The rates listed below are for Spatlight recognition only. Net to Gross is used only during the Producer's first eight months.

New Underwriting Manual

The new Underwriting manual has significant updates which reflect recent developments in the medical industry and affect the clients we presently see. This is great, because now we will see fewer ratings, and of those policies that do get rated, we will see lower ratings! Here are just a few of the changes that will impact our clients:

- The new manual offers lower ratings on diabetes and coronary heart disease, as well as on combinations of impairments such as overweight, high blood pressure, and even tobacco use. The end result is we can offer lower ratings on these frequently rated conditions.
- Clients who are moderately overweight, such as Table
 Three and even Table Four, will see reductions in
 ratings amounts. Many clients who were rated Table
 Two may find that no rating is required at all!
- Cancer ratings will be applied for lesser time frames. For instance, when a cancer rating was required for five years, this rating may now only be assessed for four years. Dollar amounts may be slightly higher, but the total amounts required over the entire rating period are comparable. This means the overall price does not go up, but the customer stops paying for the rating sooner.

Overall this is a very positive change for our clients, and it is a great way to increase sales and delivered policies.

Career Agents*

50 Percent Contract: \$75,600 of Net ALP

52.5 Percent Contract: \$85,200 of Net ALP

57.5 Percent and 62.5 Percent Contracts: \$91,200 of Net ALP

65 Percent: \$100,000 of Net AP

Supervising Agents*

Supervising Agents will need to write \$85,200 of Personal Net ALP. They may also qualify by writing \$153,000 of First Year Agent Net ALP and have at least one active First Year Agent as of Dec. 31, 2006.

General Agents*

General Agents will need to write \$91,200 of Personal Net ALP. They may also write \$153,000 of First Year Agent Net ALP and have at least two active First Year Agents as of Dec. 31, 2006.

Master General Agents Agency Production*

Master General Agents will need to have \$306,000 of First Year Agent Production or \$206,000 First Year Agent Production plus \$100,000 of Personal Net Annualized Premium. MGAs must also have at least four active First Year Agents as of Dec. 31, 2006.

Regional General Agents*

Regional General Agents must have two MGAs who qualify for convention under the MGA guidelines. RGAs can qualify as an MGA with their own MGA Agency production.

State General Agents"

State General Agents must meet year-to-date SGA standards as of Dec. 31, 2006.

* Please note, Career Agents, SAs, GAs, and MGAs can qualify on a propated basis if contracted less than a year.

Production on all levels must be as of the Dec. 31. 2006 AP&P Report. Please remember to review the Net to Gross and Retention requirements as these will be a deternining factor in convention qualification. Year-to-date aspard winners must also have 78 percent Net to Gross or a 68 percent Retention rate to be eligible for recognition.

Public Relations Representatives

To qualify, PR Representatives must obtain 17,250 Cards or 77 Endorsed Groups* - REWs, NEWs, ORIs, IGs, PGs, CHs, and TGn - (all original - ORIs group credits - will count as double credit).

PR Representatives can qualify under only one method (i.e., they can qualify by signing 77 Groups or acquiring 17,250 lend credits, but not a combination).

- * For a Group to count toward qualification, the Group must have a 50 member minimum and a three percent return with a minimum of ID Cards.
- ** Any endoned multing will count to a Group.

Public Relations Managers

PR Managers must obtain 52,500 Cards (all original - ORIs/ADIs - will count as double credit) and have at least two active PR Representatives coded as of Dec. 31, 2006.

Qualifying for convention entitles one to attend only if they are an active American Incomer or National Incomer at the time the convention is being held. No substitutions or transfers are permitted. Also, please note that individuals on Red Watch cannot qualify for convention.




