Child Safe Reminder

Last year we notified you regarding some changes which were required for the Child Safe Kits and other marketing materials referencing Child Safe. Please make sure that any old Child Safe Kits, those utilizing the blue artwork, are discarded and no longer used. You should only be using the new Child Safe Kits and boxes with the red artwork.

We appreciate your compliance with this issue. If you have any questions, please contact your SGA.

Reinstatement Bonus Reminder

As we continue the reinstatement bonus program into 2005, the following is just a reminder of the guidelines that are used when determining if a reinstatement is eligible for bonus:

- Must be a life case recoded to a different Agent, on bank draft with all back premiums collected by applicant check from the account being drafted.
- · Returned items and lapses count as eligible cases.

Case can only qualify one time – we have created a database of policies for which the bonus/advance was paid and it's monitored so we don't pay on any one case more than once.

If a case is reinstated and lapses, we will not chargeback, but it will not count for bonus a second time.

The bonus is 25 percent of the annualized premium. If a case is in its first year, an advance is given to the Agent and charged to their account. If the case is in sub-year, a bonus is given to the Agent and the company is charged.

Bonuses/advances are paid monthly by the 15th of the following month. Agents must be active as of the bonus date to be eligible.

Controlled Business

Controlled business is applications written on an Agent, their immediate family, or where the Agent is the payor on the policy.

We do not advance on controlled business sales, nor is production credit given.

You are responsible for marking controlled business, so it is easily distinguished, at the top of every controlled business application. In addition, the transmittal has been updated with a blank for listing controlled business. Please mark this blank as well.

Save yourself confusion down the road by marking your controlled business.





Politics, Power, & The Five Point Plan

As the AFL-CIO positions itself for a 2005 battle to win the hearts, votes, and representation of the unorganized work force, we must be supportive at every level.

AFL-CIO Organizing Director, Stewart Acuff, is planning new ways to raise the profile of organizing as an issue, to involve rank and file union members (which, yes, includes you the members of OPEIU Local 277), and to create comprehensive strategic campaigns to take back the moral ground: good jobs, decent wages, health care, and healthy communities.

Through a variety of strategies - establishing the Employee Free Choice Act, inciting lawmakers, and other public officials into active front line support of organizing drives, holding community rallies which highlight the issues at stake, and building coalitions to "march on the boss" - labor will drive the local political machine into a national political culture.

What does organizing and people-powered politics have to do with our 2005 Five Point Plan and our PR mantra "No Group Left Behind"?

- 1. Building Labor Alliances. I can't think of any better strategies than what Mr. Acuff proposes as a way to be introduced to "progressive" allies. Our collective memory tells us of the power of bonding by "marching on the boss" during a labor dispute. It begins and cements permanent relationships with our friends in the labor movement.
- 2. Electronic Mailings. There are hundreds of thousands of eactivists in every state. Most progressive grass roots groups educate and mobilize their membership online. E-activists are as close to a shop steward as you will find in a non-union environment. They are involved by choice, and they take their responsibilities seriously. Get involved, meet the executive directors, and offer to do an e-mailing to their online members..

- 3. Value Added Benefits. The initial value is in the "usage" of our no cost programs. Progressive officials and like-minded folks know families desperately need access to affordable prescription drugs, vision benefits, and dental care. We can offer something which provides "immediate" rewards for membership. Our Partners® program is a fabulous way to provide a short term solution for the bigger policy issues like health care reform.
- 4. Growing PR Teams. If you can't find someone who is smart, active, and a team player at a Jobs for Justice Rally, well to be quite frank, you aren't looking very hard. Your next ideal PR Rep is standing side by side with you at your next labor function - don't miss the opportunity.
- 5. Overdue Groups. One way to overcome any obstacle is to face it directly. The more involved you get, the more you know the players. You can start to ask questions of which groups are defunct, have merged, or quite frankly won't work with us. If you haven't gotten that "big group," find someone standing by your side to help you.

As the AFL-CIO marches into their winter Executive Council meeting, a variety of strategies will be proposed, restructuring discussed, and resources allocated. Whatever the outcome, one thing is for certain; a unanimous voice "no working person left behind" will indeed be the invitation for millions of unorganized workers to join the family of labor.

Organizing, people-powered politics, and our Five Point Plan - let's not leave anyone behind!


