I remember back in 2003 when I first read John Maxwell's chapter on the law of the Big Mo, thinking to myself, "Wow, that is what we have right now." But it was not until 2004 and 2005 when we went flat in sales and then started to decline that I began to understand how precious the commodity of momentum really is - how hard it was to get it started and how you must guard it with everything you have so not to lose it.

I remember in 1999-2000 feeling like I was trying to pull an 18-wheeler behind me. At first, I would pull but it wouldn't budge. In fact, at certain times it was pulling me backward. Then, slowly but surely, inch by inch, we started to get forward momentum.

By 2002-2003, I found myself having to jump out of the way; otherwise, I would be run over by that same 18-wheeler I could barely budge a few years earlier.

Today, I have almost the same feeling but with a few differences. First, we have become a lot larger than that 18-wheeler. In fact, it is more like a loadeddown freight train. Everyone is involved in moving this train - from each individual Agency to the Home Office personnel to the people at Torchmark. We have people in front pulling and people in back pushing, and this train is really starting to roll. I guarantee it will go faster and further than it has ever gone before.

The actions we have implemented this year have led us to a point where all arrows are pointing up. Our Agent count is the highest it has ever been, as is our four month retention and the amount of PR Reps in the field. Our coding is the highest it has ever been, and the past 3 months have been growth months. These are not the words of an optimist. They are plain facts and data.

AIL/NILICO is at a tipping point, and each and every one of you are about to ride this train, which brings me to our slogan for 2007 - RIGHT NOW! These two simple words determine our present,

future and past - our present because we can carry out our actions immediately; our future because the actions we do or don't do today determine what events happen in the future, and our past because we have to live with the results of our action or inaction. If an idea is good enough to get it done, then do it

Let me ask you a question - what are you waiting on? What things are you not doing right now that are adding unneeded stress to your life? What things could you do right now that would change the momentum of your business? What things can you add on right now that gives you immediate growth?

Allow me to suggest some actions you could take right now. If you are an Agent, set your 2007 activity and production goals with your manager and add one more presentation each day to increase production right now. Cement a date for your next promotion and focus on your sale size. Strive to increase the amount of referrals you receive in each home.

PR Reps, you can immediately find ways to increase your activity. Increase your number of daily presentations and expand into new markets in your area. Tell a friend about the great PR opportunities we provide.

Leaders can promote within their hierarchy today. Increase your recruiting activity to ensure your Agency's growth right now. Find ways to increase your Agency's sales activity by having your Agents learn a new presentation from the Best Practices Training Manual. Put together a new bonus, something exciting and different - and announce it





Baldemar Velasquez

President & Founder Farm Labor Organizing Committee &

arm worker Network for Econon
and Environmental Justice

Baldemar Velasquez, President and Founder of the Farm Labor Organizing Committee (FLOC, AFL-CIO) and the Farm Worker Network for Economic and Environmental Justice, has been unanimously elected to the Labor Advisory Board.

In 1967, at the age of twenty, Mr. Velasquez along with his father and a small group of farmworkers formed the *Farm Labor Organizing Committee*. Under Velasquez's leadership, the group expanded its membership and focused efforts on farmworker education and the establishment of food and fuel cooperatives, as well as a legal clinic.

His tireless efforts led to the formation of independent commissions in the United States and Mexico to negotiate and oversee collective bargaining rights for farmworkers. He conducted an eight-year strike and boycott of the Campbell Soup Company that culminated in the first three-party contracts in labor history between farmworkers, farmers, and numerous industrial produce corporations. In 1993, Velasquez formed the *Farm Worker Network for Economic and Environmental Justice* to increase collaboration among U.S. and international farmworker organizations.

His leadership and humanitarian contributions have been recognized by many groups, including the National Hispanic Heritage Award for leadership bestowed by thirty-three national Latino organizations, the National Council of La Raza, the Midwest Academy, and the National Council of Churches. Mr. Velasquez also has been the recipient of the prestigious John T. and Catherine T. MacArthur Fellowship and the Bannerman Fellowship.

We welcome Mr. Velasquez to the Labor Advisory Board and are looking forward to a long and prosperous partnership.

PR Matching Bonus

To encourage each self-employed PR Representative to save for their retirement, AIL/NILICO offers each of you an opportunity to receive matching bonus contribution funds into a qualified retirement account as a self-employed PR person. Your personal contribution must be deposited by December 31, 2006. Proof of your personal contributions must be submitted to the Home Office in order for this matching to be available. The matching contributions are subject to minimum standard requirements, years of service, and status of contracts. The rules and deadlines are slightly different for U.S. and Canadian contributions. It is important to review the appropriate regulations regarding contribution funds in your COPE 15, OPEIU 277, and CEP 247 contracts. If you are an SA, GA, MGA, RGA, or SGA, you also need to consider how much your team needs to write.


