

**Effective Jan. 1, 2023,** to be eligible for bonuses and be featured in *Spotlight*, Producers must meet the required Retention or the minimum Net to Gross. Net to Gross varies based on bonus guidelines and is used only during the Producer's first twelve months. The rates listed are for *Spotlight* recognition only.

Retention: **75.0%**  
Net to Gross: **80%**

## Dates to Remember

eApp business and paper applications subject to the 7-day hold should be uploaded or sent to Home Office by **Thursday 12/21 before 2:00pm Central**. Paper apps excluded from the 7-day hold and PR credits should be sent to Home Office by **Wednesday 12/27**. eApp business excluded from the 7-day hold should be uploaded by **Friday 12/29 before 4:30pm Central** to count for **December** production.

eApp cutoff has been extended to 3:30pm Central every Wednesday, Thursday, and last day of the calendar month to allow more business to load before the weekly advance and end-of-month AP&P cutoff. All other days of the week remain the standard 2:00pm Central cutoff time.







To our Top Producers Council, I applaud you for a fantastic performance and encourage you to keep it up. Keep aiming higher and extending your reach.


