



Keep the End in Mind

I have been preparing for the Upper Midwest Human Rights Campaign Dinner on Sept. 23, 2000. By default, I am this year's Dinner co-chair. What that means is simply no other volunteer wanted to take on the daunting task of hosting a dinner party for 1,100 people. By the way, I don't cook, I am not the best at details and I am a better motivator than manager. So what am I doing hosting a formal dinner party, juggling hundreds of details and managing 35 other volunteers? I'm not sure. But I am sure of this: when you believe in something enough, you find the way to accomplish what seems impossible.

The lessons I have learned are invaluable. Stephen Covey taught us "Start with the end in mind." When a small group of determined people has a clear vision and set priorities, the impossible becomes reality. This year, our goal at HRC was to grow the net revenue of the dinner, increase first time attendee participation and give past attendees a completely new experience. Our revenue is set to surpass budget by \$35,000 or 25 percent. We have enrolled over 150 first-time attendees and our design of the program, content, and entertainment has been controversial with the old-timers. I would measure that as success.

I share this because I believe these are the lessons of life. Whether you are hosting a dinner, building an agency, coordinating a GOTV effort or participating in credit union and other union activities, it all starts with the end in mind.

The end in mind for us is Nov. 7, 2000. What role will we each play in shaping the political face in our community? There have already been a few hurdles – things have moved a bit slower than we expected – and there will probably be a few more obstacles along the way. Keep the end in mind ... Nov. 7th, 2000. If not now, when? I guess there's always another election in four years ... and then, there's another Dinner next year.



Harold A. Schaitberger General President. International Association of Fire Fighters

Harold A. Schaitberger was elected General President of the 240,000-member International Association of Fire Fighters on Aug. 2, 2000 at the IAFF's 45th biennial Convention in Chicago. He is the ninth General President in the IAFF's 82-year history and the first to be elected by acclamation.

Schaitberger began his career with the Fairfax County, VA, Fire and Rescue Department in 1966 and rose through the ranks to become the department's youngest lieutenant. Schaitberger led the drive to organize a local IAFF affiliate in the 500-member department in 1970. His efforts paid off and he was elected the first president of IAFF Local 2068.

In 1973, Schaitberger was elected president of the Virginia Professional Fire Fighters. At 27, he was the youngest president in the history of the IAFF-affiliated state association. In that post, he worked to pass Virginia's Heart/Lung Presumption statute and bills related to protecting fire fighters' pensions, safety and health.

Schaitberger came to the IAFF headquarters in 1976 to head the union's national political and legislative programs. He played a key role in the creation of the Public Safety Officers Benefit, in the enactment of FLSA overtime, in protecting pensions and in securing federal funds to create the IAFF Hazardous Materials Training Program. Schaitberger was subsequently chosen, in 1988, to run the dayto-day operations of the IAFF as a chief advisor to the General President.

Schaitberger is widely recognized as an expert on public employee pension issues. He has served as legislative counsel to the National Conference on Public Employee Retirement Systems and was a co-founder and vice president of the Public Safety Employees Pension and Benefits Conference.

A native of Washington, D.C., General President Schaitberger currently resides in Maryland.
