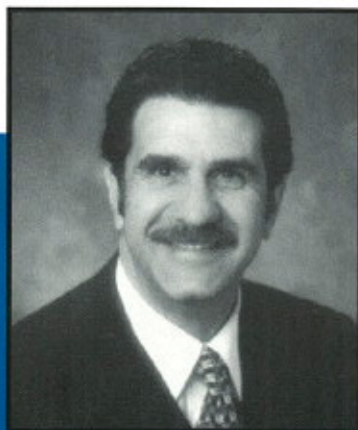

## Are You A Leader?

We come in contact with leaders everyday. Leaders can be anyone — the head of your family, a pastor, priest or rabbi, the president of a union, a teacher or an elected official. Leaders come in many forms and take on many roles. But, what does it mean to be a leader? For that matter, what is leadership? Or more specifically, what does a leader do?

These questions are often asked, but seldom answered the same. We all have our own ideas of what kind of character it takes to be a leader. Or what it means to be a leader. It is, however, important to remember a few things when pondering these questions. First, there are characteristics common to many leaders, that have placed them in their leadership roles. Such things as strength, charisma and knowledge are just a few of these common denominators. Second, there are few natural born leaders. Most leaders develop over time, built from character and experience. Rome wasn't build in a day; so too a leader.

According to *The 7 Habits of Highly Effective People*, by Dr. Stephen R. Covey, there are four levels of leadership, and in order to be an effective leader you must develop on all four levels.

- The first level is personal. Are you effective at leading yourself, setting goals and attaining them? Thomas J. Watson wrote, “Nothing so conclusively proves a man's ability to lead others as what he does from day to day to lead himself.”
- Level two is interpersonal. Are you effective with others, helping them set and attain goals? “A leader's role is to raise people's aspirations for what they can become and to release their energies so they will try to get there,” says David Gergen.
- The third level is managerial. Are you effective at managing yourself and others simultaneously?
- And the final level is organizational. Are you effective at managing yourself and others while taking your Agency in the direction it needs to go? According to Warren Bennis, “Leadership is the capacity to translate vision into reality.”

Webster's describes a leader as someone to go before and show the way, to act as a guide, one who influences or induces others to action. It was once said, “The best leaders are clear. They continually light the way, and in the process, let each person know that what they do makes a difference.”

However, are you doing all you can to motivate those with whom you work? Are you clear, continually lighting the way for others to follow?

I propose this question to you — **Are you a leader?** American Income has been doing business for close to 50 years, and I know that we have been given the time to develop our leadership capabilities. I also know that this Company is driven by people with the characteristics common to many leaders. You are a group of men and women with the charisma, the strength and the knowledge to do your job well.
