7. WORLD NEWS SUMMARY

BELFAST, NORTHERN IRELAND: Is once again subject to sporadic bursts of open warfare as a gunman machine-gunned a British Army Post from the top of a hi-jacked double decker bus and then escaped on foot. Troops shot back, but no one on either side was hurt. Skirmishes of this kind have been increasing in the last little while as 1000 more British troops are being sent to the area to keep close control over the province.

BALTIMORE: Summer storms have ravaged the whole state of Maryland as well as many other states in the US causing a state of emergency to be called by the government. The thunderstorms finally ended after dumping from 5 to 15 inches of rain in Baltimore and areas to the north. They have caused a total of \$6,500,000.00 damages. Corpus Christi Texas had a similar fate as yesterday 7 inches of rain fell in a period of three hours. In downtown sections of the city, water was between three and four feet deep.

MOSCOW: The Soviet Union and the United States have made agreements on joint space projects for the near future. The exact stipulations were not revealed, projects for joint exploration of the moon and the planets of our solar system, but it has been reported that N.A.S.A. and the Soviet Academy have made agreements.

NEW YORK: A 38 year old Englishman, Mark Saunders is being held on charges that he sailed a yacht with 1800 pounds of hashish from Morocco to New York. Mr. Saunders had sold 1,730 pounds of his stock before being caught and arrested. The hashish was valued at \$3,500,000.00 on the open market.

SPORTS: At the Pan American games in Columbia, Pedro Perez of Cuba broke the world's record triple jump and set a new mark of 57 feet 1 inch, $\frac{1}{4}$ of an inch better than the previous world mark. In the medal standings, the United States is FIRST; Cuba second, and Canada third.
