Priming The Pump

Advancement, gain, push, rally, drive, progress, improvement, compulsion, headway, force, propulsion, power. These are all words I would use to describe the current climate at American Income Life. However, there is one word that just stands up and screams All.. That word is MOMENTUM.

Momentum is the force or speed of movement, or the product of the mass of a body and its velocity. In that definition there is another great word — velocity.

The point is, whatever word you decide to use in describing our sales force, the fact remains, we are on fire! We have exceeded six

How great are these accomplishments? You were given a goal at the beginning of 2001, and you have taken

that goal and run with it. We are less than \$13 million away from our \$60 million dollar goal. I am just blown away by the outstanding effort you are putting toward this important achievement. The only other word left to use is CONGRATULATIONS!

Now that I have gotten my enthusiasm for our MOMENTUM out in the open, I am going to take this opportunity to share a story with you. I know you have all heard a Roger original before, but there is always a lesson to be learned. Or, at least a lesson I have learned and one that is worth being passed on.

I got this story from Zig Ziglar, a motivational speaker and sales force trainer located here in the Dallas area. Mr. Ziglar travels the country extensively speaking to salespeople about an array of different subjects. Most of his topics revolve around three areas: your personal life, your family life and your professional life. There is, however, an allegory Mr. Ziglar uses quite frequently to tie these three concepts

together. The allegory is about a water pump and a well,

The story goes like this:

There were a couple of guys out driving one hot August day in Mississippi, and anyone who has been to Mississippi in August knows just how hot and sticky it can get. Well, these fellas decided they needed to stop and get a cold refreshing beverage, but the only place to stop for miles was an old farm house. The farmer rold them to belp themselves and pointed to an old water pump. One of the men, desperately thirsty, ran over and started to oump like a mad man. The poor fella pumped and pumped, but nothing came out. The other fella just stood by and watched the desperate action. This went on for a few more minutes, and the gay numping started to get frustrated to the point of quitting. This is when the other man stepped up and told his friend this is called priming the pump. You have to pump until the water is brought up from the well, and once the water has been brought up you have to continue to pump so the water will continue to flow.

Mr. Ziglar uses this story as a life lesson to show how important it is to keep pushing yourself to the next level in every aspect of your life. Think about it a minute. How many times have we quit pumping, so to speak, not knowing the big pay-off was just around the corner, or the water was almost to the top? The point is you have to continue the effort even after a goal has been teached.

At American Income we have reached so many goals this year, and we don't lack much before we reach our big pay-off — only \$13 million left to go. We need to just prime our pumps a little longer and keep our MOMENTUM going. I have all the confidence we will go above and beyond our \$60 million goal. Keep pumping, we're almost there.







In 500 B.C. the Greeks, known then as Phocacans, set up trading post sites along the coast, including Antibes*, Nice* and Monaco*. Around 100 B.C. these trading posts came under attack by neighboring tribes until Rome came to aid in the defense of these strategic territories. After centuries of conflict

1792 The French Amy Invaded Nice

Rome prevailed, and Julius Caesar took control of the region in 52 B.C.

Christianity became an official religion in 313, and it proliferated under Constantine, a Roman Emperor from 306 to 337. It spread first along the Riviera coast, and its evidence remains to this day in the Monastery on Saint Honorat Island (opposite Cannes).

The French Riviera remained under Roman rule until the 5th century when Franks, thus the name France, and other Germanic groups overtan the country.

At the close of the French Revolution,

1780-1792, the French Republic was established,

and the rest, as they say, is history!
