Likewise acquiring the Qur'an is a means of honor in this world and the next.

An example of honor in this world is that the right to lead the Salaah is for the one who knows and reads the most Qur'an.

The Shuhada who knew more Qur'an were given preference when burying multiple Sahaba togeth-

er and many other forms of honor.

Similarly it is a means of honor in the Aakhirah.

It will be said to the haafidh:

Read and ascend in Jannah!

A second group of people had their heads smashed repeatedly and grown back and smashed again. They were those who didn't practice on the Qur'an that they had learned.

A third group of people were drowning in a River of blood and stones were being thrown at them. They were those who were involved in usury (interest).

There many other warnings about interest mentioned in the Quran and Ahadeeth

Three different meanings for the word خبط have been mentioned:

- 1. Their head are not right (mad)
- 2. Their heads will keep falling in humiliation
- 3. They would look insane to other people

A fourth group of people were in an oven with their private parts exposed. This was because of Zina (fornication) despite Allah making Halaal avenues to fulfil their desires.

This advice of abstaining from Zina is of paramount importance for a Haafidh.

How beautiful is it that bees eat from the fruits and make homes as mentioned in the Aayah.

Then the drink of honey which has many benefits comes out of that hive.

Within the bee colony there are various jobs:

1. Builders - How beautiful is the shape and perfect form of construction without any wastage in the shape of hexagons

Those blessed with Qur'an should be those that give light and benefit other

3. Those that guard the hive. They prevent those with dirt and even kill those bees that bring dirt in or those that cause harm (by the command of the Queen)

We should protect the place we are in.

Home, place and actions must be pure.

To make this continuous effort for Islaah (reformation) under our Asaatidha.

The only chance you have in this world to collect good deeds is this moment, this life. You won't get another chance again no matter what. Don't waste your time in useless activities even if Halaal [things like oversleeping after Fajr for long hours, wasteful gossips, busying yourself with a lot of news etc]

Don't forget to use your time to please your parents and serve them. If you really want your Duaas to be

accepted serve them, massage their feet, ask them to supplicate for you

"And lower unto them the wings of submission and humility through mercy and say; MY RABB, Bestow on them your mercy as they did bring me up when I was small".

As the followers of Rasulullaah we also need to fulfil the rights of our families and dependents.

proves the veracity of the Dīn of Islām is the extent that it has been preserved for almost a millennium and a half. There is not a shadow of doubt that Allāh Ta'ālā Himself has preserved this Dīn, as He promised in His Book: "Indeed, we have revealed this re-

membrance (i.e., Qur'an), and We shall surely preserve it" (Sūrah al-Hijr, Ayah 9). However, He- out of His Infinite Wisdom- chose the scholars of the Dīn as the means by which this preservation took place. These scholars preserved the Dīn in every single aspect, and just to name the different subjects that they developed to preserve the Dīn could fill a book by itself. Part of this preservation is that the lives of all those with any connection to the Din were preserved with meticulous detail- from the Sīrah of the beloved Prophet , to the lives of the illustrious Sahābah RadhiAllāhu 'Anhum, to the pious Salaf, and then the lives of the 'Ulama' who had any sort of impact up until our times. There is surely no other example in any other religion of such preservation of the lives of those personalities who had influence in that religion.

Thus, we have in front of us a treasure trove of biographies of the greatest people to live on the earth after the Prophets ('alayhimus salām)- yet another perk of being part of the greatest Ummah sent for mankind. The variety of these biographical works reflects the variety of the efforts that were made in the preservation of this Dīn.

Shaykh 'Abdul Fattāh Abū Ghuddah (Rahimahullāh) writes: "The early scholars- as well as those that came after them- wrote many books regarding a specific category of 'Ulama' as well as others (nonscholars), sharing either a common physical trait, or a common 'Ilmī occupation, or a common place, or some other common factor. As for those that shared a common 'Ilmī occupation, the 'Ulamā' have written separate biographical works chronicling the lives of: the Mufassirīn (exegetes), Qurrā' (Oral Transmitters of the Qur'an), Muhaddithin (Hadith scholars), trustworthy narrators (of Hadīth), the narrators who have been criticized, the judges, the Muftīs, the jurists (Fugahā'), the 'Usūliyyīn (scholars of 'Usūl), the historians, the theologians (Mutakallimīn), the scholars of Arabic grammar, the linguists, the scholars of Arabic rhetoric (Balaghah), the writers

(in Arabic Literature), the poets, the calligraphers, and others. The books written in this regard are so many that they cannot be counted.

As for those who share a common place, the 'Ulama' have written regarding the history of different lands, and they wrote in the history of each land those personalities who were born and raised there, or those who moved and settled there, or even passed through there. In this regard, there are also an uncountable number of books.

As for those who share a common physical trait, the 'Ulamā' have written regarding the blind, the one-eyed, the cross eyed, the hunchbacked, the lepers, the deaf, the lame (i.e., those who walk with a limp), the dark skinned, those who had broken teeth, those who lived long lives, the genius insane people ('Uqalā' al- Majānīn), those women who had multiple husbands (at different times), as well as other physical qualities which a group of people shared." (al-'Ulamā' al 'Uzzāb pgs. 9- 10)

Allāh Ta'ālā - in His Infinite Wisdom- has created each of us differently, with each of us having different tastes and passions. With such a variety of biographies in front of us, each of us can dive into the biographies of those scholars we feel more connection to- whether it be because of the science they specialized in, or the place they were from, or for even because we share a physical trait with them so we can be uplifted and motivated. This aids us in fulfilling the command of Allah Ta'ala in the Qur'an: "They are those whom Allah has guided, so follow their guidance". (Sūrah al- 'An'ām, Āyah 90) Although, in context, the verse is referring to the Prophets ('alayhimus salām) - as they are the greatest of role models- we can also take it in a more general meaning to include all those pious 'Ulama' who passed before us that we can take as role models, applying the famous principle of Tafsīr: "Al-'Ibrah bi 'Umūm al Lafdh, Lā Bi Khusūs al-Sabab" (Consideration is given to the generality of the wording, without limiting it to the specific con-

Allah says in the holy Quraan:

"Call [people] to the path of your Rabb [Islam] with wisdom and beautiful counsel [providing encouragement instead of causing resentment] and debate [with proof] with them [the kuffaar] in a manner that is best [without driving them further away from Islam]" [Ayah 144 Juz 14]

Nabi states in a Hadith:

"Convey [anything that you have learnt] from me even if it may be a single verse" [Bukhari]

Calling towards Allah sis one of the most important aspects of our Deen. As a favour from Allah , sit has been given as a speciality to this Ummah of Muhammad sand no other Ummah was blessed with this work.

After the advent of Rasulullah monew Nabi is to come. Thus this most important aspect and work of Dawah, which was exclusively the domain of the Ambiyya [Alayhimus Salaam] rest upon the shoulders of this Ummah.

Allah has spoken most glowingly of those people

who do the work of Dawah, in the Quraan Kareem: "And who says any better speech than him who calls towards Allah."

Approximately six hundred years after Hadhrat Eesa Alayhis Salaam was raised up to the heavens, the period which is known as Fatrah [the period in which revelation was stopped], the final Messenger, the seal of prophets, the leader of the first and last of men. Hadhrat Muhammad was sent as a guide for mankind. His first task was to call the Mushrikeen [polytheists] of Makkah towards Tauheed and the oneness of Allah . . These people turned in enmity and hatred against Nabi ﷺand began to persecute Him and his followers. Some of them were persecuted mercilessly beyond human endurance such as Hadhrat Khabbab Radhiallahu Anhul whose stories are very famous, while others were even killed such as the parents of Hadhrat Ammar Bin Yasir [Radhiallahu Anhuma].

Unfortunately, in today's time we have become so selfish and so negligent with regards to this beautiful Deen of Allah, that we do not propagate it to non-Muslims at all. How are we going to answer in the court of Almighty Allah when he is going to ask us that "Oh Servant! What effort have you made in order to propagate this Deen of mine?"

By us only going to Muslims to remind them of the commands of Allah sis not sufficient, rather it is very necessary for us to try and propagate the Deen of Islam to the non-believers as well, in tandem with our efforts for Muslims.

Moulana Akoo Sahib [an Ustaadh of Darul Uloom Newcastle] was stuck in traffic on the Golden Highway due to an accident that occurred on the road. So Moulana stepped out of his vehicle and he walked from car to car spreading this beautiful message of Deen. SUBHANALLAH!

A lie doesn't become true, wrong doesn't become right and evil doesn't become good, just because it's accepted by the majority. One such sin which is of this kind is music

WHAT IS MUSIC?

Music is, by definition, the science or art of ordering tones or sounds in succession, in combination to produce beauty of form, harmony, and expression of emotion.

WHO WAS THE FOUNDER OF MUSIC?

لما مات آدم عليه السلام وشمت به إبليس وقابيل فاجتمعا في الأرض فجعل إبليس وقابيل المعازف والملاهي شماتة بآدم عليه السلام فكل ما كان في الأرض من هذا الضرب الذي يتلذذ به الناس فإنما هو من ذاك

"When Adam (peace be upon him) passed away, Iblis and Qabil (the son of Adam) were delighted. They both gathered on the Earth and Iblis and Qabil in-

vented stringed and other instruments to rejoice on the death of Adam (Peace be upon him). Thus, whatever types of instruments are on the Earth that people derive pleasure from are actually from these instruments (that they had first used).

PHYSICAL EFFECTS OF MUSIC

Experiments carried out by doctors and researchers confirm that music is such that it does not only affect the brain, but each and every organ of the body. There is a close relationship between music and bodily movements.

It is also proved that music affects one's emotions, increases arousal in terms of alertness and excitement and also leads to various psychological changes in a person. In a psychological experiment, it was found that listening to moderate types of music increased one's normal heart beat, whilst listening to rock music, the heart beat increased even further, yet people claim that music has no physical effect.

Music affects the brain and every part of the body. A simple example of this is that, as soon as one hears music, the body reacts by tapping one's feet or moving the head. The message in music is all about drugs, freedom and illicit relations.

The ideas that are presented in music go against the teachings of the Qur'aan and Shariah and influences one to rebel against Deen.

SPIRITUAL EFFECTS OF MUSIC

The listener of music is deprived of the enjoyment of Ibaadat. He doesn't feel like reading the Qur'aan. Salaah becomes a burden to him. His contentment is shattered, as a result of which he will want to listen to louder and more of the latest music. Eventually due to the hypocrisy, he feels irritated with the Azaan, Deen and the people of Deen until he totally hates them and avoids them. He has now reached the border of Islam and Kufr! May Allah Ta'ala protect us! Aameen.

قال رسول لله صلى لله عليه و سلم: الغِناءُ يُنْبِتُ النفاقَ في القلب، كما ينبت الماءُ الزرعَ

NABI (SAW) has said: Music/singing germinates hypocrisy in the heart just as water germinates vegetation.

All sins are detestable in Shari'ah. However, some sins have an effect of leading a person Into sin further.

One such sin is music, which is predominantly associated with vice. Where there is music, there is generally dancing, intermingling, women, intoxicants, zina and vulgarity, just to name a few.

Allamah Munawi (rahimahullah) states that this hadith infers that music is the main cause for hypocrisy.

Therefore, the more one engages in music, the closer he gets to hypocrisy.

The Prophet of Allah (peace be upon him and his family) said: "Stay away from ghina (singing and music) because it destroys shame (modesty) and increases sexual excitement. It kills one's manliness. Its effect is similar to that of liquor. Thus, if you are led into music, then stay away from women since music and singing will lead a person to commit adultery." (Ad-Dur al-Manthur, Volume 5, Page 308)

The one who acquires the passion of listening to the Qur'aan will never get enjoyment in listening to anything else.

PUNISHMENT FOR LISTENING TO MUSIC

And of mankind is he who purchases idle talks (i.e. music, singing, etc.) to mislead (men) from the Path of Allah without knowledge, and takes it (the Verses of the Quran) by way of mockery. For such there will be a humiliating torment (in the Hell-fire).

in the text imply such a thing الهو الحديث The words that may allure and absorb a listener completely and make him heedless of everything else around him. Lexically, there is nothing derogatory in these words, but in custom and usage, they apply to evil, useless and vain things, such as gossip, nonsensical talk, joking and jesting, legends and tales, singing and merry-making, etc

REWARDS OF NOT LISTENING TO MUSIC

Rasulullah said: "On the Day of Qiyaamah, Allah Ta'ala will say, 'Where are those people who, in the world, protected their ears from listening to satanic music and their eyes from looking at singers? Separate them from the people.' The angels will separate them from the people and seat them on mounds of musk and amber. Thereafter, Allah Ta'ala will command the angels, 'Let them hear my pure and majestic hymns.' The angels will then recite to them from the zikr of Allah Ta'ala in such

beautiful and melodious voices which they had never heard before." (Jam'ul Fawaaid)

WHAT IS THE WISDOM BEHIND MUSIC BEING PRO-HIBITED IN ISLAM?

In conclusion, music and the instruments used for singing are a cause for arousing the sexual desire of an individual. It could lead a person to adultery and fornication. Therefore, Islam takes preventive

measures rather than suffer the consequences. This is also one of the principles of Islamic Jurisprudence, namely 'blocking the means' (sadd aldhara'i). This is based on the idea of preventing an evil before it actually materializes, and is taken from the heart of the guidance of the Qur'an and Sunnah that, "Preventing harm is given precedence even to achieving possible benefits."
