

BRIG. GEN ALLEN IS NEW AIR LOGISTICS CENTER VICE COMMANDER

Brig. Gen John R. Allen Jr. has been named the new vice commander for the

Sacramento Air Logistics Center at McClellan Air Force Base.

Prior to his assignment to McClellan, General Allen was commander of the 45th Air Division, Strategic Air Command, Pease AFB, New Hampshire.

He replaces Brig. Gen. James W. Hopp, who is now Air Force Logistics

Command's deputy chief of staff for Communications-Computer Systems Center and

commander of the Logistics Management Systems Center at Wright-Patterson AFB,

Ohio.

A native of Louisville, Ky., General Allen began his first Air Force operational assignment in December 1959, when he was assigned to Little Rock AFB, Ark., as a B-47 co-pilot. In June 1964 he was transferred to the 393rd Bombardment Squadron at Pease. After completing B-52 training he was assigned to the 20th Bombardment Squadron, Carswell AFB, Texas, as a B-52 commander and later served as chief of the Standardization Division.

Between 1969 and 1971, he flew 150 B-52 combat missions during three temporary duty tours in Southeast Asia and served as chief of the Tactical Evaluation Division, 8th Air Force, Andersen AFB, Guam.

In 1972, he was assigned to Headquarters, Strategic Air Command, Offutt AFB, Neb. While stationed there as an air operations staff officer, he helped certify Navy sea mines for use on B-52Ds and completed feasibility tests on the B-52 high-altitude laser-guided bomb delivery. Positions as chief of the Aircraft and Weapons Test Branch and executive officer to the deputy chief of staff for operations, also at SAC headquarters, soon followed.

In February 1977, the general assumed command of the 46th Bombardment Squadron, Grand Forks AFB, N.D., and then was transferred in August 1978 to the Air Staff at Headquarters, U.S. Air Force, Washington, D.C. During this period he served as one of two action officers who presented Air Force positions to the Joint Chiefs of Staff on the strategic arms limitations talks.

General Allen received a bachelor of arts degree from the University of Nebraska in 1975 and a master of arts degree in management and supervision from Central Michigan University in 1979.

His military education includes the Industrial College of the Armed Forces and Harvard Universitys Senior Defense Managers Program.


General Allen is a command pilot with more than 6,000 flying hours in B-47s, FB-111s, B-52s, KC-135s and T-39s. His military decorations and awards include the Defense Superior Service Medal, Legion of Merit, Distinguished Flying Cross, Defense Meritorious Service Medal, Meritorious Service Medal with one oak leaf cluster, Air Medal with six oak leaf clusters, Air Force Commendation Medal with one oak leaf cluster and Combat Readiness Medal.

General Allen is married to the former Josephine P. Jones. They have two children.

GENERAL SAMUEL E. ANDERSON, USAF COMMANDER, AIR FORCE LOGISTICS COMMAND

Samuel E. Anderson was born in Greensboro, North Carolina on January 6, 1906. He was graduated from the U. S. Military Academy on June 9, 1928, and commissioned a second lieutenant in the Coast Artillery.

After graduation from Advanced Flying School at Kelly Field, Texas, in September 1929, he held various assignments at Mitchel Field, New York, and Chanute Field, Illinois, before returning to Kelly Field in 1934 as an Advanced Flying School Instructor.

After serving in Hawaii and Langley Field, Virginia, from 1939 to 1941, General Anderson was assigned to the Office of Assistant Chief of Air Staff at Army Air Force Headquarters, Washington, D. C., in October 1941.

Moving to England in June 1943, General Anderson became Commander of the Ninth Bomber Command there. On May 26, 1945, he was named Chief of Staff of the Continental Air Force at Andrews Field, Maryland, and in June, 1950, he was transferred to the Office of the Secretary of the Air Force.

On August 1, 1950, General Anderson assumed command of the Eighth Air Force, Strategic Air Command, at Carswell Air Force Base, Texas. He was appointed Commander of the Fifth Air Force, Korea, on June 2, 1953.

Returning to Washington, D. C., on August 1, 1954, General Anderson was designated Director of the Weapons Systems Evaluation Group in the Office of the Assistant Secretary for Research and Development, Office of the Secretary of Defense.

On August 1, 1957, he assumed command of Air Research and Development Command (ARDC), Andrews AFB, Washington, D. C., and on March 16, 1959, became Commander of Air Materiel Command, with headquarters at Wright-Patterson AFB, Ohio. Before assuming command, he was promoted to four-star rank.

On April 1, 1961 Air Materiel Command was redesignated Air Force Logistics Command.

His decorations include the Distinguished-Service Medal with two Oak Leaf Clusters, Silver Star, Distinguished Flying Cross, Air Medal, and decorations from seven foreign nations. He is rated a command pilot.

General and Mrs. Anderson have one daughter, Ellen.


