Required Retention Rate

Effective Jan. 1, 2005, to be eligible for bonuses and featured in *Spotlight*, Producers must meet the required Retention rate or the minimum Net to Gross. The Net to Gross rate varies based on bonus guidelines. The rate listed below is for *Spotlight* recognition only. Net to Gross is used only during the Producer's first eight months.

Retention: Net to Gross:

Look for the Asterisk

The asterisks, shown throughout the magazine, indicate that place will be a year-to-date award winner. The Producers, who will be recognized at the New Orleans Awards Presentation, are: the top SGA from each category, the top two PR Managers and the top two PR Representatives from each category, the top RGA, the top five MGAs, the top five GAs, the top sA, and the top ten Individual Producers. Check your production! If there is an asterisk by your position, you could be on your way to The Fairmont in New Orleans! The convention will be held July 27-30, 2006.

Reopens

Since June's issue, some revisions have been made regarding *reopens*.

Reopening an application cannot be completed in a day or two, as the MIB must be checked and Underwriting must approve before it can be reopened. To possibly complete these by month's end, they should be at the Home Office by the 20th of the month.

Often, we receive amendments, CODs, and replacement checks for returned items on cases after they have been NTO'd or cancelled. If possible, we reopen the case with the information we have, but sometimes a "Good Health Statement" (AG-1781) is required before we can proceed with the reopen. If this form is not received, we will ask you to obtain one. Waiting for this will cause delays.

Here are a few reminders when trying to reopen an app:

- Get the AG-1781 signed while you are in the home and send with the delivery requirement. This form must be included on reopens over three and less than six months old.
- If the app is over six months old, collect a new app and write "REOPEN" along with the old policy number on the top. (If you do not write "reopen" on the new app and reference the old policy number, it may be confused as new business and loaded with a new app number, which can negatively affect you.)
- · List all applications on one request.
- Collect all back premiums on life cases if you wish to reopen as of the original app date. Only collect one month's premium on A&H plans.
- If you wish to collect one month's premium on a life app, we will use the new app date provided, and age will be calculated as of that date. Remember to recalculate ages, mainly on apps over six months old.
- Don't reopen or rewrite declined applications or incompletes.
- Any request to recode must be received with the reopen and signed by the SGA. The form used for recodes is listed on the Agency Resource Center.

Introducing the New BR Bonus

As announced at convention, we have created a new bonus in honor of Mr. Rapoport and have supplied the details of this new bonus below. The bonus is available on production submitted to the Home Office July 1, 2005 through Dec. 31, 2005.

Effective July 1, 2005, we are making a new bonus available to the immediate up-line Manager of any Agent who is in their first six months with American Income or National Income. This would be the level two person in the Agent hierarchy who would have field trained the Agent. Again, this bonus will run for six months, from July 2005 production through December 2005 production. However, if we begin to experience double-digit production growth as a result of this bonus and your efforts, we will discuss the possibility of extending it past Jan. 1, 2006.

30nus Details*

- The bonus is equal to 100 percent of the New Agent Bonus that the Agent earns during their first six months on life business. (Includes bonus earned at the \$4,000-\$6,199 level.)
- · There is no Net to Gross or Persistency requirement for the level two Manager.
- This bonus is in addition to any Leadership Bonus that might be paid and is not tied to whether an MGA earns a Leadership Bonus.
- * Please note if the hierarchy of the new Agent changes, the up-line bonus eligibility ends.

As noted above, this is in addition to any Leadership Bonus that could be paid and there is no Retention or Net to Gross requirement for the level two person (direct up-line Manager who should have field trained the Agent). It is also important to remember that the bonus is equal to 100 percent of the New Agent Bonus received by the Agent in their first six months (July to December production).

Listed below is the contract month and number of months a potential BR Bonus could be payable:

Contract Month	Manager eligibility for BR Bonus (based on Agents' first app date)
January 2005	Not eligible under the guidelines
February 2005	One month available under the guidelines
March 2005	Two months available under the guidelines
April 2005	Three months available under the guidelines
May 2005	Four months available under the guidelines
June 2005	Five months available under the guidelines
July 2005	Six months available under the guidelines
August 2005	Five months available under the guidelines
September 2005	Four months available under the guidelines
October 2005	Three months available under the guideliness
November 2005	Two months available under the guidelines
December 2005	One month available under the guidelines

Clayola Brown, President of the National A. Philip Randolph Institute (APRI), has been unanimously elected to the Labor Advisory Board.

The A. Philip Randolph Institute was founded in 1965, the same year as the Selma-to-Montgomery Freedom March. The APRI was formed as a national organization of black trade unionists with a mission to fight for racial equality and economic justice. APRI members are involved in political and community education, lobbying, legislative action, and labor support activities.

Ms. Brown worked for the UNITE International Union since 1970 before becoming president of APRI. However, her involvement with the labor movement actually began many years earlier. She started as a sewing machine operator at the Manhattan Shirt Factory in Charleston, South Carolina where she and her mother were organization activists.

Once Ms. Brown chose to pursue a career in labor, she went to work for the Textile Workers Union of America and moved up through the ranks from there. She became an education director for the newly merged Amalgamated Clothing and Textile Workers Union and was soon appointed Civil Rights director. In 1991, she was elected international vice president, a position she held for 13 years.

Ms. Brown has a tremendous commitment to her community and her fellow man which shows through the many boards and organizations she currently serves.

We welcome Ms. Clayola Brown to the Labor Advisory Board and are looking forward to a long and prosperous partnership for many years to come.

Peter Kang —

The Drive Behind the Record



Peter Kang is not a stranger to being on the road. In fact, he was in the car driving when we finally contacted him for this interview. But it is this constant traveling that indicates all of the hard work that goes into being our newest record breaker.

In May, Peter broke the all-time monthly Net ALP record with an incredible \$53,774 Net ALP (the previous record stood at \$51,235). When asked what method he used to break the record, he replied that it was just stern determination.

"My MGA saw my numbers for the month and brought in the previous *Spotlight* to show me what the current record was. When we both saw I was so close to beating it, I decided to really put my mind to it. I wrote down my goals for how I would be able to accomplish it and just went after the record."

As a relative newcomer to the field, his success is no small feat. After selling his own business, Peter had a meeting with Slav Bitman (his current SGA) and decided it was time to bring his life to a new level.

He says his secret to his success is to cater to the customer. He keeps odd hours for those who may work the late shift and cannot meet before late at night. In fact, he has been known to keep appointments at midnight, if that was what the customer wanted.

"Good service is all about supplying the product to *everyone* who needs it," he explains. "Sometimes people just cannot work normal business hours, so if they need me later, I'll be there."

Peter stresses the importance on addressing the customer honestly and ethically. He says you have to keep in mind that you are not only presenting yourself to your customers, but you are also representing your Agency and the whole Company as well, and it is crucial to keep that in mind. Your actions reflect back on the Company.

Besides going out of his way to meet the customer's appointment needs, he also tries to keep in contact with them. Peter mentioned he always calls the customer back within four to eight weeks to make sure they received their policy. He does this not only to check efficiency, but also to make sure his customers know that he has not forgotten about them.

Changing the Referral Culture

I mentioned a few months ago the fact that our growth — as a Company — will come from what we have labeled as "non-traditional leads." In order to describe a non-traditional lead, we must first define a traditional lead. Basically, a traditional lead is the union lead card. Let's look at this a little closer.

In the past 12 months, we have written about \$90 million of Net ALP; \$37 million of which came from the union marketplace. The interesting thing is, when we were writing \$50 million five years ago, we wrote about \$31 million from the union marketplace. So while overall production has nearly doubled, premium from union leads has risen just about 19 percent.

Therein lies the challenge. Let's say that ten years from now we are writing \$250 million, we'll probably be getting only about \$55 million from the union lead — based upon estimates of how much penetration we already have in the overall union population. Therefore, as the numbers show, our premium growth will come from outside union markets, or the "non-traditional" markets — of which a primary source must be referrals.

Okay, we all know the importance of getting the referral. You've been told it's easier to set, easier to sell, and has a better retention. Given that, why is only 26 percent of our current business referral-based? The answer, it's because of our culture.

Culture is the development of the mind through the sum total of beliefs and behavior passed on from one generation to the next.

There was a time at American Income when there was such an abundance of golden union leads that recruiting ads actually boasted, "No Prospecting at All!" Or, "We set 'em and you run 'em!" And believe it or not, there are offices that still actually hand out lead packs with hundreds of these golden leads. We don't know any different; it's been our culture.

The truth is, referrals are easier to get than originally thought. They are an easier appointment set, and they do carry a better presentation to sales and closing ratio.

Now, I'm not suggesting we cut back the lead packets. But I am suggesting we get more serious with standards relating to our sources of business, and that a reward system be set for those who bring us premium from non-traditional lead sources. It's something to think about getting better at now, so you can cash in when the culture really does change.

Experience shows the main cause for not obtaining a referral is simply because it's not asked for, or because the referral presentation is not set properly. I can remember suggesting to an Agent that all they really needed to do was tell the prospect for every food item they contributed to the food bank it would entitle them to sponsor a friend or family member to receive the Partners® Plan or an AD&D Certificate! Even the most timid of referral getters can enjoy some success with that approach!

We have written \$24 million in referral business over the past 12 months. At \$410 per sale that is about \$58,500 sales per year or \$1,125 per week. That is an interesting number since we have about 1,735 Agents who submit business each week. This means on average, an AIL/NILICO Agent obtains .67 referral sales per week. That's a number we can certainly improve on together.



Al-Karim Walji, an Agent with the Rick Altig Agency, Believes Referrals are all About Relationships

"What makes me different is that this is my business and I take it seriously. I seldom get leads from the office because I work on building my business base. I commit myself to always putting myself in the customer's shoes which allows me to diligently follow-up and always personally visit with my clients whether or not they take advantage of our programs. I also believe that the *Family Information Guide* is a very powerful tool when it comes to securing referrals because it opens the conversation up for, 'This might be something cousin Mary and John would be interested in.' I want my customers to know that I am here to build a relationship with them and I will be here to service their needs now and in the future. Every customer is different and they all have different needs, but if you're faithful, honest, and dedicated, the referrals will happen."
