, *wool over and draw loop through. Repeat from * twice more, draw through all threads together, 1 chain; now make another cluster (wool over and draw loop through, 3 times) in same place, 1 cluster in next space; then 2 clusters in next, 1 cluster in next, and so on to end. Join.

Draw loop up between first 2 clusters and make 2 clusters in space of each increase, and 1 cluster in all other spaces. Continue in this way, increasing at the four increases every round, until you have 10 rounds altogether. Now begin as usual at centre of 1st increase and work around to centre of last increase without increasing further. Turn and work backward and forward for 11 rows. At end of last row work a row of double crochet all along neck, turn and make 1 double crochet in each d c of former row, taking through both back and front threads. Repeat this row 4 times more.

Now work up edge of double crochet at end of row and then 1 d c in each cluster and each space on front of bonnet and at edge of double crochet at neck. Work backward and forward for 5 more rows and break off. Trim with full ribbon rosettes and add strings.

No. 23.

CROCHET BONNET.

Materials.—1 ball ivorine wool and crochet hook No. 10 (Strathnoid). Make 4 chain, join and into ring put 14 treble.

1st Round.—*2 double crochet in 1st stitch, 1 d c in next stitch. Repeat from * all round.

2nd Round.—2 double crochet in 1st stitch of each increase, and 1 d c on each of 2 stitches between. Continue

in this way, having one more stitch between the increases until you have 6 between each.

Next Round.—1 double crochet in 1st stitch, * miss one, 3 treble in next stitch. Miss one, 1 d c in next stitch. Repeat from * all around.

Next Round.—3 treble in each d c, stitch and 1 d c, in centre of each tr group. Now 2 rows of double crochet, one in each stitch.

Next Round.—*1 d c in 1st stitch, miss one, 3 tr in next stitch, and miss one. Repeat from * all around.

Next Round.—3 tr in each d c, and 1 d c in centre of each group until you come to centre of 5th group before end. Turn and work backward and forward in this way (leaving 4 groups unworked) for 15 rows. Now work a row of open treble (1 tr, 1 ch, miss one, 1 tr on next) all around entire bonnet. Break off. Across neck make alternately 5 treble in one treble, one double crochet in next treble, then along front make 3 tr, 1 long tr (wool twice over needle), 3 tr, all in 1 treble, and 1 d c in next treble. Edge with silk 1 d c in every stitch with 1 chain between all, but immediately over the double crochet stitch. Run ribbon through holes from centre of top to centre of back, draw up to suit baby's face, and tie in tiny bow. Attach ribbon string.

No. 24. **KNITTED BONNET.**

(First Size.)

Materials.— $\frac{1}{2}$ oz. 4-ply Lady Betty fingering wool and No. 8 bone needles. Cast on 22 stitches, and knit 30 rows (15 ribs). You are now at top of bonnet. Pick up and knit every stitch across top, and also down opposite side (60 stitches).

Knit backward and forward for 40 rows (20 ribs), and cast off loosely.

Take No. 10 crochet hook and work one row of double crochet all around entire bonnet, then one of 1 treble in each alternate stitch, with one chain between each.

Along neck work 1 d c in one treble and 3 tr, in next treble alternately, and then work 4 tr and 1 d c alternately across front. Break off.

Take crochet silk and work 1 double crochet in every stitch, 1 chain between 2nd and 3rd on each group across front, and 1 d c 1 chain, 1 d c in centre of each group along neck.

Thread narrow ribbon through holes to draw up to suit, and add wider ribbon for strings.

No. 25. **KNITTED BONNET.**

Materials.— $\frac{1}{2}$ oz. of 4-ply Lady Betty fingering wool, No. 8 bone needle, and crochet hook No. 13.

Cast on 24 stitches, and knit 1 row plain and 1 row purl.

Pattern: 1st Row.—*Knit 1, knit 2 tog. Repeat from * to end where knit 1.

2nd Row.—Knit 2, *then pick up the loop before next stitch and knit it, then knit the stitch. Repeat from * to end.

3rd Row.—Plain. 4th Row.—Purl. Repeat 4 rows 8 times. After last purl row purl across top and down other side.

Repeat the 4 rows (70 stitches) for about 4 inches, and cast off. Crochet one row of double crochet all around entire bonnet, then one row of 1 tr, 1 chain in each alternate stitch. Now work 4 tr, in one treble and 1 d c, in next treble alternately all around. Break off.

Edge with crochet silk, 1 d c in each stitch with 1 chain between those on 2nd and 3rd trebles in each group.

Thread ribbon from centre of neck at back all around, and after drawing up to required size tie in bow at back. Add ribbon rosettes and strings.

No. 26. **KNITTED BONNET.**

Materials.—1 oz. 4-ply Lady Betty fingering wool, No. 8 bone needles. Cast on 7 stitches, and knit one plain row.

Pattern: 1st Row.—Increase in every stitch (by knitting 1st into front, then into back).

2nd and All Even Rows.—Plain.

3rd Row.—*Increase in 1st stitch, knit 1. Repeat from * to end.

5th Row.—*Increase in 1st stitch, knit 2. Repeat from

* to end. Work on having 1 more stitch each increase until you have 84 stitches on needle.

Next Row.—Cast off 4 and knit to end.

Next Row.—Cast off 4 and knit to end.

Pattern: 1st Row.—Knit 1, then knit 2 tog. to end of row, last stitch singly.

2nd Row.—Knit 2, then * knit loop before next stitch, then the stitch. Repeat from * to end.

Next 6 rows plain, then 1 row purl.

Repeat these 9 rows 4 times more, but instead of working the purl row the last time, cast off. Sew up back.

Work a row of double crochet along neck.

Now work a row of open treble (1 tr, 1 ch) around entire bonnet. Next Row.—1 d c in 1st treble, 3 tr in next treble, alternately all around.

Edge with silk, 1 double crochet in each stitch, except in centre of each group, where put 1 d c, 1 ch, 1 d c.

Thread ribbon through holes.

Add strings of wider ribbon.

No. 27. **BABY BOY'S HAT.** (Silk.)

Materials.—3 oz. crochet silk and No. 13 hook (Strathnoid). Commence with 4 chain, join, and into ring put 12 treble.

1st Row.—2 double crochet in each treble.

2nd Row.—1 d c in each double crochet.

3rd Row.—2 d c in each double crochet.

Next 3 Rows.—1 d c in each double crochet.

7th Row.—2 d c in 1st double crochet, 1 d c in next alternately all around.

Next 3 Rows.—1 d c in each stitch all around.

11th Row.—2 d c in 1st d c, and 1 d c in next alternately all around.

Next 4 Rows.—1 d c in each stitch.

Next Row.—*3 tr in one double crochet, miss one, 1 d c in next, miss one. Repeat from *.

Next Row.—1 d c in centre of each treble group, and 3 tr in each double crochet all around.

Work on as for last row until work measures 5 inches from centre of crown.

Now work 5 rows of double crochet, 1 in each stitch.

Turn, and working the contrary way, work in the fancy pattern for $1\frac{1}{2}$ inches. Break off.

Turn this part up.

Trim with ribbon rosettes and strings.

No. 28.

CROCHET HAT.

Materials.—1 oz. Andalusian wool, crochet hook No. 13 (Strathnoid).

Carlson Currier's knitting silk, shade 190, for edge.

Commence with 4 chain, join, and into ring make 12 treble.

2nd Round.—2 treble in each treble. Join.

3rd Round.—3 chain, take up 2nd and 3rd stitches, drawing wool through and keeping all on needle, then take up top of 1st and 2nd trebles below (through both back and front threads), draw wool through all 5 stitches together, 1 chain. *Take 1 stitch in eye of star (made by 1 chain), 1 stitch in back thread of last stitch of previous star, 1 stitch in same treble as other star, 1 stitch in next treble on work, draw through all 5 stitches together, 1 chain. Repeat from * all around. Do not make final one chain before joining.

Next Round.—3 chain, 1 stitch in 2nd and 3rd stitches, 1 stitch in top of star below. 1 stitch in eye, draw through all 3 loops together, 1 chain. Now work stars as in previous round, but pick up 4th and 5th stitches on top and in eye of star below. The 1st row has every star increased, the 2nd row ordinary star stitch. Now work 1 round like the 1st, and 2 rounds like the 2nd.

Next Round.—*Increase, making 3 stars over two, then 3 ordinary stars. Repeat from *. Now work without increase until hat measures at least $5\frac{1}{2}$ inches from centre of crown. Now work 1 double crochet in top and in eye of each star, then 5 rounds of double crochet.

Brim.—*Increase, having 3 stars over 4 double crochet stitches, then 1 star over two stitches. Repeat from * all around. Now 4 rounds without increase.

Edge.—Take silk and make 1 double crochet in each stitch with 1 chain between each double crochet to end. Trim with ribbon as you please.

No. 29.

CROCHET HAT.

(Silk.)

Materials.—1 skein jumper silk. Crochet hook No. 13 (Strathnoid).

Commence with 4 chain, join and into ring make 12 treble.

1st Round.—2 double crochet in 1st stitch, 1 d c in next stitch alternately all around.

2nd Round.—*2 double crochet in 1st stitch and 1 d c in each of next 2 stitches. Repeat from * all around.

Increase in this way, putting 2 d c in 1st stitch of each increase and 1 d c, in each stitch between until work measures $2\frac{1}{2}$ inches from centre of crown; then work 2 rows without increase.

Next Round.—*1 d c, in one stitch, miss one, 3 treble in next stitch, miss one. Repeat from * to end.

Next Round.—3 treble in each double crochet, and 1 d c in centre of each treble group. Repeat last row until hat measures $5\frac{1}{2}$ inches from centre of crown. Now work 5 rounds of 1 double crochet in each stitch, then begin brim.

1st Round.—*1 d c, in each of 2 d c, 2 d c in next stitch, Repeat from * all around, then work 2 rounds without increase.

Next Round.—1 d c, in 1st d c, *2 d c, in next 1 d c, in each of next 3 d c. Repeat from * all around, then 6 rounds without increase and fasten off. Trim with ribbon according to taste.

No. 30

CROCHET HAT.

Materials.—1 oz. 4-ply Lady Betty fingering wool. Hook No. 10 (Strathnoid).

Commence with 4 chain, join and into ring put 12 treble.

Next Round.—2 double crochet in 1st tr, 1 d c in next tr, alternately all around.

Next Round.—*2 double crochet in 1st d c, 1 d c in each of next 2 d c. Repeat from * all around.

Next Round.—*2 double crochet in 1st d c, 1 d c in each of next 3 d c. Repeat from * all around. Continue in this

way, increasing in 1st stitch of each increase until you have 12 rows, then 1 row without increase.

Pattern: 1st Round.—3 chain, *, 4 treble in next stitch, withdraw hook and put through both 1st and 4th trebles, and draw wool through, 1 chain 1 tr in each of next 2 stitches. Repeat from * all around, 1 tr, once the last time, and join to top of 3 chain.

2nd Round.—3 chain to commence, then 1 tr in each treble, and each cluster to end. Repeat these 2 rows twice more, then work 3 rows of plain treble, then 3 rows of double crochet.

Turn and work the opposite way around. Firstly, a row of plain treble, then a cluster row.

Repeat these 2 rows twice more, then work another cluster row, but make the cluster on the 2nd of each of the single treble instead of over each cluster.

Sew on pompom on top or trim as you wish.

No. 31. CROCHET BONNET.

Materials.—1 ball Ivorine wool. Hook No. 10 (Strathnoid).

Commence with 19 chain, turn and make 3 treble in 3rd stitch from needle, miss 3, slip stitch into next * 1 chain, 3 tr in same place, miss 3, slip stitch into next. Repeat from *, last time make a double crochet instead of slip stitch.

2nd Row.—Turn with 2 chain, 3 tr, in same place, slip stitch into hole made by 1 ch in previous row, * 1 ch, 3 tr in same place, slip stitch into next hole. Repeat from *, ending with 1 d c.

Repeat 2nd row 12 times more. Break off wool.

Next Row.—Begin where you started bonnet, and work up the side, across top, and down other side, working the pattern as usual for 16 rows, then work one row of double crochet all around entire bonnet, omitting the slip stitch on each shell, then work 1 row of treble (one in each stitch) across front of bonnet, then a row of shells along the neck, and break off.

Begin on 1st treble in front, and work the pattern as usual, one shell on every 3rd treble.

Work 7 rows, and break off. Turn back this part.
Edge entire bonnet with silk.
Finish with ribbon rosettes and strings.

No. 32. **CROCHET BONNET.**
 (Silk.)

Materials.— $2\frac{1}{2}$ oz. crochet silk, hook No. 14, and 2 yds. ribbon.

Commence with 5 chain, join and into ring make 12 double crochet.

Next Round.—2 double crochet in 1st stitch, 1 d c in next stitch, alternately all around.

Next Round.—*2 double crochet in 1st stitch, and 1 d c in each of next 2 stitches. Repeat from * all around.

Next Round.—*2 double crochet in 1st stitch and 1 d c in each of next 3 stitches. Repeat from * all around.

Work on in this way, having one more double crochet between the increases (which must always be on 1st stitch of increase in previous row) until work measures $2\frac{1}{2}$ inches from centre of crown, about 19 rows.

Next Round.—3 chain, 3 treble all into 1 stitch, miss 3, and slip into next stitch, *2 chain 3 tr, all in same stitch, miss 3 and slip into next. Repeat from * all around.

Next Round.—Turn with 3 chain, * 3 tr, all in same stitch, slip into space made by 2 chain in previous row, 2 ch. Repeat from * until you have 25 shells, make 1 double crochet instead of slip stitch the last time. Leave other shells unworked for back of neck.

Next Round.—Turn and work as for last row, always having 3 chain to turn and ending with 1 double crochet, one more row the same.

Now turn with 9 chain, and into space made by 2 chain work a triple treble (silk 3 times over needle, and draw off 2 stitches at a time), * 3 chain, 1 triple treble in next space. Repeat from * to end of row. Turn with 3 chain and work 4 rows of the shells as before, then turn with 9 chain and work the row of open triple treble, then 2 rows of shells, then a row of open triple treble. Do not break off silk, but make 9 chain and work along neck in the same way with triple treble until you come to edge of front again, where you work the turned back points.

First work a row of shells as usual across front (29). Turn and work 9 shells, turn and work 8, turn and work 7. Continue until you have only one. Break off silk. Begin again, and slip into 2 chain space of shell following end of last point, and work 9 shells for 2nd point, reducing to one as before, then work the 3rd point in the same manner.

Begin again at right end of neck, and work 1 double crochet in end stitch, *-1 picot (4 chain, 1 d c in 1st chain), 1 d c on top of next triple treble. Repeat from * all along the neck, then after turning the points back, work on across front, working into the chain the points where worked on, then continue on around the 3 points, and finish off neatly.

Thread ribbon through 3 rows of holes, and sew neatly at ends, then thread ribbon through holes at neck, leaving ends to tie. Tack the points here and there to keep them in place.

No. 33.

KNITTED BOOTE.

Materials.—1 oz. Andalusian wool, No. 12 needles.

Cast on 20 stitches, and knit 1 row plain.

2nd Row.—Slip 1, knit, first into front, then into back, of next stitch, plain to end.

Repeat 2nd row until you have 31 stitches on needle.

Now decrease, slip 1, knit 2 together, plain to end. Repeat this row until reduced to 20 again.

Cast on 7 for heel, and knit 12 rows, keeping heel end straight, and increasing at toe, alternate rows, until you have 33 on needle.

Next Row.—Cast off 14, knit to end.

Next Row.—Knit 11, purl 8.

Next Row.—Knit 2, knit 2 tog. 3 times, knit 11.

Next Row.—Knit 12, *then knit loop before stitch, then stitch to end.

Next Row.—Plain.

Repeat last 4 rows twice more, then 1st to 3rd rows.

Cast on 14.

Next Row.—Plain.

Now knit 2nd and 3rd stitches tog. at toe end alternate rows, keeping heel straight, until reduced to 27. Cast off.

With wrong side of work towards you, pick up, and knit 36 stitches, knit 3 rows plain.

Next Row.—Knit 1, *wool over, knit 2 tog. Repeat from * to end, last stitch singly. Next 3 rows plain.

Pattern for Leg: 1st Row.—Plain. 2nd Row.—Purl.

3rd Row.—Knit 1, then knit 2 tog. to end, last stitch singly.

4th Row.—Knit 2, then knit loop before the stitch, then the stitch. Repeat from * to end.

Repeat these 4 rows 6 times more. Now knit 4 plain rows.

Last Row.—Cast off 2, *make 4 tight chain. Cast off 3. Repeat from * to end. Work a row of double crochet around outline of shoe. Sew up neatly, drawing plain piece across toe close together before sewing to centre of sole. Thread ribbon at ankle.

No. 34. **KNITTED BOOTEY.**

Materials.—1 oz. Andalusian wool, No. 12 needles.

Cast on 43 stitches, and knit 1 row plain.

Next Row.—Slip 1, increase (knit, first into front, then into back), knit 18, increase, knit 1, increase, knit 18, increase, knit 1.

Next Row.—Plain.

Next Row.—Slip 1, increase, knit 20, increase, knit 1, increase, knit 20, increase, knit 1.

Next Row.—Plain. Continue in this way, having 2 more stitches between the increases each time until you have 63 on needle.

Now knit 12 rows plain.

Next Row.—Knit 36, knit 2 tog.

Next Row.—Turn, slip 1, knit 9, knit 2 tog. Repeat last row 8 times more.

Next Row.—Slip 1, purl 1, *knit 1, purl 1. Repeat from * twice more, knit 2 tog., turn.

Repeat last row 9 times more, then next row; this time knit on to end of stitches on left-hand needle.

Next Row.—Knit back to end of needle. Knit 2 plain rows. You require 40 stitches; if you have more, knit 2 together.

Next Row.—Knit 1, *wool over, knit 2 tog. Repeat from * to end, last stitch singly.

Next Row.—Plain.

Next Row.—Knit 1, purl 1, alternately to end.

Next Row.—Purl 1, knit 1, alternately to end.

Repeat last 2 rows 11 times, then 6 or 8 rows of ribbing, 2 plain, 2 purl, and cast off.

Sew up neatly, and thread ribbon at ankle.

No. 35. **KNITTED SHOE.**

Materials.—Jumper silk or Andalusian wool, No. 12 needles.

Cast on 20 stitches, and knit 1 plain row.

Now increase (knit, first into front, then into back, of stitch) in the 2nd stitch at beginning of each row until you have 30 stitches on needle. Knit 1 plain row, then decrease (knit 2nd and 3rd stitches tog.) at beginning of each row until reduced to 20 again.

Cast on 6 stitches for heel, knit to toe.

Now increase as before at beginning of toe end, leaving heel end straight until you have 32 stitches on needle.

Cast off 14 from heel, then knit 2, purl 2, alternately over 8 stitches, knit 10.

2nd Row.—Knit 12, purl 2, knit 2, alternately.

3rd Row.—Purl 2, knit 2 over 8 stitches, knit 10.

4th Row.—Knit 12, purl 2, knit 2 over 8 stitches.

Repeat these 4 rows 3 times more.

Now cast on 14, and knit backward and forward, decreasing at toe each alternate row until reduced to 26. Cast off. Sew neatly together, drawing up the stitches across end of instep before sewing to centre stitch of sole.

Take a fine crochet needle and work 1 treble, *1 picot (3 chain, 1 double crochet, into top thread of treble just made), miss 1, 1 tr in next stitch, miss 1. Repeat from * all around. Thread ribbon at ankle.

No. 36.

CROCHET SHOE.

(Pink Silk.)

Materials.—1 oz. silk and fine crochet hook.

Commence with 5 chain, join, and into ring put 12 double crochet.

2nd Round.—*2 d c in 1st stitch, 1 d c in each of next 2 stitches. Repeat from * all around.

3rd Round.—*2 d c in 1st stitch, 1 d c in each of next 4 stitches. Repeat from * all around.

4th Round.—Like 3rd.

5th Round.—*2 d c in 1st stitch, 1 d c in each of next 3 stitches. Repeat from * all around.

6th and 7th Rounds.—Like 3rd.

Now work around and around, without increasing, until there are 19 rows from beginning.

Next Row.—1 treble, 1 double crochet, alternately for 28 stitches, leaving 9 unworked. (If you are short of stitches, put 2 into 1, but you should have the correct number.)

Next Row.—Turn with 3 chain (to stand for 1st treble), and make 1 d c in each treble, and 1 tr in each double crochet. Begin each row with the 3 chain, and end with 1 double crochet. Repeat this last row until work measures 2 inches from toe part. Break off silk, and sew backs together. Around ankle work alternately 1 treble, 1 chain.

Edge.—1 d c, 1 picot (3 chain, 1 d c in d c just made), 1 d c in each hole all around. Fasten off neatly, and thread ribbon through holes at ankle.

No. 37.

CROCHET SHOE.

(Cream Silk.)

Materials.—1 oz. silk, fine steel crochet hook.

Commence with 5 chain, join, and into ring make 12 double crochet.

2nd Row.—*2 d c in 1st stitch, 1 d c in each of next 2. Repeat from * all around.

3rd Row.—*2 d c in 1st stitch, 1 d c in each of next 4. Repeat from * all around.

4th Row.—Like 3rd.

5th Row.—2 d c in 1 stitch, 1 d c in each of next 3.
Repeat.

6th and 7th Rows.—Like 3rd.

Now work around and around without increasing until you have 19 rows from beginning.

Next Row.—1 d c in each stitch to within 9 of end of round. Leave these unworked.

Next Row.—Turn, and work backward and forward, taking hook through back thread of stitch, 1 d c in each stitch until you have 9 ribs (19 rows). Break off silk, and sew from top to end of heel.

Work around top alternately 1 tr, 1 ch.

Edge.—Slip into 1st treble, *3 ch, 1 tr, in same stitch, slip into next treble. Repeat from *, and finish off.

Thread ribbon through holes at ankle.

No. 38.

KNITTED BOOTEE.

Materials.—1 oz. Andalusian wool, No. 12 needles.

Cast on 43 stitches, and knit 1 row plain.

Next Row.—Slip 1, increase (knit, first into front, then into back), knit 18, increase, knit 1, increase, knit 18, increase, knit 1.

Next Row.—Plain.

Next Row.—Slip 1, increase, knit 20, increase, knit 1, increase, knit 20, increase, knit 1.

Next Row.—Plain.

Continue in this way, having 2 more stitches between the increases each time, until you have 63 on needle.

Now knit 12 rows plain.

Next Row.—Knit 36, knit 2 tog.

Next Row.—Slip 1, knit 9, knit 2 tog.

Repeat last row 8 times more.

Next Row.—Slip 1, knit 8, knit 2 tog.

Next Row.—Slip 1, purl 8, purl 2 tog.

Next Row.—Slip 1, knit 1, *wool over, knit 2 tog.

Repeat from * twice more, knit 1, knit 2 tog.

Next Row.—Slip 1, purl 8, knit 2 tog.

Next Row.—Slip 1, purl 8, knit 2 tog.

Next Row.—Slip 1, purl 8, knit 2 tog.

Repeat these 4 rows twice more.

Next Row.—Slip 1, knit 8, knit 2 tog., then plain to end.

Next Row.—Purl 24, knit 2 tog., purl remaining 14.

Next Row.—Knit 1, *wool over, knit 2 tog. Repeat from * to end, last stitch singly.

Next Row.—Purl.

Next Row.—Plain.

Next Row.—Purl.

Pattern: Next Row.—Knit 1, *wool over, knit 2 tog., knit 1. Repeat from * to end.

Next 5 rows alternately 1 purl row, 1 plain row.

Repeat these 6 rows twice more, then 1st to 4th rows, then 6 rows of ribbing, 2 plain, 2 purl, and cast off.

Sew up neatly, and thread ribbon through holes at ankle.

No. 39.

KNITTED SOCK.

Materials.—1 oz. Andalusian wool, No. 14 needles.

Cast on 48 stitches, 12 on each of 2 needles, and 24 on one in centre, knit 16 rows of ribbing, 1 plain, 1 purl, then 1 plain row.

Pattern.—Knit 12 on 1st needle plain, then * wool to front as when purling a stitch, slip 1, knit 1, pass slipped stitch over knitted one, knit 1, knit 2 tog., wool to the front, knit 1. Repeat from * to end of 24 stitches on 2nd needle, then knit 12 plain on 3rd needle.

2nd Row.—Plain all around. Repeat these 2 rows 15 times more.

Heel.—Knit on 2 back needles, one row plain, next row purl, alternately, 9 times. Now 1 row plain, turn, purl 13, purl 2 tog., purl 1, turn, slip 1, knit 13, knit 2 tog., knit 1. Repeat last 2 rows, taking one extra stitch each time until all are used. Now pick up and knit 9 stitches down side, then work pattern across centre, then pick up 9 on opposite side with 3rd needle, and take half the stitches off triangle at end of heel on to same needle so 2 back needles have same number. Now knit the backs plain and centre in pattern as usual. Decrease at ends of plain needles next to centre. On the 3 last stitches before pattern, slip 1, knit 1, pass slipped stitch over and commence other one with knit 1, knit 2 tog.

Next row plain. Repeat last 2 rows until reduced to 12 on each back needle.

Knit until you have 11 openwork holes from beginning of heel, then 6 rows plain. Now decrease for toe.

Decrease at both ends of centre needle, and at end of each back needle nearest centre, then 3 plain rows, decrease as before, 2 plain rows, then decrease again with 1 plain row between until you have 8 on front needle and 4 on each of back ones.

Either sew up toe or darn off as for Red Cross socks, described in plain sock.

No. 40.

FIRST SOCK.

Materials.—1 oz. Andalusian wool. No. 14 needles.

Cast on 48 stitches, 16 on each of 3 needles, and knit in ribbing of 3 plain, 1 purl for 14 rows, then knit 12 plain rows. Decrease to shape the leg. On last 3 stitches of one needle, slip 1, knit 1, pass slipped stitch over knitted one, knit 1; next needle knit 1, knit 2 tog., then plain all around. Now 5 rows plain, then decrease again, then 12 plain rows and commence heel. Divide stitches, taking 22 on to one needle for back, and leaving remainder on 2 needles for front. Now knit one row and purl 1 row alternately for 16 rows on back needle. When purling last time, purl 12, purl 2 tog., purl 1.

Next Row.—Turn, slip 1, knit 12, knit 2 tog., knit 1. Repeat these 2 rows, taking an extra stitch each time until all are taken. Pick up and knit 8 stitches on same needle, then 22 for front all on one needle. Pick up 8 with 3rd needle, and knit half of the heel gusset stitches on to same needle, so 2 back needles have an equal number. Knit 2 rounds plain, then decrease every 3rd row, until you have 11 on each back needle. At end of needle before front in last 3 stitches slip 1, knit 1, pass slipped stitch over, knit 1, and 1st 2 stitches after front knit 1, knit 2 tog. Now knit plain for about 16 rows, according to length of foot required, then decrease for toe. On centre needle begin and end by knit 1, knit 2 tog., begin next needle by knit 1, knit 2 tog., and end last needle with knit 2 tog., knit 1. Now knit 3 plain

rows, then decrease again, 2 more plain rows, then decrease again, 2 more plain rows, then decrease with one plain row between until 10 remain on front needle and 5 on each at back.

Red Cross seam. Break off a few inches of wool at end of sock, and thread a wool needle. Begin with stitches next you, and use wool needles as if to knit. * Take off the first stitch, pulling wool well through, then put needle through 2nd stitch as if purling, draw wool closely through, but leave stitch on. Now pass wool around (not over knitting needle) to back needle, and purl the 1st stitch and take it off (with darning), knit the 2nd stitch and leave it on. Repeat from * until toe is all grafted. Darn end of wool down side.

No. 41. **CROCHET BOOTE.**

Materials.—1 oz. 2-ply fingering wool. Hook No. 13 (Strathnoid).

Commence with 20 chain, turn and make 1 treble in 5th chain from needle, 1 tr, in each of next 13 chain, 6 tr, in last chain. Now work 1 tr in each of 14 on other side of chain, 5 tr in last stitch, slip stitch to top of 3 chain.

2nd Row.—3 chain to stand for 1st tr, then 1 tr in each of 13 tr, then 2 tr in each of next 6 tr, then 1 tr in each of 14, then 2 in each of next 6. Join.

3rd Row.—3 ch, 1 tr in each of 14, then alternately 2 tr in 1 tr, and 1 tr in next 6 times. Join.

4th Row.—2 ch, 1 d c in each stitch, taking up back thread only all around. Join with slip stitch.

5th Row.—Turn with 1 ch, pass over slip stitch, and make 1 d c in each stitch all around. Join with slip stitch. Repeat 5th row 4 times more. Join, turn, with 3 chain and make 1 tr in each stitch all around, join, and without turning work 1 row of d c, taking through both top threads. Join. Break off.

Mark centre of front. Slip into 9th d c from centre stitch, 1 d c in next d c, *miss one; 1 d c in next. Repeat from * 7 times, slip into next d c. * turn without chain, pass over stitch, and make 1 d c in back thread

of 9 d c, pass over slipped stitch and slip into next d c, through both top threads. Repeat from * 14 times.

Next Row.—4 chain to turn. * Miss one d c stitch, 1 tr in next, 1 chain. Repeat from * all around. Join.

Next Row.—1 d c in each hole and each tr to end. Join and break off.

Next Row.—Slip into centre stitch at back, 3 chain, * 1 d c in next stitch, 1 tr in next stitch. Repeat to end of row, finishing with 1 d c.

Next Row.—Turn with 3 chain, and make 1 d c, in each treble, and 1 tr in each double crochet to end of row. Repeat last row 13 times more.

Edge.—3 chain, 2 tr. * Miss 2 stitches, slip into next, 3 chain, 2 tr in same place. Repeat from * to end. Break off. Sew up back of leg, and thread ribbon at ankle.

No. 42

KNITTED GAITER.

Materials.—A little over 1 oz. 4-ply fingering wool, No. 9 bone needles.

Cast on 44 stitches, and knit in ribbing of 2 plain, 2 purl, for 11 rows.

Next Row.—Knit 1, * wool over, knit 2 tog. Repeat from * to end, last stitch singly. Now 3 rows in ribbing, then 3 rows plain (garter stitch).

Next Row.—Knit 28, turn, and knit 12, turn, and knit 13 (always slip 1st stitch). Turn, and knit 14. Continue in this manner, taking 1 more stitch each time until all are taken off, then knit 7 rows plain.

Pattern: 1st Row.—Knit 14, purl 2, knit 2, purl 2, knit 2, purl 2, knit 2, purl 2, knit 2, purl 2, knit 16.

2nd Row.—Like 1st.

3rd Row.—Knit 16, purl 2, knit 2, purl 2, knit 2, purl 2, knit 2, purl 2, knit 14.

4th Row.—Like 3rd.

Repeat these 4 rows 3 times more, then work on in the same way, but decrease (for shaping of leg) by knitting 2 tog. at each end of needle every 8th row until reduced to 38, then knit 5 rows plain.

Next Row.—Knit 13, then in pattern on next 12 stitches. Turn, and work backward and forward on

these 12 stitches until the 4 rows of pattern are completed 4 times, then knit across in pattern, and pick up, and knit stitches down side of instep flap, then the 13 on needle.

Turn, and knit plain to end of needle, then pick up and knit all the stitches down other side of flap and final 13. Knit 5 more rows, and cast off.

Sew up back of gaiter.

Thread ribbon through holes at knee, and elastic beneath instep.

No. 43. **KNITTED BINDER.**

Materials.—1 oz. 3-ply Lady Betty fingering wool, 4 No. 10 needles.

Cast on 96 stitches, 30 on each of 2 needles, and 36 on third.

Knit in ribbing of 3 plain, 3 purl, for 20 rows, then in stocking stitch for 40 rows, then 10 rows of 1 plain, 1 purl, and cast off.

No. 44. **KNITTED GAITER.**

Materials.—1 oz. 4-ply fingering wool. No. 9 bone needles.

Cast on 44 stitches, and knit in ribbing of 2 plain, 2 purl, for 16 rows.

Next Row.—Knit 1, *wool over, knit 2 tog. Repeat from * to end, where knit 1. Now 5 more rows of ribbing.

Pattern.—Knit 1, purl 1, alternately to end of row.

2nd Row.—Purl 1, knit 1, alternately to end of row. Keep to this pattern (which is called "moss stitch") throughout, so that the plain stitch comes over the purl, and vice versa.

For shaping knee, knit (in pattern all the time) over 28 stitches, turn, and knit over 12, turn, and knit over 13. Continue in this way, adding 1 more stitch each time, and always slipping 1st stitch on turning, until all are knitted off.

Now knit backward and forward for 2 inches, then knit 2nd, and 3rd stitches tog. at each end of every 6th

row, until reduced to 36. Knit on until work, from under ribbing at back of leg, measures 6 inches.

Next Row.—Knit 24, turn, and knit 12. On these 12 continue knitting until instep flap measures $1\frac{1}{2}$ inches, then pick up and knit stitches down left side of flap, and then the 12 stitches left on needle.

Next Row.—Knit plain (garter stitch) to end of flap at toe, then pick up, and knit down side of flap and along final 12 stitches. Knit 6 more rows in garter stitch, and cast off. Sew up backs of legs. Thread narrow ribbon through holes at knee, and add elastic to go under centre of foot.

No. 45.

CROCHET BIB.

(Silk.)

Materials.—2 oz. crochet silk, fine hook.

Commence with 16 chain, turn, and make 1 double crochet in 4th stitch from needle, and in each of 11 chain, 3 double crochet in end stitch, then work up other side, 1 d c in each of 12 chain. Turn with 2 chain, and make 1 d c in back thread of each to end stitch, where put 1 d c, 2 ch, 1 d c, then work up other side.

Turn with 2 ch, and make 1 d c in 1st stitch (usually passed over), then 1 d c in back thread of each of next 9 d c, then 1 d c, 2 ch, 1 d c in next, 1 d c in each to end, where have 1 d c, 2 ch, 1 d c, then work on, making (the 3rd point) 1 d c, 2 ch, 1 d c on 5th, then 1 d c on each to end, where make 2 d c.

Next Row.—Make 1 d c in each double crochet and each 2 chain.

Next Row.—1 extra d c at each end, and 1 d c, 2 ch, 1 d c in centre of each point, otherwise 1 d c in each stitch.

Repeat these 2 rows three times more.

Next Row.—Treble, increasing at top at all 3 points, and at top alternate rows.

Next Row.—Alternately 1 tr, 1 ch, increasing at all 3 points.

Now 6 rows of double crochet, increasing at points.

Next Row.—Treble, increasing at all points.

Next Row.—Open treble, increasing at points. Break off thread.

Next Row.—28 chain, then beginning where you broke off treble, increasing at points to end, 31 chain.

Next Row.—Turn, and work around neck, make 1 tr in 4th stitch from needle, then 1 ch, 1 tr, alternately all around, 7 tr at top, then 1 tr in each stitch to opposite end (increasing at points).

Now work around neck 1 d c in 1st space, *1 picot (3 chain, 1 d c in 1st), 1 d c in next space, 1 ch, 1 d c in next space. Repeat from * to end of neck, then at turn work *1 tr, 1 picot, 1 tr, 1 picot, 1 tr, 1 picot, 1 tr all in one stitch, miss 1 treble, 1 d c in next, miss 1 tr. Repeat from * around bib to neck. Thread narrow ribbon through holes around neck.

No. 46.

CROCHET BIB.

Materials.—Perle cotton, No. 5, or crochet silk, fine hook.

Commence with 38 chain, turn, and make 1 double crochet in 3rd stitch from needle, and every stitch to end.

2nd Row.—2 chain to turn, 1 d c in each of 17 double crochet (taking through back thread), 1 d c, 1 ch, 1 d c, all in next stitch, then 1 d c in each of last 18.

3rd Row.—3 ch to turn, 1 tr in each of 6 stitches, 5 half treble (thread over, draw through stitch, draw through 2 loops, and keep last one on needle), draw through all stitches on hook together (this will now be referred to as a "tuft"), 1 tr in each of next 7 stitches, 1 tuft, 1 tr in each of next 3 stitches, 1 tr, 1 ch, 1 tr, all in chain stitch in centre of former row, 1 tr in each of next 3 stitches, 1 tuft, 7 treble, 1 tuft, 7 treble.

4th Row.—2 chain to turn, 1 d c in each tr to centre, where make 1 d c, 1 ch, 1 d c in chain stitch, then 1 d c in each stitch to end.

5th Row.—3 ch to turn, 1 tr in each d c to centre, 1 tr, 1 ch, 1 tr in chain, then 1 tr in each stitch to end.

6th Row.—Like 4th.

7th Row.—Like 3rd. You will have 7 tr each side of centre. Work on in this way, increasing in centre, and working through back thread of stitches until you

have 22 rows. Break off. In the 11th and 19th rows you will add 1 more tuft, with 7 tr between each side of centre.

Edge.—28 ch, 1 d c in each stitch down right side of bib, 4 chain, then *miss 1 stitch, 1 tr in next, 1 ch. Repeat from *, taking through both threads across foot, making 1 tr, 1 ch, 1 tr in centre as usual. At end of foot make 3 ch, and work 1 d c in each stitch up left side, 31 chain.

2nd Row.—Turn, 1 tr in 5th chain from needle, then 1 chain, 1 tr, alternately all around to end of chain, making 1 ch, 1 tr extra at 3 corner points, and putting the treble into each treble at foot.

3rd Row.—Turn, with 3 ch, *1 tr, 1 ch, 1 tr, in next tr stitch, 1 tr in next tr stitch. Repeat from * around bib and across end, then alternately 1 ch, 1 tr, missing 1 stitch between, around neck and opposite end of strap.

4th Row.—Now work all around entire bib, alternately 1 d c, 1 picot (3 chain, 1 d c in 1st stitch), 1 d c in chain between trebles, and 1 d c on single treble.

Thread narrow ribbon through holes at neck.

No. 47.

FIRST STAYS.

Materials.—1 oz. 4-ply fingering wool, and No. 9 bone needles.

Cast on 36 stitches, and knit 1 row plain, 1 row purl.

Pattern: 1st row.—Knit 2, wool over needle, knit 2 together, plain to end of row.

2nd Row.—Plain.

3rd Row.—Knit 2, wool over needle, knit 2 tog., purl to end of row.

4th Row.—Purl to last 4 stitches, which knit plain.

Repeat these 4 rows 8 times more.

Work on in the same manner, except alter the commencement of top row to form the armhole in this way.

39th Row.—Knit 1, knit 2 tog., wool over needle, knit 2 tog., plain to end. Commence each top row in this way until you reach the 57th row. Now work the 4th row, then 4 rows of pattern with no decrease, then increase at top to complete arm-space in this way.

67th Row.—Knit 2, wool over needle, knit plain to end. Increase to 83rd row.

84th Row.—Like 4th. Repeat the 4 pattern rows without increase 14 times. Now work from 39th to 84th rows to form 2nd arm-space. Repeat the 4 pattern rows 9 times, and cast off.

Make shoulder straps of ribbon. Sew narrow ribbon on each side of back to tie, placing one set about 2 inches from edge, so that stays will overlap. Add buttons at waist-line.

No. 48. **INFANT'S SINGLET.**

Materials.—1 oz. 2-ply fingering wool, No. 7 bone needles.

Cast on 60 stitches, and knit in ribbing of 2 plain, 2 purl, for $9\frac{1}{2}$ inches.

Now knit 6 rows (3 ribs) plain. Cast off all but 12 stitches. On these 12 knit backward and forward until shoulder-strap is 4 inches long. Cast off.

Work other side of singlet in the same way. Sew shoulder-straps in place, then sew up sides, leaving space for armholes.

Around neck work a row of trebles, taking 3 stitches together at corners.

Next Row.—1 tr in treble, *1 chain, miss 1 treble, 1 tr in next. Repeat from * all around.

Edge.—1 d c in treble, 4 tr in next treble, alternately all around. For sleeves, work only 1 row of treble and 3 tr, 1 d c, alternately all around. Thread ribbon at neck.

No. 49. **KNITTED SINGLET.**

Materials.—1 oz. 2-ply fingering or Ivorine wool, No. 8 bone needles.

Cast on 54 stitches and knit 1 plain row.

First 3 Rows.—Knit 3, purl 3 alternately.

Next 3 Rows.—Purl 3, knit 3 alternately.

Repeat these 6 rows until work is about 9 inches long. Cast off all but 12 stitches, and continue the pattern of these 12 stitches until shoulder-strap is about 4 inches long. Make other side the same. Sew shoulder-straps to

body, and sew up sides, leaving space for armholes. Around neck work 1 tr in each treble, taking 3 tog. at corners.

Next Row.—1 tr, 1 ch, in alternate stitches, taking 3 tog. at corners.

Edge.—1 d c in 1 treble, 4 tr in next treble, all around. Work around armholes 1 row of trebles, and edge the same as neck. Thread ribbon through holes at neck.

No. 50. **KNITTED MODESTIE.**

Materials.—2 oz. 4-ply fingering wool, No. 7 bone needles.

Cast on 62 stitches, and knit in ribbing of 2 plain, 2 purl, for 7 rows.

Next Row.—Knit 1, *wool over, knit 2 tog. Repeat from *, then 4 rows ribbing.

Next Row.—Knit 36, turn, and knit 10, turn, and knit 14, turn, and knit 18. Continue in this way, taking 4 more stitches each time until all are knitted.

Now knit backward and forward until work measures 8 inches at sides. Cast off 2 stitches at **beginning** of each row until reduced to 38, then knit on without decreasing for $2\frac{1}{2}$ inches, then cast on 2 stitches at **end** of each row until you have 62 on needle again. Now knit on until the same length at sides up to the ribbing.

Work 4 rows of ribbing, 1 row of holes, then 7 rows of ribbing as beginning of back. Cast off, sew up legs. Around legs work 1 row of treble, then a row of shells. Slip into 1st stitch, *3 chain, 3 tr, all in same place; miss 2 treble, slip stitch into next. Repeat from * to end.

Thread ribbon at waist and knees.

No. 51. **KNITTED MODESTIE.**

Materials.—2 oz. 4-ply fingering wool, No. 7 bone needles.

Cast on 60 stitches, and knit in ribbing of 2 plain, 2 purl, for 7 rows.

Next Row.—Knit 1, *wool over, knit 2 tog. Repeat

from * to end, last stitch singly. Then 5 more rows of ribbing.

Pattern: 1st Row.—Plain.

2nd Row.—Purl.

3rd Row.—Knit 1, then knit 2 tog. to end of row, last stitch singly.

4th Row.—Knit 2, *knit the loop which lies before the next stitch, then the stitch. Repeat from * to end of row.

Repeat these 4 rows until work measures 9 inches.

Now cast off at **beginning** of each row (otherwise knitting as usual), until stitches are reduced to 36.

Knit $2\frac{1}{2}$ inches without decrease, then cast on 2 stitches at **end** of each row until you have 60 on needle again. Work on these 60 until you have the same amount of rows of dots as on front.

Next Row.—Keeping pattern correct, knit over 36 stitches, turn, and knit over 12, turn, and knit over 16. Keep on in this manner, taking 4 extra stitches each time, until all are worked, then knit 5 rows of ribbing, 1 row of holes, and 7 rows of ribbing, as at top of front, and cast off.

Pick up stitches around leg, and knit in ribbing of 2 plain, 2 purl, for 6 rows. Cast off. Sew up sides. Thread ribbon through holes at waist.

No. 52.

KNITTED SINGLET.

(Open.)

Materials.—1 oz. 2-ply fingering or Ivorine wool, No. 8 bone needles.

Cast on 132 stitches, and knit 2 plain rows.

3rd Row.—Knit 10, then alternately purl 2, knit 2, until only 10 remain. Knit these plain.

4th Row.—All plain. Repeat 3rd and 4th rows until work is 7 inches long.

Yoke.—Knit 40 stitches plain, turn and knit backward and forward for 24 rows (12 ribs). Cast off from front 30 stitches and knit remaining 10 backwards and forwards for 14 ribs. Cast off.

Knit next 52 stitches (back of shirt) plain for 24 rows (12 ribs). Cast off. Now knit remaining 40 plain for 24 rows. Cast off 30 from front and knit on remaining 10 for 28 rows (14 ribs) and cast off. Crochet little edge around neck and armhole.

No. 53. **KNITTED MODESTIE.**

Materials.—2 oz. 4-ply fingering wool. No. 7 bone needles.

Cast on 60 stitches and knit in ribbing of 2 plain, 2 purl, for 7 rows.

Next Row.—Knit 1, *wool over, knit 2 tog. Repeat from * to end; 4 more rows of ribbing.

Pattern.—Knit 3, purl 3, alternately to end for 3 rows. Purl 3, knit 3, alternately to end for 3 rows. Repeat these 6 rows until work measures 7 inches at side.

Next Row.—Cast off 2 stitches at **beginning** of each row (otherwise keeping pattern correct), until reduced to 36 stitches. Now work without decreasing for 2½ inches, then cast on 2 at **end** of each row until you have 60 stitches on the needle again.

Now knit until work is the same length from here to ribbing, as on the front part.

Next Row.—Knit on (in pattern) over 36 stitches, turn, slip 1st stitch, and work to the 12th, turn, and work over 15, turn, and work over 18. Continue in this way until all are knitted off, then work 4 rows of ribbing, then the row of holes, then 7 rows of ribbing, as at beginning.

Cast off. Sew up sides.

Crochet 1 row of treble around legs, then a row of shells, thus—1 d c in treble, *miss 1, 4 tr in next, miss 1, 1 d c in next. Repeat from * to end.

Thread ribbon at waist and knees.

No. 54. **KNITTED MODESTIE.**

Materials.—2½ oz. 5-ply fingering wool, No. 7 bone needles.

Cast on 64 stitches, and knit in ribbing of 2 plain, 2 purl, for 8 rows.

Next Row.—Knit 1, *wool over needle, knit 2 tog. Repeat to end, last stitch singly.

Pattern: 1st Row.—Purl.

2nd Row.—Knit 1, slip 1, alternately to end of row.

3rd Row.—Purl.

4th Row.—Slip 1, knit 1, alternately to end of row.

Repeat these 4 rows until work measures 9 inches.

Now cast off 2 stitches at **beginning** of each row until reduced to 40 stitches, then knit on (keeping pattern correct all the time) for $2\frac{1}{2}$ inches without decrease; then cast on 2 stitches at **end** of each row until you have 64 stitches on needle again.

Now work until the same length from here to ribbing.

Work a row of holes, then 8 rows of ribbing, sew up the sides, and work a row of shells around legs.

No. 55. **KNITTED KNICKERS.**

(First Size.)

Materials.—2 oz. 4-ply fingering wool. No. 8 bone needles.

Cast on 68 stitches, and knit in ribbing of 2 plain, 2 purl, for 5 rows

Next Row.—*Knit 1, wool over, knit 2 tog. Repeat from *. Now 5 more rows of ribbing.

Next Row.—Knit 8, turn, purl 8 (slip 1st stitch all the turns), turn, knit 16, turn, purl 16. Continue in this way alternately plain and purl rows, and adding 8 more stitches every time you go forward until all are worked. The last time there will be only 4 stitches. Now knit backward and forward for 2 inches from ribbing at short side, which is the front. Now increase 1 at back every 6th row until you have 74 on the needle, then knit on until work at back is $9\frac{1}{2}$ inches. Knit 2 tog. at each end of every row until reduced to 52, then take a pair of No. 12 needles and knit in ribbing of 2 plain, 2 purl for 8 rows, and cast off. Work other side to correspond. You will first knit 1 plain row, then begin by purl 8, turn, and knit 8, purl 16, turn, and knit 16. Sew backs and fronts together, then the legs. Thread elastic at waist.

CROCHET SHAWL.

Materials.—8 oz. 4-ply, and 3½ oz. 2-ply fingering wool, 1 ball crochet silk, large hook (slightly thicker than a slate pencil) and No. 10 hook for silk edge.

Commence with 128 chain, turn, and draw wool through 4 stitches, then through all 5 loops together, 1 chain. This forms one star. For 2nd star * draw thread through eye (hole made by 1 chain), then through the back thread of last stitch of previous star, then through next 2 chain, and draw through all 5 loops together, 1 chain. Repeat from *. At end omit the chain stitch and make 1 treble in final chain.

2nd Row.—Turn with 2 chain, 1 d c in space before star, then 1 d c in top of every star and in every eye to end.

3rd Row.—Turn with 3 chain, and work as for 1st row, taking through both threads of the 2 double-crochet stitches.

Repeat these 2 rows until shawl is square.

Border.—Take 2-ply wool, and make 1 treble in first stitch, *1 ch, miss 1, 1 tr, 1 ch, 1 tr, all in next stitch, 1 chain, miss 1, 1 tr in next. Repeat from * all around, increasing at corners always.

2nd Row.—1 tr, 1 ch, 1 tr, in each single treble, and 3 tr in centre of each group.

3rd Row.—*1 tr in centre of each group, 1 ch, 3 tr in centre of each 3 treble, 1 ch. Repeat from * all around.

4th Row.—Like 2nd. 5th Row.—Like 3rd. 6th Row.—Like 2nd.

7th Row.—1 tr in centre of each group, and 2 tr, 1 ch, 2 tr, in centre of each 3 treble.

8th Row.—1 d c on each single tr, and 5 tr in centre of each 3 treble.

Edge.—With silk work 1 d c, 1 ch all around, omitting the chain at each side of double-crochet stitch.

KNITTED SHAWL.

Materials.—6 oz. 4-ply, and 4 oz. 1-ply super-fingering wool. No. 7 bone needles. No. 10 crochet hook, and 1 ball crochet silk.

Cast on 162, and knit 1 plain row. Knit the shawl loosely throughout.

Pattern: 1st Row.—Knit 1, *purl 3 tog., then knit 1, purl 1, knit 1, all in next stitch. Repeat from * to last 1, which knit. 2nd Row.—Knit 1, purl 160, knit 1.

3rd Row.—Knit 1, *knit 1, purl 1, knit 1, all in one stitch, purl 3 tog. Repeat from * to end, where knit 1.

4th Row.—Like 2nd.

Repeat these 4 rows until shawl is square. Cast off loosely.

Border.—Take 2-ply wool and hook, and work 1 row of treble all around shawl, making 3 tr in each corner stitch. Join.

2nd Row.—*1 tr in each of 2 treble, 4 treble in next, withdraw hook, then put through 1st of 4 tr and loop of 4th, and draw wool through both loops together, 1 ch. Repeat from * all around.

3rd Row.—1 tr in each treble and in each tuft.

4th Row.—*1 tr in one treble, 3 tr in next treble. Repeat from * all around; at corners make 3 tr on each of 3 centre stitches.

5th Row.—3 tr in each single tr, and 1 tr in centre of each group.

Repeat last 2 rows twice more, then work 4th (increasing at corners, each row).

11th Row.—1 double crochet in each single treble, and 5 treble in centre of each group.

Edge with silk if desired, 1 d c, with 1 ch between in each stitch, except over double crochet.



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
