Innovation — The Key To The Future

One of the great pleasures I get, as Marketing Director, is visiting with a number of you throughout the month. While the topics may vary widely, one, or more, of the calls I receive have to do with a new idea or an improvement for one of our existing programs. It is these calls I relish the most. 

rom the desk of Jim Wright

Former Speaker of the U.S. House of Representatives

Jim Wright was born in Ft. Worth, Texas, a city he represented in Congress from 1955 to 1989.

He was elected to the Texas legislature at 23, and at 26 became the youngest Texas mayor when he was chosen to head the city of Weatherford.

Elected to Congress at 31, Mr. Wright served 18 consecutive terms and authored legislation in the fields of foreign affairs, economic development, water conservation, education and energy.

He served 10 years as Majority Leader before being sworn in as Speaker in 1987, a post to which he was re-elected in 1989.

Currently, Mr. Wright serves as Senior Political Consultant to American Income Life Insurance Company.

Winning Qualities

At lunch recently, Roger and Dottie Smith. Paul Straubel and I were talking fondly of many of our mutual friends in American Income. We discussed how great it might be if we could somehow distill the essence of whatever magic the Top Producers have in common, and share it with all the rest of us.

What is it, even in an organization like ours which has so much talent and energy, that sets some few apart and makes them so outstandingly successful? One thing we agreed upon is that they all possess a positive selfimage, an optimistic outlook based on a belief in their succeeding.

Some months ago the newspapers carried a story on America's top business and professional executives. As I read, it became clear the principal trait all these high achievers had in common was a healthy sense of self-regard. By self-regard, I don't mean ego or conceit, but they all seemed at peace with themselves. They knew their worth and trusted their instincts when it came to making goal oriented decisions. They just believed in their own abilities, just as our top performers at American Income do.

A second quality that spells success in our business is sincerity. An aspiring young politician once asked me to judge between two five-minute video tapes he'd made. He asked, "Which approach, do you think, would seem more sincere?" I tried to say it kindly, "The only way to seem sincere is to be sincere."

Sincerity is a quality that's hard to fake. The word itself is derived from two Latin words, sine and cera. In the days of the Roman Empire, traders returned with artifacts from the Aegean Islands. Some pieces were chipped or broken, their imperfections concealed with a waxy substance. Soon, quality merchants started using the stamp sine cera, meaning "without wax," to indicate the genuineness of their artifacts. A few thousand years later we still use the term to indicate genuineness, only today we use it to describe people.

Over the years I have watched American Incomers like Eddie Norman, Larry Malitz and Brian Traboulay get repeated recognition as Individual Producers. And not because their presentations are the slickest. I get the idea it has a lot to do with their transparent sincerity.

A top producers once told me, in a private moment, that before he rings a doorbell for an appointment he always closes his eyes for a few seconds, takes a deep breath and holds a silent wish for those who live there. It isn't done as a selfish prayer, that they'll buy a policy, but sort of a silent prayer for their happiness and well-being. Well, they don't always buy, but enough do and there is always a rapport.

This is one great thing about our conventions. We get a chance to soak up and benefit from the good experiences of others in this big family. I have been to at least 15 and have never failed to learn something new. There is much to learn for all of us, but two of the common ties that thread it all together are a positive self-regard and sincerity!
