# How to Think and Act Big — <u>Just Think Big!</u>

As we enter 2006 and the idea of "Just Think Big" gets more and more ingrained into our minds, you reach a point where you ask yourself, "What exactly does it mean to Just Think Big?" I mean, if we are being told to think big, it must be because we are not presently doing a great job of it or that we need to improve our current manner of thinking. And if we should Just Think Big, wouldn't it help some if a big thinker maybe gave us some tips?

Well, I happen to be one of the biggest thinkers I know, so I would like to share with you some thoughts and ideas that I know will put you on the right path to some *really* BIG THINKING.

The unspoken but popular notion is about how we must move systematically from our present level of achievement to the next — a steady and gradual progress. Unfortunately, this thought puts you in the mind-set to make only incremental gains that come too routinely and too slowly. Do not get caught in this bogged-down mentality! Start thinking "breakthrough!" Imagine an explosive jump that will put you beyond what would normally be the next logical step. Go for exponential gain rather than incremental progress. Depart from habits, and make it a point everyday to break from the routine.

If you want to accelerate your rate of achievement, you must search out and implement a new behavior and attitude. Old routines will yield old results. A new and bigger result cannot be realized without a change in your behavior. There are many different ways to

approach a similar situation, and you will find this new insight to be greatly beneficial to your results.

Now that you are testing some different methods, let's make sure the mental part of THINKING BIG is not your obstacle. You see, what you are capable of achieving is more influenced by your own capacity to believe in yourself rather than anything physical. If your mind-set is flawed by doubt or skepticism, you should understand that any doubts you may have about your own potential are likely to be product of habitual thinking rather than accurate thinking. If you need to doubt something, then doubt your own preconceived notions about how you can only be so good at what you do. Better yet: how good you can be. You can be so much more.

Just Think Big! As an agent, a weekly submit of \$3,500 can become normal for you. If you are on a management career track, you can be an MGA within a very realistic time frame. If you are a Public Relations Representative, you could be thinking outside the union marketplace and believing it possible to generate 20,000 leads. As an SGA, you could be envisioning yourself on stage in 2007, being recognized for your agency's growth.

You need to understand that someone will submit \$3,500 on a weekly basis. Someone will be promoted to MGA. Someone will generate 20,000 leads, and someone will be on stage at convention in 2007. Why not you?



- 7. Presenting yourself as a possible SGA candidate

Building your Agency goes hand and hand with recruiting and one can't happen without the other. Given that, here are the seven traits that all successful recruiting individuals have within our Agency force.

- They control their destiny by taking ownership of their recruiting efforts.
- They manage their time effectively, focusing their energy on high payoff recruiting activities.

- 3. They balance hard work with rest and play.
- They periodically review their goals and make changes when needed.
- They maintain a positive attitude about recruiting and building their team.
- 6. They have a high sense of self-esteem.
- They work for American Income and National Income and have a great opportunity to share and a desire to so.

So, as you can see three groups of seven equal 21 which is a winning hand when it comes to recruiting and leadership with American Income and National Income. Not to mention, this is not a bad hand in Poker to have three of a kind.

Giving you the principles, traits, and reasons to play the perfect recruiting hand is only a start to making recruiting work for you instead of against you. 


