


The Story of Jonah

This true story is found in the book of Jonah. About 750 B.C. the Assyrians ruled over the Middle East.



Their army was one of the cruelest in history. Israel had been warned that if they sinned, they would suffer.



And this was such a time. Israel's king, Jeroboam II, did "evil in the sight of the Lord." (Il Kings 14:24)

Jonah, a prophet of God, stood before King Jeroboam.



Jonah also hated the brutal Assyrians.

The Assyrian capital, Nineveh, was called "The Robber City." It was built like a huge fortress.



Because of its wickedness, God marked it for judgment and destruction. Jonah heard a command from God that made his blood turn cold.

Arise, go to Nineveh, that great city, and cry against it: for their wickedness is come up before me.

Jonah wasn't about to warn the Nineviles. He wanted them dead!



He knew if they repented, God would forgive them. He decided to run from God.

Instead of going east to Nineveh like God said, Jonah went west.



He caught a ship headed for Tarshish in southern Spain. Once on board, Jonah thought he had it made. He was sure the Ninevites would be destroyed.





"But the Lord sent out a great wind into the sea... so that the ship was like to be broken." The terrified sailors cried to their gods, and threw the cargo into the sea to lighten the ship.




Why didn't he call on his God? They asked him who he was.

I am an Hebrew; and I fear the Lord.... They asked Jonah what they should do.




The harder they rowed, the more the storm increased. It was useless.

Jonah was rebellious... and God didn't let him get away with it.




"Now the Lord had prepared a great fish to swa, ow up Jonah "

And Jonah was in the belly of the fish three days and three nights (Jonah I 17).




Jonah was being taken back towards Nineveh. the hard way!




In faith. Jonah believed that God would get him out of this and that he would again see God's temple

As they approached dry land, the fish prepared to get rid of Jonah.






Jonah looked terrible, but he obeyed God even though he still hated the Ninevites



Jonah was the only evangelist who prayed that he diget no converts


Jonah warned the people.

Outside the city, Jonah built a booth to watch if God would burn down the city



God used this than to live " incident to teach Jonah a great lesson. "Jonah 4 3


Jonah had pity on the gourd but no mercy for people!


"He came into the world, the world was made by him, and the world knew him not libber (-o) As Jonah warned Nineveh, Jesus warned US of coming judgment




When the Lord Jesus Christ began his ministry his first word was Repent! Jesus spoke more about hell than anyone else in the Bible

For the Father ladge hino man, but hath committed all judgment unto the Son (Jesus) * (John 5.22)






It was an act of love when God sent Jonah to warn Nineveh...
