Required Retention Rate

Effective Jan. 1, 2006, to be eligible for bonuses and featured in Spotlight, Producers must meet the required Retention or the minimum Net to Gross. Net to Gross varies based on bonus guidelines. The rates listed below are for Spotlight recognition only. Net to Gross is used only during the Producer's first eight months.

Retention: 68% Net to Gross: 78%

Easy to Load Applications

Remember Pin the Tail on the Donkey? It seems easy in the beginning until they blindfold you and spin you around so you can't tell where you are or which direction to go. This makes a simple task more difficult.

Loading an application at the Home Office can be similar. It seems easy enough — input the information the Agent writes on the application into the computer. What makes it more complicated is difficult-to-read handwriting or incomplete information, such as no bank routing number or zip code. A discrepancy in the amount of CWA causes confusion too. Now a simple task becomes more time consuming.

We know how little time Agents have with the customer to write the application. We too have limited time to load applications to make sure they are advanced. We welcome and need your help. Here are some ways to make sure the business gets loaded quickly:

- · Make your handwriting easily legible.
- Use black ink. Applications are electronically scanned for storage, so darker original application handwriting is better.
- Be sure the amount of CWA listed on the application matches the amount of CWA you send in.
- Always include the bank routing number for bank draft applications.
- Always include the zip code or postal code on the application.

By helping us with these items, you keep the task simple and help us meet the advance cut-off deadlines.

Nancy Wohlforth Co-President Pride at Work, AFL-CIO bull Secretary-Treasurer **OPEIU**

Nancy Wohlforth, Co-President of Pride at Work, AFL-CIO and International Secretary-Treasure of OPEIU, has been unanimously elected to the Labor Advisory Board.

National Pride At Work is affiliated as the newest constituency group of the AFL-CIO. The purpose of Pride At Work is to mobilize mutual support between the organized labor movement and the LGBT community around organizing for social and economic justice.

Nancy Wohlforth is a lifetime activist who has marched, organized, and been arrested for civil, human, and worker rights since she was 16. Ms. Wohlforth has always been a passionate and tireless advocate for social and economic justice.

Ms. Wohlforth's career is rooted in the labor movement. She was elected as vice president of Office and Professional Employees International Union Local J in 1983. In this post, Wohlforth negotiated sexual orientation non-discrimination clauses into all of Local 3's collective bargaining agreements

(which now include gender identity and expression) as benefits for both same sex and opposite sex partners.

As a founding member of the Lesbian & Gay Labor Alliance, Ms. Wohlforth was a natural choice as the co-president of Pride at Work. In this capacity, she has pushed to see domestic partner benefits included in all union contracts as well as working with coalitions to get them at non-union companies. Wohlforth's deep belief is that the only way for LGBT workers to be truly represented and achieve equal wages is through a union contract.

Nancy Wohlforth also serves on both the executive board of the San Francisco Labor Council and as vice president of the California State Federation of Labor.

We welcome Ms. Wohlforth to the Labor Advisory Board and are looking forward to a long and prosperous partnership for many years to come.

Maintaining Your Activity

So much has been said about the opportunity to increase sales size with our focus on the 2001 CSO changes upon us. Given these changes, we cannot ignore the fantastic possibilities open to us at this time. The excitement about this opportunity has created a phenomenal response. The SGA body is developing and submitting new product packages which we hope will increase our annual premium per sale by \$100.

The excirement does not stop with these new SGA package developments. Recently, I sent out an e-mail to the SGAs about PVFC. I am not talking about Present Value of Future Commissions, although increased sales size will have a direct impact on your future income stream. Rather, I'm talking about Premium Value Funnly Coverage. The PVFC plan is an insurance package for individuals and families, and each package is designed to carry a minimum \$100 monthly premium - all designed to increase sales size and provide needed coverage to the consumer.

As we focus our work and effort to move our average sales size, we are pleased to announce this fun and exciting bonus program' It is the PVFC Bonus, and it begins with your transition into the 2001 CSO (Sept. 18 or Oct. 1) and will be in effect through the end of this year. This bonus gives Agents the chance to collect \$50 for each PVFC package sold.

Each office has received a box of AIL \$50 PVFC Bills that include fields to enter the Agent's name, number, agency, and applicant's name. When a PVFC is sold, the Agent should fill out one of these 450 PVFC Bills and staple it to the application. For each of these \$50 PVFC Bulls, the Home Office will usue a \$50 bonus check to the Agent on a one week advance delay for presentation at each Agency's weekly meeting. This is just one of the many things the 2001 CSO changes have made possible

While these new happenings create tremendous opportunity for increased production at every level, we must maintain and improve our existing levels of activity in the field. In other

words, the CSO changes, new product packages, and the new bonus will not mean a thing if, for example, an Agent presently making five \$400 sales per week starts making four \$500 sales.

I want to drive home what this means. Let's imagine a basketball player who has the opportunity each game to take an average of 10 two-point shots. If he makes every shot, then he scores twenty points every game. Now, let's say the same player gets some additional training and maybe a little extra help on the court to the effect that he can consistently sank three-point shots. Do you think he would stay in his two-point comfort zone? Absolutely not! By maintaining his hustle on the court and now sinking his 3-point shots, he makes 30 points per game rather. than the original 20 points, which can make all the difference if a game is on the line. He might even take advantage of the fact he no longer has to take the time to fight his way for a closer shot and actually increase his shot activity from long range.

Similarly, no one should get trapped by what they believe to be a comfortable or coutine weekly submit. Instead, Agents should focus on continuing their current activity and increasing sales size. If you do not maintain existing levels of sales activity per week, all of our efforts - and yours - will be for naught.

In addition to these higher annuanzed life premiums, we want to create a culture where riders - ADB (Accidental Death Benefit), GIO (Guaranteed Insurability Option), child, spouse, ten-year renewal R&C term, and the A71000 policy - are part of every sales package. I spoke last month on how these riders/ benefits are inexpensive yet carry incred ble value to our clients. These are all additional opportunities for increased sales size, but again they will only make a difference as long as the levels of activity either remain consistent or increase

This is a fantastic opportunity, and now you need to realize its full value. Every Agent has the means to increase their sales size Why not combine it with increased activity?




