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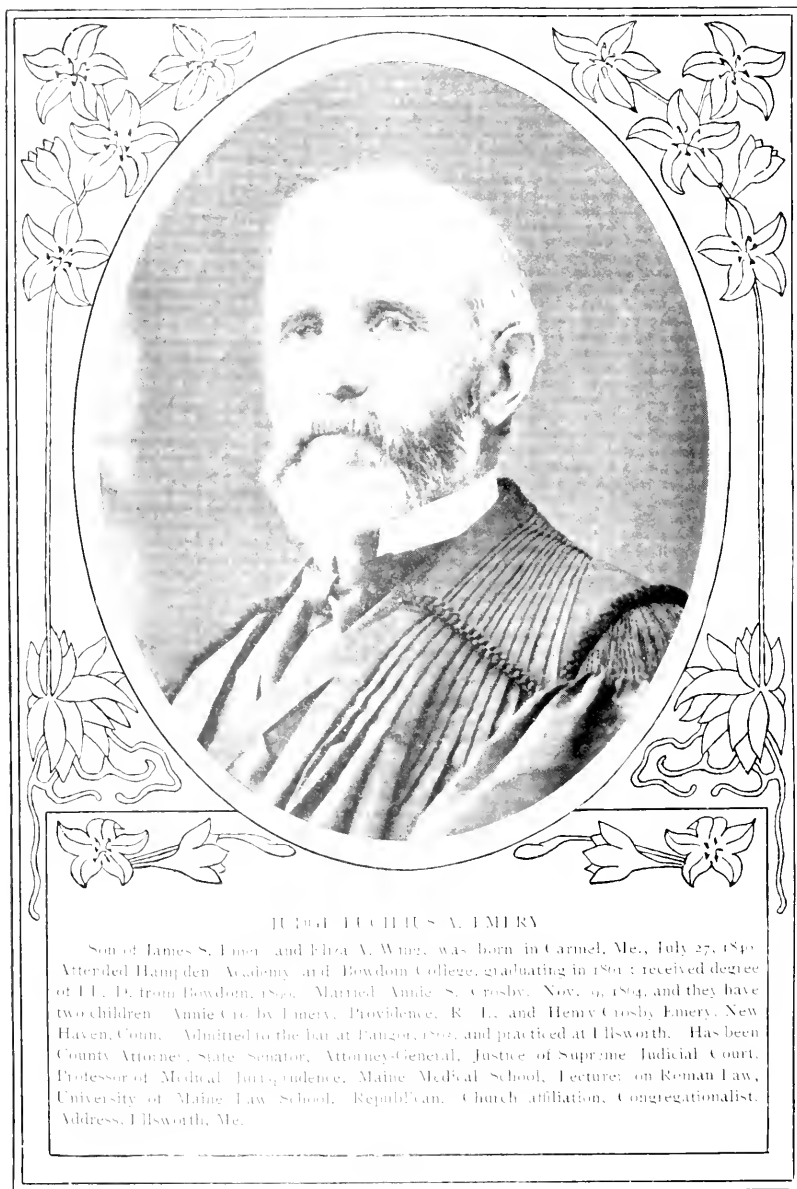
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JUDGE ANDREW P. WISWELL.

Son of Arno Wiswell and Sarah Peters, was born in Ellsworth, Me., July 11, 1852. Attended school at Ellsworth, East Maine Conference Seminary, Bucksport, and Bowdoin College, graduating in 1873, receiving LL. D. degree from Bowdoin in 1900. Married Emma Green of Brunswick, Dec. 15, 1875. Admitted to Hancock County Bar, 1874, and has practiced law in Ellsworth. Judge of Ellsworth Municipal Court, 1878-82; National Bank Examiner, 1882-86; member Maine House of Representatives, 1887, 1889, and 1891; Speaker of House, 1891; Associate Justice Supreme Judicial Court of Maine, 1893 to Jan. 1, 1900; Chief Justice Supreme Judicial Court of Maine, from Jan. 2, 1900. Republican. Address, Ellsworth, Me.



JUDGE JULIUS A. EMERY

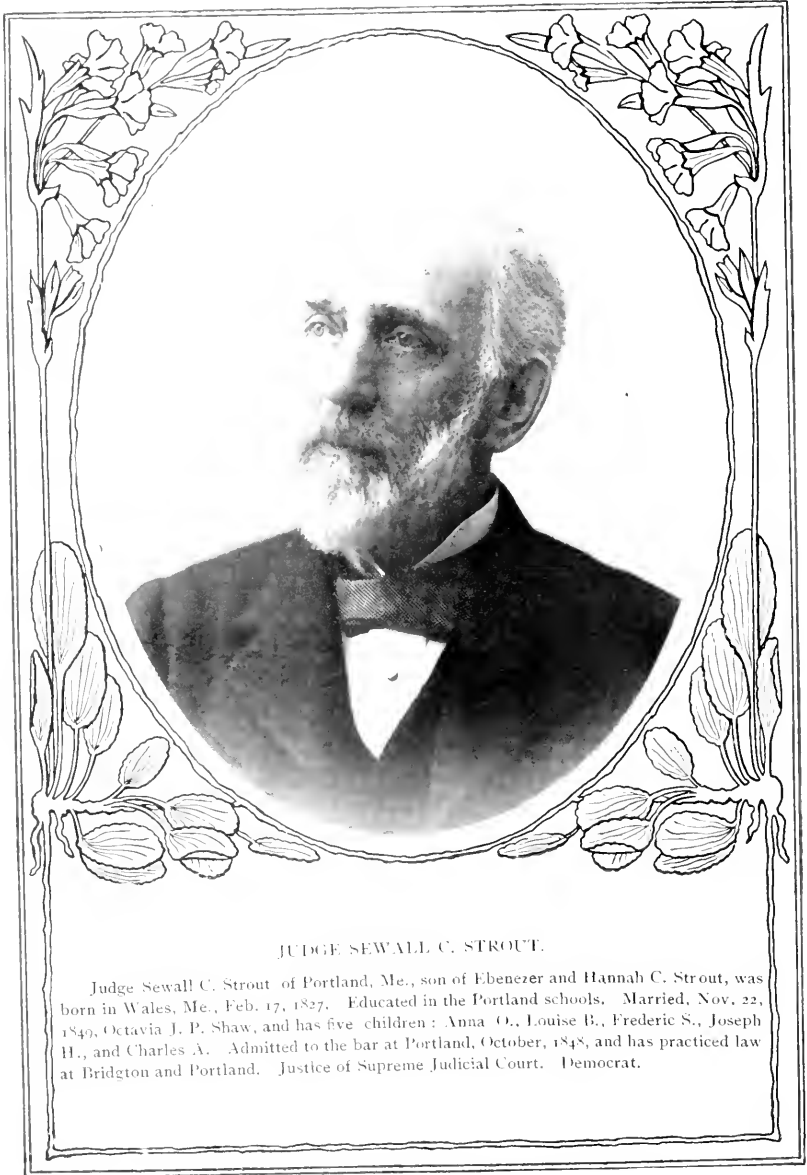

Admitted to the bar at Bangor, 1869, and practiced at Ellsworth. Has been County Attorney, State Senator, Attorney-General, Justice of Supreme Judicial Court, Professor of Medical Jurisprudence, Maine Medical School, Lecturer on Roman Law, University of Maine Law School, Republican, Church affiliation, Congregationalist. Address, Ellsworth, Me.





JUDGE WILLIAM PENN WHITEHOUSE.

Born in Vassalboro, Me., April 9, 1842; son of John Roberts and Hannah (Percival) Whitehouse. First American ancestor was Thomas Whitehouse, who settled at Dover, N. H., 1658. His mother was a descendant of John Percival, Barnstable, Mass. Graduated, Waterville College, 1863, with highest honors, and on receiving second degree of A. M., 1866, was appointed to deliver a master's oration; received degree of LL. D., 1876. June 24, 1869, married Evelyn Treat, daughter of Col. Robert Treat, descendant in sixth generation from Col. Robert Treat, colonial governor of Connecticut, and has one son, Robert Treat Whitehouse of Portland. Admitted to the bar, October, 1865. City Solicitor, Augusta, four years; County Attorney, seven years; Judge Superior Court from February, 1878, to April, 1896, when elevated to bench of Supreme Court. In 1872, chairman of commission on New Insane Hospital, and wrote a monograph against adoption of Cottage System, which was published by State. Address, Augusta, Me.



JUDGE SEWALL C. STROUT.

Judge Sewall C. Strout of Portland, Me., son of Ebenezer and Hannah C. Strout, was born in Wales, Me., Feb. 17, 1827. Educated in the Portland schools. Married, Nov. 22, 1849, Octavia J. P. Shaw, and has five children: Anna O., Louise B., Frederic S., Joseph H., and Charles A. Admitted to the bar at Portland, October, 1848, and has practiced law at Bridgton and Portland. Justice of Supreme Judicial Court. Democrat.



JUDGE ALBERT R. SAVAGE.

Forn, Ryegate, Vt., Dec. 8, 1847, son of Charles W. and Eliza M. Savage. Educated at Lancaster (N. H.) Academy and Dartmouth College, graduating from the latter in 1871. Married Nellie H. Hales, Lunenburg, Vt., and has three children, Charles H., Mary A., and Anna May. He was admitted to the bar at Montpelier, Vt., March, 1874, and at Auburn, Me., April, 1875, and has practiced in Auburn and Lewiston. Was County Attorney, 1881-85; Judge of Probate, 1885-89; Mayor of Auburn, 1889-91; Member of Maine House of Representatives, 1891-93; Speaker of House, 1893; State Senator, 1895-97; Associate Justice Supreme Judicial Court since 1897. Politics, Republican. Address, Auburn, Me.



JUDGE WILLIAM HENRY FOGLER.

Born, Nov. 19, 1837, Searsmont, Me.; son of Henry Fogler and Eliza McKinney. Educated at Kent's Hill, Newbury, Vt., and Colby. Married, Dec. 31, 1863, Harriet Anna Kingsbury, and had two children, Mary, died in infancy, and William F. Fogler, died, 1890, aged 12 years. Admitted to the bar, 1862; practiced in Belfast and Rockland. Deputy Collector of Customs, Belfast district, 1864-7; County Attorney, Waldo County, 1872-8; was Mayor of Belfast, member of County and State Republican Committees, City Solicitor and Representative from Rockland; Judge Advocate General on Gov. Cleaves' Staff; Trustee, Rockland library. Appointed by Gov. Powers, Mar. 16, 1878, Associate Justice of Supreme Judicial Court. Entered army, July, 1892, as Capt. of 15th Me. Regt.; was promoted to Colonel of that regiment; discharged, 1894, on account of wounds; served as Provost Marshal, 5th district of Maine. Was a Knight Templar, and at one time eminent Commander of Claremont Commandry. Universalist - Republican.



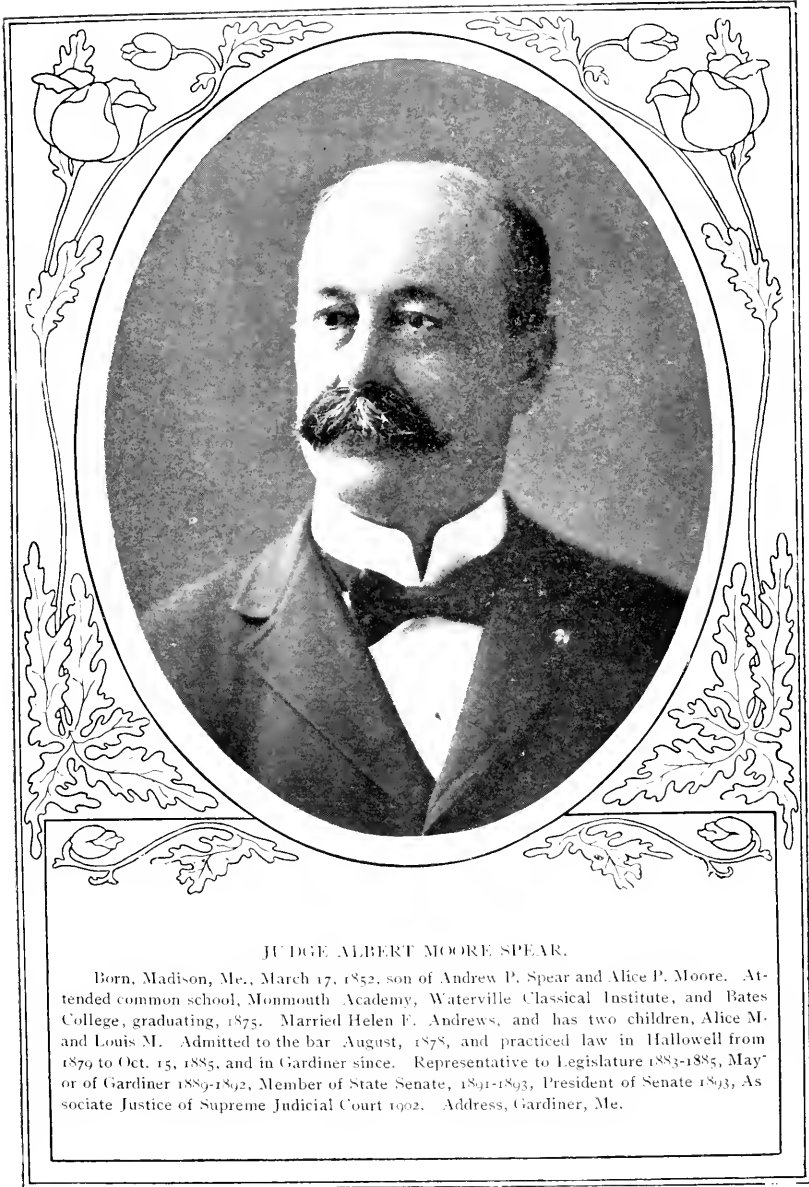
JUDGE FREDERICK A. POWERS.

Frederick A. Powers, son of Arba and Naomi (Mathews) Powers, was born in Pittsfield, Me., June 19, 1855. Was educated in Maine Central Institute, graduating in 1871, and Bowdoin College, graduating in 1875. Married May Hussey, January 7, 1870, and has two sons, Llewellyn Hussey Powers and Paul Hussey Powers. Admitted to the bar at Houlton, September, 1876, and has practiced law in that town. Member, Maine House, 1885-7, Maine Senate, 1891; Attorney-General, 1893-4-5-6; Justice Supreme Judicial Court since Jan. 2, 1900. Republican. Address, Houlton, Me.



JUDGE HENRY CLAY PEABODY.

Born, Gilead, Me., April 14, 1838, son of John Tarbell and Mercy Ingalls (Burbank) Peabody. Removed with his parents to Gorham, N. H., 1849. Fitted for college at Gould's Academy, Bethel, Me., and Fryeburg Academy, Fryeburg, Me., and graduated from Dartmouth College, class of '59. Read law in office of Gen. Samuel Fessenden, Portland. Admitted to the bar in Cumberland County, 1862, and commenced practice of law in Portland. Judge of Probate from 1879 to Nov. 29, 1900, when he was appointed by Gov. Powers Associate Justice of the Supreme Judicial Court of Maine. Married, 1867, Miss Ellen Adams, daughter of Dea. Augustus Adams of Portland. They have had three children: Clarence Webster Peabody, who graduated at Bowdoin College and Harvard Law School and is now in the practice of law in Portland; Arthur Glendower Peabody, who died in 1886, and Henry Adams Peabody, of the class of '03, Bowdoin College.



**JUDGE ALBERT MOORE SPEAR.**

Born, Madison, Me., March 17, 1852, son of Andrew P. Spear and Alice P. Moore. Attended common school, Monmouth Academy, Waterville Classical Institute, and Bates College, graduating, 1875. Married Helen F. Andrews, and has two children, Alice M. and Louis M. Admitted to the bar August, 1878, and practiced law in Hallowell from 1879 to Oct. 15, 1885, and in Gardiner since. Representative to Legislature 1883-1885, Mayor of Gardiner 1889-1892, Member of State Senate, 1891-1893, President of Senate 1893, Associate Justice of Supreme Judicial Court 1902. Address, Gardiner, Me.



JUDGE JOHN A. PETERS.

Born, Ellsworth, Me., Oct. 9, 1822, son of Andrew and Sally Jordan Peters; attended Gorham Academy and Yale University, graduating from the latter in 1842; twice married and has two daughters by second wife. Admitted to Hancock Bar, 1844; practiced in Bangor until 1873. State Senator, 1862, 1863; Representative, 1864; Attorney-General, 1864-1866; elected Representative to Congress, 1866, and served in 40th, 41st, and 42nd Congresses; Justice of Supreme Judicial Court, 1873-1883; Chief Justice, 1883-1900, when he voluntarily retired therefrom. Received degree of LL. D. from Colby College, 1883, Bowdoin College, 1884, and Yale University in 1893. Always a Republican. Address, Bangor, Maine.





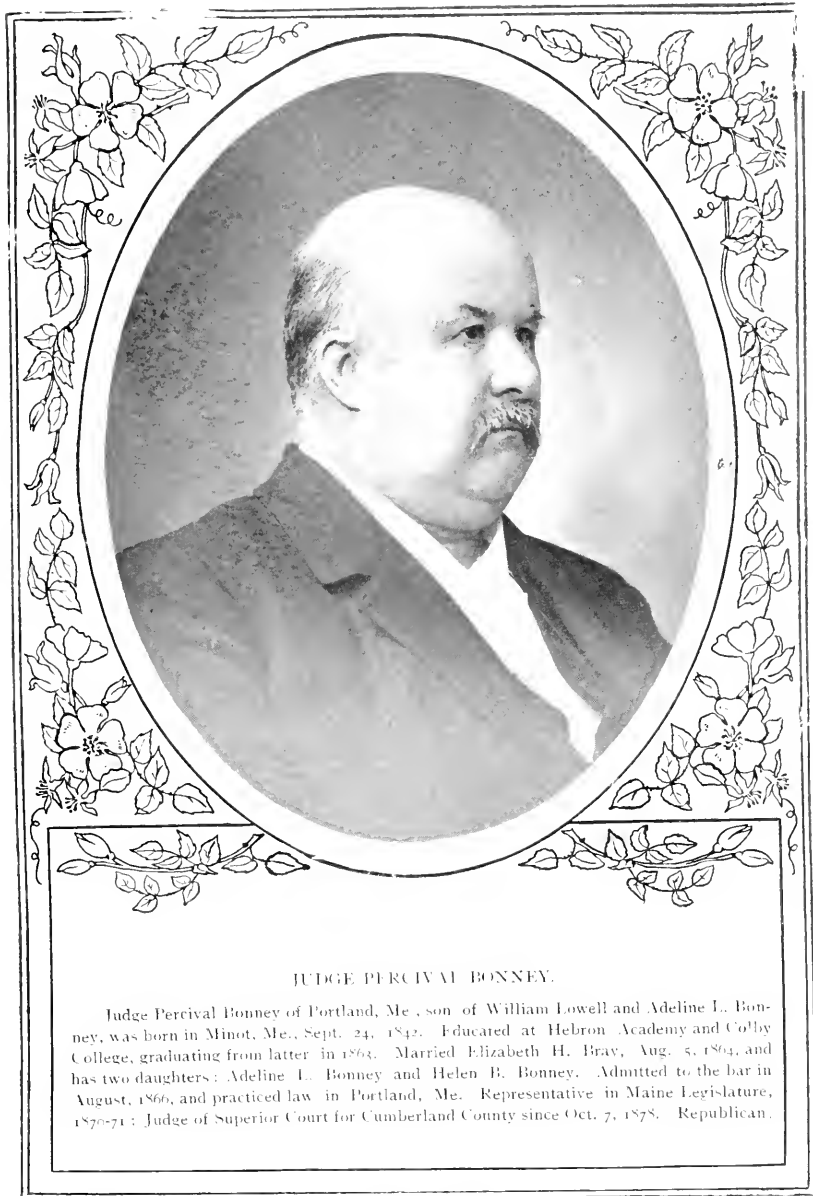
JUDGE ENOCH FOSTER.

Born, Newry, Me., May 19, 1839; attended comm in schools, Gould's Academy, Bethel, Me., and Maine State Seminary, Lewiston; graduated, Bowdoin College, 1864, Albany Law School, Albany, N. Y., 1865. Married, June 3, 1864, Adeline O. Lowe, who died June 12, 1872; June 6, 1873, Sarah W. Chapman. Has one son, Robert C. Foster, class 1891, Bowdoin College. Admitted to bar, Albany, N. Y., 1865, and Augusta, Me., 1865. Practiced law at Bethel, Me., until 1878, since then at Portland. Was county attorney, 1868—1874; State Senator, 1874—5; Justice of Supreme Judicial Court of Maine, 1884—1898. He has an honorable war record covering a period of three years: was 2nd and 1st lieutenant, Co. H, 13th Me. reg. in Civil war; was in Department of the Gulf, in Butler's expedition in capture of New Orleans, and in Banks' expedition to Texas and Red River. Politics, Republican. Judge Percival Bonney of Portland, Me., son of William Lowell and Adeline L. Bonney, was born in Minot, Me., Sept. 24, 1842. Adams of Rumford, who died Aug. 20, 1866. Children of this marriage: Clara W., Bion A., Mary J., Alvan I., William H., and George F. Aug. 17, 1868, married Florence J. Reed, Mexico, Me. Children: Martha Florence and William W., Jr. Admitted to bar, April 15, 1846, S. J. Court, Portland, Me., and has practiced in Rumford, Dixfield, Lewiston, and Auburn. County Attorney Oxford County, 1861-7; member Maine Senate, 1869-70; President Senate, 1870; member Governor's Council, 1883-4. Has been Alderman, City Solicitor, and Mayor of Auburn; State Bank Examiner from Jan. 15, 1873 to 1879; Trustee State Reform School, eight years. Republican. Address, Auburn, Me.



EDGAR M. BRIGGS

Eldest son of Orlando M. and Mary Caswell Briggs, was born in Parkman, Piscataquis Co., Me., in 1850. After graduation he was connected with the Lewiston Gazette, with the late Col. Waldron, but in 1880 began to study law with Hutchinson & Savage, of which firm Judge Savage of the Maine Supreme Court was a member. Taught school at Menomonie, Wis., one year, where he was admitted to the bar in 1883. He returned to Maine, 1884; was admitted to the bar in this State, and has since practiced in Lewiston, where he has since lived. Was associated in business at Lewiston with Hon. John P. Swasey, under firm name of Swasey & Briggs, from 1888 to 1898. Never sought or held any political office, excepting City Solicitor of Lewiston, one year. 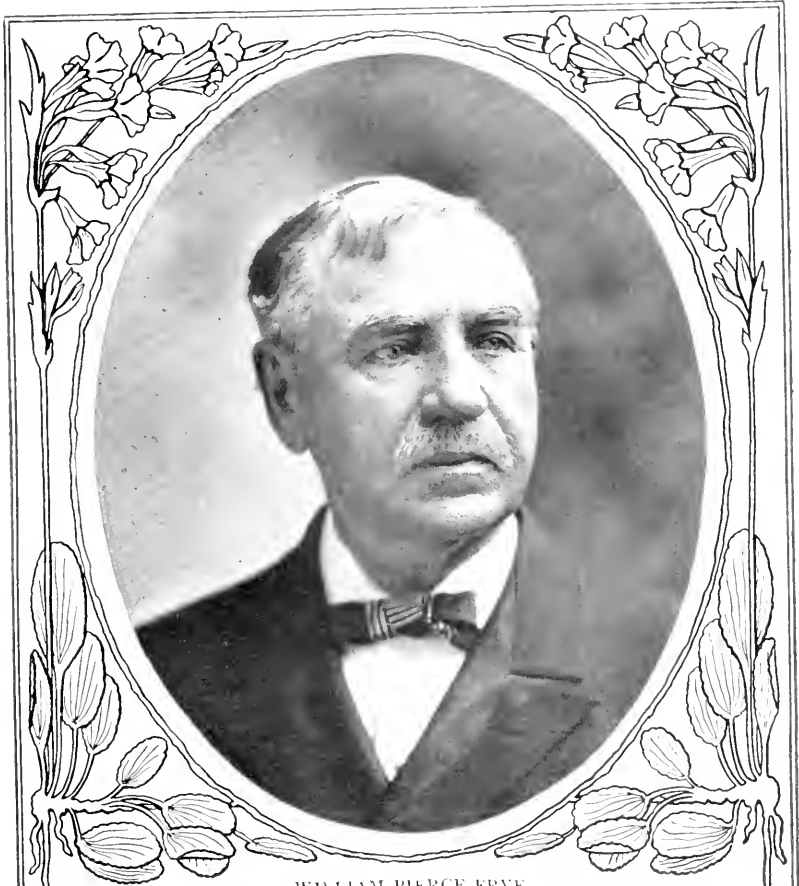
RALPH W. CROCKETT.

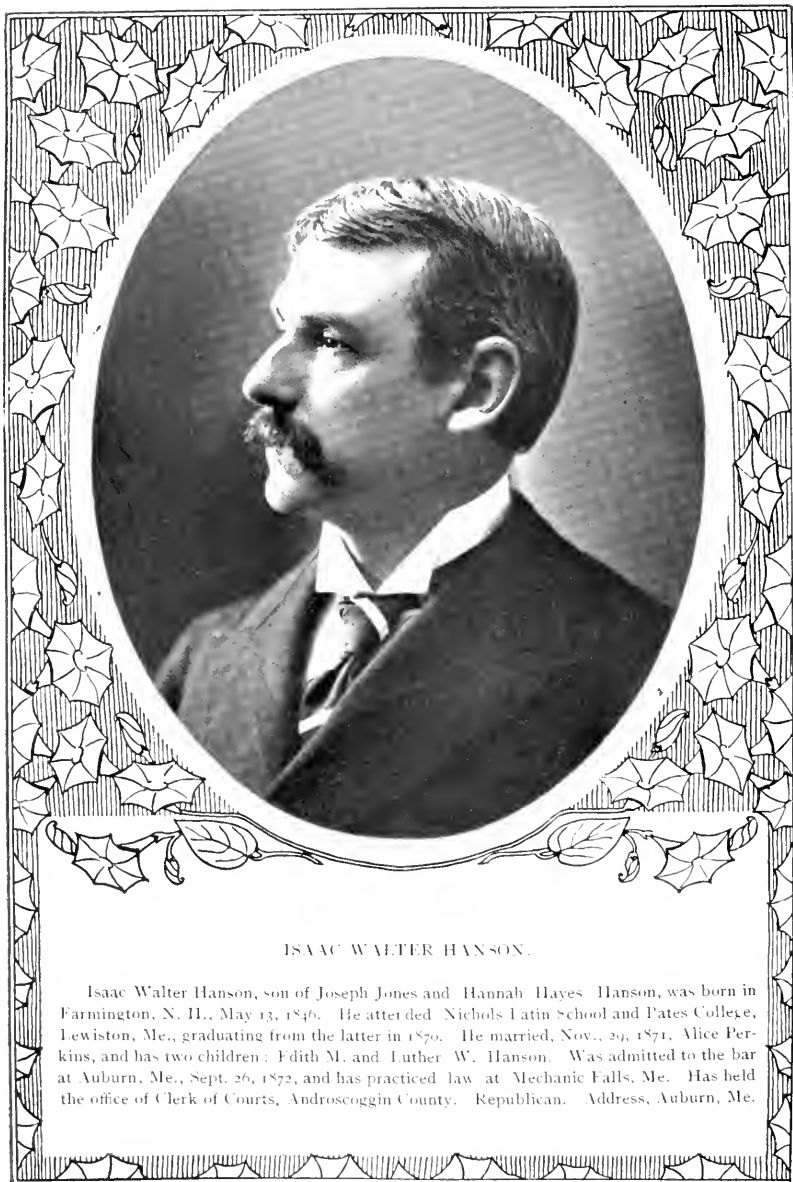
FRANKLIN M. DREW.

Republican.



WILLIAM PIERCE FRYE.

Born, Lewiston, Me., Sept. 2, 1831; graduated, Bowdoin College, 1850; studied and practiced law; member State Legislature, 1861-2, and 1867; Mayor of Lewiston, 1866-7; Attorney-General of Maine, 1867-8-9; elected member National Republican Executive Committee, 1872-76-80; elected Trustee of Bowdoin College, June, 1880; received LL.D. degree, Bates College, 1881, Bowdoin College, 1889; Presidential Elector, 1894; Delegate to National Republican conventions, 1872-76-80; Chairman State committee, 1881; Representative in 42nd, 43rd, 44th, 45th, 46th, and 47th Congresses; elected to United States Senate, taking his seat, March 18, 1881; re-elected, 1883-88-95-1901; President *pro tempore* of Senate, 1896-1901; member Peace Commission, Paris, September, 1898. His term of service will expire March 3, 1907. Is also Regent of Smithsonian Institution and Trustee of Carnegie Institute.



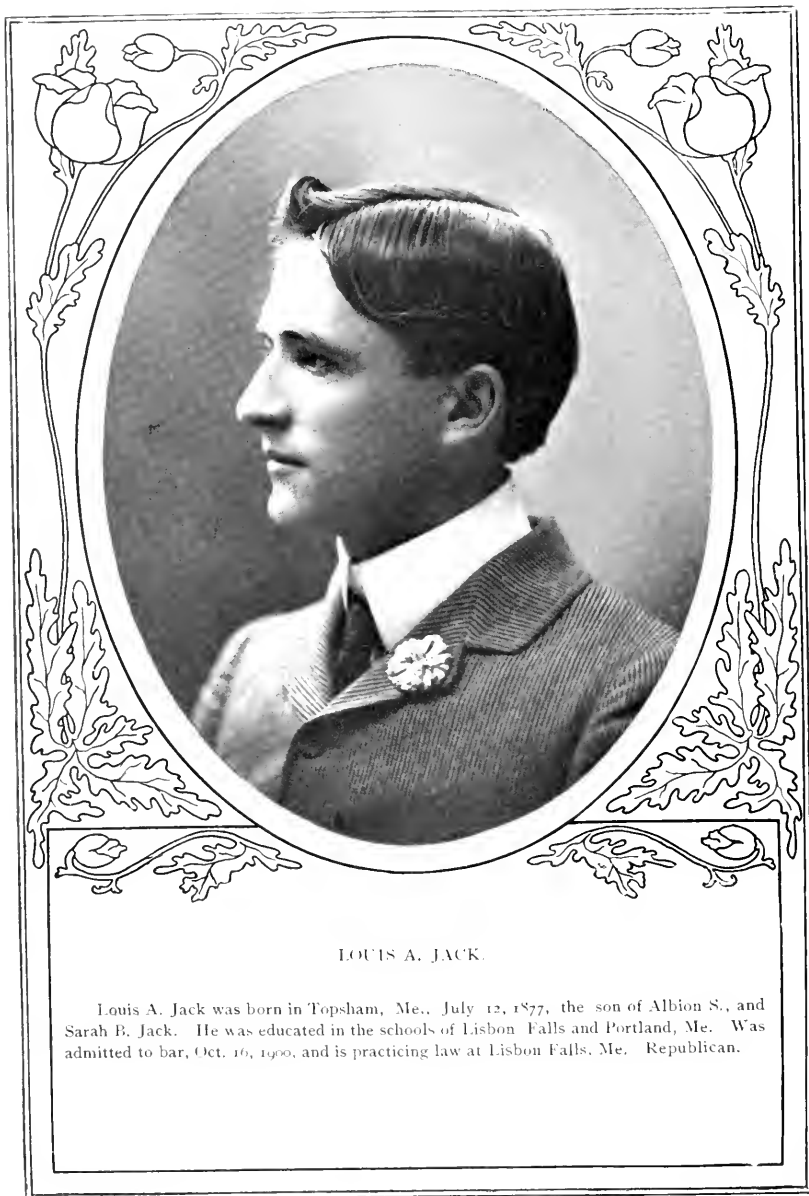
ISAAC WALTER HANSON.

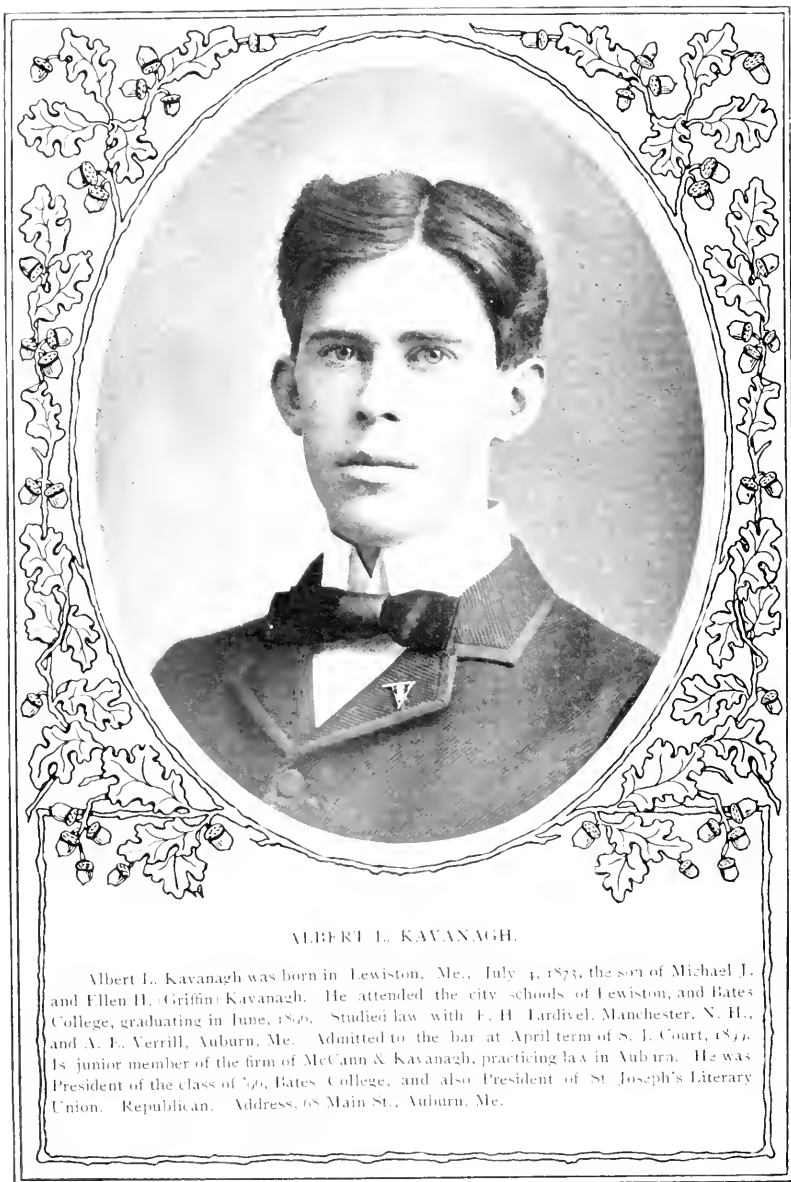
LOUIS A. JACK.

ALBERT L. KAVANAGH.

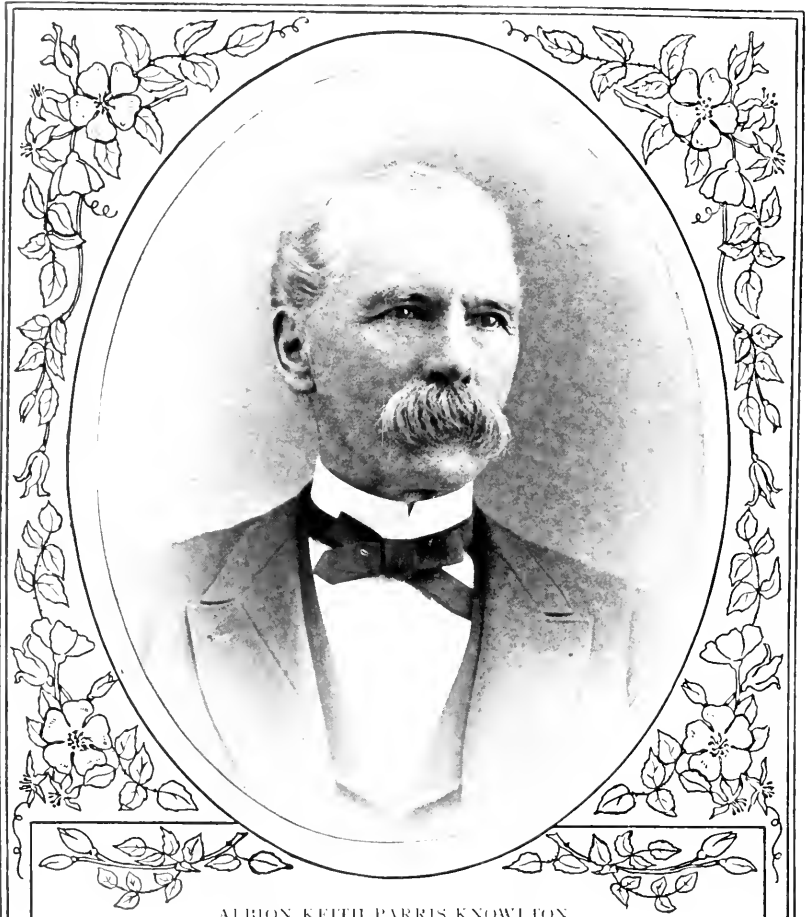

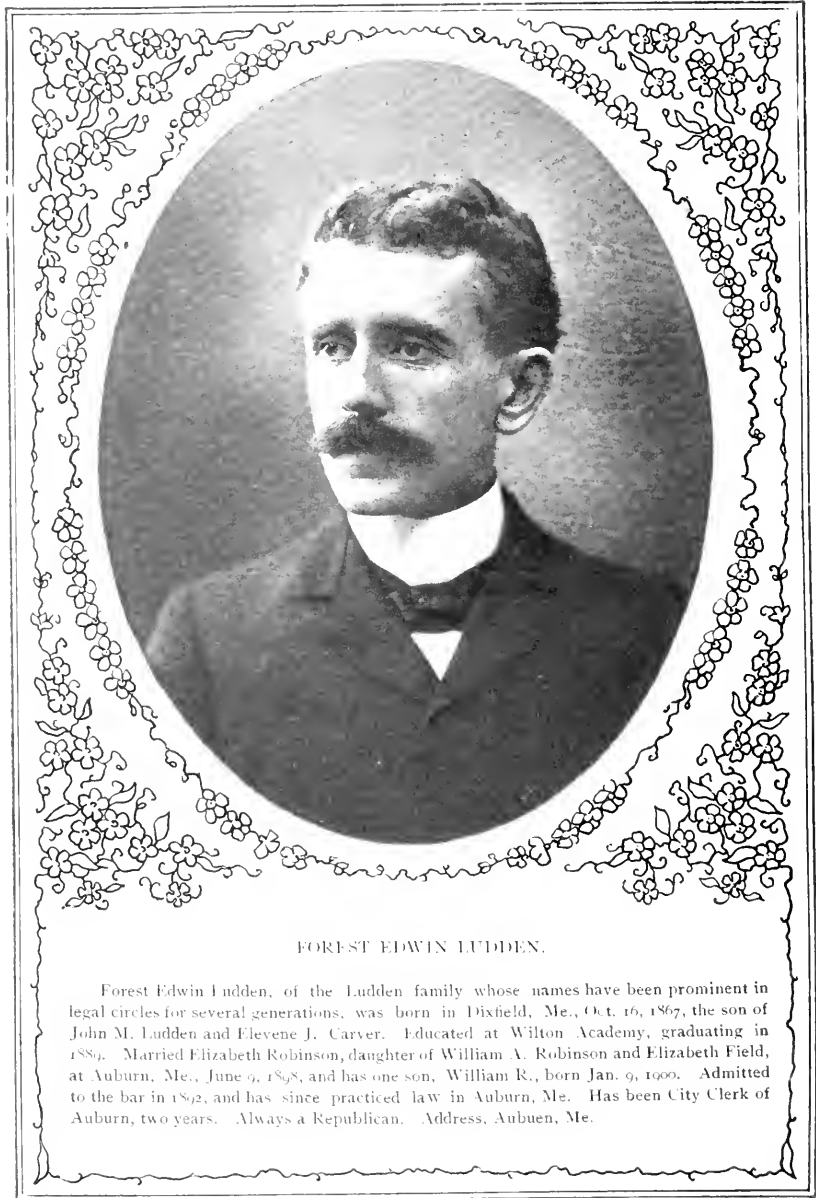
ALBION KEITH PARRIS KNOWLTON.

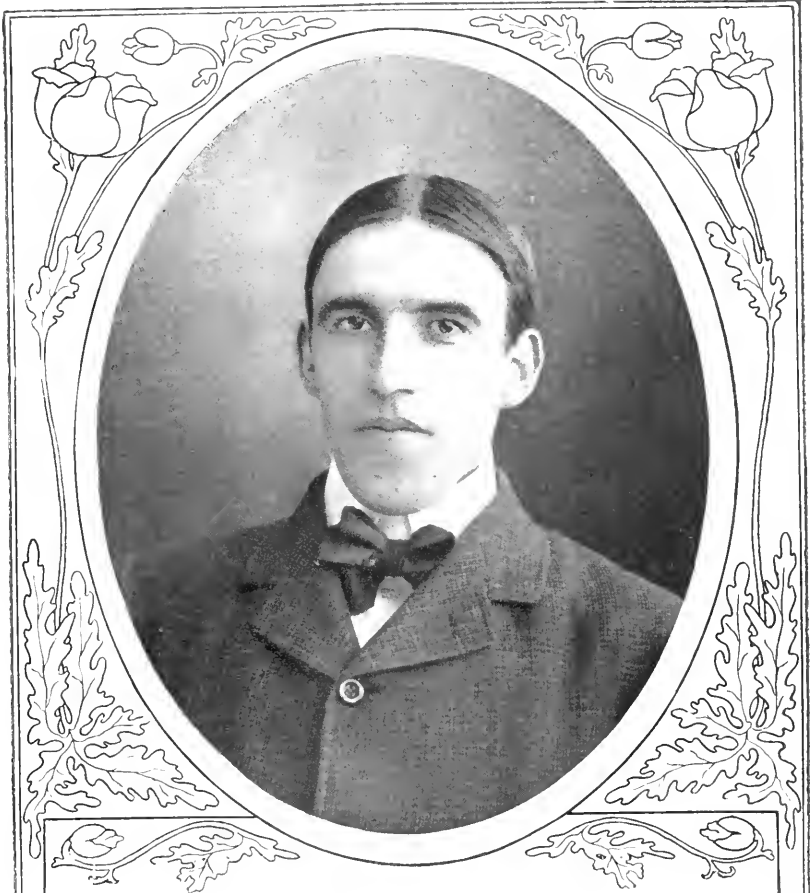
HORACE H. BURBANK.
