

I have met thousands upon thousands of people over the course of my career with American Income, and it is always interesting to see what motivates these individuals. For one person, it is all about providing for their family. For another, it is about offering a benefit to the working families this Company serves. Still, for someone else, it is about having more personal time to do other things besides work.

However, no matter what the motivation, there remains one common denominator — American Income Life and National Income Life.

At AIL and NILICO, motivating and cultivating our Company's leaders are important components to succeeding. We believe we have a tremendous resource in the people who choose to be a part of our organization. We also believe it would be a waste if we did not develop that resource. The word leader is actually a word which was developed in the 14th century and, I believe, it was given to our language to help guide us to higher levels. Leaders are those who refocus our minds and set attitudes.

Actually, leadership is the act of being a leader, or rather the act or instance of leading. Given this, there are two components to leadership: the act and the individual. For a leader to be successful, you cannot have the act without the individual. The reverse holds true as well — you can have the individual, but if they do not take action, then true leadership will not materialize.

Where the individual and the act meet, action occurs. Therefore, for true leadership to materialize, it is important for you to act by creating a culture in your Agencies, being an active participant in your labor communities and getting leadership exposure. Allowing yourself to be exposed to as many things as possible only makes for a more well-rounded salesperson and leader. Wihelm Von Humboldt has been quoted as saying, How a person masters his fate is more important than what his fate is. What that means is it is more important to *try* than to leave things to chance. Leading is one of those things you should not leave to chance. Take advantage of any, and all, training. This only helps build confidence and retention. Remember too, it is important to lead by example. This is how I lead you, and this is what you should give back to your Agencies.

We have great leaders in this Company who are leading us in the right direction — just take a look at any **Spotlight** to see who these leaders are. These are the people you need to look at and follow their example. Don t be afraid to utilize their knowledge in this area. They may have mastered some of the very things you struggle with today.

At American Income and National Income, we want our leaders to refocus our minds, set our attitudes and get excited. According to John Maxwell, everything in an Agency rises and falls based on the leadership within that Agency. So whatever the motivation, remember it is leadership that will effectually take this Company to the next level.

Labor Day – A History Lesson

Every year, on the first Monday in September, many us plan our Labor Day festivities. School is about to start, if it hasn't already, and summer is coming to a close, making Labor Day somewhat of a last fling before the fall season.

For many of us in the labor movement, Labor Day is much more than just a last summer fling. For us, Labor Day is a time to honor those who make this country what it is, and to honor the hard work which has gotten us to where we are today. According to the Department of Labor, "Labor Day is the creation of the labor movement and is dedicated to the social and economic achievements of American workers." Knowing this though, we may still be a bit hazy as to the history surrounding this important holiday.

Well, get ready, we are about to have a history lesson!

Recent research indicates that the labor movement's first manifestation of this day of recognition occurred in 1882. On Tuesday, Sept. 5, 1882, in New York City, the first Labor Day holiday was celebrated. The Central Labor Union planned to have a picnic and demonstrate at the proposal of then secretary, Matthew Maguire. Maguire is noted as saying, "this will exhibit to the public the strength and esprit de corps of trade and labor organizations in our community." From that point on, this celebration grew.

In 1892, the same union members took an unpaid day off and marched around Union Square in support of a labor day holiday. However, it wasn't until 1894 that President Grover Cleveland signed the legislation making Labor Day an offical national holiday. Not to mention, President Cleveland only signed this holiday into effect as an election-year compromise due to the hostile circumstances surrounding the Pullman strike that's another history lesson altogether.

Today, the labor movement still struggles for workers' rights and fair legislation concerning the workers of this country. Labor Day is a time to recognize this struggle, celebrating it with the reverence it deserves. Samuel Gompers, head of the American Federation of Labor, in 1898 called it, "the day for which the toilers in past centuries looked forward, when their rights and their wrongs would be discussed. . .that the workers of our day may not only lay down their tools of labor for a holiday, but upon which they may touch shoulders in marching phalanx and feel the stronger for it."

Common Issues Regarding Reopens and Reinstatements

A reopen means there was never a premium applied to an application. This usually happens because the application was withdrawn (WTH), incompleted (INC) or not taken (NTO) before the policy was issued. Another possibility is the policy was issued then cancelled and all premiums refunded or the new business check was returned unpaid. Check CAS and, if the issue-date and the paid-to-date are the same, it is a reopen.

Reopens are handled by Policy Issue (PI), and checks or money orders for reopens must be sent directly to this department. Reopens are given the same priority as new business applications since advance and production rules apply to both.

Advances are charged back on these cases, but, when reopened, they are eligible for another advance.

It is important to remember a reopen is not a reinstatement and should not be included on a reinstatement transmittal. If you include a reopen on a reinstatement transmittal, it will be routed to Policy Owner Services (POS) which will cause a delay in getting the request to the proper department – Policy Issue.

A Reinstatement means premiums were paid, but, for some reason, the payments were stopped and the policy lapsed. When looking on CAS, the paid-to-date and the issue-date will be different. Reinstatements must be on a reinstatement transmittal and must be sent to POS.

Advances are not paid on reinstatements.

If you have a problem remembering which department handles a *reopen* or a *reinstatement*, check CAS. If the issue-date is the same as the paid-to-date, the request should go to PI. If the issue-date and the paid-to-date are different, the request should go to POS.

Remember, if a request is sent to the wrong department, there will be delays.

Are you confused as to what department to send a request to reinstate, reopen or recode?

Improper routing costs all of us time. Delays can happen when the wrong department receives a request and has to decide where to send it next.

The most common form of improper routing occurs when correspondence is not labeled and received in a large FedEx package.

To insure proper routing, please clearly mark where each item is to be sent.

Here is a quick guide of which departments to route requests:

- Reinstatements go to POS.
- Reopens, COD's, and Amendments go to PI. Please remember to use the red PI envelope for these items.
- New business applications also go to Policy Issue.
- Recodes of pending policies go to PI. All other recodes should be routed to POS.

Please help us speed up the request process by sending them to the correct department.

Hugh Walsh

Assistant Vice President of AIL & Assistant Executive Director LAB

HughWalsh began his career with the Ohio Bell Telephone Company in 1965. He became a steward that same year, and, later, served as chief steward, vice president and three terms as president of Communications Workers Local 4301.

In 1983, Hugh was appointed the administrator of labor relations for Ohio by Governor Celeste and given the responsibility to oversee the development of the Ohio State Collective Bargaining Bill for Public Workers. The bill was passed and became law on April 1, 1984 bringing collective bargaining and organizing rights to Ohio public employees.

Hugh was appointed as full-time staff with CWA on Feb. 1, 1984 and worked in this capacity in both Ohio and Wisconsin. He became the administrative assistant to the vice president of CWA District 4 in 1990, responsibile for Indiana, Illinois and Wisconsin, representing more than 700 contracts and 24,000 union members.

In 1994, Hugh was assigned to Washington, D.C. by CWA President, Morton Bahr, to serve as his administrative assistant. During this time, Hugh wrote CWAs first training manual for teaching union chief negotiators how to bargain first contracts.

On July 1, 1999, he was promoted to assistant to the president and assumed responsibility for Human Resources, AFL-CIO coordination, convention coordinator, CWAs charities, *Union Privilege* and, also, became executive director of the CWA Joe Beirne Scholarship Fund. On April 1, 2000, he took on the position of political director.

On Jan. 2, 2003, Hugh retired from CWA, after 38 years of service, and on Jan. 6, he accepted a position with American Income Life as assistant vice president, assistant executive director of AIL s Labor Advisory Board.
