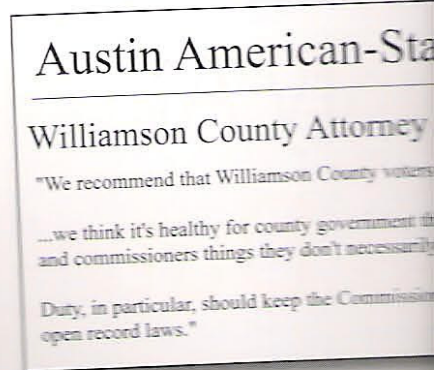

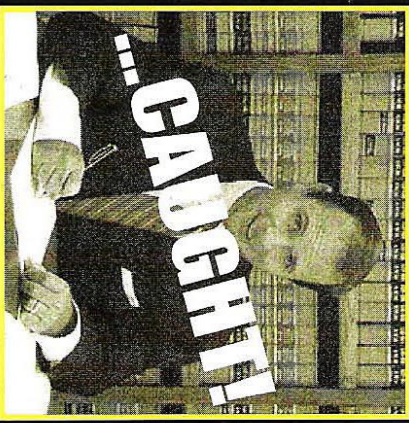

The truth is that he is an inexperienced **PERSONAL INJURY LAWYER** who has never represented abused and neglected children. He has never worked in the juvenile justice system. He has never represented victims of family violence. And he has never prosecuted a single crime in his career. This is quite a record for someone who wants us to entrust him with the job of protecting our families.\*
