






## INTRODUCTION.

---

IN compiling and arranging the following DIRECTORY, a work which the Editor hopes will prove acceptable to the Professors and Lovers of Music in general, he has taken every care to avoid offence to the Profession; carefully avoiding, in the arrangement, any thing which might be construed into a judgment on the abilities of the several persons whom he has inserted: intending to be strictly alphabetical, he has arranged persons of the same Sir Name, according to the initials of their Christian Names, excepting some few instances, where persons of the same Family have requested to be otherwise placed. Those whose Christian Names are unknown to the Editor are necessarily placed last.

A taste for the sublime Choruses by Handel and other composers, has given rise to a number of Societies, where this kind of Music is regularly practised by a respectable set of Amateurs, it has been thought a desirable thing to have such Amateurs inserted.

Great pains have been taken to learn the various Places at which the several persons have of late performed, as well as the Societies which they have belonged to, the insertion of which will, it is hoped, apologize with gentlemen of the Profession, for the introduction of so many Amateurs and Performers of inferior note; for some such there undoubtedly must be in so large a collection of names.

In a work so novel and extensive, it cannot be expected but considerable errors have passed, particularly in the Addresses, as no doubt many of the persons have changed their residence, while the materials have been arranging and preparing for the press; the DIRECTORY will not however be found altogether useless in these cases, for the Residence of a person may generally be obtained by inquiry at the place from whence he is recently removed, which place as well as the removal, may without this Directory, be unknown to persons who on friendship or business may wish to call or direct to them.

No inconvenience can, it is hoped, arise to the reader from the Abbreviations which are used in order to bring the work into a moderate compass, as the explanation in any case may be instantly had by a reference to the Table at the end, where every abbreviation, which is not exceedingly common, is explained as they occur in alphabetical order. In recapitulating the Societies and Places where persons have performed, the order is observed as near as possible, in which the said societies are set down in the list which precedes the Directory.

To distinguish the performers of airs, or principal vocal parts, from the Choral performers, the word *prin* is prefixed, as *prin Bass*, *prin Tenor*, and *prin Alto*, the principal Trebles are distinguished by *Soprano*, while the choral part is denominated *Canto*; in like manner, Leaders or principal instrumental performers in a band, are distinguished as *prin Violin*, &c. in some cases performers of *concertos*.

It will be observed, that several persons mentioned in this Directory are now abroad in Italy or other parts, whither they have lately gone; the new Theatre at Philadelphia in America, has lately drawn a number of musical persons from this country who are mentioned herein.

The reader will notice that persons in this Directory may not at present belong to, or perform at every place which is affixed to their name, only that they have so belonged or performed within a few years. Likewise, that some of the Societies and Performances referred to are now extinct, or have ceased.

The Editor is in possession of the Names, and some of the requisite particulars of several hundred musical persons, who are not inserted in this edition, some of whom he is personally acquainted with, but is ignorant of their address. Many of these, with other names, he hopes to introduce in the next impression, should this attempt meet the approbation of the musical world.

The Editor cannot here omit expressing his grateful thanks to his numerous friends, for their kind information and assistance, in collecting and completing the Directory which he has now the honour of submitting to the candour of the public.



A H I S T O R Y   O F  
T H E   A C A D E M Y  
O F  
A N C I E N T   M U S I C.

---

THE happy and refined taste for Music which prevailed amongst the Nobility and Gentry of this Kingdom in the beginning of the present Century, induced, in the Year 1710 (memorable for *Handel's* first appearance amongst us) a number of the most eminent composers and performers in London, to concert a plan of an Academy for the study and practice of vocal and instrumental Music, which was no sooner announced than it met the countenance and support of the principal persons of rank.

Amongst the foremost in this undertaking were Mr. *John Christopher Pepusch*, Mr. *John Ernest Galleard*, an excellent composer and performer on the Oboe, Mr. *Bernard Gates* of the Queen's Chapel, *Henry Needler*, &c.

The Society was founded at the Crown and Anchor Tavern, in the Strand, and commenced with the formation of a Library of the most celebrated compositions which could be procured in this and other Countries, manuscript as well as printed, which was considerably augmented by voluntary donations from several Members of the Society. The first Subscription required from the Members was only Half-a-Guinea each, which, with the Gentlemen of the Chapel Royal and St. Paul's Choirs, enabled the Academy to open, and their performances met the distinguished approbation which they so well deserved.

Thus the Academy continued, countenanced not only by the Nobility and Gentry, but by the greatest Masters of the Age, *Abbate Steffani*, who was a Member, from time to time transmitted from Hanover the most valuable of his works to the Academy as soon as they were composed, *Tosi* frequently sung, and *Antonio Lotti* enriched the performances of the Academy by many of his original compositions; even *Handel* and *Signor Germiniani* lent the Academy their support, the latter frequently honouring it with his own exquisite performance.

The most perfect harmony continued to prevail amongst the Members of the Academy till the Year 1728, when an unlucky

lucky circumstance seemed to threaten the very existence of the Society. The cause was as follows:

An Italian Madrigal "*In una Siepe ombrosa*" being selected by one of the Members from a book of Duets and other pieces, composed and published at Venice by Antonio Lotti, Veneto Organista della ducale di san Mareo, for performance, it was afterwards discovered that the Madrigal in question had been produced in Manuscript to the Academy, by Dr. Green, as an original composition of his Friend Giovani Bononcini, who was then a Member of the Academy. On this Bononcini complained to the Soiety, and loudly accused Lotti of plagiary, asserting that he himself had composed the said Madrigal 30 Years before. The inquiry however which followed on these remonstrances ended to the honour of *Lotti* and the disgrace of *Bononcini*, who was clearly proved to be an impostor.

This affair, so disgraceful to Bononcini, destroyed his interest with the Marlborough Family, in which his behaviour had for some time been inconsistent with strict honour.

Dr. Green, who had introduced the Madrigal as his friend Bononecini's composition, could yet hardly be convinced of his error; therefore, finding himself quite singular in his opinion, and being perhaps slighted by his associates on that account, he withdrew from the Society, and took with him the Boys of St. Paul's Choir, of whom he was then Master.

Dr. Green, after his secession, by the assistance of Mr. Festing, the first Violin of the King's Band, and his own Boys, established a Concert at the Devil Tavern, Temple Bar, called the Apollo's Society, from the Room in which it was performed. The joke among Academicians on this occasion was, that Dr. Green was gone to the Devil.

The Academy continued to flourish under the influence and direction of Dr. Pepusch, already mentioned as one of the Founders, till the Year 1732, at which time the opposition to Mr. Handel, from a part of the Nobility having greatly reduced his circumstances, the Academy performed the Oratorio of Esther, which he had some Years before composed for the Duke of Chandos, which performance was received with such applause that the Composer conceived the idea of performing this species of Musical Composition during the Lent Season, from which he afterwards reaped such great advantage; but for this circumstance the Public might have never known many of the valuable compositions of this great Master.

In the same Year, Mr. Gates, Master of the Boys at the Chapel Royal, conceiving some dislike, withdrew from the Academy, and of course it lost the assistance of his Boys also.

The Academy being thus left without Boys to sing the Treble

Treble Parts, it was determined to educate four Boys at the expence of the Academy, under the direction of *Dr. Pepusch*, who were to be instructed in English Grammar, Writing and Arithmetic, and to be taught to sing, accompany on the harpsichord, and to compose; for which Dr. Pepusch was to receive 50 Guineas per Annum, £20. of which was intended to pay an Assistant under the Doctor, to take constant care of the Boys, £8. was designed for their Schooling, and the remaining £24. 10s. od. for contingent expences.----In order to support this additional expence, the number of Academicians was increased to 80, and at the same time their annual Subscription was raised to One Guinea and an Half; it being at the same time determined that if any Surplus may remain it should form a Fund for the encouragement of such Boys as should remain 7 Years in the Academy, and behave well.

*Dr. Pepusch* applied himself with great assiduity to the instruction of the Children there placed under his care, and altho' so indifferently paid, considering his great merit, he qualified several in succession as eminent Professors of the Science. *Dr. Cooke*, so well known for his eminent abilities and pleasing Compositions, whose death was so lately and sincerely regretted by all who had the pleasure of his acquaintance, was one of the Boys thus educated under *Dr. Pepusch*, and proved so apt a Scholar, that he at length succeeded his Master in conducting the Academy.

*Isaac Pierson*, son to the master of a charity school in Red Cross-Street, Cripplegate, being admitted into the Academy when seven years old, soon shewed marks of such an extraordinary genius, that Dr. Pepusch paid particular attention to his education, and in a few months Pierson was able to sing his part with accuracy; in less than a year he also obtained considerable dexterity on the organ, and this from the weakness of his fingers, he was unable to manage a strike, yet by the tremulous motion of two keys, he so well supplied that deficiency, that the discord arising therefrom was scarcely perceivable. *Dr. Pepusch* with a view of encouraging *Pierson*, made him an associate of his own son in his studies, and Pierson improved so much, that before he was nine years of age, he performed voluntaries on the organ, with the execution and judgment of an experienced master; he was also taught the violin, on which he was soon able with facility to execute the most difficult of Geminiani's concertos: from a progres so surprising, and from his amiable disposition, his friends, and in particular his father, who was a lover of psalm-singing, or divine music, as he styled it, began to form the most flattering ideas of his future fame and success;

success; but unfortunately their hopes were frustrated by his death, when scarcely eighteen years of age.

But to return to the Academy: in March 1734, it was determined by the Academicians that no new instrumental performer should be admitted till after he had performed his part in a piece of music before three of the managers. In 1735, it was agreed to admit auditor members, and in March 1737 it was resolved that every member might introduce three ladies, to hear the performance, but no ladies to be admitted but such as the members introduced.

In the autumn of 1738, Mr. Handel intending to perform some *Concertos* and sonatas during the following winter, requested of the managers of the Academy, the assistance of their boys, which request was cheerfully and unanimously agreed to, and Mr. Howard, the assistant, was directed to accompany and take care of the boys. The resolution on this occasion concluded with observing that this favour was granted from the great regard which the Academicians entertained for Mr. Handel, and was therefore not to be considered as a precedent. A similar request was made by Mr. Handel in the year 1740, and complied with. It appears that, in October 1749, the Academicians passed several laws for regulating their society, some of which were, that auditors should be admitted, in future, on paying one guinea entrance, and a guinea and a half yearly. It was also agreed that every new professional member should pay one guinea entrance, that the gentlemen of the Chapel Royal Choir should have free admission to the orchestra of the Academy at every performance, and the Treasurer and Secretary were then also appointed. In 1752 the Academy sustained an irreparable loss in the death of Dr. Pepusch, its chief supporter, and whose services ended but with his life, for he generously bequeathed to the Academy the most valuable part of his library, which was very extensive.

After the death of Dr. Pepusch, the Academicians entertained an idea of giving the Academy more the form of a Concert, and of engaging some of the most eminent singers, and performers on particular instruments, hoping thus to derive assistance, as a Concert, from persons who might be apt to disregard it as an Academy. Here however they were involved in fresh difficulties, for the great increase of places of public amusement, made it impossible, with their present income, to continue a competition in procuring eminent performers. The subscription of the auditors was therefore advanced, and the number of Concerts was diminished.

On this plan the Academy continued to flourish for several years, and received assistance occasionally from persons of the greatest

greatest eminence in the profession; during part of which interval Mr. Trudway, a gentleman of some fortune, led the band he was succeeded in that situation by Mr. David Richards, and followed by Mr. Bartholemew.

In February, 1783, a Committee was appointed to examine the several Laws and regulations since the institution of the Academy, and prepare a new Code as agreeable to the original intention of its Founders as the present temper of the Time would admit; which Code was submitted to and confirmed by a general Meeting in March following.

In September 1784, the Academy removed from the Crown and Anchor Tavern in the Strand, to Freemason's Hall, in Great Queen Street, Lincoln's Inn Fields, where it is at present held.----In April 1788, it was determined to increase the number of Subscribers to 280 and to admit Ladies as Subscribers to the Performances. Hitherto it seems Ladies were not admitted, unless introduced by the Members of the Academy.

The Orchestra about this time was much improved, but the Subscriptions afterwards falling short, it was, in November 1789, resolved at a general Meeting of the Academicians to contract the Performances, and to place them, for that Season, more fully under the direction of a professional Gentleman of eminence, subject however to the control of the President and Committee.

On this Occasion Dr. Arnold, Dr. Cooke and Dr. Dupuis were severally nominated, when Dr. Arnold was chosen by very large Majority, and was accordingly invested with the entire direction and management of the Orchestra, the hiring of Instruments, engaging Performers, and every other matter relative to the Performance; the Committee pledging themselves to indemnify Dr. A. for the expences attending the same. In April following the Academy's Library was placed under the care of Dr. Arnold and Mr. Robert Smith, who were appointed Librarians, and Fiermin Joseph Dorion their Assistant.

The Performance continued during the Years 1790 and 1791, under the Direction of Dr. Arnold, with increasing credit, and greatly to the satisfaction of the Academicians and Subscribers.

In April 1792, it was determined, at the request of several of the Subscribers, to advance the Subscription to Five Guineas per annum, on which occasion a circular letter was addressed by the committee to each of the several subscribers. The Orchestra was then very much improved, to the state it is in at present; a description of which it is hoped may be acceptable,

Freemason's Hall being occasionally ued for other purposes than music, the whole of the Orchestra is so constructed as to be removed;

removed. At one end of the room, which is in form of a parallelogram, is a platform of the whole width of the room, rising about five feet from the floor, in the front of which is a rising about two feet and a half high, with a part in the middle projecting about two feet into the room, in which the principal vocal performers, usually about six or eight in number, sit. Immediately behind this is a bench, the whole breadth of the room, on the left-hand end of which the Tenors, eight in number, sit; in the middle of it the Treble boys, about eight, sit; and on the right-hand end, sit eight Basses. In front of the several vocal performers' seats, are very convenient places for lodging the books, when not in use: a convenience wanted in most Orchestras. Behind the Trebles, at a convenient distance, sits the Conductor, at the keys of the Organ and Harpsichord, with his back to the auditors. At his left-hand, on the same level, but rather before him, is a Violoncello and a double Bass; and further to his left, two other Violoncellos. To the Conductor's right hand there is also a Violoncello and a double Bass, and further to the right hand is a seat, behind the Bass, on which eight Alto singers are placed: the performers last mentioned are arranged in a circular form, falling back in the middle, so that every one can conveniently see the Conductor: behind them is a second platform, rising four or five feet, having a circular front, in the centre of which, above the keys, and immediately before the Conductor, stands the Leader, having on his right-hand seven first Violins, and on his left the same number of seconds, each of whom can conveniently see both the Leader and the Conductor. Behind this is a third platform, having in its centre, immediately behind the Leader, three Bassoons. On the right-hand end of this platform, behind the second Violins, are placed four Violas, and further to the right two Horns. On the left-hand end, behind the first Violins, are placed two Oboes or Flutes. Further to the left are Stands for additional Violins or other Instruments. This Platform, like the last, has a circular Front, so that every Performer on it can distinctly see the Conductor and Leader. In the Corners of the Room are two Platforms rising still higher, and completing the Space left by the circular Form of the other Platforms. That to the left is occupied by the Drums, and that on the right by two Trumpets. The Organ, which is not moveable, occupies a Nich in the centre of the end of the Hall, the front of which is even with the Wall. Immediately behind the Bassoons, above whom it rises a considerable height, and has a very fine appearance. The long Keys which pass under the upper part of the Orchestra are disengaged, and re-

moved when the Orchestra is taken down, when short ones may be substituted if the Organ is wanted for the Room, or a Scene placed before it, and hides the whole entirely, completing that end of the Room in uniformity with the other.

The Ornaments of the Room and Orchestra are simple, but possess considerable elegance.

The Audience are placed on a range of Seats behind each other, along the middle of the Room, at the ends of which Seats is a considerable Space for passing and repassing, from which Passage a range of two or three Seats rise above each other, near the side Walls of the Room, and completes the whole.

The Orchestra belonging to the Academy is so well disposed, and so complete in its Construction, that the Editor wished much to give a Drawing of it in the Directory, which would communicate a more perfect Idea of the arrangement and proportions than can be done by Words. With this View he lately procured a Drawing, but found the engraving of it would have delayed the Publication longer than could be judged prudent in the present advanced Stage of the Musical Season.

The Library of the Academy occupies a Room adjoining the Orchestra, and is stored with a very large Collection, complete for the Orchestra, of the best Music of almost every kind, which the Countries of Italy, Germany, France, Spain, the Netherlands and England have produced in ancient or modern Times.

The general arrangement of the Academy's Music is into Categories for the Church, the Theatre and the Chamber. The first Head includes Masses, Motets, Anthems, Hymns, Psalms; the second, Oratorios, Masques, Serenades, Overtures, and Concertos; and the third Madrigals, Duettos and Cantatas, every of which Species of Music is in its turn exhibited at the Academy in a very superior Style.

Altho' the Academy was principally designed for the exhibition of Ancient Music, and from thence took its Name, its performances are at present not deficient in new and modern Compositions. Indeed much of the Music in their Library of the 16th and 17th Centuries, is as new to us as it was to its Auditors on its first performance: it appears that the Musicians apply the Epithet "Antient" to Compositions of the 16th Century.

The Performances are at present divided into two Acts, which generally conclude with that celebrated Canon *Non nobis* &c. The Words of each Performance are printed in a neat Octavo Pamphlet, containing a List of the whole Band, with

Name of the Gentleman who selected the Performance, &c.---  
The Performances at present are eight in Number. The Vocal Performers are very select, and the instrumental Performers well chosen. The Band is very ably led by *Mr. Solomon* and is conducted by *Dr. Arnold*, with peculiar Spirit, derived from his Great Master *Handel*, under whom Dr. A. was a Pupil.

The Subscribers are of the most respectable Cast, a very large proportion of whom are Ladies, and always appear full dressed, which, in aid of their native Beauty, has the most charming effect imaginable.

The Royal Society of Musicians, (Ro So Mu) established in the Year 1738, for the support of decayed Professors of Music, residing in London, their Widows, &c. to which Fund a part of the profits from Musical Performances in Westminster Abbey are applied.

The New Musical Fund, (New Mu Fu) established in the Year 1786, for the same purpose as the Society mentioned, but on a more enlarged plan, extending to Country Members.

The Choral Fund, (Cho Fu) established in the Year 1791, for the practice of Choral Music, collecting a Choral Library, and for the maintenance of its indigent Members, their Widows, &c. residing in England.

Portland Chapel Society, (Por Cha So) a Society of Musical Persons, who perform Anthems and Services at Portland Chapel, Mary-le-bone, and meet every Sunday Evening, to practise Oratorios and Church Music.

*Long Acre Society*, (Lo Ac So) which met weekly, for some Years, in Long Acre, to practise Sacred Music. In 1789 it was united to a Society at Surry Chapel.

*Titchfield Chapel Society*, (Tit Cha So) which performs Anthems, &c. at Titchfield Chapel, Mary-le-bone.

*The Handelian Society*, (Han So) which for some years met weekly, in Wych-Street, for practising Choral Music, (principally Handel's). In 1791, it was united with the *Choral Fund*.

*The Cecilian Society*, (Cec So) which meets weekly, for practising of Choral Music.

*Surry Chapel Society*, (Sur Cha So) which met weekly at Surry Chapel, Southwark, for practising Sacred Music. In 1791 it was united with the *Choral Fund*.

*The Glee Club*. (Gle Cl) a Society for performing Glees, &c. many of which are the composition of its own Members.

*The Madrigal Society*, (Mad So) which meets at the Globe Tavern, Fleet-Street, for performing Madrigals, Glees, &c.

*The Anacreontic Society*, (Ana So) which met at the Crown and Anchor Tavern, in the Strand, the festivities of which were heightened by a very Select Band.

*The Amicable Society*, (Ami So). A respectable Subscription Concert, held at the Paul's Head Tavern, Cat-eaton Street.

*The Academy of Ancient Music*, (Acad) a very ancient and respectable Society, which meets at Free Masons' Hall, Great Queen-Street, of which see a History in the preceding Pages.

*The Concert of Ancient Music*, (Conc) commonly called the King's Concert, held in Tottenham-Street.

*Solomons Concert*, (Sol Con) A respectable Subscription Concert, held in the Great Room, Hanover-Square.

*The Professional Concert, (Prof Con).* A Subscription Concert which was also held in the great Room, Hanover Square.

*The Vocal Concert, (Voc Con)* or Harrison and Knyvet's Subscription Concert, in Wills's Room, for Glee Canzonets, &c.

*The King's Band, (Kin Ba).* A number of Gentlemen Performers, belonging to his Majesty's household.

*The Queen's Band, (Que Ba).* Ditto, belonging to Her Majesty's Household.

*The Band of the first Regiment of Guards, (Gua 1st Reg).*

Ditto. . . 2d. (Gua 2d Reg).

Ditto. . . 3d. (Gua 3d Reg).

Ditto. Horse Guards, (Hor Gua). Whitehall.

the Performances by the Druay Lane Company,  
both at Drury Lane and in the Hay-market. The  
same is to be observed of the Oratorios.


