



## The Labor Advisory Board — A Company Tradition

Thirty-five people sat around a long table in New Orleans discussing the uneven American economy, and the upcoming congressional elections. Emotions ran high and the conversation was free-flowing.

American Income Life founder Bernard Rapoport and CWA International President Morty Bahr co-chaired the session. Our President, Roger Smith, Chairman and CEO Mark McAndrew, Jules Pagano and I listened in. Two distinguished economists and two current congressional leaders were present as well. The rest were union officials representing a broad cross-section of labor.

This was the February meeting of the AlL Labor Advisory Board, a longstanding Company tradition. We talked about how we the Company and the international unions we serve - can help one another.

Two distinct points of view quickly surfaced. Labor representatives, reflecting the sentiments of their members. were eager for democratic congressional leaders to take

more forceful stands against administration tax policies that favor the super-rich, and imports based on starvation wages. They cited figures reinforcing the need for action to increase the minimum wage, and their members wanted something done on affordable health care.

U.S. House leaders Martin Frost and Nita Lowey emphasized the difficulties in getting any progressive legislation passed in a House where the slim majority rests tightly in the hands of archeonservatives. They kept stressing the need for unity and help with the elections to change the numbers and put labor's friends back in the majority.

Both sides were right. Each needed that forum to express concerns which plagued them, and each needed equally to hear what the other was saying. As I sat listening, I could feel the real heart behind the words.

It brought back a scene from two decades ago. In 1981, having been struck by an attempted assassin's bullet a recovering Ronald Reagan came to Congress under a mantle of heroism. People everywhere wanted to uphold and encourage him, just as they do now with President George W. Bush following the horrifying events of September 11.

In that emotional atmosphere, Reagan pushed through a package of harsh cuts in the programs that benefit


ordinary people. He followed these with a deceptive threeyear tax out loaded with costly benefits for the biggest corporations. The national debt suddenly tripled! Speaker Tip-O'Neill and I, then the majority leader, made every argument we could but to no avail. The tide was running against us.

After two election cycles, winning seats in both the Senate and the House of Representatives, we turned that

tide. As I became speaker, we were calling the shots. In January 1987, I listed ten bills in our agenda. We passed all ten, even overcoming vetoes on three.

This could not have been done without the enthusiastic help and cooperation of labor - America's working men and women.

So it is with American Income Life. We have forged a strong partnership with those we serve. We have never forgotten where we came from, and, as we reach boldly toward an exciting \$75 million year, we are undergirded by one certainty: every penny of what we have promised to our clients will be there for them when they and their loved ones need it, and that is a good feeling!

## AIL's Labor Advisory Board Welcomes. . .

Tom Lee was elected International President of the American Federation of Musicians (AFM) by the delegates at the 94th AFM Convention in June 2001.

Prior to that, Lee was elected secretary-treasurer in March 1999 by the International Executive Board of the AFM to fill a wacated position. The delegates at the July 1999 convention then elected Lee, by acclamation, to a new two-year term. In less than a year, he streamlined the financial operations of the AFM, completed a new design of the union's monthly newsletter, designed a new employee medical policy saving more than \$100,000 annually, implemented cost saving measures through a more efficient use of existing office space, and is currently working on a variety of projects which will benefit all AFM members.

As a working musician, Tom Lee served 24 years on active military duty as a pianist with The President's own Marine Band. performing three or more days a week at the White House. He served through seven presidential administrations in this capacity beginning with the Johnson. administration and ending midterm during Bush 41's administration. After retiring from the Marine Band in 1990, he continued to perform in hotels and other venues in the Washington, D.C. area.

Lee first became active in union issues in the late 1970s when he lobbied the AFM to admit military musicians into union membership. Before his successful effort, military musicians were prohibited from either Joining the AFM or maintaining their membership in the union. Lee also played a major role in lobbying to lift a 70-year restriction which kept military musicians from performing "off-base" for money — a restriction that did not apply to other military personnel.

Lee was first elected to the AFM Executive Board of Local 161-710 in 1980 and was elected secretary-treasurer in 1990. As a local officer, he devoted himself to effectively resolving member problems and updating office procedures for greater efficiency. Lee also negotiated for, and offered assistance to, members of the National Symphony, the Kennedy Center Orchestra, and the National Theater Orchestra

In 1991, Lee was elected to the International Executive, Board (IEB) of the AFM — a position held until his election to the position of vice president in 1995. As a member of the IEB, Lee used his background and experience as secretary-treasurer of AFM Local 161-710 to actively promote the union's legislative agenda while serving as chair of the IEB's TEMPO-PCC/Legislative committee. He has represented the interests of

AFM members on such issues as Live-PALRA, NEA funding, copyright reform and performance rights, and also chaired the committee dealing with legislative and political contributions.

Lee represented his members as a delegate to seven AFM

Conventions. For many of those years, he was a member of the finance committee, which reviews AFM finances and evaluates all recommendations and resolutions concerning the AFM's fiscal stability. This experience together with his tenure on the Executive Board, provides the background which qualifies him to serve as the AFM's president.

As a student at the George
Washington University School of
Business in the early 1970s, Lee
became fully aware of how

important an efficient-running financial department is to any organization. Lee brings the skills he learned in college, and the development he received at Local 161-710 together in examining all aspects of AFM operations and reform.

Tom Lee was unanimously elected to American Income Life's Labor Advisory Board earlier this year. Mr. Lee brings a careerlong advocacy of labor and an extensive knowledge of financial matters to this premier advisory board. Lee's dedication to efficiency, and his proficiency in organization will be a welcomed addition to the board. American Income is looking forward to a long and continued partnership with Mr. Lee.
