

a note to parents

This pack is intended to help the young schoolchild to master the basic skills of handwriting. Its aim is to supplement school learning, not replace it, and for this reason, the form of letters used here are the same as those used in the great majority of schools today.

Use the programs alongside the workbook. While the child is working through the first half of the book, the program LETTERS can be used to demonstrate the formation of any lower case letter. Towards the end of that section the program PRACTICE can be brought into use. This gives additional copying practice. There are a number of exercises written into the program, but you will find it useful to

type in particular words and phrases that interest the child.

CAPITALS is the demonstrator program for capital letters, for use with the second part of the workbook. PRACTICE will again be useful at this time. Further copying practice can be gained from LABELS, which helps the child to design a variety of labels, book plates and name tags.

If you have a printer attached to your computer, then the screens produced by LABELS can be printed out.

SUPERBUG is a game. Its purpose is to bring Superbug and his friends to life for the children who will use this pack.


