Preface

HIS small book is not intended to be a full history of the 7th Battalion C.E.F., but merely a short narrative of its career during the Great War, set down in the most condensed form so that those who served with the 7th may have some record of that service. One can only hope that the real history of the regiment will be written one day by a more competent hand.

If the part from August, 1914, to the end of April, 1915, is rather more detailed than the rest, it is because it has been written from personal experience.

From the end of April, 1915, until demobilisation, I am indebted for very much of the material to the account that appeared in the last number of *The Listening Post*, and have followed Rudyard Kipling's excellent advice:

> "When 'Omer smote 'is bloomin' lyre He'd 'eard men sing by land an' sea An' what he thought he might require 'E went an' took—the same as me!"

The complete casualty list at the end will be of pathetic interest to all who followed the fortunes of the 7th Battalion, and for the rest I take as my motto:

"Ce que je scais je scais mal, mais ce que ignore j'ignore parfaitement."

The 7th Batt. sailed with this complement of officers, a number of the subalterans being supernumeraries. All these supernumeraries were absorbed within three months of the regiment's arrival in France.

Those marked with an asterisk (*) were killed in action.

ALCARTIER! What a thrill the name of that wide dusty valley brings to the man of 1914, for it was there that Canada as a fighting nation was born; it was on the banks of the Jacques Cartier River that the first Canadian Division was formed and from there that the men of the 7th Batt. of the Canadian Expeditionary Force marched to their ship to help make history on the fields of Flanders.

The hot sticky days of August, 1914, saw riflemen from the Duke of Connaught's Own, Fusiliers from the Irish Fusiliers of Canada, the Victoria Fusiliers and the Westminster Fusiliers, together with detachments from the Rocky Mountain Rangers from around Kamloops and a splendid draft from the Kootenays sinking their old identity to form a homogeneous whole in the 7th Batt. C.E.F.—the-1st British Columbia Regiment. The

With the exception of the Kootenay detachment, all these units were militia regiments of some standing. Their personnel had had, in some cases, very considerable training. Many of the officers and men had seen active service in different parts of the Empire, whilst part of the detachments of the Duke of Connaught's Own and the Victoria Fusiliers had been embodied and just served on strike duty for a year on Vancouver Island.

Just the same, the six short weeks that were spent at Valcartier were all too short as a preparation for war. Apart from the actual training which was highly necessary, there was the issuing of equipment, the attestation of the men and the settling into a camp that was in no way complete.

It never seemed possible to get more than one particular part of one's equipment at any one time, though this was no fault of the newly appointed quartermaster. Capt. J. MacMillan, whom someone described as "the best quartermaster since Moses." Innoculations exempted men when they were most wanted and, finally, endless inspections followed exhausting field days and tried the tempers of the best. The hot, sticky, dusty days were offset by the bitterly cold nights, when water froze in the basin and the lovely Maple trees on the Laurentians turned from green to red and from red to gold.

Canteens started up all through the big camp, run generally by French Canadians. Profits must have been enormous, as, wishing to get a regimental fund together, the 7th Batt. started a canteen for the benefit of its own men, charged prices that seemed to barely show a profit and cleared over \$1,000 nett in a little less than five weeks. With this money we bought our band instruments on arrival in England.

That Valcartier existed at all was due to the energy, initiative and driving force of the Minister of Militia, Colonel Sam Hughes, aided by Colonel Victor Williams; and, with all its imperfections, it was a very*creditable camp.

H.R.H. the Governor-General took a personal interest in everything to do with this big undertaking, not satisfying himself with stereotyped reviews, but following the troops on manoeuvres and even coming to our battalion headquarters on occasions afterwards and giving the officers the benefit of his experience and advice.

The command of the 7th Batt. was given to Major W. H. Hart-McHarg, a splendid rifle shot, a keen militiaman who had served in the ranks in the South African War and was a fine type of citizen and soldier. The secondin-command was Major V. W. Odlum, who had also served in South Africa, and the adjutancy was taken over by Capt. S. D. Gardner, an exceptionally well-trained officer with much active service and police experience to his credit.

Until December, 1914, the 7th Batt. remained an eight-company battalion, all training and organization being carried out on that model.

It is of passing interest to note that the following officers of the newly formed 7th Batt. were gazetted Justices of the Peace for the Province of Quebec in Army Order No. 441 for the purpose of the attestation of recruits:

On the 28th September, the 7th Batt. entrained for Quebec instead of marching, owing to the bad state of the roads, and embarked on board H.M.T. *Virginian* and for the next three days lay in the stream, watching others embark, looking longingly at the Heights of Abraham and signalling to the crowds that swarmed on the Dufferin Terrace.

A remarkable sight, these ships in the roadway, and a fitting setting for Canada making preparation for war.

On the morning of the 2nd October, the battalion woke up to find itself in Gaspé Bay, the huge bay filled with ships and along the horizon a bleak coast of low, cold hills.

On the 3rd the convoy sailed. Three lines in line ahead, eleven ships to a line and the whole under the command of Admiral R. Wemyss, R.N. The transport *Florizel* with the men from Newfoundland joined the convoy after we left Gaspé Bay, taking its place in the rear of Z column. The following was the order of our sailing:

No finer armada ever sailed the seas. Thirty-three thousand fighting men escorted by ships of the Royal Navy; and each morning on reveillé sounding, as far as the eye could see—and again beyond that horizon—the might of the British Empire was gathering towards the shores of Britain to fight her battles for the freedom of the world, and not as the Roman Legions of 2,000 years ago hurried home to save decaying Imperial Rome.

But impressive as was the fleet at sea, quite unforgettable is the arrival at Plymouth on the 14th October, 1914. Ship after ship steamed up past Plymouth Hoe, returning the cheers that came from the crowds thronging the Hoe and every other vantage point along the waterfront and passed to her moorings in the Hamoaze.

H.M.T. Virginian berthed astern of H.M.S. Tiger, and that night the proverbial hospitality of the Royal Navy excelled itself.

On the 15th, the 7th Batt. disembarked at 10 p.m., and, marching through Plymouth, entrained for Salisbury Plain. As the regiment marched through the darkened streets, the frivolous music hall songs, proverbial marching tunes of the British Army, were sung with such zest and enthusiasm that the windows and doors of every house were flung open as the inhabitants rushed to see Canada's first contingent on its way.

Perhaps the first songs sung may be of interest. "We Are the Boys from Canada" was a home-made regimental song; "Hold Your Hand Out, Naughty Boy" and "Henry the Eighth I am" were popular at the time in all the halls; "Tipperary" was becoming slightly vieux jeux. "There's a Hole in the Bottom of the Sea" with its subsequent verses, which are quite unprintable, was probably popular with many other regiments besides our own.

On the morning of the 16th October, the battalion arrived at West Down South and lived in tents with no floor boards and outside and all around a sea of mud. The health of the regiment remained excellent, however, and it was not until we moved into huts at Lark Hill that the men suffered in any way from sickness.

Lieut.-General E. A. H. Alderson, C.B., was given the command of the 1st Division on its arrival in England. He was a Suffolk man with a good active service record. Probably not a brilliant soldier, he was an excellent type of regimental officer; a hard working, hard riding, fox hunting, country squire type who cared for his men like he would for his own horses and hounds, and he was, in consequence, trusted and liked by the rank and file.

Brig.-General A. W. Currie was confirmed in the command of the 2nd Infantry Brigade, of which the 7th Batt. was a part, together with the 5th, 8th and 10th Batts.

On Saturday, 24th October, Lord Roberts, V.C., came and inspected the division. Straight as a dart, his kindly eye glancing down our ranks and taking in every detail, it was hard to believe that this was almost his last public appearance in England and that three weeks later he would be lying dead in France.

H.M. the King inspected the division early in November. He was accompanied by H.M. the Queen and Lord Kitchener. All went on foot through the mud down the lines. Lord Kitchener looked tired, old and inclined to corpulence. It was reported that he had no great faith in the fighting qualities of the Canadians and he may well have looked askance at the Ross rifle, but at the time there was no other weapon with which we could have been armed.

The Canadians were troops that he would have found a difficulty in understanding. There was a high educational standard and an independence of thought amongst the rank and file which made them formidable in the field, but political interference and appointments would have made it impossible for a man of his temper, ability and experience to work hand in glove with those at the back of the front.

Shortly after this inspection, we moved into huts at Lark Hill and the battalion was visited in consequence with considerable sickness. But the time soon passed in training and on the night of February 5th, 1915, we entrained for Avonmouth and the following morning sailed for France.

On the 4th February, His Majesty had again inspected the division and his farewell message was read to all ranks during the passage across the Channel:

"Officers, N.C.O.'s and Men: At the beginning of November, I had the pleasure of welcoming to the Mother Country this fine contingent from the Dominion of Canada, and now, after three months' training, I bid you God speed on your way to assist my army in the field.

"I am well aware of the discomforts that you have experienced from the inclement weather and abnormal rain, and I admire the cheerful spirit displayed by all ranks in facing and overcoming all difficulties.

"From all I have heard, and from what I have been able to see at today's inspection and march past, I am satisfied that you have made good use of the time spent on Salisbury Plain.

"By your willing and prompt rally to our common flag you have already earned the gratitude of the Motherland.

"By your deeds and achievements on the field of battle I am confident that you will emulate the example of your fellow-countryment in the South African War, and thus help to secure the triumph of our arms. I shall follow with pride and interest all your movement. I pray God may bless you and watch over you.

GEORGE R. AND I."

The battalion arrived off St. Nazaire and remained on board until the 8th February before being able to land, the entrance to the mouth of the River Loire being prevented by a high wind springing up which made the Bay of Biscay rough and unpleasant for the later transports. From our ship, H.M.T. *Cardiganshire*, we could watch the poilus drilling on the sand, their red trousers showing up at a great distance. Several transports grounded owing to the state of the weather, but refloated with the rising tide without damage.

From St. Nazaire we travelled in two days to Strazeele. This was our first experience of box cars holding "40 hommes ou 8 chevaux," a mode of travel with which we were to become all too familiar.

At Strazeele, Sir John French inspected the 1st Division and pronounced himself satisfied that it was capable of taking its place in the line.

The 2nd Brigade thereupon moved up to Ploegsteert, a hard march over the rough pavé, and on February 22nd platoons went into the trenches with the 1st Batt., the Hampshire Regiment; the 1st Batt., East Lancashire Regiment, and the 1st Batt., the Rifle Brigade, the last named occupying a portion of Ploegsteert wood.

The battalion spent a week here in instruction in the trenches, digging support trenches and in other ways becoming accustomed to the front line. Our casualties were naturally small in this quiet sector, but we had the misfortune to lose Lieut. B. Boggs on the 26th and Pte. A. E. Clapp died of his wounds on 1st March; two of the youngest members of the regiment were the first to go. These early casualties reminded us that we were at war in earnest and were the first of a long list of gallant names to follow.

The Rifle Brigade were quietly as efficient as ever and gave us a great deal of valuable instruction, as did the other two regiments. The friendly rivalry that existed between the Hampshire Regiment and the East Lancashire Regiment was amusing and informative to the outsider.

An officer of the 7th Batt. who had been in with both regiments and been treated with equal courtesy and kindness by each was entertained by the question put to him by a company commander of the East Lancashires.

"What do you think of the Hants?" he was asked.

"A splendid lot," he replied, "and excellent trenches."

"Good Lord," was the answer, "those trenches cost £5,000, and they never get a man killed."

A few moments later when the Hants regimental headquarters were being shelled: "Come and watch the little old 'Ants running out of their nest."

Receiving a similar query a few days later from the adjutant of the Hants Regiment and replying that he had enjoyed himself with the East Lancashires, he was told:

"Why, they do nothing to their trenches and they don't mind how many men they get killed." Rough fun at the other's expense, but all said with good feeling, and it all helped to make a healthy regimental rivalry.

The sang froid of the little Lancashire men was well exemplified when the writer went out with two of their snipers and crawled into the roof of a broken-down barn. Unfortunately, a German sniper must have seen us, as no sooner were we in the barn than a bullet caught one of the East Lancashire men through the mouth, and a second bullet, hitting a slate on the roof, glanced down and richocheted through the left leg of the other sniper.

We decided to retire to the dressing station, and as we approached company headquarters an officer shouted:

"What on earth has happened to you chaps?"

"Sir," said the sniper holding his wounded jaw, "we went out to get Ginger and Ginger got us." They were told to make their way back to the battalion dressing station and both calmly climbed over the back of the trench and made their way back slowly across the ploughed field in full view of the Germans. Early in March we moved to Fleurbaix, occupying trenches between the 15th Brigade and the 19th Brigade. There were few linguists in the battalion at the time and billetting used sometimes to be a problem. A young officer of the 7th, whilst on a billetting party, asked his sergeant to go to the nearest estaminet and order breakfast for the party to consist of coffee and omelettes.

"Very good, sir," said the sergeant, "but what is the French for omelette?"

The writer was known to his hostess at one billet as "Monsieur Ha-Ha," whilst she referred to Lieut. N. A. Jessop as "Monsieur What-What." Going over the Western front on a number of occasions after the war, one is struck by how extremely short all the distances are, that seemed so long in 1915.

At Sailly-sur la Lys, on the road to Fleurbaix, the 7th Batt. took over billets newly vacated by the Scots Guards. No. 2 Company had a broken down barn, scrupulously clean, with nothing in it but a rough table and some fire wood chopped and neatly piled by the guardsmen and on the table for the incoming Company Commander, an unopened bottle of port, a pot of Henri's pâté de foie gras, the Pink 'Un and the Eton College Chronicle.

Fleurbaix was a quiet sector, but its quiet was rudely disturbed by the Battle of Neuve Chappelle, which started on the 10th March and lasted until the 13th. Our part was but a holding part, and, had the action been more uniformly successful, we were prepared to go forward with the rest, but as it was we did not have to leave our trenches. We lost, however, Major P. Rigby on the 10th. Rigby was quite the most experienced officer in the regiment. His mild eccentricities appealed to all and everyone had the greatest confidence in his ability as a leader, and his loss to the battalion at this early date was a very serious one.

Towards the end of March, we moved into rest billets at Estaires to prepare for offensive operation from that neighbourhood, but these were called off before preparation had gone very far. At Estaires, we were visited by the Bishop of London on a tour of the Western Front, who gave the officers of the division a talk on "Patriotism" at the Hotel de Ville. A few days later the battalion moved up to billets around Steenvoorde. From here, in the second week in April, we moved up the inevitable road to Ypres by bus and relieved the 69th French Regiment from Nancy in trenches in front of the Grafenstafel Ridge.

Ypres in the early days of 1915 was still very much intact. Business flourished, the Cloth Hall was damaged, it is true, and so was the Cathedral Church of St. Jacques, but commerce still carried on in the market square, the shops were well stocked and an enterprising photographer stationed himself inside the Cloth Hall itself to photograph those who wished to have the frescoes as a background, and the city, in spite of the dreadful first Battle of Ypres of the previous December, had not yet earned the sinister name which it still holds.

Sir Horace Smith-Dorrien, to whose army we had been transferred early in April, inspected us before we moved up to Ypres. This gallant old warrior and fine old English gentleman made himself personally acquainted with every officer in the Canadian Division, saw that every man knew him by sight and told us, now that we had shown our ability to stand the storm, we were to be put in the most honourable and active part of the British line.

He was right. From the moment of our arrival, the Germans seemed to take a most natural dislike to the Canadians and our wastage increased rather rapidly. Our artillery support was very limited and unable to reply with any effect. On the 19th April, No. 2 Company had tear gas shells ranged on it for the first time, which was duly reported by the company commander as "shells filled with ammonia which made the men cry, but did not seem to do any other damage."

The division was holding at the time about 5,000 yards of trenches extending from a point on the Ypres-Poelcapelle Road and immediately west of the latter village to the Ypres-Roulers railway line. The French were on the left of the division, next them the 3rd Brigade under Brig-Gen. R. E. W. Turner, V.C., D.S.O., then the 2nd Brigade, with the 8th and 5th Batts. in the line and the 28th Division on the right.

Whilst the 7th Batt. was in brigade reserve on the 22nd April, the storm burst. At about 4 p.m., a low cloud

of yellow gas was seen to come curling over the Grafenstafel Ridge, a little to our North. Before the gas came Turcos and Algerians, running in all directions, throwing their arms away and falling as they ran. It was hard to get anything coherent from these choking, sobbing, demoralized men, but as heavy shelling increased, it was obvious that a major engagement was being developed.

The 7th Batt. fell in and was marched up the Grafenstafel Ridge that night, where we remained until nearly midnight, occupying support trenches. At midnight, the battalion, less No. 1 Company under Capt. J. W. Warden, was withdrawn and attached to the 3rd Brigade and started to dig itself in in the hollow ground North of St. Julien at Keerselaere at the foot of the ridge, occupying old artillery dug-outs, following a line of hedges and connecting up with a communication trench with the 15th Batt., who had dug in on the edge of St. Julien itself.

To be broken up and part of the battalion to be loaned to another brigade at the commencement of a general engagement was not the best preparation for battle. The whole position was far from being well chosen, as much dead ground lay in front of us, but in the darkness and uncertainty as to the direction of the enemy's approach, it was probably the best that could be done.

On the 23rd, the Canadian Engineers brought up wire, shovels and new stakes, and these were used to make our position a little more secure, but the time was too short to do anything very effective. Col. Hart-McHarg was mortally wounded on the afternoon of the 23rd whilst making a reconnaissance with the view to improving our position, and as he lay dying the command devolved on Major V. W. Odlum. The loss of the colonel at this crisis was a very severe blow to the regiment. He had proven himself an able and energetic commanding officer, anxious always for the welfare of his men.

At 8 a.m. on the 24th, each company commander got the order to hang on as long as possible, and a few moments later Sergeant Peerless of the machine gun section asked permission of No. 2 Company commander to run his machine gun out some fifty yards in front of the trench. Hardly was he in position than the enemy debouched from the wood in massed formation. The machine gun played on this excellent target and the Germans broke up and fled in disorder to the shelter of the wood.

The attack was not renewed until nearly noon, when the enemy secured a footing in the village of St. Julien, effectually dislodging the 15th Batt. just as three companies of the 7th were making their way into the village. An order to retire on Wieltje through St. Julien had been received at about 11:45 a.m. This was unfortunately too late, as we were already completely cut off. No reflection can be made on the 15th Batt., as they were as badly armed as ourselves; in fact, Capt. R. Y. Corry of the 15th Batt. was extremely cool and helpful in directing the leading men of the 7th Batt. to a shallow gully along which they were screened and which led to Wieltje.

The enemy were, however, still hesitant. They isolated small sections of trenches and then rushed them. They came on in six or seven lines at intervals of fifty yards and seemed very uncertain of what they were up against. With no bombs or machine guns left and with only the Ross rifle—that jammed with every round that was fired and whose funny little bayonet used to wobble off—we were quite unable to make any effective reply. Those who were in the trenches at the time will never forget, whilst those who were not will never quite understand what it is like to be charged by the flower of the German army, confident of victory, and be unable to fire a shot in return.

The most lasting impression that the second Battle of Ypres made on all who took part in it was not the ineffectiveness of our weapons or the shortage of guns or the rather amateurish efforts of the staff, but the hopeless gallantry, the splendid discipline and obedience to orders and the blind devotion and uncomplaining courage of the young regimental officers and the men in the ranks.

Canadian militiamen had been tested to the hilt under the most trying circumstances in the holocaust of war and had not been found wanting. The casualties of the 7th Batt. in the second Battle of Ypres in killed, wounded and missing amounted to 650 of all ranks and included six officers and 176 N.C.O.'s and men killed.

One of the officers killed was Capt. R. V. Harvey, who

died a few days after the battle as a prisoner of war. He had fought No. 3 Company to a finish, showing magnificent courage, determination and resource, and setting an example to all around him, an example to which every man responded as his company officers, H. A. Bromley, N. A. Jessop and C. C. Holmes, died with their men.

Lieut. R. P. Latta was killed with No. 2 Company, evacuating the men in the most gallant manner and quite regardless of his own safety.

The splendid work of the machine gun detachment was recognized in 1919 by a Victoria Cross being awarded to Lieut. E. D. Bellew, who was injured and taken prisoner, whilst Sergeant H. N. Peerless was awarded a post mortem D.C.M.

Meanwhile, No. I Company had been left on the Ridge, holding on under a murderous fire and with both flanks in the air, until the 26th April, when what was left retired under the cover of darkness to Wieltje.

Capt. J. W. Warden had been badly wounded by shell fire and was carried out by Lieut. H. B. Scharschmidt, whilst Lieut. G. H. Leslie had been seriously gassed, so that No. 1 Company was taken out of action by Sergeant W. Swindells, who later received the D.C.M.

The casualties of the 7th Batt. were high even for this period of heavy fighting, and the proportion of prisoners of war may seem out of proportion to the killed and wounded, but it is not so in fact. Three companies were isolated just as they were bringing help to the troops outside St. Julien and had hardly a chance. Again, the Germans reported all men who were gassed and able to walk and not otherwise injured as unwounded prisoners of war and even our own authorities looked upon the early gassed cases where no marked symptoms were obvious as being doubtful casualties.

What was left of the 7th Batt. retired to newly erected huts at Brielen, but they were not to remain there long, as at dawn on the 27th these huts became a mark for the German artillery and had to be rapidly evacuated for the safety of the hedgerows, where the men dug themselves in. Meanwhile, some few small drafts had arrived to fill the gaps, drafts that were all too inadequate to the casualties, and in May the 7th Batt., under the command of Lieut.-Colonel V. W. Odlum billeted around Bailleul.

On the 7th May, a draft of twelve officers and 250 men arrived from the 30th Batt. in England and the regiment was once more well up to strength. In the middle of May, the 7th Batt. moved to Festubert and after a two day's march settled down in an orchard.

Meanwhile, a bombing section had been organized from the units in the brigade. This section was used very considerably for the next two weeks in spasmodic and costly operations, which consisted in consolidating pieces of trench after a general attack carried out by the British. The section was wiped out and reorganized again and again during those two weeks.

At dawn on the 24th May, just a month after the second Battle of Ypres, a most successful attack was carried out on K. 5 by the 5th Batt., supported by Nos. 1 and 4 Companies of the 7th Batt., the remaining two companies moving up during the morning to assist.

Wastage had been so great that on moving to Givenchy the 7th and 8th Batts. had to be linked to form a composite battalion whilst in the line. This battalion took over the ill-starred "Duck's Bill" and "Keep" and held these positions until early in June.

The losses in May included Lieut. R. Buscombe killed and Major Bruce Powley, Capt. McNally and Capt. S. D. Gardner wounded. The latter was a very severe loss to the battalion, as his wounds incapacitated him from serving in France (except for a short period) for another three years, though his indomitable spirit made him invaluable as G. O. C. at Seaford.

After ten days in reserve around Oblinghem, the 7th were again in the trenches for a week and spent much of the time bringing in the dead of the 1st Brigade, who had carried out a very gallant but unsuccessful attack on the "Duck's Bill."

On the 24th June, the regiment marched back to Ploegsteert in three days and occupied a quiet sector of the line on the forward slopes of Hill 63. Though our casualties were few for the next six months, the period was not a pleasant one. Constant digging of reserve trenches on the down slopes of the hill all the summer was hard work and time wasted, as the winter rains washed away the work of months in as many nights. Our own trenches became so flooded that it was no uncommon sight to see reliefs carried out by men walking along the parapet and on either side of them a sea of mud.

The battalion was for some time at about half strength and it was not until August and September, 1915, that drafts of more than 500 men from the 47th Battalion arrived to bring us up to fighting form, but with this renewed strength, the 7th Batt. went ahead once more and was ready for anything.

In August, 1915, the first number of *The Listening Post* appeared. This excellent regimental paper appeared regularly from then on until March, 1919, under the editorship of Lieut. (later Major) D. Philpot, D.S.O.

The outstanding event during the Fall of 1915 was the most successful raid carried out by the 7th Batt. This was the first organized attempt at this kind of warfare carried out by any army on the Western Front.

The raid was organized and planned in its every detail, if it was not actually carried out, by Lieut. H. H. Owen, the 7th Batt.'s first scout officer.

The objective was the enemy's trenches near Petite Douve Farm and the intention was to inflict damage on the enemy, secure prisoners and identifications and the whole raid was so well planned and carried out that it resulted in about thirty of the enemy being killed and twelve more brought in as prisoners of war. Our losses on this occasion consisted only of one man accidentally killed.

Lieut. Owen was killed in No Man's Land on 30th January, 1916. He had at all times shown conspicuous gallantry and initiative, setting a splendid example to all ranks, and his funeral next day was attended by every man of the battalion who could be spared.

Early in April, 1916, the battalion was once more on

the inevitable road to Ypres. All roads lead to the Salient, and the survivors of a year before must have felt a tightening of the heart strings as they realized that the battalion was going back.

For the next four months, the 7th experienced the hardest period that they were ever to go through. Mud everywhere, the high ground controlled by the enemy; constant bombardment, sniping and local attacks took heavy toll. The morale of the 7th Batt. was tried to the full and stood the severest test. Our losses were constant and heavy. German and Allied dead lay unburied everywhere to add to the horror of the scene.

Lice on the body and rats in the line were minor evils in this veritable corner of Hell.

The steady drain reduced the strength of the battalion once more to a dangerously low ebb.

Amongst the many who lost their lives during this trying time were Corporal Vinson, who fell on the 15th April, having only recovered from old wounds a week before, and Corporal Weir, who had earned the D.C.M. a short time earlier.

Between the 1st and 4th June, our casualties were particularly heavy, some of the best of the battalion losing their lives, and when we were withdrawn on the 15th June we had the additional misfortune to be caught in one last strafe and lose a large number of men and Capt. Holmes, D.S.O., M.C., who had proved himself on a number of occasions an inspired leader and a most gallant officer.

The morale of the regiment was by no means shaken, but the best felt depressed at the wastage without results and the loss of their friends.

The "Pollock and Bean" was where we received our first real hammering, when No. 4 Company, with No. 2 Company on the left and No. 3 Company on the right, received a concentrated bombardment of Minnenwerfers for an hour and a half. These engines of destruction contain some 200 lbs. of high explosive and they left the trenches virtually obliterated.

Lieut.-Col. V. W. Odlum had been wounded and Major

B. M. Humble was temporarily in command of the battalion during the German attack on the "Twin Hills" on 2nd June.

The battalion counter attacked on 3rd June from Square Wood, with the object of recapturing Sorrel Hill. It was a case of necessity, as it was imperative to check the enemy's advance. Our attack started late, at 6:30 a.m., and was met by a withering fire from the enemy's machine guns and shells, which confined us to our trenches, and in the late afternoon the survivors were withdrawn and taken out of the trenches to receive a few days rest and to reorganize.

A few days later the battalion was again in the trenches holding the Hill 60 sector. These trenches afforded little protection, they were knee deep in mud, under constant shell fire and the men were without cover and without rest. The weather conditions only added to the horror and misery of the scene and if conditions are at all describable they are best recorded as "Hell on earth and earth in the sky."

Without doubt, when the battalion was withdrawn on 11th August, the men had passed through the most trying experience that they were to have during the whole war.

The only satisfactory feature of this whole tour in the Salient was the enemy's attack on July 25th. The 7th Batt. had been warned by the Intelligence in time that a big mine was about to be exploded by the Germans at "The Bluff" and our trenches were evacuated. At 10 p.m. the mine went up and within five minutes No. 1 Company had rushed and occupied the lip of the crater, turning a Lewis gun on the attacking Germans and, being supported by a terrific fire from both flanks, the enemy were pinned to their own wire and their whole attack was a complete failure.

Meanwhile, Col. Odlum had been promoted to the command of 11th Brigade and Col. S. D. Gardner, partly recovered from his old wounds, was again in command of the battalion, but the weather conditions were against him and he was unwillingly evacuated to England, the command of the 7th falling to Lieut.-Col. W. F. Gilson.

Col. Gardner fell in action whilst commanding the 38th Batt. on 30th October, 1918.

Nearly two months had been spent around Eperlecques, Albert, Pozieres and the Chalk Pit, and, whilst the battalion did not have the good fortune to take part in any major operations, its losses whilst holding trenches were constant and severe and there was always the odd counter attack to be repelled.

As an instance of this, the fight on 27th September, 1916, is a good example. Whilst No. 2 Company under Major A. C. Nation, M.C., was moving up to Mouquet Farm to relieve another unit, they found a counter attack by the enemy in progress. They flung themselves into the action without waiting and with such effect that the enemy were driven back to their trenches, the normal relief of the unit was carried out and the line occupied by the 7th Batt.

In November, the 7th Batt. lived on Vimy Ridge and towards the end of December a month's rest was received, the battalion spending Christmas, 1916, and the New Year in billets at Bruay.

The end of January, 1917, found the 7th in the Bully Grenay sector, where we remained a month and then moved back to Vimy. Six weeks strenuous preparation for the great attack followed. The whole enemy's position was mapped out with tapes, untiring rehearsals followed, minute instructions were given and every detail thought out, and in spite of the mud and the rain and weather conditions that beggar description, the battalion went over the top on the 9th April. The weight of the whole attack on the grand scale was irresistable—Vimy was ours.

Our losses in the initial stages had been heavy, but the results achieved had more than justified the action. The battalion continued with the rest of the brigade to attack until the end of April, when it was withdrawn to Maisnel-le-Ruitz and once more brought up to strength by a substantial reinforcement of more than 500 officers and men from the 48th Batt.

On 15th August, we took our part in the famous attack on Hill 70. The enemy were in no doubt as to our intention and determined to hang on at all costs. For four miles gas masks had to be worn by everyone as they went into the trenches, whilst we were constantly harassed by gas, machine gun fire and H.E. shells. The fight itself was sharp and bitter, but the attack was irresistible and by evening of the 15th August the whole hill was in the hands of the two Canadian divisions.

The next few days saw no less than twenty-seven counter attacks made by the Germans in the most gallant style to recapture their lost ground. These attacks were supported by every gun that could be brought to bear on the Canadian trenches, but the magnificent gallantry of the enemy was met at every point with such a resistance that they retired with colossal losses, leaving the hill in our hands.

At the end of October, the 7th moved back to the Salient for the third time and spent some time around Wieltje awaiting their turn to take part in the general engagements raging on the Grafenstafel and Paschaendaele Ridges.

On the 10th November, the battalion took part in the general attack made to extend the gains and to include the whole of the Ridge, which commanded the country as far as Roulers.

The attack commenced at dawn under conditions that were so discouraging that they baffle description. In a grey, cold dawn with the rain pouring down in torrents, the whole country a quagmire, the attack was carried out with great élan. Within two hours the battalion had reached its objective, in spite of every obstacle and then followed a repetition of the treatment that we had received on Hill 70. The Germans swept the crest of the Ridge with shells of every calibre. Only the nature of the ground, which was little better than a morass, prevented the battalion being exterminated, but as it was, the mud neutralized to some extent the explosions of the shells. Just the same, No. 2 Company of the 7th returned on the 11th with seven men under the command of a lance-corporal.

A short rest was given the 7th at Bethune and a little later we took up our old trenches in the Lens sector.

Again we spent a month at Christmas out of the line at Bruay, and at the New Year, 1918, we returned to Hill 70. The first six months of the last year of the war were quiet ones for the battle-scarred battalion, and we were occupied only in holding the trenches around Loos and Vimy Ridge.

The great German offensive, their last despairing effort in the war, was expending its force on others whilst we held our line, but in July we realized that our counter offensive was to commence. The most thorough preparations were completed whilst profound secrecy kept our intentions completely hidden from the enemy. At 4:20 a.m. on the 8th August, the great drive that was to end in victory commenced. The gods seemed at last to be on our side and the ensuing operations were carried out with enthusiasm and confidence. Shortly after noon on the first day, the 10th and the 7th were marching through Caix—eight and a half miles inside the German lines whilst from the other end of the village streamed German troops and transports fleeing in one confused rabble.

Our casualties were infinitessimal, the results achieved superb. The offensive was continued until the 17th, when we handed over Damery to the French and returned by degrees to Amiens and then to Arras.

On 1st September, the 7th were brought up into position to attack the Drocourt-Queant line and went over the top at dawn on the following day. The attack was fortunate, over 600 prisoners falling to the 7th after a few short hours fighting. The 10th Batt. were not so lucky, as for awhile they were held up, but consolidated their position next day. We ended the operations by making good our position along the Canal Du Nord.

Two weeks rest followed at Simencourt, and at dawn on the 27th September we followed the 3rd Battalion across the Canal Du Nord and going through them at Marquinon.

Here the enemy put up a most stubborn resistance, and some bitter fighting followed before we drove the Germans at the point of the bayonet from their positions.

We rested that night at Haynecourt whilst other troops continued to advance for the next few days, when we moved forward to Abancourt and held a portion of the line. On the 6th October, we moved to the flooded country around L'Ecluse, where, owing to the inundations, our line was some thousand yards from the enemy and we were virtually at peace.

On the 11th it was determined to cross this flooded area. The only alternative to crossing in boats was to follow the raised road to Tortequenne. This was done, and so shaken were the enemy by this time that the battalion captured some square miles of enemy territory and fifty-six prisoners without the loss of a single man.

The war had for some time developed into a pursuit of a demoralized enemy, success following success with seemingly little effort. The brigade crossed the Sensee Canal on the 14th October on cork floats and went into billets at Auberchicourt, now some thirty miles behind our lines, and other units followed up the pursuit. Whilst in these peasants' homes, the Armistice came to tell us that our efforts had not been in vain.

A few days later the 7th Batt. took its place with the gallant 1st Division in its march to the Rhine and in February, 1919, we were quartered near Huy awaiting orders for home.

During the five years of service that the 7th Batt. had seen, twenty battle honours had been gained. These are:

Those in capital letters were chosen to be carried on the colours and in referring to them, Gen. Sir Arthur Currie says: "I most emphatically state that the 7th Batt. must not leave off Canal du Nord from their battle honours. It was in many respects the greatest battle in which the Canadians took part and in that battle the 7th Battalion played a most magnificent part. Men like Byng and Rawlinson have regarded the crossing of the Canad du Nord by the Canadians in the manner in which it was done as one of the most splendid feats of the war. I make a plea for Hill 70. . . ."

Of the individual honours gained by officers and men of the 7th, it would be invidious to write. Where all did their duty, it is honour enough for all to have served with the 7th. Suffice it to say that three Victoria Crosses were awarded to the following: Lieut. E. D. Bellew for the work of the Machine Gun Section on the 24th April, 1915; Private M. O'Rourke, whose citation appeared in the London Gazette of 8th November, 1917, for conspicuous gallantry and devotion to duty over a prolonged period as a stretcher bearer in bringing in wounded under concentrated and accurate machine gun and rifle fire; and to Sergeant W. L. Rayfield for conspicuous gallantry on the 2nd-4th Sept., 1918, when he personally bayonetted two of the enemy, silenced a machine gun and took over forty prisoners. He followed up this magnificent exploit by bringing in wounded under machine gun fire and setting a superb example to all ranks for coolness, courage and resource.

Early in April, 1919, the 7th Batt. left Huy for Le Havre and sailed for England. After an uneventful crossing from Liverpool to St. John, they arrived in Vancouver on 25th April, 1919.

Lieut.-Col. W. F. Gilson, D.S.O., commanded the 7th Batt until the end, with Major D. Philpot, D.S.O., as second-in-command, and the battalion, without a single one of its original officers and less than a dozen of its original N.C.O.'s and men, was demobilized at Vancouver on 5th May, 1919, and so passed into history.

In nearly five years of service overseas the regiment had lost sixty-four officers and 1,335 N.C.O.'s and men. There can be no finer epitaph for these splendid fellows than this:

> "Sound, sound the clarion, fill the fife, Throughout the sensuous world proclaim One crowded hour of glorious life Is worth an age without a name."

To their memory was unveiled in Christ Church Cathedral in Vancouver a suitable bronze memorial on 10th November, 1930, ex-members of the regiment coming from all over British Columbia to pay tribute to their comrades in arms.

At the same time, a memorial brass was unveiled in St. George's Church at Ypres, the centre of the Salient in which our casualties had often been so great and where all must have the most poignant memories.

When the 7th Batt., C.E.F., passed out of existence, its records were taken over by the British Columbia Regiment, and its splendid past became an inspiration for a younger generation to carry on in the path of duty and service for Canada and the British Empire.
