

The rates listed below are for *Spotlight* recognition only. Net to Gross is used only during the Producer's first eight months.

Retention: 68%

Net to Gross: 78%

Shoot For A Cure



In 2003, 86 clay shooters in Northern California got together for the first OPEIU/AIL Shoot For A Cure Charity Sporting Clays event. Since then, the program has grown it now includes six yearly events covering twelve

states. These events have introduced hundreds of new people across the United States to sporting clays shooting, while raising tens of thousands of dollars for leukemia research.

Shoot For A Cure has partnered with the UFCW Leukemia/ Lymphoma Fund, where every dollar raised is used to support the Leukemia and Lymphoma Society's thirty leukemia research facilities nationwide. Because of this research, over 200,000 more people are surviving with leukemia today than were four years ago, and the cure rate has risen to over 86 percent!

Labor unions, outdoor organizations, contractors, business leaders, elected officials, and others from various walks of life are supporting this great cause by attending the Shoot For A Cure program — and it is still growing!

National event chairman and AIL PR Representative, Mark Gagliardi, says there are big plans ahead for Shoot for A Cure. The goal for 2007 is to raise \$100,000 for the fund and establish

their new Patron Sponsorship program, in which the sponsors' company logos will be displayed on the event's new twenty-foot travel trailer as it tours the country.

The program is win-win for everyone involved. Not only does it allow the attendants help fight for a cure for leukemia, but it also introduces AIL/NILICO to groups who may not have known of us otherwise. According to Mark, the past four years of the event have led to over \$1,260,000 in premium being sold. "These are groups who came to the event and wondered why they hadn't been working with AIL before now. They see we are behind this great program, and it causes them to look at us in a new light."

There are six events planned for 2007 located in California, Texas, Pennsylvania, Michigan and Washington, but Mark plans to do more. Eventually, he would like to add six to ten more events, set up regional and national championships, and strive to raise \$500,000 every year. "This is all very fulfulling," he added. "I feel this is what I was meant to do. It's a beautiful thing because it's great to help the cause, you get to have a lot of fun, and it really brings out the best in people."

SGAs: The top SGA in each category (one winner from Categories 1-6 plus the top new SGA from either Category 7 or 8) based on the average of their percent of Net ALP production growth, their percent of 1st 6-month agent production standard, and their percent of code standard. Each qualifying SGA must have been an SGA for the full 6-month contest period.

RGAs, MGAs, GAs, and SAs: The winners for each rank will be the one with the most Net ALP produced by new Agents coded under them during the 6-month contest period. The minimum of new Agents coded vary for the specific ranks: RGAs must have 25 new Agents coded within the 6 months, MGAs must have 12 new Agents, GAs must have 9, and SAs must have 6. To be considered a code for this contest, the new Agents must have produced \$1,000 of Gross ALP.

Personal Producers: The winners will be the Top 10 personal producers based on Net ALP produced and processed within the 6-month contest duration.

PR Reps: The contest time frame will be one month longer to allow time for printing and mailing. The contest period will be January 1, 2007 through July 31, 2007. The top person in Category A and the top from Category B will be those with the most cards. To be eligible, at least 30 percent of the cards must be from original groups, and the evaluation will be on cards processed by the Home Office within the contest duration. The top PR Rep from Category C will be eligible based on the number of groups submitted. Each group must have a minimum of 50 members and a 3 percent card return in order to count, and at least 30 percent of the groups must be originals.



Activity, Fate, Destiny

How often do you see those three words in the same sentence? I'm not sure if I have, but here at American Income and National Income, anything is possible.

At AIL/NILICO, your activity can determine both your fate and your destiny. All of your 2007 goals — income, convention, trips, promotions — will be determined by how active you are and how active you can motivate your team to be.


What is activity? Let's be sure everyone understands what I mean by "productive" activity. For a sales agent, productive activity can be defined as any reasonable method to increase your number of sales presentations in a week. For a sales leader, productive activity can include the process associated with increasing your number of productive new agents coded. Either way, it is productive activity that, in the short run, determines the fate of sales agents and, in the long run, the fate of the sales leaders.

Now that we have defined productive activity, let's discuss exactly how to raise your number of presentations a week.

- Obviously, referrals can give you a limitless number of potential presentations.
- Another way to spike your activity includes raising
 the percentage of presentations you give per
 appointment booked. This can include sharpening
 your phone scripts to include an assurance that
 both the husband and wife will be there. Other
 assurances you can include would be making sure
 they set aside 60 minutes for the presentation
 and there be no distractions to keep them from
 the appointment. Just try setting a strong
 appointment and do not accept a cursory yes on
 the phone.

- Maintain a notebook of the previous day, week, or month's appointment sheets. Chances are, from time to time, you will find yourself making a sale in a neighborhood where you may have had a no show earlier in the past. Orderly recordkeeping will help you research additional prior appointments.
- Knock on the wrong door! For a small amount of time spent knocking, you will be surprised how receptive neighbors can be to a no cost benefits plan, if you inject it into the conversation.
- Book on the fly! When traveling between appointments, keep pushing digits on your cell.
 Try to call everyone within a reasonable geography to where you are headed. Someone will say, "Come see me."
- Don't book the referrals. Wait, what? Don't
 book the referrals? Instead, when your current
 appointment gives you a referral, have the person
 call and book the referral for you. You are sure to
 gain a stronger presentation that way.
- Go non-traditional. Start generating your own leads in original and aggressive ways. From a desk at a youth hockey game to a booth at a county fair, your SGA has access to marketing materials that can help you garner interest in our product lines.

Activity does not come to you — you have to capture it. These are a few obvious ways to increase your presentations, sales, and income. Sure, your SGA is going to give you a lead packet, but you know you are a top performer when your lead packet becomes your filler.
