FLIGIBILITY TO RECEIVE CORRESPONDENCE LESSONS

The Alberta Correspondence School will send lessons in Grades I to VI for the following:

- (a) Children who are six years of age on or before February 29, 1976.
- (b) Children who live where there is no school.
- (c) Children who cannot go to school because of illness or some physical disability.
- (d) Children who live too far from a school or bus route.
- (e) Children of parents temporarily living outside the province.
- (f) Adults who wish to improve their education.
- (g) Persons in a place of detention.

FEES FOR RESIDENT ALBERTA STUDENTS

Any student residing in Alberta will be granted courses FREE of charge by the Department of Education, providing the application is approved by the School. <u>For students of school age</u>, one of these conditions must apply:

- (a) Student lives in an unorganized territory in Alberta. (Description of land location must be submitted with the application form.)
- (b) Student is unable to receive regular classroom instruction because of physical disability or other medical reasons. A medical certificate issued by a medical doctor or district nurse must be enclosed with the application, stating that the student is unable to attend school over an extended period of time as a result of the disability. The medical certificate should be dated, and appear on the official letterhead of the doctor or district nurse. The medical certificate must be renewed each school year.
- (c) Student is in a place of detention.
- (d) Student is recommended as a special case by the superintendent of schools or by the Department of Education.

FEES FOR NON-RESIDENT STUDENTS

A non-resident is one who lives outside of Alberta at the time of registration, or who lives in Alberta, but will be leaving the province and sending lessons in from outside Alberta.

A student who is temporarily residing outside of Alberta, and plans to continue his studies in Alberta when he returns may register for courses with the Alberta Correspondence School.

POSTAGE AND MAILING

- (a) The student is required to pay the postage on everything which he sends or returns to the Alberta Correspondence School. The Alberta Correspondence School will pay the outgoing surface postage on all items mailed to any address in Canada or the United States.
- (b) Students whose addresses are <u>outside Canada or the United States</u> must pay the postage on outgoing and incoming lessons. At the time of registration, sufficient funds should be remitted to cover cost of shipping material to the student.
- (c) An initial sum of \$40.00 per student should also be deposited with the Alberta Correspondence School, to cover air mail charges on the return of corrected lessons. Additional air postage funds may be required during the year depending on postal rates.

- (a) A FULL GRADE course in Grades I VI consists of 33 lessons. Each complete lesson is planned on a five-day school week. This means that a FULL GRADE course takes approximately 8 1/2 months to complete satisfactorily. In planning the courses, allowances have been made for regular school holidays such as Thanksgiving, Christmas and Easter. Allowances have also been made for the occasional sick day. A student who begins his correspondence studies in September, and works regularly can easily complete the course by the end of June.
- (b) A FULL GRADE course at the elementary level includes writing, reading, language, spelling, science, health, social studies, art and arithmetic activities.
- (c) Some separate subject courses are available for those students who wish to register in one subject only. See pages 3 and 7 for the available separate subject courses.
- (d) When a student is registered, a letter or shipping order is sent giving the student's file number. This must be written clearly on every lesson, letter, or other material sent to the Alberta Correspondence School.
- (e) On registration, the first eleven lessons are sent to correspondence students studying in Alberta. Further lessons will be sent as the student progresses and well before the time they will be needed. Envelopes will be enclosed with the lessons.
- (f) On registration the COMPLETE SET OF LESSONS is sent to students studying outside Alberta. Envelopes will be enclosed with the lessons.

8. TEXTBOOKS

- (a) The Alberta Correspondence School loans textbooks, readers, and library books to students in Grades I to VI who live in Alberta and who are studying at home.
- (b) Upon completing the grade, the student should return the books promptly to avoid delays in issuing a promotion certificate. Parents are responsible for the care of books. (See the declaration on page B of the application form.) If books are scribbled on or defaced in any way, this service may be discontinued.
- (c) Books are not loaned to students in supervised centres.
- (d) A student living outside Alberta at the time of registration (or who moves from Alberta after he has registered) is expected to purchase the required textbooks and workbooks. These may be purchased from:

Textbook Order Forms will be supplied for this purpose.

When a student is unable to obtain certain textbooks, he may borrow textbooks from the Alberta Correspondence School upon payment of a CAUTION FEE. The caution fee, which is the total cost of loaned books, will be refunded when books are returned in perfect condition. See page 6 of this bulletin for list of books loaned on CAUTION FEE.

ARITHMETIC - Based on Seeing Through Arithmetic 3 (Revised)

(b) GRADE FOUR

SCIENCE - Based on Concepts in Science 4. This course to be available during the 1975-76 school term.

GRADES FOUR, FIVE, SIX

ARITHMETIC - A modern arithmetic program which does not require a textbook. All teaching instruction, practice work and SEND FOR CORRECTION exercises are included. At the Grades Five and Six level a short introduction on metric study is included.

SOCIAL STUDIES - Early Civilizations of Man - This course to be available during the 1975-76 school term.

SUBMISSION OF LESSONS

- (a) When the student completes all the exercises of the first lesson, forward the lesson to the Alberta Correspondence School in the envelope provided. The Alberta Correspondence School pays the surface postage on all mail sent out by the School to an address in Canada or the United States, but not on mail sent in.
- (b) The student then works on the second lesson while the first lesson is at the School being corrected. He should not wait for the first lesson to be returned. Each lesson should be mailed as soon as possible after it has been completed. More than one lesson should not be sent at one date of mailing without a full explanation given on the mailing form.
- (c) GRADING SYSTEM

Letter gradings are used to evaluate completed lessons in Grades 3-6.

A - 80-100%

B - 65-79 %

C - 50-64 %

D - 0 -49 %

Promotion Certificates are issued to elementary students upon satisfactory completion of their grades.

RE-REGISTRATION

Even though correction service is available and lessons may be submitted during July and August, a student should attempt to complete all lessons by the end of June. A student, living in Alberta or a student living outside Alberta, who is unable to complete the lessons within the required time, may $\underline{re-register}$ at the end of August. There is no charge for a first re-registration. The student may continue submitting lessons from the point at which he left off.

If a student, living outside Alberta, does not complete the grade after the <u>first re-regis</u> <u>ration</u>, no further re-registration in the grade will be permitted. The student will have to complete a new registration and pay the full gistration fee.

ATTENDANCE AND PROGRESS REPORT

COURSES AVAILABLE FOR ADULTS

An adult may apply for registration in an elementary grade if he so wishes. He is reminded, however, that courses for Grades I, II and III are prepared for young children and that much of the material in them is of little value to an adult. Occasionally an adult, who has a rudimentary reading knowledge, wishes to apply for a Grade IV, V or VI course. It is important to note that the courses for these grades are full grade courses which include all subjects at the elementary level. If you are interested in one of these grades, please state reason for requesting the elementary course. (See item 4, page A of the application form.)

An Alberta resident who wishes to enrol in a <u>full grade</u> course should complete pages A and B of the enclosed application form. (See conditions of eligibility for free courses on page 3)

It is suggested, however, that an adult who has had some previous elementary schooling should begin with the special courses, $\it ENGLISH\ FOR\ ADULTS\ l$ and $\it MATHEMATICS\ FOR\ ADULTS\ l$ that are described below.

16. SPECIAL ADULT COURSES

15.

The Alberta Correspondence School has prepared two special courses at the elementary level for adults: $ENGLISH\ FOR\ ADULTS\ l$ and $MATHEMATICS\ FOR\ ADULTS\ l$. A student may apply for one or both of the subjects. He must, however, be capable of reading with understanding before applying for these adult courses. No textbooks are required except a good dictionary. The material covered in the courses is as follows:

ENGLISH FOR ADULTS 1: This is a course in English which attempts to give the adult, in one course, the equivalent of the first six years of elementary school English.

<u>MATHEMATICS FOR ADULTS 1:</u> This is a course in elementary arithmetic using the "modern" method. It assumes that the adult has little or no background in the traditional or "old" arithmetic formerly taught in Alberta Schools, or in modern mathematics. The twenty-four lessons of this course cover the material in Grades I through VI and serve as a preparation for work at the Grade VII level.

TO REGISTER FOR ONE OR BOTH OF THE SPECIAL ADULT SUBJECTS, COMPLETE PARTS A AND B OF THE ENCLOSED GREEN APPLICATION FORM WHICH ARE APPLICABLE TO YOU, THEN RETURN THE GREEN FORM TO THE ALBERTA CORRESPONDENCE SCHOOL WITH THE REQUIRED FEE.

18. RE-REGISTRATION FOR ADULTS

A registration in *ENGLISH FOR ADULTS 1* or *MATHEMATICS FOR ADULTS 1* is valid until the end of the first week of September, 1976. Should a course not be completed by the end of the first week of September, 1976, the student may re-register at a cost of \$2.00 per subject and then continue submitting lessons from the point at which he discontinued.
