A D D R E S S .

By the recent report of the Commissioner of Patents, it appears that the whole number of patents issued by the United States, from the establishment of the office, to January 8, 1844, scarce half a century, amounts to the incredible sum of thirteen thousand five hundred and twenty three. How have the elements been put to the question, and racked, and tortured, to extort their secrets for the benefit of man! Bacon declared at his day "there remained a world of sciences and inventions unknown;" and research has ever since been verifying the truth of this assertion, and developing the wonders which he foretold.

There is no limit to the career of improvement—from the humblest agency to the highest—from the patent razor-strop to the power-loom—from the improved churn, which curtails the painful labors of the housewife, to the applications of galvanism; its range is as wide as the elements. Look at galvanism alone; it already propels the car, it plates the wire, it writes upon steel, it has superseded the pains of lithotomy. It has robbed Jason of his honors; the golden fleece is no longer a fable.

The island of Great Britain, by means of its machinery, now performs more labor than the empire of China. The United States, by the application of new discoveries to arts and to agriculture, now accumulates more capital annually, than seventy millions would have accomplished two centuries ago. The powers of nature are inexhaustible, the discovery of one principle facilitates that of another, and multiplies the chances of some new inven-

tion—something, which like the application of steam, shall revolutionize society.

Hitherto the patents granted have been on the gradual increase, amounting to an average of two hundred and fifty per annum. Last year the number allowed amounted to five hundred. The spacious and beautiful edifice of the Patent Office is already crowded; the spectator is lost amidst the confused mass of improved ploughs, fanning mills, furnaces, chronometers, philosophical instruments, water wheels, and printing presses, to say nothing of the innumerable improvements in the various processes of the arts, as in the preparation of leather, glass, building materials, and wearing apparel.

This too, it will be observed, is the result of but a few years in an obscure quarter of the world. All Europe, with her two hundred and fifty millions of inhabitants, has been engaged in this career for two hundred years, and is now pursuing it with increased ardor and success.

The prize held out is splendid beyond the dreams of antiquity. The fame of Fulton, the wealth of Watt, dazzle the eyes of the projector. Whatever is most prized or sought for among men is given without measure and without stint to successful ingenuity. It is a well ascertained law, that the increase of the human family is limited to a supply of the means of support. Wherever new channels of industry are opened, nature's children seem to rush in to feast on her exuberance. What philanthropist will not rejoice at the masses thus added to the great sum of human enjoyment!—at the millions that thus become participants of the joys of this living and breathing world! What Christian will not thank God for the added myriads who will swell the chorus of his praise! What man but will exclaim with Bacon, “all knowledge, limited by religion, is to be referred to *use* and action!”

The world is now nearly six thousand years old. Strike from the transmitted wealth of the past the accumulation of the last three centuries, and what have we left! Little besides the ground we stand upon. Go back but a few years, and all beyond is a barren waste. Proud philosophy! She has been the guide and controller of mind, from the time of Aristotle to that of Bacon, a period of more than two thousand years. But where is her patent office? What has she done for the physical advancement of man? The same mental labor which has been expended, if properly directed, would have filled the world with the comforts and conveniences of life, abrogated that vast portion of crime which springs from poverty, and elevated the moral condition of man far above its present standard.

I will, with your permission, dwell a moment upon this ancient barrenness, and the vicious tendency of the schools, and ascertain their cause and contrast them with the productiveness of recent times, and close with a few remarks upon *utility* as a motive and a rule of human conduct. The wisdom gathered from a perpetual recurrence to the errors of the past, is the surest guide to future improvement.

The *discipline* and *methods* of instruction of the ancients, were in many respects mischievous. They made a mystery of knowledge. Plato declares that "it is a difficult thing to discover the Creator of the universe, and being discovered it is impossible and would even be impious to expose the discovery to vulgar understanding." He did not indeed close the door of his school, nor exact an oath of secrecy from his pupils, like Pythagoras; but he, as well as Aristotle and most of the philosophers, had his esoteric and exoteric doctrines. The first of these they taught only to the select few; the second were the

doctrines which they promulgated to the world. In teaching their students to love philosophy, they made them esteem themselves; in training them to aspire to an elevated object, they led them to look with scornful pride upon the mass beneath, for whom they professed to have no regard, and with whom it was their highest boast to have no sympathy. All this tended to create unworthy distinctions among men, and to secure the sway of arbitrary power. Plato, Aristotle, and other ancient teachers, are said to have dressed themselves splendidly, and with as much regard to scenic effect upon their schools, as stage-players upon their audience.

This affectation of peculiarity in dress and manners, has tinged the habits of the studious world even to the present day. The costume of all professions until recently, was invariably the flowing gown; the professions of divinity and law, in Europe, still retain the dress of Aristotle, and it is feared, cling to many other vanities of his school, more puerile and degrading.

Thus much for the mere habits and discipline of their schools. Their *doctrines* exercised a still more important influence; many of them were radically wrong, and tended only to increase the superstition of the age. All believed that matter was eternal, and most that it was sentient. Pythagoras believed in a soul of the world—that all matter was animated with a *spirit*—that there was but one soul in the universe, which was all-pervasive, and of which the souls of individuals were parts.

Plato is said by some of his followers to have taught, that every object possessed an unconscious soul. Thales and some of the earlier philosophers, did not separate mind from motion; they taught that the magnet was animated with a spirit. This was fostering the deepest source of vulgar superstition—that matter, especially such as

moves, feels. Hence the bleeding bush of Virgil, from which issued the voice of Polydorus. Hence the enchanted forest of Tasso; Rinaldo sees his beloved Chlorinda start from every pine, and every myrtle is embraced by the beautiful and imploring Armida. No wonder that the unreasoning but sympathetic multitude, should people every grove with hamadryads, every brook with nymphs, and that every breeze should be laden with the wailings of spirits. No wonder that such men, with such instructions, should become, like the Athenians, "in all things too superstitious."

If poets are to be literally considered as *creators*, the true poets of antiquity were their philosophers. Their grave theories of the formation of the universe, surpassed any thing ancient or modern in wildness of invention. Considered as intended for sober truth, the fairies and the genii of the Arabian Nights Entertainment, do not make such draughts upon credulity.

Plato, and after him his pupil Aristotle, imagined the universe to consist of ten spheres, like ten concave globes, one within the other; in the outward, an infinite circle of *cerulean*, silent, motionless and self-willed, they placed the Omnipotent; next came the *crystalline* sphere, or *primum mobile*, which receiving its motion from the motionless First Cause, communicates it through the universe. It is thus described by the Portuguese poet:

" Within its shining frame,
In motion swifter than the lightning's flame,
Swifter than sight the moving parts may spy,
Another sphere whirls round its rapid sky;
Hence motion darts,—its force impulsive draws,
And on the other orbs impresses laws."

The eighth sphere in the system of these philosophers, is called the starry heavens; this is the spangled vault which

presents itself to the naked eye. The seven planets were supposed to revolve in the seven subordinate spheres, to which they gave names.

It is strange that a theory so fanciful and so puerile, should have gained the credence of mankind, during a period commencing four centuries before Christ, and terminating with the general adoption of the Christian religion, about four centuries after; but it is obvious, that this theory, as well as most of the speculations of these philosophers, such as the numbers of Pythagoras, and the ideas or plastic forms of Plato, were more calculated to cultivate and strengthen the imagination than the reason.

But bad as were the *doctrines* of the ancient schools, the utter *perversion* of the *true object* of study, was the capital error of the ancient philosophy. They attempted to invert the order of acquisition; they uniformly endeavored to abstract the soul from the body, and educate it separately, instead of considering it as God made it, and educating them together. They constantly aimed to make men love *virtue*, or immutable truth, or some other abstract and metaphysical name, while they should have striven to make them love labor. The last was humble, but practicable; the first lofty, but incomprehensible and impossible. By saying that they inverted the order of acquisition, I mean to affirm, that virtue is merely an inference—that, by inculcating a love of labor, the advantages of the arts, the love of our fellow men, the excellency of contributing to the enjoyments of human life, the love of virtue would have followed. Seneca says, “It is not the office of philosophy to teach men how to use their hands; the object of her lessons is to form the soul.” But the only way to teach men how to form the soul, is to teach them first how most judiciously to use the hands.

Thus we see, that while their discipline and doctrines served to swell the pride of man, inflame the imagination, widen the gulf between the different classes of the human family, pamper power by inculcating authority, their visionary, speculative and fruitless object brought the blight of barrenness upon two thousand years of human thought.

Let it not be supposed, that it is a part of my plan to enter upon a crusade against the learning of the ancients. No man can appreciate more highly than I do, their contributions to geometry, and the almost perfect models which they have bequeathed us in every department of belles-lettres. Their perfection only renders regret the more poignant, that their efforts in the physical and moral sciences had not received a more useful and practical direction. The most enthusiastic apologist sees not more clearly, that it is unfair to judge them by a modern standard. Their books were few, and obtained by great labor or expense; men of thought were rare; there was no interchange of the intellectual and moral wealth of nations,—all was at first confined to the Greek, afterwards to the Greek and Latin. The progress of science had been continually interrupted by wars and commotions, and at last it was engulfed by one universal uprising of the elements of savagery. Besides, the depositories of their limited learning have been from time to time annihilated. The first library, that of Pisistratus, was destroyed by Xerxes; the celebrated collection of Aristotle was scattered soon after his death,—most of it went into that of the Ptolemies at Alexandria, which was consumed by the rash and ignorant soldiers of Julius Cæsar. The library of the Roman empire, preserved in the temple of Apollo, was destroyed by lightning. In later times the fire of Omar will be remembered, the bigotry of Pope Gregory, and the vanity of Almaman, to each of which the

most precious remains of antiquity fell a sacrifice. Still, abundance remains to show the character and direction of the ancient philosophy. Much that was valuable, though it has now become superseded by modern discoveries, has remained to recent times as a monument of the extraordinary genius of those sages, who could so indelibly stamp their own minds on the great current of human thought. We can not forget that the astronomical theory of Pythagoras differs little from that of Copernicus, or that the atomic theory of Epicurus seems to be demonstrated by modern chemistry. Recent experiments have also proved the truth of Plato's theory, that bodies are combined in numerical proportion.

In process of time, the ancient schools were swallowed up in the modern professions. The theories of Epicurus and Aristotle on physics, were especially regarded by physicians, although the authority of this latter writer was paramount on almost every subject of human investigation. In the church, although at first denounced, his writings were at length admitted as a commentary on the Bible, and the commentary was read with more zeal, and deemed of more weight than the text.

The doctrines of the Academy harmonized more with the principles of the Christian religion: Indeed the gospel of St. John opens with an expression which can not fail to be recognized as the language of the Academy, by all who remember the *λόγος* of Plato. The professors of jurisprudence may be said to be the descendants of Zeno, —at least the subtle disquisitions of the Stoics had this practical effect, that they furnished the lawyers with maxims, definitions and distinctions, on which they have erected a noble and far-extending science. It is right however to say, that their definitions were never intended for any such practical purpose; they pursued no such contemptible

object; they disdained to be useful. They never sought the forum,—they would not tarnish their dignity with the dust of the courts; but the lawyers sought *them*. Jurisprudence was formerly called philosophy, and its professors, divided into *Πράκτοι* and *Ἀπρακτοι*, were called philosophers. No one was thought qualified to practice law, who had not spent years in studying philosophy; that is, the wordy, subtle, quibbling philosophy of the Stoics. Their language was noble; it was the language of the gods. Their promises were more magnificent than Golconda,—their performance “as poor as winter.” To the followers of Zeno we are indebted for that great maxim, which lies at the corner of our republican edifice, that “all men are born free and equal.” It is a truth of world-wide importance, and while we express our boundless gratitude to them, we must admit that, in *practice*, they were the most subservient and basest sycophants of arbitrary power,—proclaiming the natural liberty of man, and at the same time kneeling to Tiberius, justifying the cruelties of Nero, and flattering every despot that ever sat on a Roman or barbarian throne.

They too were the first to discover and proclaim the absurdity of human *bondage*. “That man,” they exclaimed, “to whom all other things were given as property, should be *himself* the subject of property, is monstrous. Man the slave of man,—the Anthropophagi, with heads beneath their shoulders, were not so gross a violation of the nature of things.” Noble language! The whole world listened; the poor slave erected himself,—bright hope beamed once more in his haggard eye. But the Stoic speaks again: “*Slaves* are *things*, and *things* are justly under the dominion of man.” The slave again bent beneath his burthen, and his hopes vanished forever! This is a fair specimen of the fruitlessness, verbiage and equivocation of

their proud philosophy. So with reference to utility, they held, according to Cicero, that "from birth the animal, human and brute, directs his attention to conciliating or procuring those things which are preservative of himself." But, though they admitted the truth of the utilitarian doctrine, they were the most useless and trifling of men; they soared infinitely above its practical application. They were constantly haunted by a spectre which they called the "*dignity* of human nature," which frightened them from every thing useful; and gave them a strained and stilted morality. Bacon says, that "it is no less true in this human kingdom of knowledge, than in God's kingdom of heaven, that no man shall enter into it except that first he become as a little child." Their foundation was right; had they built upon it they would have constructed a refuge from sorrow and from shame; but their pride ruined all. Theirs was a philosophy of great swelling words, but of paltry results.

Two great misfortunes befell the Christian religion; the first and the minor one was its early union with philosophy. The most distinguished of modern philosophers has said, that "the prejudice hath been infinite that both divine and human knowledge have received by the intermingling and tempering the one with the other—as that which hath filled the one full of heresies, and the other full of speculative fictions and vanities." The one threw its robe of pride over the coarse garment of the fisherman. The other subjected to the vain fallibility of human reason what was intended only for the eye of faith, and gave up its sacred mysteries and revelations to be mingled with the vagaries of philosophy.

The second, and by far the greater evil, was the union of temporal and spiritual authority. The conversion of Constantine, and the consequent elevation of the humble reli-

gion of the cross to the divided throne of the world—the union of church and state—although at the time deemed an event glorious in itself, has been proved by the experience of several centuries of a world sunk in darkness and in slavery, to have been most baleful to human happiness, and most disastrous to the Christian religion. Had Constantine continued to persecute and oppress, religion would have continued as at first, humble and useful, full of sympathy for the multitude, dispensing its hopes and consolations to those who most require them. Its progress would have been that of the flood, first covering the humble valleys of the poor, and at last completing the work of universal charity by embracing the high places of power. It would then have taken possession of temporal thrones as a conqueror to be obeyed, and as the friend of man to be loved; not as a jealous equal to be conciliated, or a *particeps criminis* to be watched and feared.

But this ill-omened alliance was now complete, the church of Christ, civil government, and the philosophy of the schools.

Self-conceited *philosophy*, bloated with her vain-glorious pride, and black with hatred of the ignoble vulgar, proclaimed that the mass of men were born to be slaves.

The *church*, under the insidious maxim that the command of God *makes* right, and that the decrees of the church are his voice, erected the monstrous fallacy of the infallibility of Rome.

Civil *government*, borrowing the pregnant maxims of her obsequious allies, stamped with a divine sanction the power of the worst of rulers, and enforced with a divine command the slavery of the people.

I will not advert to the darkness of the middle ages, consequent upon this conspiracy against human rights. Never was the intellect so poor, and never so vain of its

achievements. The mind was doomed for centuries to describe the same idle and never ending circle. All minds were drawn into these magic vortices; all thought was employed in physics, in ascertaining the nature and extent of stellar influence, casting nativities, seeking for the stone of transmutation, or the elixir of immortality; and in metaphysics, in solving the grave questions—Whether “spirit has essence, independent of existence?” Whether an angel can see in darkness? Whether God loves the greatest possible non-existing angel better than the smallest existing insect? Abelard on his return to the University of Paris, after an absence of two years, says that “he found the students still discussing the same old questions—whether spirit has extension? whether it can be in two places at the same time?” and such idle puerilities, the decision of which is utterly impossible, and as immaterial as it is impossible. It was not through apathy, that the mind retrograded from its natural onward march of improvement. At no period have the colleges and schools of Europe been more thronged; two or three thousand are said to have crowded to hear the lectures of Abelard, and several equally popular schools of law and philosophy are said to have existed at the same time in England. What then was the cause of the extreme paucity or the utter absence of results from so much mental labor? It was the utter neglect of that immutable law of our moral and physical nature, that man seeks his own preservation. This was considered and treated as a deformity to be concealed, not as a principle to be educated as destined to give complexion to all our conduct. Men refused to glide forward easily on the current of nature, but chose rather to offer a useless opposition; hence all the barrenness, all the absurdities, all the mysteries and the mischiefs which we have described, from the curious imagin-

ings of Pythagoras to the senseless jargon of the scholastics. They were blinded by their pride. Philosophy disdained to be useful! Science scorned an alliance with the arts!

The first faint effort of common sense to throw off some portion of the incubus which the schools had heaped upon her, was made by the *nominalists* in the eleventh century. The dispute between them and the *realists* was not, as has been supposed, some vain question of scholastic discussion,—it was a struggle against the materialism of thought. Plato and Aristotle maintained, that the ideas of genera and species were impressed or daguerreotyped upon matter at its creation. The nominalists contended, that these universal ideas had neither form nor essence, and were no more than mere terms and nominal representations.

Long and eventful was the contest; all Europe was disturbed for centuries with the noise of the conflict. On the part of the realists were enlisted the three great allies, the church, the state, and the schools of the philosophers. On the part of the nominalists the more distinguished names were John the sophist, Robert of Paris, Rosaline of Compagne, Abelard, Porphyry, Occam, Gerson, and Luther. But, after bloody persecutions, martyrdoms, even wars among the nations, the nominalists triumphed; and their triumph maimed, if it did not destroy, one of the tripartite alliance. The dead weight of philosophy was gone, the mind became more buoyant; one of the chains was broken; it became more free. What was left unfinished by this contest was completed by Luther at the Reformation. He grappled with another of the allies, and strove to restore religion to its original simplicity, purity, and humility. He separated it in a great measure from its disastrous connection with temporal power. It no longer

pressed with crushing weight upon human rights, but became, as it was first intended, the corner-stone of the fabric of human liberty. Reformers sprung up every where, responsive to his voice. Men of distant nations, who were unacquainted with each other, who spoke not the same language,—Zuinglius of Switzerland, Melancthon and Erasmus of Germany, Latimer and Coverdale of England, Farel and Lefevre in France,—heard and understood. They were the mountain-tops watching over the silent and mist-covered valleys beneath; and the vividness and rapidity of the work of the Reformation, reminds us of the poet's description of a thunder storm among the Alps:

“From peak to peak leaps the live thunder”—

not from one lone cloud, but

—“every mountain now hath found a tongue,

And Jura answers from her misty shroud,

Back to the joyous Alps, which cry to her aloud.”

Thus the other of the great oppressors of human thought was removed, or rather converted into a friend. The disastrous alliance was broken up, the mind stood forth dis-embarrassed but uncultivated; untaught, but at the same time unbiassed. Thus far it was not advanced, but only disincumbered; stripped for the race, but no steps taken in its career;—prepared for any direction that might be given to it.

At this time the immortal Bacon arose. We can not sufficiently express our admiration at the perfect preparation which was made for his appearance; no character of the drama ever entered upon the stage more apropos to the development of the plot. A few years sooner and his voice would have been drowned in the clamor of the schools; a few years later, and the mind would again have received a false direction from which the powers of Verulam would have been inadequate to recall it.

He commenced, not so much by establishing a new philosophy, as by divesting the mind of *all* philosophy,—by planting it firmly upon the rocks of *common sense* (called by a distinguished writer the “*genius of humanity*”) and *common experience*. Although he calls his method the *Novum Organum*, to distinguish it from the old *Organon* of Aristotle, it might with equal propriety be called the *nullum organum*, that is, no “*artificial method*”—“the way of nature,” or those ordinary teachings of experience pursued equally in the highest investigations of science, and by the brutes themselves in seeking shelter from the peltings of “the pitiless storm.”

His predecessors, as we have seen, were too proud to be useful; their shot, elevated above mortality, but too weak to reach the stars, spent its force upon the idle air. He, on the other hand, in his own quaint language declares, that “the access to his work has been by that port or passage which the divine Majesty doth infallibly continue and observe; that is the felicity wherewith he hath blessed a *humility* of mind, such as rather laboreth to spell and so by degrees to read the volumes of his creatures, than to solicit and urge, and as it were to invoke a man’s own spirit, to divine and give oracles unto him.” Their love of abstract speculation led them to make even physics metaphysical. He utterly disregarded metaphysics, except so far as they contributed to some practical and useful end.

No wonder that these opposite courses should produce the most opposite results. Theirs it has been the object of this digression to illustrate. His are before and around us. Utility found no place in their vocabulary; he inculcates it in every sentence as the only proper guide and object in all our pursuits.

Already have the *commoda vitæ* accumulated immensely under his system, which is destined ultimately to enrich the whole human family, and go far to eradicate poverty and crime.

I do not mean to confound mere *practical* philosophy with utilitarianism. It is admitted that in our own time Bentham has gone farther than Bacon, and has considered utility not only as a guide and an end, but as a motive of action, and as a law of our nature. Whether his theory be true or false, it must be admitted that his reasonings from this law of our nature have been wonderfully successful in pointing out right qualities in governments and legislation.

The most distinguished philosopher of modern times has facetiously intimated that the fall of our first parents was caused by the too earnest discussion of the metaphysical question of the constitution of good and evil. Thus warned, I shall be careful not to commit so great a sin.

The utmost apparent diversity has prevailed among modern philosophers, as to the essential quality which enters into all right action. Cumberland calls it *practical reason*; Grotius, the preservation of human *society*; Cudworth follows Plato and his school in supposing it *virtue*; Clark, the *fitness of things*; Wollaston, *truth*; More, the *boniform faculty*. This quaint name gave rise to what Shaftsbury and his followers to the present day have called the *moral sense*; Malebranche calls this quality the love of *universal order*; Butler, *conscience*; Adam Smith, *sympathy*; Hartley, *association of ideas*; Tucker, *translation of ideas*; Brown, *suggestion of ideas*. But this diversity is only apparent. They may all, with sufficient precision, be thrown into two great classes—viz. those who suppose that all our notions have an intellectual origin, and those who believe that some of them at least spring from emo-

tion ; those who suppose that all action arises from instinctive and intellectual nature, having reference solely to our self-preservation, modified by our relations and guided by experience, and those who suppose that all action, or so much at least as relates to right and wrong, springs from some involuntary emotion, or separate moral nature superior to the intellect, which acts not in reference to self, but to some abstract and perfect rule of right and wrong.

To this last theory there seem to be three objections—it is *unproved*—it is *unnecessary*.

“Nec Deus intesit

Nisi sit dignus vindice nodus,”

is a maxim as true in metaphysical philosophy as in the art of poetry. Even Stuart, Mackintosh and others, the great champions of a moral sense, admit that it may have been an after growth. They insist that there is an apparent disinterestedness, whether it arise from an original cause or a subsequent result. This is admitting the whole question. The utilitarians contend for no more. They do not deny the existence of liberality, of benevolence, of charity, of heroism, and of magnanimity, and that they all spring apparently in some instances from a disinterested impulse. So the unreflecting suppose, that they see the distance and shape of objects, although it is certain that these are only the result of judgment from their appearance. The utilitarians define charity, for instance, the rejection of a little present indulgence in favor of a great future happiness.

Another objection to this theory is, that it confounds the distinction between a motive and a criterion. All acknowledge the existence of a moral taste as well as a natural one, and that it is equally liable to be depraved ; but it no more originates moral action, than natural taste can be said to originate a breakfast.

Again, this theory was constructed to obviate a supposed difficulty of predicating guilt or innocence of human action; but it is obvious that there is as much merit in obeying a necessity of our nature called self-love, as in obeying one dignified with the title of a moral sense; nor is there any more sin in violating the laws of a moral sense, than in violating those laws of self-preservation which our all-wise Creator has impressed upon our nature.

On the whole perhaps the simplest, the safest, and the truest principle, is that all action, whether good or bad, voluntary or involuntary, springs from the laws of nature, reason and instinct, directed to *self-preservation*, as the motive and the end. It is at least a safe criterion. Sir James Mackintosh, although an ardent advocate of disinterested emotions, declares that "the whole sagacity of the wisdom of the world, may be safely challenged to point a case in which virtuous dispositions, habits and feelings, are not conducive in the highest degree to the happiness of the individual." So that even by the confession of its enemies, utility is always a *safe guide* to virtuous conduct.

In favor of self-preservation, as a law of our nature, universal analogy may be adduced; the form of every vegetable that grows, the unerring instinct of every animal, point to their self-preservation. Natural religion deduces the conclusion of an omniscient architect, from these evidences of design. All the functions of our bodies, on which life depends, the beating of our hearts, the breathing of our lungs, are placed beyond the reach of our volition, but are conducted exclusively with reference to our preservation. All our instincts, all our propensities, all our passions, although often perverted from this purpose, have an obvious reference to the same object. The same divine architect, who contrived the involuntary, made

also the voluntary part of our natures, and analogy would incline us to the belief, that he pursued the same object in both cases.

I am aware of the scorn with which this doctrine has been spurned by distinguished men; they have deemed it unworthy a good man, to be governed by no higher motive than his own greatest happiness. It does not make the gulf which separates the learned from the ignorant, wide enough to suit their pride; they wish not to be better than, but to be different from the vulgar mass; they labor to escape the disgrace of a community with mankind; they run upon the tops of their toes and would fain persuade the world that they fly; they would build up a sort of hero-worship. The only faculties of the vulgar herd which they would cultivate, are those of wonder, reverence and admiration.

But if utility is denounced on account of its humility, the charge will avail little with those who think with Bacon, that this is the only door of entrance into the kingdom of knowledge, and who remember that the same charge was made from the same source against the religion of Christ. If it raises what is humble and prostrates what is elevated, it only assimilates the more to the divine command "to love our neighbor as ourself." But it may truly be said, if it is low, it is at least intelligible; if we have a humble, we certainly have a safe guide,—if it does not conduct us to an impossible virtue, it will never lead to crime,—if it does not make us gods, it will surely make us better men.

Much of this opposition to utility, has doubtless arisen from increasing admiration of German transcendentalism. The influence of that philosophy is yet limited, but it is all employed to sap the foundations of laws, government and religion. However pure may be some of its pro-

fessors, they are destined to share the fate of poor Epicurus and his philosophy. Abandoned men perverted his doctrines to sanction every thing most debasing and profligate. The name of the most abstemious of men, the anchorite of philosophers, became synonymous with indulgence. These men are struggling to bring back the mysteries, the folly and the fruitlessness of the old philosophy. They are imitating the miserable pride of the disciples of Zeno, by preferring form to substance, seeking rather to excite astonishment, by clothing old truths in new paradoxes, than by discovering new truths and explaining them to the world in plain language; they prefer the surprise excited by the slight of hand of the mountebank, or the tricks of a juggler, to the honest praise of a good mechanic.

It is with no ordinary pride, that I turn to this celebrated seat of the muses, and find its professors still foremost among the champions of sound learning and far reaching utility. They still inculcate in their lessons, that the only object of science is to enrich the world; the final use of all learning, but to strengthen the judgment, and to enable it more certainly to secure the ultimate good.

This new philosophy, uprooting and prostrating with blind hostility, the bulwarks as well as the abuses of society, solicits them in vain. This monstrous creation of a foreign soil has no place here; this misshapen production of vanity, fermenting with the admitted wrongs of foreign institutions, dares not approach these sacred portals.

The space allowed me will barely permit of illustrating the principle of utility in some of the more ordinary relations of life.

This philosophy beholds man with hopes, with longings, with thoughts, stretching far beyond this world, which nothing but the revelations of religion can satisfy. In the

various misfortunes and sorrows incident to this life, she discovers that the more stately preachings of philosophy about fortitude—the superiority of mind to physical ills—are empty mouthings, and that nothing but the soothing hopes of religion have been found to alleviate the distress of mental suffering; consequently she leads man to religion. Other philosophies, proud, conceited, self-sufficient, would be themselves the physicians, she only the handmaid; they aspire to be the rivals, she the humble follower; and when her temporal task is done, she resigns her charge to the fruition of an immortality she has given her humble aid to inculcate throughout life.

Again, the simple maxim of the pursuit of individual good, becomes in society the pursuit of the good of the greatest number. No additional element whatever intermingles with this fundamental maxim of voluntary society; it is simply the pursuit of individual good modified by each man's social relations. When individualism, says Guizot, is absolute, society is impossible; society is necessary for protection, and government necessary for society. The individual is compelled by his nature and the circumstances which surround him to become a member of society, and the only condition on which he can be admitted is to pursue the greatest good of the greatest number. The same principle which leads to the formation of governments, dictates also, when undisturbed, that these governments shall be popular in their form. This appears by the following illustration; the whole world has concurred in the remark of Montesquieu, which I shall therefore assume—that “honesty is the principle of republics, honor of monarchies, and fear of despotisms.” It can not be for the greatest happiness that all should be governed by fear; despotism must therefore be rejected.

Honor is defined, the distinction of one above many ; it can not be for the greatest happiness of the greatest number, that the majority should be oppressed by the elevation of a few at their expense ; monarchy and every species of aristocracy must therefore be rejected. As there is no other kind of government but that of the many, it follows that this species of government alone meets the terms of this proposition. The same thing may be demonstrated in various ways. That the dictates of utility require that government be administered on this principle, appears from the fact that such a government is more likely to be *right* than any other.

The idiosyncrasy of every man leads him to take his own particular view of every subject presented for his decision. Almost all the differences in life arise from viewing the same thing from different points. The more numerous the voters in any community, the more numerous the points of view of any given subject, and the less the probability that any circumstance will escape the observation of those who are required by law to decide upon its adoption or rejection.

Utility dictates such a form of government for another reason,—that it is more likely to be safe and enduring, because the government, being influenced by practical men of every pursuit, will be less likely to come in collision with any great interest. Such a collision often produces revolts and revolutions in other governments. But even if a disturbance should occur, there is no danger of overthrowing the government, for it is built upon the maxim of the greatest good to the greatest number. They can not enjoy more, and they will voluntarily accept of no form of government which gives less.

Utility suggests still another reason for this form of government, which is indeed but a branch or corollary of the

last. It is capable of indefinite improvement. In other governments, admitted salutary reforms are rejected through fear of innovation. "Monarchs are perplexed through fear of change." When one or a few are conscious of having arrogated to themselves advantages which belong to the body at large, they are naturally solicitous to retain them. The foundation of such a government is narrow and weak. It stands like an inverted pyramid. Improvement in any one particular may lead to the overthrow of the whole edifice. But in a government founded upon this principle, which we have seen can not in the nature of things be overthrown, experiment may follow experiment like the waves; innovation has no terrors; novelties are invited and freely examined, and improvements even in fundamental law adopted without injury. There is no limit to this law but the injury which arises from change itself. Enough has been said to show that this maxim lies at the foundation of democratic government. Modern improvement in representation has obviated the principal objection, and rendered it accessible even to the most extended nations. Nor is it a sanguine anticipation, that this principle of the greatest good will ultimately prevail throughout the world. It is a law of human nature, as much as gravity is a law of matter; and in the chances and changes of human affairs, as men and nations are placed in favorable circumstances for its action, it will surely develop itself. Thus much for the application of this principle to the *forms* of government.

Its adaptations to the *administration* of government, are equally familiar to every American; but the illustration of the wide application of the principle of utility, and the repeated injunction to recur often to first principles, must excuse its triteness. A government conducted on this principle, requires that all its functions should be dischar-

ged by the people themselves. By the people themselves I mean, in contradistinction from a class salaried, educated and set apart for any particular duty. Every citizen becomes in turn a magistrate, a soldier or a juryman. To say nothing of the faithful, honest and economical discharge of these functions, secured by such a system, its indirect benefits, by educating the people, by accustoming them to the exercise of power, by identifying them occasionally with the government itself, are incalculable. In this point of view, who can estimate the advantages arising from *jury duty*. I venture to say it does more towards disseminating among the people a practical knowledge of their rights and duties, than our schools, academies, and every other means of instruction. The accustoming the citizen to command as well as obey, tends to elevate the lowest, by filling them with a sense of their importance and responsibility; while on the other hand, it effects a comparative depression in the more elevated, and constantly teaches them a practical lesson,—to honor the law which is above them all.

Another inference which arises from the application of this principle is, that all should take an active interest in public affairs. All have a voice either by themselves, their husbands, their brothers, or their fathers; it is their duty to express it, and whatever is duty can not with propriety be called disreputable. I refer not merely to the act of voting, but to the preliminary discussions and the acquisition of all the necessary means of influence. An active interest in the public measures of the day is often and generally denounced as discreditable. The thought is of foreign birth, and most truly it is alien to the institutions of this country. In those nations where the citizens have *no* voice, and can only influence public measures through sycophancy and flattery of the great, politics are indeed

idle if not disgraceful. Formerly it was considered disreputable to take a part in religion; all theological discussion was left to the priest. Even many of the Doctors of the Reformation thought it dangerous to put the Bible in the hands of the people. More enlightened views have prevailed in modern times; every man, whether priest or layman, is responsible on his own account; no man can answer for another in matters of conscience; neither can he in matters of state,—the responsibility may differ in degree, but not in kind. As I love my country, I earnestly pray that she may never cease to be agitated by political discussion. While men think and speak freely, they will be divided in opinion; and parties will never give way but to the torpor which precedes death.

Many suppose that the powers of government should always be restricted to their direct object, that is, to the protection of persons and of property. Others suppose that they may also be advantageously employed in securing *collateral* benefits to their respective nations. In every government there is always a large mass of power conferred upon its organs ordinarily inert, to be used only in the event of war or some extraordinary emergency. The great problem which has entered more or less into the political discussions of ancient and modern times, is, shall this great unused reservoir of public power remain idle, or be employed to feed the conduits of private affairs.

We will refrain from giving examples of these two theories reduced to practice among modern nations; but among the ancients, Sparta with her black broth, and iron money, and her utter contempt for all the decencies, moralities and comforts of life, is an eminent example of the first. She struggled only for existence, and continued five or six centuries. A straight line upon the map of history, contains all that is worth remembering of her story. Ath-

ens is an illustration of the other theory; that republic facilitated in some degree the private pursuits of her citizens. She has sunk also, but has left a long train of brilliant and undying light behind her, in the glorious achievements of her sons.

Among modern political philosophers, Rousseau is a conspicuous advocate of the first school. He was not only opposed to any aid from government in advancing the arts of civilized life, but rather recommended all men to become "unsophisticated" again, like crazy Lear and poor Tom, and seek the independence of their original forests. Adam Smith is an equally illustrious example of the other school. He first reduced the economy of nations to a science, and taught the art of so using their powers as to enrich themselves and their subjects.

The views of those who disapprove of any collateral exercise of the powers of government, are derived exclusively from foreign institutions, and have no application to our own. A reference to the principle of the *greatest good*, to which we have so often had occasion to advert, will satisfactorily solve this most vexed question. In governments founded and conducted upon this principle, such an interference is not only safe, but generally in the highest degree beneficial. In this case the benefits and the burthens are equally divided; and if any given measure is not found to the advantage of the majority, it is sure to be repealed before material injury can accrue. On the other hand, in a government administered for the benefit of a few, where the advantages are monopolized by the rulers and their sycophants, and the burthens thrown upon the nation at large, the exercise of this privilege is dangerous in the extreme. It is sure to be abused—to add strength to oppression, and accumulate new afflictions upon humble industry.

It is but very recently that commerce, manufactures and the arts have been considered of sufficient importance to attract the notice and the care of government. In whatever government attention to these interests is found, it is a *democratic* feature; it is a partial, and as experience has proved a most salutary application of the utilitarian principle. About the middle of the seventeenth century, the celebrated John De Witte induced the republic of Holland to pass a law regulating its traffick with foreign nations. At the same time Oliver Cromwell procured the passage of the Navigation act. At this time Holland was a republic, and England a commonwealth. These were the first serious attempts to draw the private occupations of men into the policy of nations, and each of these acts in its turn, as it had an opportunity of being felt, made its respective nation master of the wealth of the world.

The establishment of the Patent Office is another pregnant illustration of the application of this principle to the administration of the affairs of government. The Patent Office is no part of the state; it is not necessary to the protection of person or property; and if improvements were now made under the patronage and for the exclusive benefit of a few great people, who conduct the government and monopolize trade, it would unquestionably be unjust to tax the people for the purpose of rewarding these favorites. But if, as with us, the benefits as well as the burthens are equally distributed among all, it becomes another example of those collateral advantages which government, administered upon this principle, may safely secure to the people.

It is remarkable that this admirable institution for the encouragement of the arts, should spring from that old and vicious system of monopolies with which government formerly encumbered and well nigh extinguished trade.

In its history two opposites meet: the first half springs from a government administered for the benefit of a few; the second, for the many. It had its origin in a clause in one of King James the First's laws regulating monopolies. Bacon was then Lord Chancellor of England, and probably inserted this admirable provision, which without the suspicion of his ignorant associates, completely reversed the character of the law. It seems contrived expressly to encourage and reward those anticipated inventions, which his *Novum Organum* had taught the world the art of making. The last pointed out the course; the first gave the impulse. The age felt the power, and darted forward in the race of improvement like the boat of Cloanthus; and like that too, cautiously avoided the rock on which its predecessors had been wrecked, or delayed in their career. The fable of the mystery-men in the house of Solomon, has become reality. The government provides at its own expense an inquisition over the whole world. All that is new in discovery or production, is collected and disseminated through the country,—mulicole rye from France, Gama grass from the West Indies, tea from China. It is thus that for the past few years, the whole earth has become the garden of the botanist, the school of the engineer, and the laboratory of the alchemist.

The age of *philosophy* has passed, and left few memorials of its existence. That of *glory* has vanished, and nothing but a painful tradition of human suffering remains. That of *utility* has commenced, and it requires little warmth of imagination to anticipate for it a reign lasting as time, and radiant with the wonders of unveiled nature.

These applications of the principle of utility to the various relations of life enable us to see it, not only in its simple form as it leads to aversion or attachment, but in its various combinations and results, and to trace all ac-

tions, however apparently disinterested or dissimilar, to this one motive. It has indeed a wonderful variety of applications. But let it be remembered that half a dozen postulates and self-evident truths are the foundation for the whole superstructure of pure geometry, and if to this be added the application of these truths to physics, the world would hardly contain the books that could be written. There is little resemblance between the definition of a straight line and the celebrated Pythagorean demonstration that the square of the hypotenuse of a right-angled triangle is equal to the sum of the squares of the two sides, so we may be able to trace but little resemblance between the great law that men will be governed by a desire of happiness, and the conduct of Regulus in tearing himself from his weeping friends at Rome, after advising a continuance of the war, and rushing to certain death among his foes at Carthage to preserve inviolate the promises given to his captors; yet in the one case as well as the other, if these first truths did not exist, these very important but remote and apparently disconnected results could not have been.

The unreasoning observer sees only the nebulae of brilliant light, but the stars from which they proceed are sunk far into the depths of heaven beyond the reach of the eye or the telescope.

Locke, and many wise and good men since his time, have declared that there is no difference between virtue and enlightened self-love.

If therefore there are yet to be found in our schools any remains of the fopperies and disguises of the old philosophy about abstract good and the love of virtue, away with them! and let our youths be taught to refer every action public or private to an enlarged utility. Knowledge is virtue—that is, a clear and distinct perception that a given

act is for our benefit will insure its performance; and to suppose that that act must not necessarily be virtuous, is blasphemy against the Creator of the universe.

Let then the whole end of education be to enlighten that perception. Let every appeal be openly and directly made to utility. Let the student be taught to feel, that, properly viewed, it becomes an elevating not a debasing motive. The appeal must be effective, for it coincides with all the instincts and impulses of our nature. It is in this way that knowledge may finally secure its object and triumph over the perversity of our moral as well as physical nature. It is upon a generation of generous youths refined and elevated in this manner, and habituated in every thing they do to look upon it in the light of the most enlarged and liberal utility, that our government, built up out of the fragments of a thousand states, will rest and be perpetuated.

BRETHREN ALUMNI :

PERMIT me to tender you all a hearty welcome on this our literary festival. We have come hither to this central spot, as pilgrims from every quarter of our vast country. From our homes on the shore of the Atlantic and on the banks of the Mississippi, from the margin of the Lakes and of the St. Lawrence, from the border of the Gulf, and from many an intermediate city and village, we have come hither once more to mingle hands and hearts in the halls of Yale. Among us are the patriarchs of seventy-five and eighty summers, who were moulded after the strength and simplicity of the years that preceded the battles of Brandywine and Bunker Hill; among us are men strong in middle life, on whose shoulders now rest many of the burdens of public and private duty; among us also are our young brethren, who have but just gone forth, active and sanguine, from these peaceful halls, to mingle with their predecessors in life's crowded scenes. This is our third annual convention, and we have assembled here, not as a Congress for stern party debate and for the adoption of measures of questionable policy, but as friends, as brothers, as the sons of Yale. We constitute indeed but a small portion of her children; we are but three hundred out of her twenty-eight hundred living Alumni; but we are representatives who need no instructions from the constituents whom we have left behind, for

there is but one heart and one voice in us all. Differing as we may in our geographical and other local sympathies, some of us with heads whitened and brows furrowed with care, others with the bounding pulse of opening manhood, and our professional pursuits as various as can be chosen in this great land of freedom, we are all the same, we are one, in love for our venerable *Alma*. Other bonds which we have long since formed, if not rudely severed, may have been gradually unloosed; other recollections, once cherished with vestal care, may be now forgotten or unwelcome; but who of us would ever willingly forget his college life? what can rend, while life continues, the bond that unites us to this institution? Yes, tie after tie may be ruptured; but is there not for each of us "a threefold cord" that shall never be broken,—that which binds us to the altars of our God, to the hearths of our fathers, and to the halls of Yale? Brethren, once more would I cordially greet you all.

And speak I not your united voice, when I specially wish all happiness and honor to the *officers* of our loved institution? Their venerated head and two of his associates have guided us almost universally along the paths of science; and many of the remainder who are walking worthily by their side, look down on the large majority of our assembly as their pupils. Peculiar indeed are the relations of the president and the professor to the pupil. What heart will not respond in its consciousness to my own, when affirming that the instructors of my youth ever appear to me on coming hither, to be unchanged, to be my instructors still! The great men of my early days have been often subsequently contracted into quite moderate dimensions; senators, governors, and even functionaries still more august, whose claims upon my respect were

once heartily conceded, seem not now always to merit more than official honor. Yes, even the wise and the good, whose counsels were once deemed infallible, have lost their infallibility; they do not always command my implicit deference. But when once come hither, the youth is father to the man, and the teachers of my academic days continue, as it were, my teachers still.

Nor are such feelings to be esteemed, by those who share them not, the mere reviving of youthful impressions long dormant, but now awakened for the moment into vigorous life by the power of the *genius loci*. It is not the mere law of association, the simple linking of the past with the present, as we walk along these ancient halls, that can thus call for a response from every heart. Were this the explanation, our emotions would have undiminished freshness, had a corps of literary Vandals usurped the seats of these respected officers, and our honored *Alma*, instead of retaining her lofty station, sunk into decrepitude and contempt. Such feelings, even in the eldest of us, may have much of the ardor of youth, but they are still rational and manly only. We have not come hither from every region of a country as large as southern Europe, to revive for the moment a few youthful impulses of which we are to be heartily ashamed as we return homeward. Each of us can distinctly and fearlessly assign a reason for uniting in these gratulations. The institution from whose walls, and wearing whose honors, we went forth two years, and five years, and fifteen, and thirty, and fifty, and sixty years since, we now revisit; and she is still the same in all that once gave her a title to our love and honor. She is the same, or, if changed, she has but strengthened her claims upon the hearts of her sons, by her steadfast advancement for half a century, as a great

nursery of science and usefulness. We remember her as she long since was; we have watched her in her gradual and vigorous progress, and we now rejoice in what she has become and what she is. The collegiate school has become a prosperous college, and the college has grown into a university in every thing but the name. During the last forty years her corps of professors has been quadrupled, her students in all departments have been nearly trebled, the course of studies anterior to the Bachelor's degree has been advanced two years, and her buildings have become almost a distinct quarter of this growing city. Yale is still essentially the same, and yet her growth has been so rapid and vigorous, that the Alumnus of 1804, who now reappears here for the first time, will look around him bewildered, and will scarcely recall in any object his ancient home. Yale is indeed changed, but she is still the nursery of sound learning, still a school of healthy discipline and subordination, still an institution consecrated, as from the very beginning, to Christ and the church.

And how refreshing is it, brethren, to withdraw for the time from the great world of constant change and tumult without, and to come hither to this inner region of stability and peace! In the political and commercial atmosphere, if we see not at any particular season a tempest raging, we are rarely without the signs of its speedy approach. Our religious hemisphere, which should be ever serene and brightening, is also often overcast with clouds, if not thick with mists. But here the air seems pure and bracing. If a few exhalations rise, they soon disappear; if a thunder cloud passes rapidly over, its explosions but purify the atmosphere. We would be grateful to a kind Providence that, amid the ceaseless flux which appertains

to so many institutions and which often shakes some of the firmest pillars of the community, our colleges still remain unmoved; and we would fondly hope that for this institution particularly, the law of progress and permanence only has been ordained. Time has been bearing each of us onward in its rapid flight,—with many, buoyant manhood has given place to middle life,—and on others still, the decline of age is stealing; but when we return hither we perceive no decay, no weakness,—our Alma Mater in her vigorous maturity, has lost none of her youthful activity and freshness. Her children may die, but she lives and flourishes. *Esto perpetua!*

Nor are such wishes to be deemed romantic. A university, a college, is always founded with a view to perpetuity. The monarchs and the monks who established so many of these institutions in Europe during the dark ages, displayed the same wisdom here, as did the founders of the German and American colleges of the last two centuries. Both intended to establish nurseries of learning, not mainly for themselves and their own age, but for future and distant ages. A great literary institution is usually the growth of at least a century; its endowments must have been given by a long succession of benefactors; its system of discipline and study must have been long tried before it can be fully approved. Often have nations arisen and empires been founded, while a university has been ripening into healthy adolescence. But when once grown strong and stable, who can set limits to her influence? Its circles steadily enlarge like those of the lake's agitated surface, but, unlike the latter, they are the more distinct as they widen. Generations and centuries slowly succeed each other, and her light, as that of some lofty Pharos, streams onward over the whole vast

distance, cheering where all besides, it may be, was dark. Myriads and tens of myriads of minds that have never resorted to her halls, are indirectly moulded by her hand; and whether her influence be, as a whole, for good or for evil, it is mighty and often resistless.

It is obviously then an important subject of inquiry, What is the system of university or collegiate training which has been adopted by any single institution, or which characterizes the institutions of any one nation, in distinction from those of others? It is asking, in effect, how can the literary mind of a great community, of a nation, be best formed and polished? Or, to present the subject particularly, the inquiry would at any time be seasonable, and, if I mistake not, it would be peculiarly appropriate to such an occasion as the present, How does the collegiate system of training which has been so long practiced at Yale, and which also generally prevails in the older American colleges, compare with such systems in the universities of other nations? What are its relative excellences, what its defects, what the changes which are practicable as well as desirable? These queries I propose now substantially to answer; and the mode adopted will be, to consider the English and the German systems successively, and then to notice our own. I have specified but these two courses of university education in Europe, not on the principle of selection, but as those only which are at the present time so prominent and distinct as to be entitled to the name of systems. England and Germany are the only countries whose universities now possess a European celebrity; the universities of Italy, so far as they still live, flourish in the fame of other centuries only; and that of Paris has been so essentially modified, as scarcely to admit of a proper comparison. When thus

announcing the subject, all will perceive that the limits of the present Address restrict me to a notice of little more than its mere outline. Suffer me also to add, that no one can be more aware of the incompetence of the speaker to do justice to such a topic than himself.

The *English* system of collegiate training will be first considered; and when using such language—a system of training—I intend not a mere enumeration of the different branches of learning which are pursued, and of the particular authors which are studied, together with a description of the mode of teaching the individual student. These indeed are all essential to the system, but there are many influences also which so control its application, that its distinctive working can be never fully understood without a proper knowledge of both. One of these influences is the peculiar character of the university itself; another is found in the national temperament; another still is the relative national advancement in science. Evidently none of these should be overlooked in our present survey.

When an English youth first enters the walls of Oxford or Cambridge, the veneration for antiquity, which is a stronger feeling in an English than in any other European heart, is at once excited, and usually only to be strengthened through life. Oxford boasts, though with a doubtful right, the great name of Alfred as her founder; and should this claim be pronounced apocryphal, her existence as a kindred institution to the university of Paris can be authentically traced back as far as the beginning of the thirteenth century. Cambridge, the younger of the two, began soon after to attract notice, and from this era the student of either university can pursue its progress to the present time during six centuries. We are beginning to

speak of our "venerable Yale," made venerable by the lapse of a hundred and forty-three years; but each of the two great English schools has already existed more than six hundred years. Wycliffe and his followers found a refuge at Oxford nearly five centuries ago; her Theological School still stands as a splendid specimen of the architecture of the fourth Edward's reign, and her Christ Church Chapel, with its princely endowments, still attests the munificence of her Chancellor, Cardinal Wolsey. The colleges and halls, the public buildings and the libraries, the fellowships and the ecclesiastical livings, pertaining to each, are worthy of that noble nation, and are such as only a nation's munificence for ages could establish. But influences still more potent there press alike on the youngest student and on the oldest Fellow. The great men of the nation, with few exceptions, have been sent forth for the last four hundred years from the two universities. The scholars, the divines, the statesmen and the orators, the poets and the warriors of England, have been there matured. Their hand-writing is to be still read on the different college rolls; their busts adorn the alcoves, and their portraits look down from the lofty walls. There the imperial shades of Bacon, and Milton, and Newton, and Locke, appear, as it were, still to hover. Or if the student looks beyond the inner precincts of these institutions, he sees them securely resting on the throne, the aristocracy and the established church, as a fourth estate of the realm—all conscious that they stand and fall together. Breathing such an atmosphere, yielding to such influences, the English student, we should presume, could scarcely fail to be thoroughly educated, and the English system of training to be worthy of our own general adoption.

And every man who venerates learning, must also honor these universities as having been for ages the great lights of the British isles. Their contributions to science and to letters have been immense; their long roll of learned men is perhaps outnumbered by none other; and had they at any distant period been destroyed, England, instead of taking as she now does the very front rank, would have been probably but a third rate European power. English scholarship has been made till within the last few years the only standard of American scholarship, and the English course of education the only course with which even our own professors have been familiar. But when we affirm all this, we still leave almost unanswered the question, What is the English system of training?—we have said nothing as to its relative excellences or defects.

In commencing a direct answer to this question, I would observe, that the scholarship which is demanded from the candidate for the Bachelor's degree at either university, is far inferior to that which is required at our own institutions. The student at Cambridge* must reside but twelve entire months out of the four years within the university, during which he must attend two recitations daily; and when the four years are completed, he must pass an examination in the first six books of the *Æneid* and of the *Iliad*, in *Euclid* and *Plane Trigonometry*, in *Paley's Philosophy and Evidences*, and in *Locke on the Human Understanding*. The student at Oxford† must reside twenty-one months within the university, and he will be entitled to the same degree, if he passes an examination

in Logic, on the Thirty-nine Articles, in the general history of the Bible, in the four Greek Gospels, and in four classical authors*—two Greek and two Latin—which are to be previously selected by himself, and if he can also translate English into Latin without gross inaccuracy. Such is the scholarship requisite for admission to the Bachelor's degree, and about two-thirds of the whole number graduated at each university attain no higher standard. The remaining third, and this includes all those who receive the "honors," must pass a far severer ordeal—an ordeal which but a small minority of the first third of the graduates of any American college could ordinarily endure. These honors are given however at Cambridge exclusively to superior scholarship in pure and mixed mathematics, as this is the only branch of science in which the candidate is examined; while the similar examinations at Oxford have been almost entirely confined, until within the last twenty years, to the Greek and Latin languages and literature. Such is the scholarship, such the course of instruction and study for the undergraduates, at these two celebrated universities. Each of them has its long list of professors, not a few of whom are eminent men; and of these professors, one half in Cambridge, and rather more than one fourth in Oxford, deliver public courses of lectures—courses which include from twenty† to thirty hours in a year. Attendance on these lectures is however purely voluntary, and is usually given by but very few, and no professor ever takes part as such in the personal instruction of the students, a duty which

falls exclusively in each of the various colleges on the tutors.

It is then difficult to perceive what just claim either Oxford or Cambridge can advance to the name of a school of science, in the proper signification of the term. One is mainly a school for the student in the classics, and the other is mainly a school for the student in mathematics, and sound scholarship in both may be acquired at either university. A considerable number of the Fellows of the various colleges are doubtless learned men in a more general sense, having traversed not merely one, or two, but many walks in the broad domain of science. But if we confine our survey to the three hundred young men who are annually made Bachelors at Oxford, and to the three hundred and fifty who receive the same degree at Cambridge, can we form any other estimate? It may be that, so far as the study of mathematics should be pursued, both as a fundamental element of knowledge and as a process of intellectual discipline, Cambridge deserves all the reputation she has maintained for the last century and a half. It is also unquestionable that, as the result of long previous drilling at the schools of Eton, Harrow and Westminster, not a few young men at Cambridge, and more than one third of those at Oxford, are made what would be deemed at our own colleges very superior classical scholars. Yet it is doubtful whether the classical standard which has been long adopted at either university, is not essentially defective; whether the shell of literature is not often as much valued by the student and the teacher as the kernel. If we may credit the statements of both the friends* and the enemies of these in-

stitutions, an accurate knowledge of prosody and of the art of writing Latin verses is held in almost equal honor with all other classical attainments. To give a false quantity to a line of Pindar or of Euripides, or a wrong accent when translating a sentence of Polybius or Livy, is reputed as gross a blunder as a stupid mistranslation. The tenacity of a school-boy's memory is thus rated as high as a nice discrimination of different shades of thought, and as felicity in translation. Surely such a standard can not be favorable to thorough scholarship, for the first rate critic in Greek metre, if such is his chief excellence, is little better than a classical fop. The great value of every language, ancient and modern, consists in its being the vehicle of thought; and the usefulness of the study of the Greek and Latin languages, aside from the consideration that they are primary elements in the formation of our own tongue, evidently consists in these two particulars,—that thought is there expressed with extraordinary precision and beauty, and that the transfusion of such thought from one language into another, is, in itself, one of the best processes of mental discipline. Where then it is accounted scarcely more thorough scholarship to be able to transfuse the very life of the Prometheus Vinctus or of one of the Philippics of Demosthenes into our vernacular tongue, than to write decent iambic verses, or to decide what words in Homer admit the Digamma, what can be said, but that the great high schools and universities of England largely confound classical literature with its trappings and tinsel?

We may then repeat the remark, that neither of the English universities can be properly termed a school of science. They have many scientific men, and science can be acquired within their walls, but their course of instruc-

tion is not scientific. With all their venerable antiquity, their vast endowments, their rolls of the mighty dead and of the illustrious living, and resting as they do on the pillars of the throne, the peerage, and the established church, they do not invite their young men to become scientific scholars. On the contrary, two thirds of those who are sent forth wearing the baccalaureate honors, have learned them by making the attainments of a school-boy; and the acquisitions of the remainder, however respectable, have been gathered almost wholly from the walks of mathematics and classic literature.

What then, it may here be asked, is the real, ultimate aim of this system of training? What are the specific form and hue which are there intentionally given to the English mind? The answer, if I mistake not, is this. Oxford and Cambridge are the two great schools of the polished and the intelligent young men of England,—the young men who are to sustain the established church, the peerage, the crown, and all the other ancient institutions of that kingdom. They are not sent thither primarily to become scientific or profoundly learned; but to acquire as much learning as is demanded by the standard of the English divine, the English statesman, the English lawyer, the English physician, and the English country gentleman. This standard may in some respects be high, very high; it may in others be low; but this is the university standard of education. They are to be well educated, they are to be gentlemen, they are to be manly and honorable, they are to have the graceful polish of literature, and all this is to be grafted on the sound common sense of the English mind. When they have been thus moulded, the university has done its work. A considerable number, also, and these are principally included among the fellows of the

respective colleges, are to become thorough scholars—not indeed in the course of university instruction, but by their own efforts; but they are to become thorough scholars in the English and not in the European import of the term. Such, as it would seem, is the design of this system of training, and this design is accomplished admirably well.

The charge of presumption may be here made against me for such remarks respecting these universities; and as I would not appear to merit such an accusation, I would ask if the statements already made concerning their courses of instruction and study, etc.—statements, on which full reliance may be placed, are not my justification? Can such a system of training with any propriety be styled scientific? Whatever polish and pliancy and nerve it may impart to the youthful student, is not its compass obviously narrow? It is no reply to such queries to affirm, that it fits young men well, and that no other system could fit them so well for their entrance upon active life in England; and that the statesmen, the country gentlemen, the divines, the lawyers of that country, are not equalled by the same classes in any other country. Whether such assertions are or are not true, affects not the nature of this system of public education. I would also reply that these views are virtually but a repetition of what is now affirmed by great numbers in England, and by not a few within the very walls of these universities. This is not a question between Edinburgh and Oxford, or between dissenters and the established church. It is discussed by men of all parties, by churchmen and by dissenters, by those within and those without the college halls.* The number of those who demand changes in study and discipline, it

would seem, is increasing, and the circle of those who resist these demands is lessening. And the changes which have been actually made within these institutions during the last forty, and especially the last twenty years, may be deemed an admission that many of these demands are just. I would also ask, Does not the literary history of England for the last forty years establish the justness of these remarks? The English mind is doubtless equal in its inherent vigor to that of any other nation modern or ancient, and the English press has been teeming for the last half century with new works in every department of knowledge. But am I putting a query which can be instantaneously answered, when asking, What are the great additions which these universities have made within the same period to the amount of human knowledge? Has England been foremost for the last fifty years in mathematics, in the natural sciences, in metaphysics, in history, philology, and criticism, or in most departments of the arts? Who are the great English theologians of this period? Who their lawyers, that have been profound in law as a science, or who in other words have ever thoroughly studied it, except as an insular and artificial system? Or to be still more specific, why is it that every standard edition of the classics which has been issued from the *Oxford* press for the last twenty years, has been the work of a German scholar; or what real contributions to grammar, to metre, or to correcting the text of the classics, have been made during the same period by English scholars? All these queries, it is believed, must receive the same answer, and an answer different from that which may be often given by the German and the French scholar,—an answer also, which the English scholar would not be con-

strained to give, had Oxford and Cambridge been European instead of insular universities.

The excellence of the English university system rests not then on its furnishing a thorough scientific education; this is neither its avowed nor its real design. It fits the sons of the aristocracy and hundreds also from other classes, annually, for an entrance upon active life in England; each to take the sphere which is then assigned to him, or to force his way to a still higher one by his own intense efforts, in the most artificial state of society which exists on earth. The standard, whether elevated or low, has been graduated for England alone: the tutor instructs, and the pupil studies, usually with no other aim.

The *German* system will be next considered. And no two students differ more in appearance and temperament than the English and the German. The training of the latter is begun in one of the hundred gymnasiums of his own country, where he is so minutely and thoroughly drilled for five or seven years, that he is then prepared to enter some one of the fourteen universities of Protestant Germany, a far better classical scholar than are most of the graduates of our American colleges. In one of these gymnasiums the foundations of all his future scholarship are laid, and they are probably the best classical schools, if not also the best scientific schools generally, in the world. German scholarship, whether in the youth or in the full grown man, is never superficial; it has no short and easy road to reputation, the boy is made literally to know what he is taught, and his knowledge becomes a part of the very substance of his mind. When he leaves the gymnasium for the university at an age usually equalling that of one half of our graduates, he is supposed no longer to need the tuition of an instructor.

The previous course of prescribed study, with its daily recitations, is then finally abandoned, and the knowledge which he is now to acquire, is to be gathered either in his private studies or from the lectures of the professors. Thus made his own master, one of his first acts of self-government may be that of joining the university *Landsmannschaft* of his own native province or duchy, and he is thus constituted one of the *Burschen*. And the genuine, full blooded Bursch, is an anomaly out of Germany. The docile youth of the gymnasium has lost none of his literary ardor, he is the same patient, and as he is sometimes slightly termed, the same plodding student as before, but on his solid stock of scholarship he has perhaps now grafted the wild slips of a German Bursch. These are to grow luxuriantly for three years, the term of his university course of study, and they are then to be lopped off, never to revive. You may see him strolling along the streets of Jena or Göttingen, wearing a beard that refuses acquaintance with the razor, his matted locks hanging on his shoulders, his enormous jackboots, armed with pound-spurs, clattering on the pavement, and enveloped in a cloud of tobacco smoke from his pipe of five feet in length. He is as unlike the young Englishman of Oxford or Cambridge in his reverence for the past, as he is in personal appearance. A German student lives in the present, or in the hazy visions of the future, for the *genius loci* of his university may be of quite modern origin. He enters no splendid chapels, he lives in no quadrangular hall, he sees no ancient rooms adorned with busts and pictures of the illustrious dead, where senates annually meet to confer the "honors" on the successful candidates. The university, so far as it meets the eye, is seen only in its vast library, its lecture rooms, and in the persons of

its thirty, or fifty, or seventy professors. These learned gentlemen, and they are the most learned men of Germany, deliver lectures on almost every branch of literature and science, and each student attends on just such courses of lectures, and for as long a period, as he may choose. This is the only mode of university instruction, public or private courses of lectures. As has been previously remarked, all the tutorial drilling of the student at the recitations of the gymnasium, and every prescribed routine of study are now disused as no longer necessary. The immense library of the university contains all the works which he may need for reference; he may employ a private teacher in any particular branch, but all the public instruction which he receives, is given him in the lectures of the professors in one or more of the four faculties. And these lectures are generally admirable productions. For thorough learning and nice discrimination on every subject connected with classical and oriental literature, and with civil law, it is no disparagement to the sound scholars of other countries to affirm, that they are very rarely equalled. These lectures, with their copious references, the student transfers at the time of delivery, so far as is practicable, into his note-book, and he thus gathers up for years the fruits of this varied talent and learning. Nor are his perseverance and ardor usually intermitted during his entire course. Unlike the English student, the German is ordinarily poor or possessed of but a bare competence; he has neither money nor time which he can afford to squander. His application is German application, and what this is needs no explanation. Such is the process by which the young German is trained up for professional or for public life at the gymnasium and the university.

From the descriptions already given, it is evident that a comparison of the German with the English system must be difficult. The celebrated schools of Eton, Harrow and Westminster, in England, are somewhat similar to the gymnasiums of Germany; but neither Oxford nor Cambridge has much resemblance to the universities of the latter country. The course of instruction and study at the English university is in most respects but an advancement upon that of these preparatory schools; at each the student is considered as strictly a pupil who needs the daily tuition of his instructor. His university undertakes not to prepare him for any one of the learned professions. This is a subsequent matter with which she has no concern, all that is there done is to lay the foundations on which the structure may be afterwards erected. But the German youth leaves his state of pupilage at his entrance into the university. There, as if admitted a freeman into the great field of universal science, he pursues self-directed his own path of knowledge. He daily hears, and he all but transcribes the learned disquisitions of his favorite professors, but he is still his own teacher and guide. Under these influences he is now training himself for some public post, for the law, or for medicine, for the ministry, or for a future professorship. Were the English student already engaged in his professional studies, there would be more of a similarity in their positions, although the diversity would be still wide.

But we can compare the effects of these two different systems, we can notice the mental habits which they appropriately form, and can thus, partially at least, decide on their relative merits. I would observe then, that, while the English universities are not schools of general science, and the German universities are such schools, the distinc-

tion seems to be rather speculative than practical, so far as it affects the student himself. How is the student in theology at Göttingen or Berlin benefited by the circumstance, that he may also attend courses of lectures in law, or medicine, or philosophy? True, he is a member of a renowned university, but all its usefulness for him consists in its faculty of theology alone. To him it is a theological school and nothing besides, and he would be none the loser were its other three faculties, with their thirty or forty professors, to be transferred to some distant institution. The superiority of a university to a college, when the latter is adequately endowed, consists not in the fact that the student at the former can more thoroughly explore any single department of learning, but that a university can be sustained at less expense than four or five distinct colleges and professional schools, and that the celebrity of the former will allure the greater number of students. Neither is the German system of instruction by lectures to be deemed so great an advance in the art of communicating knowledge. The student is never questioned by the professor during the delivery of the entire course, but he is permitted to bear away with him as much of each lecture as his memory and note-book can retain. In such a process the mind becomes little else than a mere receiver. There is no collision of intellects, no solution by the instructor, of difficulties started by the mind of the student, no frequent inculcation of fundamental principles. The lecture, whether replete with learning and the soundest criticism, or a mere speculative disquisition, is addressed equally as an *argumentum ad verecundiam* to the student. Whatever then the advantages of this mode of teaching, it is obvious that it may be easily rendered the medium of communicating more

undigested knowledge, more useless speculation, more positive error, than all other modes whatever. Perhaps we may here find the explanation of some of the most marked peculiarities of German literature for the last half century. The national mind is usually described as practical and stable, as possessing the attributes which were so fully developed in him whom we may style Germany's noblest son—Martin Luther. But these are not the characteristics of the literary mind of Germany. Its fecundity in every department is truly wonderful, for never was the wise man's saying so constantly verified, "of making many books there is no end,"—the annual catalogue of their titles only forming a thick octavo volume. But never was such heterogeneity seen as in the works that are yearly sold at the Leipsic fair. There is patient research, there is learning, there is ingenious disquisition, each without measure; and there is also endless diversity, nay contrariety, on almost every subject whatever. In the exact sciences and in those which are in a measure arbitrary—such as municipal law, the wildest speculator can move only in fetters; but in all others it would seem that most of the German scholars select, individually, their own path, regardless of all that have been previously trodden. As a mere classical or biblical critic, the German scholar takes precedence of the English; but when he has once passed the region of grammar and of nice criticism, the former may move in an orbit whose elements admit not of calculation. If the lectures of university professors are to diffuse the only light, how shall the student shape his course on the troubled sea of German theology, or of German metaphysics? Eichhorn follows Michaelis, and De Wette succeeds Eichhorn: Paulus descends below Semler, and Strauss sinks into depths far lower still: Tholuck,

when at Berlin, moves in conjunction with Neander, and when at Halle, in opposition to Gesenius. There is such a reality as theological truth, and the English or the American student usually takes but one path when seeking her abode; but for the German student her home is now on the surface, and now in the clouds, and now—where the old proverb places her—in the bottom of a well.

Neither is the German student guided by a more steady light through the regions of metaphysical philosophy. What was a *terra incognita* twenty years since, may have been for the past five years all mapped out as a thoroughly explored and conquered domain. But ere ten more years elapse, the present recognized boundaries will be so confounded with later divisions, that to any but a German eye, “shadows, clouds, and darkness,” will seem to rest over the whole territory. Scarcely any professor now lectures as a follower of Kant, who, half a century ago, reigned undisputed. The sway of Fichte, who succeeded Kant, has also long since passed away. Jacobi, whose supremacy was next acknowledged over a portion of Germany, still retains some adherents. But Schelling, a still younger metaphysician, was bent on occupying the throne, and as the Germans saw fit to pronounce Schelling their “deepest and sharpest thinker,” his star was next in the ascendant. And now, as if the principle of “rotation in office” were no more the law for tide-waiters, and post-masters, and secretaries in the United States, than for philosophers in Germany, Hegel has been employed for the last fifteen years in wresting the sceptre from Schelling—the latter still contending; for the struggle is not yet ended, for his very life.

Whatever then the explanation, a German university, unlike those of England, exerts no stable, permanent

influence over the majority of its students. Great attainments are indeed made, the perseverance is worthy of all praise; but the mind is in a state of constant transition. Numberless ideas are accumulated, while but few fundamental principles are adopted. The English student, although an offset from the same old Teutonic stock, is constitutionally stable, and his university renders him more stable. His scholarship, if less critical and thorough in the classics, is sounder in mathematics, and often also in modern science, if he once enters its varied walks. His acquisitions, if not more consciously those of knowledge, are often more closely retained in subsequent life, because he prizes them more for their own sake. It is difficult to resist the conviction that the German usually acquires knowledge, simply as a means to an end. The skillful critic or theologian handles his weapons admirably, but the contest is waged for victory rather than truth. Knowledge is valued, if I mistake not, for its own intrinsic worth, more in England than in Germany.

It should be also remarked, that the German system of training exercises no moral restraints upon the student. Neither the university nor its professors assume any responsibility here. He may, at his admission, be required to pledge himself by the signature of his name, that he will obey the laws, that he will not fight a duel, nor join any secret society. Should he be subsequently detected in some gross act of insubordination, he may be confined for a few days in the university prison—for every university has its prison—or, if guilty of some flagrant crime, he may be expelled. These however are mere regulations of police, so intended, and so understood by every student. As moral restraints, they have no influence. And but few, if any, of the German universities, it is supposed,

can be recommended as schools of morals. An English university, if I rightly apprehend its influence, affords an atmosphere not unhealthy to the young man who enters its walls with a reverence for virtue and religion. The idle and the vicious, whether the sons of the aristocracy or from other classes, can easily break through every restraint, and with impunity, if not flagrant in their misconduct.

In proceeding to notice the *American* system of training there are difficulties which attend neither of the preceding divisions of the subject. Some indeed may question the propriety of the term—the American system, under the persuasion that no single specific mode of training has been generally adopted in our colleges. These institutions, it may be said, are as diverse from each other in their foundations, in their courses of tuition and study, and in their discipline, as are the English and the German. Such a diversity doubtless exists, and were we to include in our survey all those institutions which their respective founders or which legislatures have chosen to style colleges and universities, we could speak with but little precision. By the American system I intend, as every alumnus present well understands, that mode of training which has been adopted in most of the older and established colleges in this country, and especially in New England. This has been long practised, its features are distinct, and it has secured general approbation. I would also observe that, while the collegiate system of New England generally will be noticed, there will be also a constant reference to that which has been so long successfully maintained at Yale.

No such institutions as the English and the German universities exist in New England, or in the United States.

Oxford and Cambridge are each a collection of distinct, though associated colleges, Oxford having twenty four, and Cambridge seventeen, and each of these latter is in itself a complete institution. Still less is the resemblance between a German university and one of our own seminaries. The former is the union of four great professional schools, or faculties, of theology, law, medicine, and philosophy, while a New England college in the structure of its academical department is not radically unlike a German gymnasium. Yale, as well as Harvard, has its three professional schools in connection with its proper collegiate department, and Harvard has long borne the title of university, but it is as colleges simply that we are to notice these institutions. The position of the student at Oxford or Cambridge, if he is considered merely as a member of his own particular college, and not of the university, is not unlike that of the American student, but there is scarcely any similarity between the German institutions and our own. In comparing our own system of training with the English and the German, it is then obvious, that we must aim rather at general results than at a course of details.

The assertion may not soothe our self-complacency, but I suppose it to be undoubtedly true, that the English student enters one of the colleges at Oxford or Cambridge ordinarily far better prepared than the youth who is received into one of our own institutions. Eton, Harrow, Westminster, and Rugby, are national schools, and lads are there drilled for years by the ablest masters, into such a knowledge of Greek and Latin as is rarely attained in any of our academies or grammar schools. This is the foundation, and they lay it deep and broad in England and in Germany; and we, in our superior wisdom, often

begin to build the house before the foundation is half completed. Probably a moiety of the New England students enter their respective colleges, scarcely more than half fitted. Some cannot afford a longer time, others have not the means, others still persuade their parents that time enough has been spent in preparation, and all apparently believe that, whatever the deficiency, it will be compensated by supererogatory attainments at college. And as the frequent result, no small part of the first two years is occupied with still laying the foundations; the building indeed after a time ascends, but slowly, often ill-proportioned, and of very frail materials. Here, as I suppose, commences the radical defect in the American system of training—a defect not chargeable upon the officers of our colleges, and which none have more pointedly exposed than themselves, but which is often remediless through the entire subsequent course. What costs in England six or eight years' constant study, and drilling by a succession of the best masters, must be here usually acquired in three, if not in two years, under a single teacher—perhaps competent, perhaps of but a journeyman's skill. A youth of sterling talents and unconquerable perseverance will, in himself, surmount even greater difficulties; but many a parent has ultimate reason to thank the college instructor that his son, thus half trained, does not leave the institution a contented blockhead, or hopelessly broken down in spirit. The remedy for this great evil, to be effectual, must be applied where the evil itself begins. Teaching must become as distinct and substantive a profession as divinity or law or medicine, and this will be done whenever the community gives it what it intrinsically deserves—equal honor. Why should the professional teacher be less respected than the merchant

or the lawyer? In cultivation of intellect he usually excels the one, while he equals the other; and in usefulness does he not commonly equal, and often exceed, either? My younger brethren, you especially have the power to accomplish much here. We have all learned from experience, that the boy can as little learn to make a railroad progress in scholarship, as can the infant in walking: let your sons then in future years be sent to Yale, thoroughly fitted.

When the youth has become a member of one of our colleges, he enters on a course of study more extended and scientific than that which is pursued at Oxford or Cambridge, or at a German gymnasium. This is undoubtedly the case in most of the New England institutions, and also in some others, and it has been probably long the case at Yale. One explanation of this inequality may perhaps be found in the circumstance, that the English universities require so short a period of actual residence as the condition of a degree,—Cambridge requiring but twelve months, and Oxford but twenty-one, out of the four years; while in our own colleges, thirty-six months out of the four years are usually occupied with study. Another explanation would seem to be this,—that the ordinary college course is deemed in England a subordinate matter, and that the great stress is placed on the additional studies which the candidates for “honors,” who constitute one third or more of the whole number, pursue under private tutors. But whatever the explanation, the American course of study is the more scientific of the two. And if the student enters on it well prepared, is it doubtful whether it is preferable to the English? Let such a youth who has attained sixteen years—and this age is usually sufficiently early—commence his first

year's studies in this college, and then faithfully pursue the three years' course which consists mainly of the classics and the mathematics, and he will have laid the proper basis for all subsequent acquisitions. Here, as really as in England or in Germany, the scholar is formed on the foundations of mathematics and the learned languages; no pillars, dug from the quarries of ancient or modern learning, compare in strength or beauty with these. And when his fourth year arrives, the new course of study then pursued is not a mere graceful appendage. A third pillar, of as fair proportions and of equal stability, is now fixed by the side of the first two; and on their united strength any subsequent structure, however lofty, will securely rest. If the American system is comparatively defective in the classics and mathematics, so that the first third of our graduates must be pronounced inferior to those of the corresponding rank at Oxford in the one branch, and at Cambridge in the other, they are superior to those of England and Germany in the third great branch of studies. The dead languages are to be studied as one form of mental discipline, mainly for the purpose of learning how to use our own language with the greatest perspicuity and force; and mathematics are to be pursued as a similar discipline, because it is the science of rigid demonstration. Neither can be ever superseded or made secondary in a system of sound education, until men shall discover that the pyramid is to be built with its base above and its apex below. But still another process of discipline is equally necessary,—that which fits the mind to reason justly on moral and metaphysical subjects, and on the other great practical interests of life. Strict demonstration, as such, has very little connection with such subjects. Instead of reasoning from contradictions

or absurdities, which is the province of mathematics, the mind is to compare analogies, to weigh opposing arguments, and to decide according to the preponderance of evidence. The mere mathematician is here often consciously at fault, and the mere classical scholar is little better than a critic on words and sentences; neither will their combined powers be sufficient, but a third process of culture is indispensable. This is secured in our own country, and particularly at Yale, by the studies of the fourth year. In this list are included Logic, Mental and Moral Philosophy, Natural Theology and the Evidences of Christianity, Political Economy, and the elements of international and constitutional Law. These are the elements of all metaphysical and moral science, and no young man can be deemed well educated who has not to some extent successfully studied them. The American system, I would repeat it, is preferable here.

In two other important branches, one of which is scientific, the student at our colleges is generally superior. Chemistry, with its kindred departments of mineralogy and geology, is a broad field of science, nor is it less the constant minister to the arts; and when taught as it is at Yale, both in its principles and by experiment, its importance can be scarcely overrated. And in the skillful and prompt use of his native language, whether in written composition or in oral disputation, the American student probably exceeds the English, if not also the German.

Were the sum of the preceding remarks to be now expressed, it would be as follows. The English system of college training usually succeeds a course of far more thorough drilling than the American. Oxford gives more of the husk and more of the fruit of classical learning, and Cambridge gives more knowledge of mathematics, to

their best scholars, than our own receive. In general knowledge and science, the scale is reversed, in favor of our own students. When the American student enters on a professional life, he is almost of course inferior as a classical, and usually also as a biblical scholar, to the German student from the university; but in most other particulars he is probably equal, if not superior. Whatever the defects of our own system, it possesses, if I mistake not, this advantage, and such has been its constant aim,—that of sending forth the young student into active life essentially deficient in no one branch of a liberal education, but well versed in all. If he does not as readily apply the Differential Calculus to the rectification of curves or the areas of surfaces as the Cantabrigian,—if he does not as critically relish an ode of Pindar or a chorus of Sophocles as the Oxonian or the German, he is better acquainted with the power of his vernacular tongue; he has entered more of the walks of modern science; he has been more thoroughly imbued with fundamental principles. It is in the strong grasp on such principles, and in their felicitous practical application, that the American mind has, if I err not, taken the lead. In mechanical inventions none surpass us; in biblical learning the English scholar for almost a generation has been rapidly falling behind the American; but it is in theology, if not also in ethics, in the science of law and of politics, and in that application of both to the public interests which evinces the profound statesman, that our own system of training has borne its richest fruit, richer than the similar products of any other soil.

But I should be inexcusable were I not here distinctly to notice one feature in this system, to which no allusion has as yet been made. It is the moral and religious in-

fluence, which accompanies the student from the moment of his entrance into the halls of a New England college until the hour of his departure. Such an influence, so far as it exists in a German university, is, as we have already seen, merely incidental. The public statutes, which are but so many police regulations, do not recognize its necessity, nor do the professors personally practise any supervision. The student in theology may waltz at Jena on Sunday* evening, by the side of his favorite professor; or should he, if challenged by some swaggering *Bursch*, fight one or more duels at Jena or Göttingen with the straight sword, he will lose no character. Nor is this influence, so far as it is felt at an English university, any other than would seem to be necessarily inherent in institutions which were originally, and for centuries, essentially monastic, and which during later centuries have been nurseries for upholding the supremacy of the established church. But in most of the colleges of New England this influence has been ever deemed a vital element, throughout the entire course of training the student. These seminaries were founded by men who loved and honored evangelical religion above all things else below the sun, and they were founded that they might be her handmaids. "*Christo, Ecclesiæque*," was the inscription designed for each corner-stone, for every alcove, for each professor's chair. Need I say that such was the foundation of Yale? One hundred and forty-four years since—and what other historical event has rendered so memorable the opening of the eighteenth century?—ten of the principal ministers of this State, then a feeble colony, met and laid the foundations of this college, designing it to be

a seminary of learning and a school of the prophets. Little did those godly men understand the policy that would divorce science from religion, and little has been the countenance given to such a separation by any of the subsequent friends of this institution. Never has the day yet dawned when, had the alternative been the continuance and enlargement of the college as a school of science only, or its extinction, they would not have aided in overthrowing it "from turret to foundation stone." Yale ever has been, may Yale never cease to be, a nursery of science, and a handmaid to the religion of the Lord Jesus Christ; and in such an institution the atmosphere must be salutary and bracing. Here, and in the younger New England colleges, as truly as at Oxford and Cambridge, or as at Halle and Jena and Göttingen, although in far less degrees, will there be profligacy and scepticism; but here also is the steady counterbalance which has never yet been overcome. It is felt, not in the laws of a military or municipal police, but as a moral and religious influence, pervading every department of the college, and triumphant through the community. No parent can send his son even to a New England college with the assurance that he shall receive him again, after the four years' course is ended, uncorrupted and virtuous; for the cherubim with their flaming swords still guard the way to the sinless paradise. But such is the strength of this influence, and so frequent have been the outpourings of the Divine Spirit upon these institutions, awing the depraved and restraining the turbulent, while making large accessions to the friends of truth and righteousness, that they may be deemed as safe abodes for the youthful student as any without the paternal mansion.

In closing an Address already too long, but for which the amplitude of the subject must be my apology, suffer me again to notice the necessity of a more thorough preparation for admission to our colleges. If our young men are to begin the race on equal terms with those of England and Germany, there must be more time spent in preliminary study, more careful drilling by able masters. I would also suggest the expediency of multiplying prizes for superior scholarship, during the last two years of the college course,—prizes, to be given in the form of gold medals, and to be accompanied by the public recitation of the successful compositions. One Alumnus of Yale,* and I mention it to his honor, has already instituted an annual premium for English composition; and were other Alumni to institute Greek, Latin, Mathematical and Theological prizes, this college would offer some of those additional stimulants to scholarship which are now so powerful in the English universities. I would also inquire, with great diffidence, whether a somewhat longer period might not be allotted to the studies now occupying the Senior year? These form, as has been remarked, the third great process of intellectual discipline; and while six years, allowing three for preliminary training, are given to the languages and to mathematics, but one year is devoted to these branches. Is there not here a real, as well as an apparent disproportion?

BRETHREN: These anniversary scenes give youthful freshness to our feelings, but which of us do they not also sadden? The past, and to many of us the long past, when manly hands were here clasped in our hands, and joyous hearts responded to our hearts; the present,—and

those hearts are silent, those hands are dust! Our subject for the brief hour has been college studies and discipline; but we are all receiving lessons from higher than earthly teachers,—we are daily undergoing a discipline which is forming us, consciously or unconsciously, for eternity. Misspent college hours may be, at times, replaced by subsequent diligence; but a misspent life, a lost probation, who can ever repair! Our exit from these peaceful halls has proved to each of us but an entrance upon the world's changeful, and often stormy scenes. May divine grace so order our remaining days, that our exit from earth shall be but an introduction to the rest of the blessed!

Terms of Admission.

CANDIDATES for admission to the Freshman Class, are examined in Cicero's Select Orations, the whole of Virgil, Sallust, Jacobs', Colton's or Felton's Greek Reader, the first three books of Xenophon's Anabasis, Andrews and Stoddard's Latin Grammar, Goodrich's or Sophocles' Greek Grammar, Andrews' Latin Exercises, Latin Prosody, Arithmetic, English Grammar, and Geography.*

A candidate for an advanced standing, whether from another college or not, in addition to the preparatory studies, is examined in the various branches to which the class he proposes to enter has attended. No one can be admitted into the Senior Class after the close of the January vacation.

The regular examination for admission into College, commences on the Monday preceding the public Commencement; but

* The deficiency of most candidates for admission, in the Latin and Greek Grammars, Latin Prosody and Composition, Geography, and the theoretical part of Arithmetic, makes it necessary to remark, that the examination in these subjects will be strict and comprehensive. Candidates will also observe, that Arithmetic is no longer studied in College, and an examination for admission is therefore held in both the theory and practice of Arithmetic.

persons may be examined for an advanced standing in any other part of the collegiate terms. It is requested that they may not be offered in the vacations, except for very special reasons.

No one can be admitted to the Freshman Class, till he has completed his fourteenth year, nor to an advanced standing without a proportional increase of age.

Testimonials of good moral character are in all cases required; and those who are admitted from other colleges must produce certificates of dismissal in good standing. The students are not considered as regular members of the College, till, after a residence of at least six months, they have been admitted to matriculation, on satisfactory evidence of an unblemished moral character. Before this they are only students on probation.

Course of Instruction.

THE Faculty, to whom is committed the government and instruction of the students, consists of a President; a Professor of Chemistry, Mineralogy, and Geology; a Professor of the Latin Language and Literature; a Professor of Divinity; a Professor of Natural Philosophy and Astronomy; a Professor of the Greek Language and Literature; a Professor of Rhetoric and English Literature; a Professor of Mathematics; an Assistant Professor of the Latin and Greek Languages; and seven Tutors.

The whole course of instruction occupies four years. In each year, there are three terms or sessions.

The three younger classes are divided each into two or three parts. These are instructed by the Tutors of the class, in rotation, with the assistance of the Professors. The Senior Class is instructed by the President and Professors. Each of the four classes attends three recitations or lectures in a day; except on Wednesdays and Saturdays, when they have only two. The following scheme gives a general view of the authors recited in each term:—

Changes in the Greek and Latin authors recited are sometimes introduced in the latter part of the course ; but these changes do not affect the *amount* of Greek and Latin required of those who apply for admission to an advanced standing.

Besides the recitations in Kent's Commentaries, the Professor of Law delivers Lectures to the Senior Class during the first and second terms ; one in each week.

A short course of Anatomy and Physiology, consisting of about twenty lectures, is given, in the summer season, to the Senior Class, which are illustrated by natural and artificial preparations.

In addition to the recitations in the books here specified, the classes receive lectures and occasional instruction from the Professors of the Greek and Latin languages ; the Junior Class attends a course of experimental lectures on Natural Philosophy ; and the Senior Class, the course on Chemistry, Mineralogy, Geology, and select subjects of Natural Philosophy and Astronomy.

In the department of Elocution, the Freshman Class, in several divisions, have through the year, a weekly recitation and exercise upon the elementary principles of the science, conducted by the Teacher of Elocution ; the Sophomore and Junior Classes, frequent private exercises, preparatory to public declamation in the Chapel before the Professor of Rhetoric and the members of the class ; and the Sophomore Class, in several divisions, an exercise once a fortnight, in reading poetry and prose. There is delivered in connection with this exercise a series of oral Lectures on the principal English authors.

The members of the several classes attend also the private exercises and lectures of the Professor of Rhetoric. A course of Lectures on the Oration of Demosthenes for the crown, is delivered to members of the Senior Class. Specimens of English composition are exhibited once a fortnight by each member of the Sophomore and Junior Classes. Written translations from Latin authors are presented weekly by the Freshman Class. The lower classes are also instructed in Latin composition. The Senior and Junior Classes have forensic Disputations once or twice a week, before their instructors.

The Professor of Arabic and Sanskrit will give instruction on Tuesdays and Wednesdays in Arabic grammar with interpretation of the Korân and the Mo'allakas, and on Fridays and Saturdays in Sanskrit grammar with interpretation of the Laws of Manu.

Gentlemen well qualified to teach the modern languages, are engaged by the Faculty to give instruction in these branches to those students who desire it, at their own expense.

The object of the system of instruction to the undergraduates in the College, is not to give a *partial* education, consisting of a few branches only; nor on the other hand, to give a *superficial* education, containing a little of almost every thing; nor to *finish* the details of either a professional or practical education; but to *commence* a *thorough* course, and to carry it as far as the time of the student's residence here will allow. It is intended to maintain such a proportion between the different branches of literature and science, as to form a proper *symmetry* and *balance* of character. In laying the foundation of a thorough education, it is necessary that *all* the important faculties be brought into exercise. When certain mental endowments receive a much higher culture than others, there is a distortion in the intellectual character. The powers of the mind are not developed in their fairest proportions, by studying languages alone, or mathematics alone, or natural or political science alone. The object, in the proper collegiate department is not to teach that which is peculiar to any one of the *professions*; but to lay the foundation which is common to them all. There are separate schools of Medicine, Law and Theology, connected with the College, as well as in various parts of the country, which are open to all who are prepared to enter on professional studies. With these the undergraduate course is not intended to interfere. It contains those subjects only which ought to be understood by every one who aims at a thorough education. The principles of science and literature are the common foundation of all high intellectual attainments. They give that furniture, and discipline, and elevation to the mind, which are the best preparation for the study of a profession, or of the operations which are peculiar to the higher mercantile, manufacturing, or agricultural establishments.

For a more particular view of the plan of education in the College, see Reports on the course of Instruction, published in Vol. XV, of the American Journal of Science.

The Berkeleian Premium, of about forty six dollars a year, is given to the scholar in each class who passes the best examination in Latin and Greek; provided he resides as a graduate in New Haven, one, two, or three years. A Premium of sixty dollars a year has been instituted by Isaac H. Townsend, Esq. for the encouragement of English composition in the Senior Class. In the other classes Premiums are also given for Latin and English composition, and solutions of mathematical problems.

There are two public examinations of the classes in a year,—one in April, the other in August,—which are continued from four to six days each. The candidates for degrees are also examined at the close of their course of study.

There are three vacations in a year; one of six weeks, beginning at Commencement, the third Thursday in August; the second, two weeks from the first Wednesday in January; and the third, four weeks from the last Wednesday in April. No student is allowed to be absent, without special leave, except in vacations. The absence of a student in term time even for a few days, occasions a much greater injury to his education, than is commonly supposed by parents and guardians.

Parents are earnestly advised not to allow their sons to remain at the College in the vacations; except the short vacation in January.

Public Worship.

Prayers are attended in the College Chapel every morning and evening, with the reading of the Scriptures; when one of the Faculty officiates, and all the students are required to be present. They are also required to attend public worship in the Chapel on the Sabbath, except such as have permission to attend the Episcopal or other congregations in town.

Expenses.

The College bills are made out by the Treasurer three times a year, at the close of each term; and are presented to the students, who are required to present them to their parents, guardians, or patrons. If any student fails to comply with this requisition, he is not permitted to recite till the bills are paid.

The annual charges in the Treasurer's bill are,

Besides this, the student may be charged for damages done by himself, and a small sum for printing catalogues, and other occasional expenses.

Board is obtained at prices varying from \$1 25 to \$3 00. To a majority of the students the cost of board is less than \$2 00 a week, each. It is furnished on the premises at \$2 00 a week; or \$80 a year, not including vacations. Fuel is procured by the Corporation and distributed to those students who apply for it, at cost and charges.

The students provide for themselves bed and bedding, furniture for their rooms, candles, books, stationery and washing. There are also, in the several classes and literary societies, taxes of a small amount. If books and furniture are sold, when the student has no further necessity for them, the expenses incurred by their use will not be great.

The following may be considered as a near estimate of the *necessary* expenses, without including apparel, pocket money, travelling, and board in vacations:

No students are permitted to take lodgings in town, except when the rooms in College are not sufficient to accommodate all.

Students who occupy the recitation rooms, save their room rent and fuel in winter, and receive a small compensation in summer. A cheap board is obtained in clubs, by those students who wish board at a lower rate than is furnished in boarding-houses.

Indigent students are supplied with text-books, without expense, from the Benevolent and Education Libraries.

By a resolve of the Corporation, a sum not exceeding one thousand dollars a year, is appropriated to the relief of indigent students and the encouragement of merit. *In addition to the above*, the income of a fund, recently placed at the disposal of the Corporation, enables them to remit *entirely* the charge for tuition of twenty meritorious students, and *in part* the tuition of about thirty more. Notes of the several incorporated banks in this State, and such other notes as are taken by the banks in the city of New Haven, are received in payment of the bills. Drafts on New York, Philadelphia and Boston, are received without discount. Money or drafts to pay the Treasurer's bills, may be transmitted directly to the Treasurer.

With regard to apparel, and what is called pocket money, no general estimate can be made. These are the articles in which the expenses of individuals differ most; and in which some are unwarrantably extravagant. There is nothing by which the character and scholarship of the students in this College are more endangered, than by a free indulgence in the use of money. Great caution with regard to this is requisite on the part of parents. What is more than sufficient to defray the ordinary expenses,

will expose the student to numerous temptations; and will not contribute either to his respectability or happiness.

As a precaution against extravagance, parents at a distance frequently deposit funds with some one of the Faculty; who, in that case, pays a particular attention to the pecuniary concerns of the student, settles his bills, corresponds with the parent, transmits an account of the expenditures, &c., for which he charges a commission.

Any person admitted to an advanced standing, unless coming from another college, pays a sum to the Treasurer, equal to half the tuition money, which has been paid by others of the class which he enters.

The Theological Department.

THE INSTRUCTORS in the Theological Department, are a Professor of Didactic Theology, a Professor of Sacred Literature, the Professor of Divinity in the College, and a Professor of the Pastoral Charge.

The whole course of instruction occupies three years; and the students are divided into Junior, Middle, and Senior classes.

The time of admission is at the commencement of the first collegiate term. It is desirable that those who join the school, should commence at the beginning of the collegiate year; and those admitted to an advanced standing will be expected to have previously gone over the studies pursued by their respective classes. The terms and vacations are the same with those in the College. The conditions for entrance, are hopeful piety, and a liberal education at some college, unless the candidate has otherwise qualified himself for pursuing advantageously the prescribed course of studies.

No charges are made for tuition or lectures.

No funds have as yet been granted to this department for defraying the expenses of indigent students.

A building has been erected for the accommodation of students, in which the rooms are without charge, and are in part furnished.

Board may be obtained in private families at from \$1 25 to \$2 50 per week.

The Law School.

THIS Department is under the direction of the Hon. DAVID DAGGETT, LL. D., late Chief Justice of the Supreme Court of Connecticut, and Professor of Law; and the Hon. SAMUEL J. HITCHCOCK, LL. D., Judge of the New Haven City Court; and ISAAC H. TOWNSEND, Esq., Attorney and Counsellor at Law.

There are two courses of instruction and study in the School, one called the *professional* course, and the other called the *general* course. The object of the professional course is to give a thorough legal education to those gentlemen who propose to enter the Profession of Law. The design of the general course is, more particularly, to communicate appropriate information to those who wish to attend to jurisprudence as a branch of liberal knowledge. A course with special reference to *mercantile law* is introduced as often as any class requests it.

I. THE PROFESSIONAL COURSE.

The students are required to peruse the most important elementary treatises, and are daily examined on the author they are reading, and receive at the same time explanations and illustrations of the subjects they are studying.

The School is divided into three reading classes. Each class is daily employed upon a lesson in the Class Book, and is separately examined, and every student can read in one or more of the three classes, as he finds himself able and inclined to perform the requisite labor.

Courses of Lectures are delivered by the Instructors, on all the titles and subjects of Common and Statute Law, and of Equity.

Three exercises, consisting of Lectures or Examinations of one hour each, are daily given by the Instructors, and at all of them each of the pupils is permitted to attend.

A moot court is held once a week or oftener, which employs the students in drawing pleadings, and investigating and arguing questions of law.

The students are called upon, from time to time, to draw declarations, pleadings, contracts, and other instruments connected with the practice of law, and to do the most important duties of an attorney's clerk.

They are occasionally required to write disquisitions on some topic of law, and collect the authorities to support their opinions.

The students are furnished with the use of the elementary books, and have access, at all times, to the College libraries, and to a law library, comprising every important work, both ancient and modern. The law library contains the Revised Statutes, the Reports and the Digests of all the States in the Union.

The course of study occupies two years, allowing eight weeks vacation each year. The months of May and September are allotted for vacations. There is also a recess of about two weeks near the first of January in each year.

The terms for tuition, with constant use of text-books, and ordinary use of the library, are as follows, payable in advance. For the whole course of two years, one hundred and fifty dollars. For one year, eighty dollars. For less than one year, ten dollars a month. For more than one year, and less than two years, seven dollars a month after the first year.

The degree of Bachelor of Laws will be conferred by the President and Fellows, on liberally educated students who have been members of the Department eighteen months, and have complied with the regulations of the institution, and passed a satisfactory examination. Those not liberally educated, will be graduated upon similar conditions, after two years' membership; and members of the Bar, after one year's membership subsequent to their admission to the Bar.

II. THE GENERAL COURSE.

This course consists of lectures and studies on the most important subjects of jurisprudence. It commences on the third Monday of October in each year, and continues six months, with two exercises each week. An *additional* course will be commenced at any other season, if a class of not less than twenty members shall be formed for the purpose. The additional course will either embrace the same exercises with the general course, or will

be principally directed to Mercantile Law, as the class formed for the course shall prefer.

The terms are twenty dollars for the whole course, payable in advance ; and five dollars a month for any less time. The professional students will have the privilege of attending the general course, and also any additional course, at pleasure, without extra charge.

The Medical Institution.

THE Instructors in the Medical Institution, are a Professor of Surgery, a Professor of Chemistry and Pharmacy, a Professor of the Theory and Practice of Physic, a Professor of Materia Medica and Therapeutics, a Professor of Anatomy and Physiology, and a Professor of Obstetrics.

The annual course of Lectures, commences at the expiration of six weeks from the third Thursday of August, and continues sixteen weeks. The lectures are so arranged, that at least five are given daily, and a part of the time six.

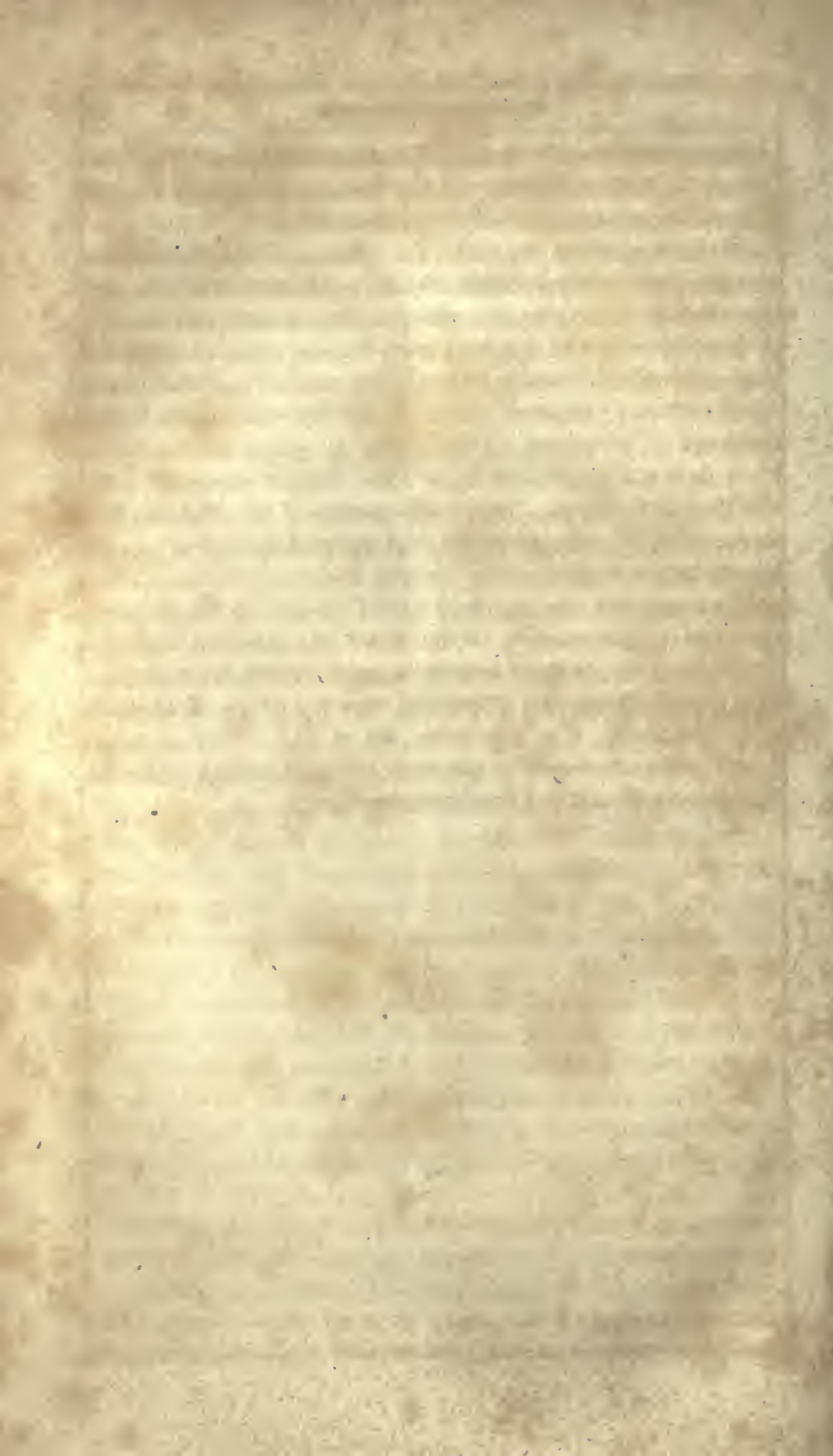
The fees, which are required in advance, are \$12 50 for each course, except that on Obstetrics, which is \$6. The Matriculation fee is \$5, and there is a contingent bill of \$2 50. Those who have attended two courses of Lectures in this Institution, are entitled to admission to future courses on the payment of the Matriculation fee and the contingent bill. Board with room, &c. may be obtained at about \$2 25 or \$2 50 per week.

The students are entitled to gratuitous admission to the Medical and Academical Libraries, to the Cabinet of Minerals, and to the Lectures on Anatomy and Physiology, given to the Senior Class during the spring term in the Academical Institution ; and also to the Lectures on Natural Philosophy, on paying the fee of the course.

The Medical College building is spacious and commodious. The Anatomical Museum, already one of the most valuable in the country, is annually receiving important additions. The arrangements for Dissections are ample, and subjects are supplied

on the most reasonable terms. The Anatomical rooms, the Cabinet of the Materia Medica, and the Museum of the Yale Natural History Society, are all freely open to students.

By the Statutes of the State, the requirements for graduation are three years' study for those who are not Bachelors of Arts, and two years for those who are; attendance upon two full courses of Lectures, either in this Institution or some other, of a similar character; the attainment of twenty one years of age, and a good moral character; together with a satisfactory examination before the board of examiners for the State, at which the candidate must present a dissertation upon some subject connected with the Medical Sciences. This board consists of the Medical Professors of the College, *ex officiis*, and an equal number of persons chosen by the Fellows of the Medical Society of the State. Licenses to practice are granted by the President of the Society, upon the recommendation of the board of examiners, and candidates for a license must possess the same qualifications as those for a degree, except that attendance upon one course of Lectures only is required. The graduation fee is \$15. The examination is held immediately at the close of the Lectures, when the licenses are granted and the degrees conferred.
