"A woman comes to the door. The salesman makes his best effort at a smile and offers, 'Hello.' The woman impatiently replies, 'No, thank you, I am just preparing to leave.' The salesman nods, inquiring, 'May I come back later?' As she shuts the door, the woman says, 'No.' The salesman moves to the next house, and the door opens, then closes. He does not even get a chance to speak. His expression never changes, but still he continues. He stops at every home in his territory. The salesman believes people may not buy now, but next time — maybe. He is adamant that no does not mean never." (Source: The Oregonian "Life of a Salesman," by Tom Hallman Jr.)

How many times do we hear the word no? As a salesman,

I am aware that no is a frequent answer to the many questions we ask, including asking for the sale. But, just as the above story indicates, no does not have to mean never. How we handle the word no can very simply determine how successful we are in the field. So how do you handle no?

The reason I bring the above story to your attention is not because it is the story of an

ordinary salesman working door-to-door in search of his next sale, but because this is a story of dedication, perseverance and sheer will. This is the story of Bill Porter, an independent salesman in the Portland, Oregon area. What makes Bill an excellent role-model is he was born with Cerebral Palsy, and despite tremendous pain and constant changes in the sales industry arena, he continues to work successfully door-to-door everyday — rain or shine.

In fact, there was a movie based on Bill Porter's life called "Door-to-Door." The movie depicts a man — an extraordinary man — who overcame insurmountable odds and eked out a living though many thought he was

unemployable. The underlying drive that has fueled this man's success is his unwillingness to take *no* for an answer. According to the article "Life of a Salesman" written in the November 1995 issue of *The Oregonian*, "Porter's hearing is the one perfect thing his body does. Except when he [has an audience]. Then the word 'no' does not register."

This brings me back to my original question, "How do you handle no?" Although no is a word we hear day-in and day-out as salespeople, how we handle that no can be the difference between getting a sale now or forfeiting a sale altogether.

Isn't no really just an objection? And, if we plan our

presentations with the expectation that there will be a few objections, will it not be easier to turn a no into a yes?

Responding to prospects' protests is a practical skill which requires understanding of how the product you are selling will help the prospects meet their individual goals. No sales presentation is free of objections of one sort or another. Since insurance needs to be sold, your response to a client's objection

can mean the difference in making the sale.

Being prepared for no can go a long way towards getting a yes. I am sure given Mr. Porter's circumstances, he was more than prepared for the nos. It was, however, his unrelenting determination to succeed and his superior sales spirit in the face of objections that made him the top salesman in his region.



AIL's Labor Advisory Board Welcomes. . .

Don M. Hahs, International President of the Brotherhood of Locomotive Engineers, was unanimously elected to American Income Life's Labor Advisory Board earlier this year. Mr. Hahs brings over 30 years of experience to AIL's premier advisory board.

Don Hahs was elected to a five-year term as international president at the Brotherhood of Locomotive Engineers' International Convention in September 2001.

The Brotherhood of Locomotive Engineers' (BLE) is

North America's oldest rail labor union. Since it was founded, the BLE has lived by its standing motto, "Since 1863, a tradition of forward thinking." The purpose of BLE is to combine the interests of locomotive engineers and others in railway service to better serve the worker. The BLE has over 59,000 members and is continuing to grow despite changes in the railway service industry.

Mr. Hahs began his professional rail career in 1961 as a clerk. He later advanced to the position of manager of special services in the traffic department of the St. Louis Southwestern Railway, also known as the "Cotton Belt." In 1972, Hahs was employed by the Southern Pacific system in the transportation department, and in 1974, he earned a promotion to locomotive engineer. In 1975, Mr. Hahs joined the BLE Division 366 where he was elected to serve in the local chairman's office. This is a position he held from 1977 to 1980.

In 1980, he was elected general chairman of the BLE General Committee of Adjustment for the Southern Pacific-Eastern sector. He also chaired the Western General Chairmens' Association and the Southwestern Convention Meeting Association. At the BLEs' international convention in 1986, he was appointed to the Constitution and Bylaws Committee. Since 1991, Hahs has been a member of BLE Division 566 in Del Rio, Texas. He is a voluntary contributor to and member of BLE-PAC, which supports the union's legislative goals at various levels of government.

> Mr. Hahs was first elected to a five-year term on the BLE Advisory Board as international vice president at the BLEs' international convention in 1996.

As vice president, he coordinated activities with various general committees on the Burlington Northern-Santa Fe System and Union Pacific systems. In this

position, he also assisted with the Union Pacific-Southern Pacific merger.

Mr. Hahs' father E.D. "Gene" Hahs was a member of BLE Division 442, and he has several other relatives who are active participants in the BLE.


