



Lord Dunsany (born Edward John Moreton Drax Plunkett, 18th Baron of Dunsany, 1878 - 1957) was an Irish writer and dramatist, notable for his extensive body of work, mostly in fantasy, published under the name Lord Dunsany. He is considered a major influence on the works of H.P. Lovecraft, J.R.R. Tolkein, Ursula K. Le Guin, Michael Moorcock and others.

A Dreamer's Tales is his fifth book; a collection of sixteen short stories, with a beautiful prose that creates unforgettable imagery.
