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PREFACE.

Salem Press in 1892, giving the ancestry of Gen. Ethan Allen, which incited so much inquiry that I was induced to undertake the compilation of the descendants of Samuel Allen, the emigrant, who settled in Windsor, Conn., in 1640. Hithertofore but little genealogical information had been published of the family, with the exception of the brochure by W. S. Allen in 1876, which was confined to the branch of John, the son of the first Samuel, to which work I beg leave to acknowledge my indebtedness, in some

measure, especially in the earlier generations given therein.

My information has been mostly gained through personal research, and through the medium of extensive correspondence with the members of widely separated descendants and other interested parties, who have generously responded to my inquiries, to all of whom my sincere thanks are due. I also especially desire to acknowledge my indebtedness to the following ladies and gentlemen for the valuable material furnished: Frances Olcott Allen of Philadelphia; James Allen Kibbe of Warehouse Point, Conn.; the late Mrs. Mary Jennings of Norfolk, Va., granddaughter of Ethan Allen; the late Judge R. S. Taft, Col. G. G. Benedict and Prof. John E. Goodrich of Burlington, Vt.; Henry W. Allen of East Windsor, Conn.; E. F. Allen of Kansas City; Miss Helen L. The small exponent figures on page 22, which follow thus, Deal Jonathan', Allein, (Deal Samuel), Samuelly, show the number of the paterations from the common ancest r. Samuel Allein.

INTRODUCTION.

Were Samuel and Col. Matthew Alien Brothers?

TOR many years very misleading views have been entertained, claiming kinship between a nmet Alien of Windsor and Col. atthew Aliya of Hartford and Windsor, Conn.* Also a confusing the names of Thomas Alivn of Barn-table Mass., and Dea. iomas Allen of Middletown, Conn.

It is only recently that these matters have been sifted and set .ht. First then, the patient investigations of Mr. Francis Olcott len of Philadelphia have conclusively shown that Samuel and Col. atthew Allyn were not brothers, but that Col. Matthew of Windsor, onn., and Thomas Allyn of Barnstoble, Mass., bore that relation ip and were the sons of Richard and Margaret Allen of Braunton, o. Devon, England, no Samuel Aden being found on the registers ere.†

The foregoing relationship of Thomas and Matthew has been rther identified by the will of Richard Allen of Braunton, proved ay 10, 1652, which fully establishes the fact beyond controversy.;

Search for English Aucestry of Samuel Allen.

Inspired by the laudable purpose of penetrating the mystery which has long enshrouded the origin of his English ancestors, Mr. Francis Olcott Ailen of Philadelphia has prosecuted careful research in England at considerable expense.

At one time the realization of his fondest hopes seemed on the point of consummation, so many favorable evidences had been unearthed. But finally they were abandoned because of the lack, of a few links necessary to complete the chain, and because Mr. Alkn is too conscientious to put forth any claims which could not bear the full blaze of critical inspection, and in that decision, no doubt, all thoughtful members of the Allen family will justify him. So for the present at least, the parentage and birthplace of Samuel Allen must remain an unsolved problem.

Allen Coats of Arms.

Allen, first spelled Alan, comes from the root word Al, meaning mountainous, high and bright. As a personal name it was first borne by the Bard of Britain, an uncle of Carottacus, who had a long line of kings for ancestors. The name name into prominence after the Conquest, from the fact that the chief general of Williams army at the battle of Hastings was Alan, Dule of Britainy, who made England his future home and but one the taird riches, man in the kingdom. From that time on the name grew in number and importance.

The Allen family has been especially honored in England and Scotland by the bestowment of armorial bearings; no not toan sixty-two families have been thus honored.

There is little doubt that our Samuel Alten was descended from a knighted family, yet intil his ancestry has been fully tracell beyon? a doubt, it would not be good form for his posterity to assume the right to appropriate a crest, as some other families have done wit alight evidence to forthly the claim.

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very ancient in appearance and construction, which is probably the same house bought by Samuel Allen, and in which Joseph Allen, the father of Gen. Ethen Allen, was born. Hon. George Sheldon writes me that while there is no direct evidence of this, yet it is highly probable, for he was certainly born on this place, if not in the old house now standing. Samuel Allen sold this place in 1711 to Samuel Barnard and bought the Hawks place in Wapping, which in turn he sold in 1713 and soon removed to Coventry, Conn.,* where he d. Oct. 14, 1718. In 1720 his widow, with her children, removed to Litchfield, Conn., where she d. Feb. 5, 1728, ac. 59. She inherited some property from her father's estate, for we find years afterward that her children sold their several interests to their uncles, Judah and Ebenezer Wright of Northampton. She purchased quite a large tract of land in Litchfield, for on her death her son Daniel, as executor, conveyed March 1, 1729, one-third of the same to his prother Joseph, who in 1732 sold one hundred acres to his sister. Lydia, and the same amount to Paul Peak Jr. The will of Mercy Allen was made in Litchfield Jan. 28, 1727-8, and probated Apr. 24, 728, in Woodbury. She gives her son Daniel quite liberally, and hakes him sole executor. Her remaining estate she divides among er children and mentions dau. Mercy, wife of Eliakim Root of oventry; dau. Mary Smalley of Lebanon; dau. Lydia Allen at ome; sons Joseph and Ebenezer of Litchfield; no mention is hade of Lucy, who was doubtless deceased but alive when the emoval was made to Litchfield. The eldest son, Nehemiah of ruilford, was appointed guardian to brother Joseph, and Daniel to rother Ebenezer. The final settlement has not been found on ecord.





moved. They were the parents of fourteen children, ten of whom lived to marry and have families. Six sons were patriots and had no table service in the Revolutionary War, and left records worthy of farne. Joseph Allen was a staunch friend of Jonathan Edwards, and was one of the nineteen who stood by him during all his difficulties with his church.

Betty Allen was truly a mother in Israel, a woman of service and general usefulness, for the church records show that she assisted at the births of three thousand infants. She was also a woman of faith and believed in the efficacy of prayer. Her husband's uncle, Thomas Allen, had devised in his will money to defray the expenses of a college education for their son Thomas, which bequest was to be contested at Boston, where her husband had gone to plead the case for his son. Betty and her daughter spent the day in prayer when the case came on, and it was decided in their favor, and the son Thomas was given the liberal education which meant so much to his after life and that of his noble family.

With the knowledge of the long and noble life of Betty Allen and of the six patriot sons she gave to the service of her country, it is a worthy tribute to her memory that the Northampton Chapter of the Daughters of the American Revolution has adopted her name.*

Joseph Allen took his young bride to his home on King street, first owned by his grandfather, Samuel Allen, where he lived till his death, and where his wife continued to live sixty-six years in all; so it came to be known as the "Betty Allen house;" it stood quite near the home of Jonathan Edwards. Their son Elisha continued to live in this house till his death in 1796. His widow, Merab Allen, lived there till 1805, when she married Oliver Root of Conway. Jonathan, son of Elisha, the last of the line associated with the house, sold soon after 1800 and removed to Pittsfield after being in the Allen family 150 years. It was enlarged several times during this period, but is remembered as a pleasant home shaded by hemlock trees.

Dr. Benjamin Barrett lived there after his marriage. Mrs. Rhoda Dwight lived there later, and her daughter Margarette opened there her boarding school, afterward famous as Gothic Seminary; later

Col. A. E. Watson owned the house. The next owner was John W. Wilson, who sold it in 1858 to Oscar Edwards, now president of the Northampton National Jank, who lived there five years. The house was torn down about 19.5.*







Three years later, in 1771, he moved to and commenced the first settlement in Poultney, Vt.: one of his children, a son, was the first white child born in Poultney. He removed thence to Tinmouth, Vt. In 1775 he was a lieutenant in Col. Warner's regiment of Green Mountain Boys, and was also captain of a company of Minute Men, and was with Ethan Allen at the taking of Ticonderoga. May 10, 1775. He was a member of the onvention held at Dorset, Vt., Sept. 25, 1776, which declared the New Hampshire Grants to be a free and separate district. He was a delegate to the convention held at Windsor July 25, 1777, which formed the first constitution of Vermont. He was a captain in Herrick's battalion of Rangers, and took a conspicuous part in the Battle of Bennington. In the operations against Ticonderoga in Sept., 1777, Capt. Allen, with forty men, surprised and captured the fortified post on Mount Defence, occupied by a superior force of British regulars. During the retreat of the British from Ticonderoga Capt. Allen, with 50 Green Mountain Rangers, captured 49 men of the rear guard of the enemy and over 100 horses. At that same time he captured a negro woman named Dinah Mattis, who was in a British camp with her infant child. Allen gave to her a certificate of emancipation, which he caused to be recorded in the town clerk's office at Bennington. In this he recites that under a resolve of the Continental Congress all prizes belong to the captors, but "being conscientious that it is not right in the sight of God to keep "aves," he gives to Dinah and her child their freedom. Allen was subsequently promoted to be a major of the Rangers and colonel of 4 militia regiment. He was in command of the post at Vergenas, Vt., in 1778, and rendered other important service during the war of the Revolution. Soon after the grant of the two islands in Lake Champlain, called the "Two Heroes," was made by the Vermont degislature to him and others in 1779, Col. Allen removed with his family to South Hero, Vt., in which township he was the first settler



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and where he was town clerk from 1784 to 1794. In time he established a ferry to the mainland, opened a public house on the island, engaged in the lumber business and prospered. About 1800 he removed to Burlington and opened a public house there. He died Mar. 26, 1806, at the age of 63, and was buried with Masonic honors in Burlington. His wife returned to South Hero and died there at the age of 88."

I am indebted to Col. G. G. Benedict of the Burlington Free Press, who kindly copied the foregoing from Dr. Melvin Barnes' Biography of Col. Ebenezer Allen.

The foregoing account impresses us that Col. Ebenezer Allen was a self-made man, and a man of remarkable energy and ability, filling well every position to which he was called and thus deserves full recognition by posterity. It is to be regretted that so httle has come down to us of this generation regarding his descendants. He had a son born in Poultney, Vt., name not given, who is said to have lived to an advanced age in the state of New York. He had a son, Ebenezer by name, and is said to have had a son Timothy, whose daughter, Fanny Allen, married William Campbell, whose daughter Sophie married Almon Bates, whose daughter Carrie married J. C. Wilson of Cherokee, Iowa, and living there in 1907.

The following abstracts from the town records of South Hero, Vt., sent me in Nov., 1906, by the town clerk, are of interest in this connection: Referring to Col. Ebenezer Allen, the clerk writes, "His wife, Lydia Allen, died in 1834. Her dower was a part of "Lot No. 1," which was Col. E. Allen's "land grant." In Feb., 1835, the heirs of the Col. deeded their right in the dower for \$100 to Ebenezer, son of the Col. Their names were Zeno Campbell, Sophronia Campbell his wife, Fanny Campbell, James M. Allen, Guy Meigs, Drucella Meigs his wife, Juilet Allen, Chloe Allen, Ammey Allen Fletcher, Vashte Allen, Melvin B. Allen, John C. Ingalls, Laura Ingalls his wife, David Page and Mary Page his wife. I find no records of births of the children."

36. REV. THOMAS⁵ ALLEN (Joseph⁴ Dea. Samuel³, Samuel², Samuel¹), b. in Northampton Jan. 17, 1743; m. 1768, Elizabeth. dau. of Rev. Jonathan Lee of Salisbury, Conn., a descendant of Gov. Bradford of Plymouth Colony. He d. at Pittsfield, Mass., Feb. 11, 1810; she d. Mar. 31, 1830.

He was left a legacy by his great uncle, Thomas Allen, which enabled him to pursue his studies at Harvard, where he graduated in 1762 with an enviable reputation for scholarship. He later studied theology under Rev. Dr. Hooker. He was ordained the first minister at Pittsfield, Mass., Apr. 18, 1764. Like nearly all who laste the Allen name, he was an ardent patriot in the Revolution. He was the chaplain of the regiment which served at Ticonderoga in 1776, and with the one which served in Westchester Co. in 1777. He also hurried to the onset at Bennington, and there, after offering a fervent prayer which inspired all with courage, was the first one to fire a gun, teiling his brother Joseph to load and he would fire. He richly earned the title of the "Fighting Parson."

"Parson Allen was once asked by his son if he supposed he ever killed a man. "My son, I don't know, but I guess I did. I remember that near the close of the day at Bennington I observed



a flash behind a bush at our left which seemed to take effect upon our men. I raised my musket and fired at the bush, and I put out the flash."* After the war he was very prominent in political matters. He left a name long to be remembered in Pittsfield for his noble qualities of heart and mind. He was notably honored in his children, who made an enviable mark in life.

Sprague's Annals of the Am. Pulpit says: "He was of middle height, slender and energetic, and elastic in his movements."

He retired in 1820, one year before his death. He settled for a time in Brighton, N. Y., and came thence to Pittsfield, Mass.

Dea. Maynard retired in 1810, and the firm became Allen & Knight. Mr. Knight left the business in 1811, after which Mr. Allen carried on the business alone and accumulated a competent fortune. Capt. Jonathan Allen was elected to the Mass. Legislature of 1832, and was prominent in effecting a change in the state law, giving all Christian denominations equal protection of the law. He was a captain of militia in Pittsfield, and a leading citizen there. Besides being a good business man he possessed some literary taste, and was a good writer. Many of the best articles contributed to the Sun in its first half century were from his pen. He held many town offices and was active in town affairs, as well as in national politics."†

44. GEN. ETHANS ALLEN (Joseph⁴, Samuel³, Nehemiah², Samuel¹), b. in Litchfield, Conn., Jan. 10, 1737-8; m. June 23, 1762, Mary. dau. of Cornelius Bronson Jr., b. 1732 of Voodbury, Conn.* She was a pious and most excellent woman. S' e d. at Sunderland, Vt., in the early part of 1783. He m. (2) Feb. 3, 1784, Frances, widow of Capt. John Buchanan of the British navy. She was b. Apr. 4, 1760, probably in New York City. She was the daughter of Captain Montresor, who was an officer in the British army and is said to have lost his life in one of the battles of the period when his daughter was an infant.

The maiden name of Mrs. Allen has long been a puzzle to antiquarians. Hall in his history of Eastern Vermont gives it as Montuzon; while on her gravestone in the cemetery at Burlington it is Montezuma. The careful researches of Col. Benedict of Burlington indicate quite conclusively that the name is Montresor. He found that the record in the Annals of the Hotel Dieu, Montreal, is that Fanny Allen was the daughter of Ethan Allen and "Francoise Montresor." Further it has been found in the archives at Albany that a John Montresor was commissioned an officer in the British army in 1755 and served in America. Also that a John Montresor was wounded in Braddock's defeat and received a grant of land in Willsboro, N. Y., across the lake from Burlington. May he not have been the father of Mrs. Allen? Capt. Montresor was a Frenchman. and his wife was a German lady of accomplishments. Soon after his death, his widow Margaret married Col. Crean Brush, a lawyer and a native of Dublin, who came to New York in 1762 and was appointed assistant secretary of the colony. He removed with his family to Westminster, Vt., in 1771, where he practiced law for several years. But he became involved in many difficulties and lett the state under a cloud, tragically ending his life in 1778. His large

A note in the papers. ... one of the big television networks and a firm of producers plan to make a series of filmed haif-hour shows about Ethan Allen, leader of the Green Mountain Boys and hero of the capture of Fort Ticonderoga.

As Fibber McGee used to say on the radio, "Just a darned minute!" Ethan Allen was a loud-mouthed, profane, footstomping iconoclast. He was not above stretching the truth to make a good story, especially about himself. He had a finger in several pies of doubtful savor.

That he was also a leader with few if any peers in northern New England is what makes him attractive to the television people. They'll have him trumpeting his "In the name of the great Jehovah and the Continental Congress" (an afterthought he put into one of his books; what he actually said couldn't be broadcast on television) as he dashes into Fort Ti over the littered corpses of the British (it was one of the most bloodless captures in history).

A whole generation of children will think he played the banjo or harmonica while some other leather-lunged patriot sang a ballad about "Ethan, Ethan Allen, King of the North Countree." Look what happened to Davy Crockett.

Colonel Allen was one of the most notable toss-pots of his time. How can television let the little folks see the old Catamount Tayern with the hero hoisting one tankard after another of hot rum and hard cider laced with maple syrup?

They'll have him patting little children in the head and crooning something about. Liberty, I Love Thee the Most." Applying the birch seal to the Yorker tax collector will be re-written; good of Ethan will kick the villian in the seat of his breeches and start him back toward Albany with a gruff jest. (Whipping is taboo on felevision, but hearty kick is always good for a juvenile laugh.)

The television people had better think twice before they start grinding their cameras up Bennington way, as the papers say they plan to do. Here in New England there's a reverence for Ethan, rough character that he was. They'd better keep in mind something Ethan once told a Yorker judge who was trying to impose the New York patroon system on the free Vermonters:

"The gods of the valleys are not gods

estates were divided for the benefit of his daughter, stepdaughter and widow. In the troubled times of 1776 Mrs. Brush, being desirous of placing her daughter under protection, overpersuaded her to marry at the age of sixteen, Capt. John Buchanan. She never loved her husband, although he loved and tenderly cared for her. It is said he lost his life in a naval engagement of the time, leaving his young wife with a son John, the only fruit of the union. This son John married and had a son John and a daughter Fanny, who resided on Long Island; further than this the writer has been unable to trace them.

After the death of her husband Mrs. Buchanan returned to Westminster, where her mother had married Patrick Wall, a man of respectability and accomplishments. The advent of the young widow in the quiet town of Westminster was a notable event. She was possessed of remarkable beauty, was accomplished, vivacious and ever at her ease in the best society. She soon attracted the attention of the brusque hero of the hills, which ended in their union after a brief courtship. The following from Hall's Eastern Vermont is so characteristic, I may be pardoned for quoting it in full:

"On the 9th of February, 1784, the judges of the supreme court were at breakfast with Lawyer Stephen R. Bradley of Westminster, when General Allen in a sleigh with a span of dashing black horses and a colored driver, drove up to the house. Passing through the treakfast room he found in the next room the spirited young widow of twenty-four summers, Mrs. Frances Buchanan, who was living in the house with her mother, Mrs. Well. Dressed in her morning gown, Mrs. Buchanan was standing in a chair arranging china and glass on some upper shelves. She amused her visitor with some witticism about the broken decanter in her hands; a brief chat ensued, then Allen said, "Fanny, if we are ever to be married, now is the time, for I am on my way to Arlington." "Very well," she reglied, "give me time to put on my josiè." The couple passed into a third room, where the judges were standing, and Allen said, "Judge Robinson, this young woman and myself have concluded to marry each other, and to have you perform the ceremony."

"When?"

"Now! For myself I have no great opinion of such formality, and from what I can discover she thinks as little of it as I do. But



as a decent respect for the opinion of mankind seems to require it, you will proceed."

"General, this is an important matter, and have you given it serious consideration?"

"Certainly! but"—here the General glanced proudly at his handsome and accomplished bride, twenty-three years younger than himself, perhaps also conscious of his own mature, stalwart symmetry—"I do not think it requires much consideration in this particular case."

"Do you promise to live with Frances agreeably to the laws of God?"

"Stop! stop!" cried Allen looking out of the window. "Yes, according to the law of God as written in the great book of Nature! Go on, go on! my team is at the door."

"Soon the bride's guitar and trunk were in the sleigh and the bells jingled merrily as they disappeared westward."

Ethan Allen commenced his married life at Salisbury, Conn., where he had an interest in an iron mine, then removed to Sheffield, a border town in Massachusetts. It was probably in 1769 when he first went to Vermont to spy out the land of his future exploits. He seems to have made Bennington his headquarters for some years, where his house at the old center remained till a few years ago. His family remained for a time in Sheffield. The story of his gallant leadership of the Green Mountain Boys in their conflict with the authorities of New York, his romantic capture of Fort Ticonderoga and his life as a military prisoner of the British, is too well known to be recounted here.

He was exchanged May 6, 1778, for Col. Campbell, and Congress, mindful of his services, sent him a commission as Colonel in the Continental army, and the Legislature appointed him Major General and Commander of the Vermont Militia. On his return from captivity he rejoined his family at Sunderland, Vt., where they had removed in 1777 from Sheffield, and soon after removed to Arlington, which town he represented in the Vermont Legislature in 1779. He was also sent as a special delegate to the Continental Congress. He removed to Burlington in July, 1787, and bought a farm once belonging to his brother Ira, on the Burlington side of the Winooski river, about one and one-half miles from the city of Burlington. This has since been known as the Van Ness estate, where he lived

at the time of his death, which occurred suddenly Feb. 12, 1789. His funeral was held at the house of his brother Ira in Colchester, and he was interred with the honors of war in the cemetery at Burlington, where a grateful state has erected a suitable monument to his memory. This monument consists of a shaft crowned by a statue of the hero in the act of demanding the surrender of Fort Ticonderoga. It was designed by Stephenson and dedicated in 1873.

The inscriptions are as follows:

NORTH SIDE.

VERMONT TO ETHAN ALLEN, BORN IN LITCHFIELD, CONN., JAN. 10TH, A. D. 1737, DIED IN BURLINGTON, VT., FEB. 12, 1789, AND BURIED NEAR THE SITE OF THIS MONUMENT.

EAST SIDE.

WIELDING THE PEN AS WELL AS THE SWORD, HE WAS THE SAGACIOUS AND INTREPID DEFENDER OF THE NEW HAMPSHIRE GRANTS AND MASTER SPIRIT IN THE ARDUOUS STRUGGLE WHICH RESULTED IN THE SOVEREIGNTY AND INDEPENDENCE OF THE STATE.

WEST SIDE.

THE LEADER OF THE GREEN MOUNTAIN BOYS IN THE SURPRISE AND CAPTURE OF TICONDEROGA, WHICH HE DEMANDED IN THE NAME OF THE GREAT JEHOVAH AND THE CONTINENTAL CONGRESS.

SOUTH SIDE.

TAKEN PRISONER IN A DARING ATTACK ON MONTREAL, AND TRANSPORTED TO ENGLAND, HE DISARMED THE PURPOSE OF THE ENEMY BY THE RESPECT WHICH HE INSPIRED FOR THE REBELLION AND THE REBEL.

In September, 1895, the Daughters of the American Revolution honored his memory by placing a memorial bronze tablet on Prospect Rock, located on his old tarm in Burlington.

W. J. Patten, the present owner of the Ethan Allen farm near Burlington, having devoted a portion of the farm for a park, the Vermont Society Sons of the American Revolution erected a massive battlemated observatory tower of Vermont granite on a high elevation in the park, known as Indian Rock, which was dedicated August 17, 1906, with impressive ceremonies. The United States was represented by Vice President Fairbanks, the President by the Secretary of the Interior, Ethan Allen Hitchcock, a great-grandson of the Vermont hero, Vermont by Governor Bell and others, the



Sons by Dr. Holton, and the literati by Mrs. Julia C. R. Dorr, who contributed a noble poem, "The Voice of the Tower," the concluding stanza of which is given here:

"I shall stand on my rock as the years come and go, And whether the ages pass swiftly or slow
They shall hear the proud story of chivalrous youth,
Of honor unsullied, of courage and truth,
Of patriot ardor, of valor sublime,
That soars like a bird o'er the wreckage of time;—
Of all souls that undaunted face danger and death,
Counting all that life holds as the gossamer's breath;
Save the love of the highest—the love that looks up
In the face of the Highest—and draineth the cup."

The state of Vermont has placed his statue in the Capitol at Montpelier and sent another to forever commemorate his fame at the National Capitol, and the hero deserves all this and more at the hands of a state for which he accomplished so much.

Ethan Allen was a unique character in our history; he was a terror to his foes, an uncompromising patriot whose love of justice and his country outweighed all other considerations; but combined with his sternness he possessed a heart as tender as a woman's for those deserving sympathy, which noble characteristic was often exemplified in his varied career. In the mellowing process of the years his foibles have been forgotten, his virtues remembered, so his fame will be as lasting as the hills of his adopted state.

The widow of Ethan Allen married Oct. 23, 1793, Dr. Jabez Penniman; for further account of his life see Penniman Family Record in the appendix H.

Ethan Allen's Sword.

The following concerning Ethan Allen's sword will be of interest in this connection. It is copied from the Detroit Tribune:

"The sword which Ethan Allen carried when he demanded the surrender of Fort Ticonderoga in the name of the great Jehovah and the Continental Congress, is by gift and inheritance the personal property of H. Allen Hopkins, a resident of Jackson, Mich. The sword is an old-fashioned blade, nicked and venerable, twenty inches long and slightly curved. The handle measures seven inches, making the total length of the weapon thirty-four inches. The handle



s of bone and horn, the mounting is of silver washed with gold, the latter being partially worn off. A dog's head of silver forms the end of a handle, and from this to the guard runs a silver chain. On one of the silver bands of the scabbard the name "Ethan Allen" is couraved in large letters; on another band "E. Brasher," maker, New York;" and on still another in script, "Martin Vosburg, 1775." Why this name appears no one knows. Upon the death of Ethan A.ich the sword became the property of his son, Capt. Hannibal M. Allen. This Hopkins family also has the original commissions issued to Captain Allen, one as "first lieutenant in the regiment of attillerists." dated Mar. 14, 1806, signed by Thomas Jefferson, countersigned by H. Dearborn, secretary of war, and the other as captain of artillerists, signed by James Madison, countersigned by W. Eustis, and dated May 26, 1812. Captain Hannibal M. Allen, it reems, died at Fort Nelson, Va., in 1813, and the sword was retained by his widow, Agnes B. Allen. After the death of her husband Mrs. Vien made her home with Hannibal Allen Hopkins, her favorite ne; hew and heir, until her death in 1863. The sword of Ethan Sen then became the property of Hannibal Ailen Hopkins. He ded in 1871 and left it to his widow; on her death it became the perty of her son, H. Allen Hopkins, and is now in his possession, "sether with commissions above referred to."

At may be said in addition to the above that this sword is valued to Mr. Hopkins at \$5000, for which sum it was offered to the accomment some years ago, but whether the offer was accepted or that the writer is unable to say.

45. CAPT. HEMAN⁵ ALLEN (Joseph⁴, Samuel³, Nehemiah², Samuel¹), b. Oct. 15, 1740 in Cornwall, Conn.; m. Feb. 18, 1778, Abigail Beebe of Salisbury, Conn., b. Feb. 14, 1753. He d. May 14, 1778. Captain Allen was a merchant in Salisbury, yet he owned much land in Vermont and "represented Rutland and Colchester in the Vermont Convention, and was sent to Congress by Dorset." He was a man of affairs and took an active and intelligent interest in passing events. Like his brother Ethan he was a patriot, and was captain of a company in a regiment of Green Mountain Boys engaged in an expedition to Canada. He was also present at the battle of Bennington as a member of the Committee of Safety, and his death was the result of a cold contracted at this time.

Betsey Holmes and went to the wilds of Western New York and settled; while Lydia m. John Bush, from whom Mrs. Cole is descended. The records of the Arms and Bush families have been lost in the burning of a house, but so many traditions have been handed down of such definite character which accord so exactly with known facts, that the writer has accepted Mrs. Cole's version.



After the death of her husband Lydia Allen Arms lived with her daughter, Mrs. John Bush, in Greenfield and often visited her Allen relatives in Sheffield, Mass., going there on horseback, and is said to have spent her last days in Sheffield.

John Bush and wife Lydia removed from Greenfield to Bristol, Vt., and lived with son Seth. John Bush died there Apr. 10, 1816, ae. 62; Lydia, his wife, died there Apr. 10, 1826, as per her gravestone in Bristol. Their children, in the order of birth, were: John, Seth, Lydia, Samuel, Betsey, Russell, Mary, Amanda and Jesse. They married as follows: John m. Prudence Pickett; Seth m. Mary Hawkins; Lydia in. Isaac Drake; Samuel m. Abigail Varney; Betsey m. Hervey J. Barton; Russell, m. Mary Stillwell; Mary m. Nathan Hastings; Amanda m. Hervey J. Barton several years after the death of her sister Betsey; Jesse m. Matilda Barnes.

The above Russell Bush removed to Michigan and was survived by a son, Harmon K. Bush, who resided in Hesperia, Mich., where he died in 1906. His daughter, Mrs. William H. Maks, is now (1907) a resident of Sabanaso, Cuba, Prov. Oriente. There are many descendants of John and Lydia Bush still living in Vermont and the West.

Mrs. Ella Barton Cole traces her descent from Lydia Allen, the sister of Gen. Ethan Allen, as follows: Lydia Allen m. Daniel Arms; their daughter, Lydia Allen Arms, m. John Bush; their son, Seth Allen Bush, m. Mary Hawkins; their daughter, Almeda Bush, m. Kassell A. Barton, who were cousins. The above Russell A. Barton was the son of Hervey J. Barton, who m. Amanda Bush, and a g. g. grandson of Andrew Barton Sr., a graduate of Harvard College, who with his family were captured in the Revolution and held as prisoners at Whitehall till exchanged, whose brother, Gen. William Barton, was an officer under Washington, and to whom was granted the town of Barton, Vt.

The children of Russell and Almeda Barton were Andrew William, James Harvey, Ella B., Russell Frank, and Mary Amanda.

Russell Frank, the only surviving son, lives in Proctor, Vt. Ella B. was born in New Haven, Vt., Oct. 24, 1849; m. June, 1870, Lahin Curtis Carr; he d. 1877; she m. (2) Feb. 6, 1893, James S. Cole. Reside in Brandon, Vt.

Mrs. Cole, who has furnished much of the foregoing data of the descendants of Lydia Allen, may justly take pride not only in her descent from the Allen line, but also in the fact of the patriotic spirit exhibited by her grandfathers Bush and Hawkins, who were both in the battle of Bunker Hill, and the latter in that at Concord also, while both performed valient service later in the war for independence.

47. Major Hebers Allen (Joseph⁴, Samuel³, Nehemiah⁴, Samuel¹), b. in Cornwall, Conn., Oct. 4, 1743; m. Mar. 17, 1768, Sarah Owen of Salisbury, Conn. She d. 1788, and is buried at Winooski Falls, Vt.; he d. at Poultney, Vt., Apr. 10, 1782. He removed from Salisbury, Conn., in 1771 to Poultney, Vt., being one of the earliest settlers there and its first town clerk. He was a man of more than ordinary ability and took an active part in public affairs; was assistant judge of the Rutland shire of the Cumberland County court in 1778–9. He assisted his brother Ethan in the capture of Ticonderoga, and was a Major of militia under Gen. St. Clair at the battle of Hubbardston. His health was impaired by exposure in that last military service, from which he never recovered. His remains rest with his kindred in the cemetery at Burlington. where the following inscription is found on his tombstone:

THIS GRAVE CONTAINS THE REMAINS OF MAJOR HEBER ALLEN, WHO WITH HIS BROTHERS ASSISTED IN THE STRUGGLE FOR THE INDEPENDENCE OF THIS AND UNITED STATES. HE WAS ONE OF THE EARLIEST SETTLERS IN THIS STATE (VT.) AND DIED AS HE LIVED, AND AS EXPRESSED BY HIS BROTHER ETHAN, "THE NOBLEST WORK OF GOD."

- 48. LEVIS ALLEN (Josepht, Samuel3, Nehemiah2, Samuel1), b. Jan. 16, 1745; m. July 29, 1779, Mrs. Anna Allen of New Milford, Conn. Date of her death not known. He married a second time, for in his will, dated Jan. 11, 1796, having no child he devises the bulk of his estate to his wife Nancy. He had a large unsettled estate, but died insolvent. His death occurred in Bennington, Vt., 1801. He was a merchant, in partnership with his brother Heman at Salisbury, Conn., for a few years, which relation was dissolved Feb. 3, 1772. He also had extensive land interests with his brothers in Vermont, owning at one time the township of Swanton, Vt.* He seems to have been the negative member of this family, for while his brothers were intense patriots he espoused the cause of the Tories. He was detected in giving aid to the British on Long Island, for which offense he was imprisoned at New London for six months, and his lands in Vermont were confiscated; after his release he joined the enemy in South Carolina and served there through the war. After the war he went to Canada and England, but returned to Vermont to end his days.

In the spring of 1903 I visited Sheffield and made a careful search of the town records; found the name of Dr. Lewis Beebe on the tax rolls of 1777-78-79 and 1780; found nothing further relating to him or his family, from which circumstance it may be inferred that his stay was brief. I also failed to find his name on the land records at Great Barrington or Pittsfield. Quite likely he returned soon to Conn., where it is supposed his

relatives resided, as there were many of the Beebe name in the adjoining town of Salisbury.

- 50. ZIMRIS ALLEN (Joseph4, Samuel3, Nehemiah2, Samuel1), b. Dec. 10, 1748. He early became interested in land transactions in Vermont, and in partnership with his brother Ira purchased 300,000 acres of land between Ferrisburg and Canada, Ira Allen being the chief manager. At a proprietors' meeting held in Salisbury, Conn., Mar. 24, 1774, "voted whereas Ethan Allen, Remember Baker. Heman Allen, Zimry Allen and Ira Allen, known by the name of the Onion River Company who are proprietors, in the township of Colchester."* etc. In a paper served on Ira Allen Apr. 28, 1795, there is mentioned the rights in lands which fell to Heman Allen from his brother Zimri, deceased.† Now as Heman Allen died in 1778 and the last record we have of Zimri is at Salisbury, Conn., in 1774, we may infer that he died about 1775. And further, as I failed to find any record of him at Sheffield, where it is stated by some that he died, I am of the opinion that he died at Salisbury at the home of his brother Heman. As his property fell to his brother it is probable that he was unmarried

Enos was well educated and a man of ability; served in French and Indian war. and at the seige of Havanna, and with honor in Revolutionary war; was for many years Maj. Gen. of the Vermont regiment. Ira Allen died at Philadelphia Jan. 15, 1814. His wife, Jerusha, d. May 16,



1838. Ira Allen went to Vermont about 1771 as a Lieutenant with the Green Mountain Boys. He soon became interested with his brothers in the unoccupied lands, and in 1774 in company with his cousin, Remember Baker, commenced a settlement in the present town of Colchester, Vt., where a block house was erected, but owing to the troubled times he soon abandoned this enterprise for a period. He was with his brother Ethan at the capture of Ticonderoga. was due to his alertness that Stark gathered his men at Bennington in season to attack Baum before reinforcements could reach him." In 1783 he returned to Colchester to develop his lands there, and in 1701 became the first town clerk in the new town, which became his home for many years. He continued to add to his land titles from year to year till he had acquired nearly 300,000 acres, ranging over several townships. When he was married he bestowed the title of the town of Irisburgh, containing 23,000 acres, upon his wife, which remained as a source of wealth in his family after his death. He became by his ability and force of character one of the leading spirits in the formation period of the state of Vermont. He was for years the continuous secretary of her conventions, and his ready pen was of great service; he led where others faltered, and his diplomatic foresight kept the enemy away from Vermont in a most critical He was the state treasurer from 1775 to 1785, and was the leading factor in the Counsel of Safety for years. He was chosen eight times to represent the town of Colchester in the General Assembly, and was a member of the Constitutional Convention in 1791. He was appointed Surveyor General of the state in 1778, and retained the office till 1787. Up to this point the career of Ira Allen has been a grand success. He has become a very prince of Unded estates; has lived to witness the consummation of his labors, the independence of his adapted state and her reception into the sisterhood of the young and sturdy republic. About 1795 he was appointed Maj. General of the Vermont militia, and noting their creat lack of arms decided he would not review them again till they were suitably supplied. He soon received authority to go abroad to purchase them. From this point in his life the genius of success seems to desert him; after much trouble he purchased 20,000 stand of arms of the French government, but on his way home his ship *as captured by a British crusier and declared a lawful prize. hught the matter in the English court till 1804 and won his case,



but it nearly beggered him. He returned to Vermont to find that much of his landed estate, valued at nearly one million dollars, had been sold for taxes, and owing to the existence of a most unrighteous law of that time he was subjected to arrest and imprisonment for debt; he pleaded in vain for redress and then became an exile from the state for which he had done so much and sought a home in Philadelphia, where he died and was buried in the Free Ouaker burial ground, where his grave remains as yet unmarked. It is due to the patient search of Mr. Francis O. Allen of Philadelphia that the real date of Ira Allen's death has been made known and the precinct of his last resting place ascertained. Vermont has at last become sensible of her neglect, and sooner or later the name of Ira Allen will be honored with a monument suited to perpetuate his fame. He already has one foster child, the Vermont University, which will forever honor him for the £4000 with which he nobly dowered her at the beginning of her career, a feeling of gratitude which was nobly voiced in the "Centennial Oration" delivered before the faculty and alumni of that institution in 1892 by Prof. J. E. Goodrich, and to which the writer is largely indebted for the foregoing facts in Ira Allen's life. Describing his personal appearance, Prof. Goodrich says, "Ira Allen was a man of middle stature, thick set, a ruddy and lively countenance, large black eyes, a fine form, genteel in manners and naturally social."



The above Col. Caleb Booth, on the receipt of the news of the battle at Lexington, marched with the North Parish Train Band of



East Windsor for the relief of Boston. Learning at Shrewsbury that the period of immediate danger was past he returned home with the majority of the company, having been absent four days. He was commissioned a Lieutenant in 1783; Captain of the fourth Co. of Town Militia in 19th Regt. in 1784; Major in same 1793; Lt. Col. 1796. After the close of the war he served seventeen terms in the Connecticut Legislature from E. Windsor; also rendered most valuable service to his own town. He was also a local justice. 

The first number of the Sun



was issued Sept. 16, 1800. The Sun continued to be published alone by Mr. Allen until 1829, when he admitted his son Phinheas as a partner, which partnership continued till the death of the senior member May 8, 1868. The son continued the paper till May, 1872, when he sold out to his kinsman, Theodore L. Allen, who in turn, after creditable management, sold his interest in August of the same year.* The Sun continued to be published until near the close of the year 1906, after a continuance existence of 106 years.

Hon. Phinheas Allen served in the Mass. Legislature with honor, and was a man of influence in his own town, interested in its prosperity, and had a large share in its public affairs.

Phinheas Allen Jr. began to learn the art of printing at the age of six years. Manifesting a love for a sea-going life, he was placed on his father's ship as cabin boy at the age of seven. His father was engaged in the East and West India trade. In time the boy became an able seaman. He was impressed by the British when they claimed the right of search on the high seas. History shows that more than four thousand American sailors were thus impressed, which was one of the causes which led to the war of 1812. When on the British man-of-war Allen was compelled to fight against the French and Americans; he used to say, "I always aimed too high with my gun to hit anyone." After enduring for many months this life of peril he sought some method of escape; he knew it must be on an American ship, when they should be in the same port; finally, on reaching Calcutta, India, he saw a ship flying the American flag and began to make plans. He was permitted shore leave with other sailors; after wandering around he slipped into a narrow street, leaving his companions, but soon discerned an under officer from his ship coming towards him; fearing an order to return to the ship he began picking up some pebbles in the street, walking slowly along, and began throwing them as if for amusement; the officer said a few words and passed on, greatly to his relief. Soon after dusk, still separated from his companions, he sought the aid of a friendly native, knowing enough of the language to make himself understood, and was rowed out to the American vessel. When on board, he quickly made his way to the cook's galley and told his story of hardships. The cook said he would hide him, so pried up a plank in the floor and pointed out a beam on which he could sit in a stooping posture; this was a hiding place for three days, during which time the ship was being searched. The cook was very faithful, passing him food and water when possible. After a long voyage the ship finally reached New York City. It was Christmas Day when he landed, barefooted and ragged; he always said it was the



happiest day of his life. Late in life he used to say how he ran up the street so excited shouting "Freedom, freedom, down with the British." He ever afterward spoke of his experience on the British man-of-war with much bitterness.

In due time he became a captain, promoted for his ability and success in training seamen. During his many voyages to China he brought home valuable articles which are now treasured by his descendants, among them a set of rare china, expressly selected for his bride-to-be. He continued in service as a sea captain till after the War of 1812, when his wife urged him to remain at home. The "call of the sea" was so strong he said he must go far from the shore to be able to resist it. His plans led him to locate in the far West, as Illinois was then considered. After mature investigation he located a settlement and called it Marine, in remembrance of his former life on the ocean wave.*

The following, taken from the New York Daily Advertiser of May, 1818, describes the starting of the company from New York City for Marine, Ill.: "EMIGRATION — A caravan consisting of covered wagons, drawn by two, three or four horses each, two coaches, a number of out-riding horses and about 120 persons, composing the expedition under Captains Blakeman and Allen for the state of Illinois, crossed the Pawles' Hook Ferry on its way to the West. These two gentlemen, having been for a number of years engaged as shipmasters in the Chinese trade and made hand-some fortunes, have now turned their attention to the fertile plains of Illinois and have commenced the forming of a settlement there on their extensive purchase. The present caravan forms the first division. In the autumn the second division marches, and in the spring following the third division, which is to complete the establishment, will advance.

"In the company which passed here yesterday there were farmers, carpenters, blacksmiths, wheelwrights, masons, coopers, etc., with their families, mostly natives of the Northern hive; all their equipments were in fine order and the emigrants in fine spirits."


After living in Marine some 18 years Capt. Allen, in 1836, removed to Naples, thence to Columbus, and later to Quincy, Ill., where he died.

81. FANNY6 ALLEN (Gen. Ethan5, Joseph4, Samuel3, Nehemiah2, Samuel1), b. in Arlington, Vt., Nov. 13, 1784; unm.; d. at Montreal, Canada, Dec. 10, 1819. After the death of her father she went with her mother to Westminister, Vt., where her mother married Dr. Penniman. She continued in the family of her stepfather. When she was 23 years old she obtained the consent of her parents to enter the convent of the Sisters of the Congregation at Montreal for the purpose of studying French. While at this school she became a convert to Catholicism, the news of which, when it reached her parents, caused her withdrawal from the school. She remained with them at home for a year, during which time they employed every reasonable device to deter her from her purpose of becoming a nun. She possessed something of the determination of her father, and at length overcame the opposition of her parents and was received as a novice at the Hotel Dieu Dec. 29, 1808. In 1810 she was received as a sister of the order. Eleven years after taking the religious habit she contracted a disease of the lungs which made such alarming progress that her life was despaired of. She was as beautiful in death as in life, the admiration of all who beheld her.* We have the following description from a lady whose mother was personally acquainted with Miss Allen, and saw her frequently after she had taken the veil:

"Fanny was the youngest daughter of Gen. Ethan Allen, and inherited much of the energy and decision of his character, controlled by womanly gentleness. In person she was rather above than below the medium height. Her complexion was fair, her eyes dark blue with a singular depth."

said he was buried near Fort Nelson, Va., and that the present hospital was erected over his grave. Young Hannibal, after the death of his father, was placed by his uncle Ira in the Vermont University, where he remained for a while. His military record is given herewith from the report of the war department:

"It appears from the records that Hannibal Montresone Allen entered the U. S. Military Academy June 15, 1803; that he was graduated and appointed 2d Lieutenant of Artilerests June 27, 1804; promoted to 1st Lieutenant Jan. 31, 1806, and to be Captain Jan. 29, 1811; and that he died May 11, 1813, at Norfolk, Va."

It will be observed that the war department record gives the second name as Montresone, while his mother's name was Montresor; it is reasonable to suppose this is an error, for the department also errs in giving the second name of his brother as Augustus, when his real name was Alphonso, as given by his own daughter. Again, the date of his death is given as May 11, 1813, when the Norfolk record is Apr. 20, 1813.

Allen's wife while her husband was living, and furnished by their daughter, Mrs. Jennings of Norfolk, Va., so there is every reason to suppose this date to be correct, although it differs from other accounts which give Feb. 3, 1786, as the date of his birth. Capt. Allen m. Apr. 14, 1817, Mary Susanna, dau. of John and Mary Bayard (Moody) Johnson, b. Sept. 26, 1797, at Norfolk, Va. She d. Nov. 1, 1818. He m. (2) Apr. 4, 1820, Martha Washington Johnson, sister of first wife, b. Feb. 22, 1802. She d. at the family residence, Lebanon, Norfolk, Va., Apr. 20, 1855; Capt. Allen died there Jan. 6, 1855.

Young Ethan was placed by his uncle Ira in a preparatory school for colleges, but was later removed to West Point, as will be seen from the following report from the War Department:

"The other son, Ethan Augustus Allen, (should be Alphonso) entered the U. S. Military Academy Dec. 10, 1804; was graduated and appointed 2d Lieutenant Regiment of Artillerests November 14, 1806; promoted to First Lieutenant October 1, 1809; transposed to the Corps of Artillery May 12, 1814, and promoted to

be Captain July 25, 1814. It appears he was honorably discharged upon the reduction of the army June 15, 1815, reinstated May 17, 1816, and finally honorably discharged June 1, 1821."

While connected with the army Capt. Allen was highly esteemed as a disciplinarian, and strongly attached the soldiers under his charge by his uniform kindness to them. After his dismissal he retired to private life and lived on his wife's paternal estate at Lebanon, Norfolk, Va. Capt. Allen was buried on this old estate, where there is a private burial ground, where five generations, descendants of the Johnsons and of Gen. Ethan Allen, now rest. "The Sacred Spot overlooks a beautiful arm of the sea. It is shaded by stately magnolia trees and by the myrtle and ivy, which are in bloom the greater part of the year. There, too, the Virginia creeper and the fragrant honeysuckle are doing their utmost to beautify and adorn."

Court 1811; member of the State Legislature 1812; treasurer of the University of Vermont 1815; Quartermaster General with rank of Brigadier 1814; member of Congress 1817; Marshall of the District of Vermont 1819; agent for paying pensioners 1819; Envoy Extraordinary and Minister Plenipotentiary of the United States to the Republic of Chili 1823 to 1830: President of the Office Bank of the United States at Burlington, 1830; was the Whig candidate for Governor of Vermont in 1830, and defeated by the Anti-Masonic faction. He was honored and respected by all parties as a man of strict integrity, and his defeat for the gubernatorial chair was the outcome of a rancor which should never have had a place in politics. His remains repose in the cemetery at Burlington.

DESCENDANTS OF OBADIAH2 ALLEN, SAMUELI, OF MIDDLETOWN, CONN.

THE descendants of Obadiah Allen, the sixth child of Samuel Allen, are given a place in the appendix because of his supposed adoption by his uncle, Dea. Thomas Allen of Middletown, who had no children. The date of Obadiah's birth is not known, but about 1644 is a probable date. His exact relationship to Dea. Thomas Allen is no longer an open question, since the matter has been settled by the research of Mr. James Allen Kibbe, as noted in the introduction to this volume, and received after the bulk of material had been compiled in form.

Dea. Thomas Allen m. Isabella ——, who died about 1678; he m. (2) 1680, Martha Gipson, widow of Roger Gipson or Gibson, of Saybrook. He d. at Middletown, Conn., Feb. 5, 1689; she d. Nov.. 1702, having made her will Apr. 30, 1690.

Thomas Allyn is said to have left England in 1632 for Cambridge Mass., was made freeman in 1635, removed to Hartford, Conn., in 1636. He removed from Hartford in 1650 with the first planters of Mattabeseek (Middletown), where he became a prominent man of the town and was chosen deacon of the first church Mar. 16, 1670. He was a representative to the General Court, a selectinan, etc. As before intimated, the patient investigations of Mr. Francis Olcott Allen have clearly proven that this Thomas Allyn was not a brother of Hon. Matthew of Hartford, but a brother of Samuel of Windsof A few of the descendants of Obadiah Allen spell the name with a "y," but most of them spell it "Allen," which form I use in the following record, and I reckon the descent from Samuel of Windsofinstead of from Thomas of Middletown.



THE CONNECTION OF ORRIN P. ALLEN WITH SOME OF THE DESCENDANTS OF SAMUEL ALLEN OF WINDSOR.

THE compiler of this volume has been asked so often regarding his connection with the descendants of Samuel Allen, that he has consented to give the information herewith.

First, then, the connection came through the Allen-Burt alliance. O. P. Allen is descended from Henry¹ Burt (of Springfield) through Dea. Jonathan², Henry³, Lieut. Jonathan⁴, Ebenezer⁵, Carissa⁶, who m. Roswell Doolittle (grandson of Rev. Benjamin of Northfield). Eliza P. Doolittle, their dau., m. Robert Allen, father of O. P. Allen. The Ethan Allen branch runs thus: Henry¹ Burt, Mercy², m. Judah Wright; their dau. Mercy, m. Samuel³ Allen (Nehemiah², Samuel¹),

Ebenezer Burt, great-grandfather of O. P. Allen, and Gen. Ethan Allen were third cousins, while O. P. Allen and Ethan⁸ Allen, the great-grandson of Gen. Ethan, are sixth cousins. He also bears the same relationship to the grandchildren of Heman, the son of Major Heber, the brother of Gen. Ethan Allen.

He is also connected with Hon. Ethan Allen Hitchcock, the late Secretary of the Interior, as a sixth cousin, he being the great-grandson of Gen. Ethan Allen, whose dau., Lucy Caroline, m. Judge Samuel Hitchcock. In fact, O. P. Allen is doubly connected with the Secretary, as he is also descended, on the maternal side, from Capt. Luke Hitchcock, who was the emigrant ancestor of Secretary Hitchcock.

Another pleasing connection has come through the marriage of Azariah⁴ Allen (John³, John², Samuel¹), with Martha Burt, dau. of David³, Nathaniel², Henry¹, which makes Francis Olcott Allen and O. P. Allen sixth cousins, as well as all the other descendants of Azariah of the eighth generation.

Another connection is through the Allen-Doolittle alliances. O. P. Allen is descended from Abraham Doolittle, who came to New Haven about 1640, through John², Rev. Benjamin³, Amzi⁴, Roswell⁵, Eliza P.⁹, who m. Robert Allen, father of O. P. Allen.

Joseph⁶ Allen (Joseph⁵, Joseph⁴, Samuel³, John², Samuel¹), b. in East Windsor Mar. 23, 1762, m. Lucy, dau. of Simeon and Lucy (Doolittle) Chapin. She was the granddaughter of Rev. Benjamin Doolittle. The children of Amzi, son of the foregoing Joseph Allen. are the third cousins of O. P. Allen. The following gives the record connecting the wife of Joseph Allen with the Doolittle-Chapin families: Simeon Chapin, son of Japhet, b. Aug. 20, 1739; m. Aug. 20, 1765, Lucy, dau. of Rev. Benjamin Doolittle of Northfield. Mass., b. July 15, 1741. She d. Sept. 2, 1824; he d. May 20, 1709. He was a Lieutenant in the Revolutionary Army, and settled in Chicopee. Mrs. Chapin possessed rare native talent, enhanced be every opportunity for cultivation, so that she became a valuable member of society.

ORRIN PEER ALLEN

was born in Wallingford, Vt., Sept. 30, 1833, son of Dea. Robert and Eliza Paine (Doolittle) Allen, the line of descent being Orrin P.6 Allen (Roberts, Roberts, Josephs, Nathaniels, Edwards), of Nantucket, who came from London, Eng., and settled there about 1690.

He points with reasonable pride to the fact of his descent from five Mayflower ancestors, viz: Gov. John Carver and wife, Katherine, son-in-law John Tilley, and granddaughter Elizabeth Tilley, who married John Howland. Besides these he numbers scores of worthy pioneer settlers of New England, too numerous to mention.

He finished his education at Chester Academy, Vermont, after which he taught school for several years in his native state, during which time he was elected superintendent of schools in his resident town, which position he resigned to take charge of a school in Hackensack, New Jersey, resigning which he came to Palmer in October, 1859, where he has since resided. In 1883, mainly through his efforts, a committee was appointed by the town of Palmer, of which he was the chairman, to gather material and have charge of publishing a history of the town, which was successfully accomplished in 1889. It was during this time that he became much interested in local history and in genealogy in general. So it came about that he has since gathered and published a large amount



of local history, enough to form a large volume. He has prepared and published the Descendants of John Lee, Abraham Doolittle. John Fairman, William Scott of Hatfield, -including John Scott of Springfield,—and the first and second series of the Allen Memorial, which gives in the first, the descendants of Edward Allen of Nantucket, and in the second, the descendants of Samuel Allen of Windsor. The third of the series will give the Pioneer Allens of America, which is well under way. He also has in hand the Descendants of Nicholas Cady of Watertown. He has also compiled and published a History and Manual of the Second Congregational Church of Palmer, of which he is a member. He also gave the historical address of this church on the occasion of its Jubilee celebration in 1897, and again in 1907 on its sixtieth anniversary. He also gave the historical address on the occasion of the one hundredth anniversary of Thomas Lodge of Masons of Palmer in 1896, and compiled the Memorial of the occasion for publication.

He was one of the founders of the Young Men's Library Association in 1878, of which he has since been one of the directors. In May, 1899, was founded the Palmer Historical Society, largely through his efforts, of which society he has since been the curator. Although he has been a member and an officer in various literary and other societies, he has declined to enter the political arena for the sake of office, but rather to quietly pursue the course of his chosen vocation.

In August 1775 he enlisted under Gen. Montgomery for the invasion of Canada, and being sent to reconnoiter the enemy's position at St. John's, he was shot by an Indian. † Thus ended the life of a brave and valuable man in the vigor of manhood.

While preparing the sketch of the Baker family a letter was received from Miss Margaret Clark Ripley of Randolph, Vt., claiming that her grandmother, Rachel Baker, was a cousin of Gen. Ethan Allen; if so, she must have been a daughter of one of the sons of John and Sarah Baker, and although I have as yet not been able to verify the statement, it seems quite probable and I gave the

record as received from her: Rachel Baker was born about 176; in Salisbury, Conn., and married about 1785, John Johnson, b. in Woodbury, Conn., Sept. 24, 1757, who was a soldier in the Revolution nearly eight years. Soon after marriage the couple removed from Connecticut to Sandgate, Vt., and later to Highgate. where they resided till death. She d. Feb. 9, 1848; he d. Apr. 17. 1850, in his 92d year. Their children were: Sarah, James, Rhoda. Nathaniel, Oliver, Solomon, John and Reuben. The above Rhoda Johnson, b. in Sandgate, Vt., May 16, 1790, m. Joshua West Ripley and was the mother of Margaret Clark Ripley. Her ancestry in the Ripley line has been so notably patriotic that it is given here in brief: The line begins with William¹ Ripley, who came from Windham, England, and settled in Hingham, Mass., in 1638. 

Col. Seth Warner, one of the members of that grand trio of Green Mountain heroes, was the son of Dr. Benjamin Warner (as noted above) and removed from Connecticut with his father to Bennington in 1665, where he soon took a prominent part in defending the rights of the settlers against the demands of New York. His muscular and commanding presence fitted him for a born leader of men, as well as the counterpart of Col. Warrington, the hero of that interesting romance, "The Green Mountain Boys," by Thompson, which so delighted our boyhood days. Seth Warner was the nephew of Tamar, the daughter of Dr. Ebenezer Warner, who was the mother of Capt. Remember Baker. Thus the

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three heroes — Allen, Baker and Warner — were bound by the ties of friendship and a sort of relationship. These combined qualities of these sturdy men eminently fitted them for the fierce struggle thrust upon them by fate, and their names will be forever treasured by a grateful posterity. Gen. Ethan Allen has been immortalized in marble; Capt. Remember Baker deserves to be and I trust will be so remembered; Col. Seth Warner has been honored by his native state,—a monument of Quincy granite was erected on the Center Green in Roxbury Apr. 30, 1859, to him, with these inscriptions on the four panels:

ON THE EAST (FRONT) SIDE IS INSCRIBED:

COL. SETH WARNER OF THE ARMY OF THE REVOLUTION, BORN IN ROXBURY, CT., MAY 17, 1743. A RESIDENT OF BENNINTON, VT., FROM 1765 to 1784; DIED IN HIS NATIVE PARISH DEC. 26, 1784.

ON THE NORTH SIDE APPEARS:

CAPTOR OF CROWN POINT, COMMANDER OF THE GREEN MOUNTAIN BOYS IN THE REPULSE OF CARLETON AT LONQUILL AND AT THE BATTLE OF HUBBARDSTON, AND THE ASSOCIATE OF STARK IN THE VICTORY AT BENNINGTON.

ON THE SOUTH SIDE IS INSCRIBED:

DISTINGUISHED AS A SUCCESSFUL DEFENDER OF THE NEW HAMPSHIRE GRANTS, AND FOR BRAVERY, SAGACITY, ENERGY AND HUMANITY AS A PARTISAN OFFICER IN THE WAR OF THE REVOLUTION.

DESCENDANTS OF SAMUEL AND LUCY CAROLINE (ALLEN) HITCHCOCK.

A FAMILY well deserving an honored niche in this volume; sons and daughters are widely known to fame.

JUDGE SAMUEL⁵ HITCHCOCK (Noah⁴, Nathaniel³, John², Luke¹), b. in Brimfield, Mass., Mar. 23, 1755; m. May 26, 1789, Lucy Caroline Allen, dau. of Gen. Ethan Allen, b. 1768, d. Aug. 27, 1842. He d. Nov. 30, 1813. Their graves are to be seen in the old cemetery at Burlington, Vt.

Judge Hitchcock was the fourth son of Noah and Mary (Burt) Hitchcock. He fitted for college with Rev. James Bridgham of Brimfield, Mass., and graduated from Harvard in 1777; he then read law with Hon. Jedediah Foster of Brookfield, Mass., and was admitted to the practice of law in Worcester, Mass. He removed to Burlington, Vt., about 1786. He removed to Vergennes in 1794, remaining there till 1806, when he returned to Burlington, where he spent the remainder of his life. He was the first state's attorney appointed in Chittendon County, which office he held from 1787 to 1790. He represented the town of Burlington in the Legislature of 1779-90-91 and 93. He was one of the founders of the University of Vermont in 1791. He was Attorney General of Vermont from

1790 to 1793. He was Judge of the District Court of the U.S. for the District of Vermont, and held the office until the repeal of the judiciary act. Judge Hitchcock was a ripe scholar and a man of rare ability, and was conspicuous at the bar and in the social circle.

He was a man of the highest character, influence and reputation, universally honored and beloved, and his death was lamented in Mobile and throughout Alabama as a public calamity."*

Gen. in 1851 and resigned Oct. 18, 1852. when he removed to St. Louis, Mo. On the breaking out of the late war he was appointed Maj. Gen. U. S. Volunteers Feb. 10, 1862. and was assigned to special duty at Washington, D. C.; acted as confidential advisor to President Lincoln 1862-3; Commissary General of Provisions 1865; resigned Oct. 1, 1867. and Iron Co., of which he was made president; also president of the Chicago and Texas R. R. Co. of Illinois. He has also been president of the Commercial Club. Mr. Hitchcock was a personal friend of President McKinley, who selected him for minister to Russia in 1897; the appointment was received with much favor by the press as an eminently fitting one, for Mr. Hitchcock was known as a gentleman of extensive experience with the world, possessed of keen, practical business intelligence and having a commanding presence, fitted to shine in any position. The post was considered one of the most important in Europe, and was raised to the rank of an embassy in 1798, when Mr. Hitchcock was reappointed to fill the new position as embassador. On December 21, 1898, he received the appointment of Secretary of the Interior, which position he accepted, and after maintaining a most honorable record retired by his own wish March 4, 1907. THE compiler has deemed it best to include the history of the descendants of this include the history of the descendants of this interesting family because of its intimate connection with the family of Gen. Ethan Allen. The data has been almost wholly derived from the records of the families set forth through personal correspondence, and has not been previously published.

Dr. Jabez Penniman (Jesses, Joseph2, James1, the emigrant in 1631), b. in Connecticut Sept. 28, 1764; m. Oct. 28, 1793, Mrs. Frances Allen, the widow of Gen. Ethan Allen. She d. Oct. 13. 1834. He m. (2) Mar. 2, 1836, Mrs. Cynthia Marvin. She d. Feb..

Dr. Penniman was a resident of Westminister, Vt., when the young widow of Ethan Allen came back there to reside with her mother; in the conrse of time he formed her acquaintance, which resulted in their union. In 1801 Dr. Penniman was appointed collector of customs at Swanton, Vt., which office he held until 1809, when he purchased a farm in Colchester near the high bridge which spans the Winooski river some two miles from Burlington, where he spent the remainder of his life. He served the town as clerk and representative; he was also Judge of Probate for the county several years.

Mrs. Penniman retained much of the beauty of youth to the last, as well as the refined air which had so charmed society in other days. She was quite an adapt in botany and had the rarest collection of plants known in those days, both in the house and garden, to which she gave much attention. In the latter part of her life she went into society but little, although often urged to do so by her husband. Mrs. Brinegar, a granddaughter of Mrs. Penniman, from whom I have the above, says she always looked upon her grandmother with great reverence in her childhood, when she was permitted to visit her; she also speaks of a fine old portrait painted by Copley of Mrs. Penniman when she was ten years old. It used to hang on the wall in the old Penniman house, and was in the possession of Luther L. Penniman of Colchester, Vt., a few years also, from which the writer has had a copy taken.
