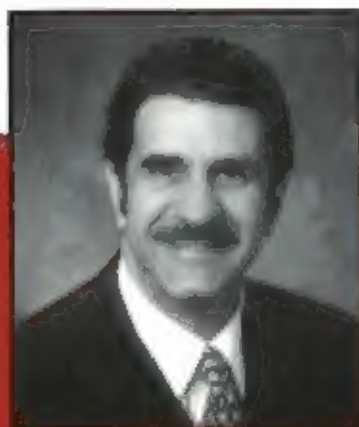

Whereas, this expansion will result in more than 200 new jobs over the next two years and these positions will be filled by members of the Office and Professional Employees International Union (OPEIU);

Whereas, American Income Life has consistently proven over the years to be a company that is committed to the needs of unions and working families, providing strike support, scholarship funds, labor centered publications and no-cost Accidental, Dismemberment and Death benefits for union members;

Whereas, American Income Life Insurance works closely with national labor leaders to serve union members. It is the only insurance company in North America with a Labor Advisory Board made up of 40 international union presidents and secretary-treasurers, and whose chairman is New York's Morty Baht, President of Communications Workers of America, therefore be it

Resolved, that the New York State AFL-CIO welcomes AIL's establishment of the National Income Life Insurance Company of New York, and will do what is necessary to facilitate its growth and expansion for the benefit of New York State's unions and New York's union families.

AIL is rooted in a tradition of serving union members and their families. And it has been a long desired goal to be able to provide our services to the union members of New York State. We are excited about this new association and have great expectations that it will bring a whirlwind of benefits to New York's unions and to AIL.
