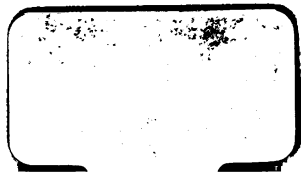

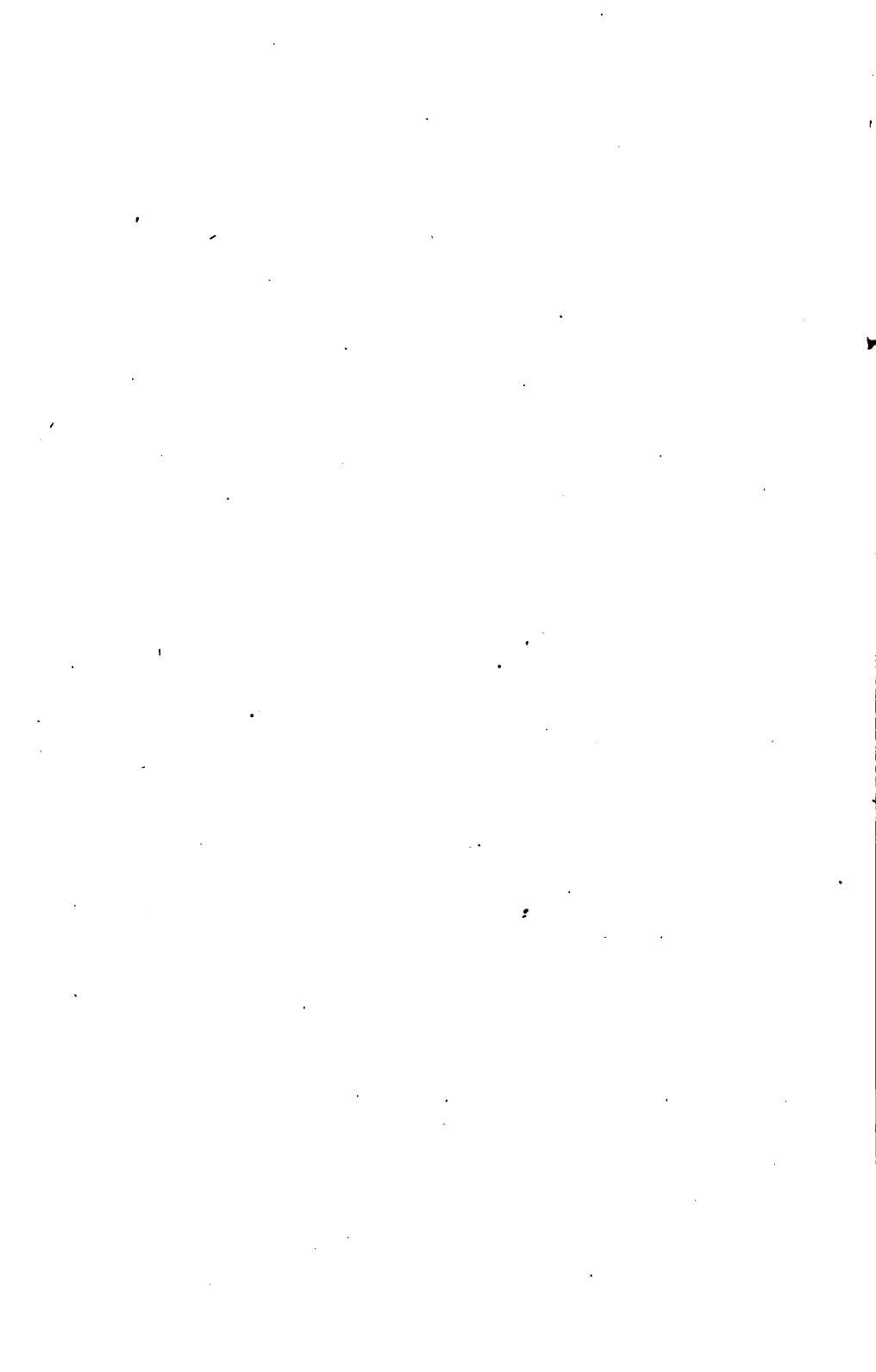

PREFACE.

THE whole of these inscriptions were copied with great care, and the same care has been extended to the printing of them; it is therefore hoped that no errors of an important character will appear in any portion of the work.

A short note, descriptive of the style of the monument in regard to its shape or ornamentation, generally precedes the inscription. Where no note occurs, the stone is plain.

Dotted gaps in the inscriptions show where space has been left in the stones for the insertion of other names at a future time.

A short line separates the inscriptions, and each one is comprised within inverted commas.

HENRY THO^S WAKE.



BRIGHAM.

(13. 7. 76.)

THIS large stone is set about four feet in the ground, as if standing in a pit, and built round about to allow of its being seen and read.

“Sacred to the Memory of John Nawell of Brigham, Mason, who departed this Life the 8th of January 1822, aged 60 years. Also of Nancy his Wife daughter of Thomas & Ann Dixon, who died the 10th of April, 1823, aged 71 years. Also of Joseph their Son who died the 11th of July 1828, aged 33 years. Also of Isaac their Son who died the 18th of January 1832 aged 34 years. Also of Elizabeth his Wife who died the 30th of January, 1831 aged 29 years.”

The top ornamented, and on an urn standing on a book is inscribed, “Know thyself.” On the opposite one, “Consider thy latter end”; and on a scroll between, “Do justly, love mercy and walk humbly with thy God.”

“Here lies the Body of John Middleton of Brigham. Buried April the 5th A.D. 1733, Aged 39.”

“In Memory of.....
William son of John and Mary Jane Stockdale who died January 28th 1864 Aged 1 year and 5 months. John their son who died February 4th 1870, Aged 6 months. Sophia their Daughter who died December 17th. 1874, aged 1 year and 11 months.”

“Here lies the Body of John Walker of Gillbrow who died the 7th of August 1740 Aged 86...
..... Mary Daughter of John & Mary Walker wife of Daniel Fearon of Ullock died April y^e 22th. 1716 Aged 26.”

“In Memory of Martha Penny who died January 22nd 1802 in the 50th Year of her Age.”

“In Memory of Joseph Bell who died on the 31st Day of March, 1857, Aged 59 Years. Also of Hannah the Wife of the above Joseph Bell of High Walton, formerly of Brigham Parsonage, who died on the 15th Day of July 1839, Aged 61 Years. William the Son of Joseph and Hannah Bell, who died on the 11th day of February 1831, aged 3 years. Also of Ann their Daughter who died on the 22d of February 1831 aged 6 years. Also of James their Son who died on the 9th day of June 1840, aged 7 Weeks.”

“Elizabeth Harding Walker: Born, October 12th, 1852. Died, August 13th, 1857. Sarah Harding Walker Born 24th, October 1858, Died 6th Dec: 1861.”

At the back of this last one is an ancient stone trough, into which the upright part of a cross or memorial stone probably once fitted.

The following are placed against the north wall:—

“In Memory of Thomas, the Son of Robert and Mary Blake, of Brigham Vicarage, who died Nov: 23rd 1785 Aged 20 years. Robert Blake died Jan: 5th 1800, Aged 83 years. Also of Mary his Wife who died in the Isle of Man Jan: 2nd 1823. Aged 90 years.”

On a red sandstone, surmounted by an hour glass:—

“In Memory of Thomas Downs late of Maryport, who died the 27th of Sept: 1790 Aged 84 Years. Mary his Wife died the 30th of July 1757 Aged 51 years.”

On a red sandstone, built in the wall and set in a trough:—

“ Here lies y^e Body of Henry Harrison of Sea-
ton who died April y^e 21st 1714 Aged 44 (?) [the
latter figure indistinct] years. Also Ann his Wife
died March y^e 15th 1714. Aged 35 years.”

“ Erected by Joseph Harrison their Son.”

Portion of a stone fixed to the wall, near the ground:—

“ ...e lies y^e Body of Mr. [Ric]hard Head of
Brandl..... who died May y^e 1749 aged 34
years.”

On a fragmentary stone, beautifully cut in large capitals:—

* “ HERE LIETH THE BODY OF ALICE·
FISHER · WIFE OF RICH[A]RD · FISHER
OF MO[ORE]SIDE WHO WAS [BURIE]D
THE 30.....”

Another similar, but fragmentary:—

* “ ROBERT AND IANE CHILDREN OF
JOHN LAWRENCE OF BRIGHAM BURIED
APRILL THE 3 · 1699.”

* “ Henry Son of Mr Thomas Crakeplace of
Brigham. Born Ianuary the 6th 1718 Buried
here March y^e 24 · 1724 ”

* “ THE BODY OF M^r EDMOND HAR-
RINGTON BVRIED IAN 6 1697 ”

* ——— “ Barbara daughter of Mr Roger Flem-
ing Uicar Born September 27 · 1705 Buried
Here August 3^d 1717.”

NOTE.—All those inscriptions against which an asterisk is placed
were probably taken up from the floor during the restoration of the
ancient edifice in 1864, and placed outside against the north wall,
where they now stand.

Some letters cut away from the commencement of each line, all along the edge of the stone, have been supplied; and the following is the same epitaph modernized :—

" Here honour, age, and piety,
 All in one grave together lie,
 In this man whom heaven did remove
 From life on earth to live above.
 He was a minister that stood fast
 In his religion to the last;
 Like a house, founded on a rock,
 He did endure the force and shock
 Of all temptations; and still he
 Came off from all victoriously.

He in his life time oft would say,
 While watching, 'Lord, take me away.'
 Mr. Henry Stephenson, Vicar of Brigham,
 Departed this Life January 19, 1704."

The following stone stands a little from the wall :—

"Sacred to the Memory of Joseph Sproat who died December 5th 1808 in the 65th year of his age. Elizabeth his Wife died April 23d, 1825 aged 77 Years. Jane the Wife of Matthew Sproat their Son; She died December 17th 1816 aged 36 Years. Margaret their Daughter died Nov. 16th 1815 aged 42 Years. Also of the above named Matthew Sproat who died September 16th 1848, aged 64 Years"

"Sacred to the memory of John the Son of John and Sarah Caird of May Field who died Sep. 10th 1810, Aged 10 years. Also of John Caird, who departed this Life July 20th 1825, Aged 72 years. Also of Sarah his Wife who died January the 9th 1831 Aged 72 Years."

"In Memory of John Head, who died at Harrington, July 11th 1831 aged 30 years. Also Phebe, his Wife who died at Cockermouth Dec. 17th 1873 aged 75 years. Also Jonathan Head Son of the above, died Oct. 13th 1873 Aged 29 years, also Mary Head, died Jan. 9th 1872 aged 41 years."

"Erected to the Memory of Samuel Johnston, Woollen Weaver of Cockermouth, who died Nov. 15th 1851, Aged 34 years. Also of Elizabeth Cragg his Grandmother who died April 28th 1849 Aged 89 Years."

“ In Memory of.....
 Eleanor the daughter of John and Mary Ann
 Barnes, of Cockermouth, who died July 4th, 1866
 Aged 19 years and 11 months.

This lovely bud, so young and fair
 Called forth by early doom,
 Came but to show how sweet a flower
 In Paradise would bloom.

Also Sarah their Daughter who died April 16th,
 1854, aged 10 months. Also Jonathan their Son
 who died May 14th 1855 aged 1 year.”

“ Blessed are the dead that die in the Lord.”

“ In Memory of William Hartley of Eaglesfield
 Cragg, who departed this life October 15th 1875
 in the 69th Year of his age. Eleanor, Wife of
 William Hartley of Eaglesfield Cragg, who died
 April 25th 1870, aged 63 Years. Also William,
 their Son who died April 25th 1832, aged 5 Months.
 John Robert their Son, who died June 16th 1860,
 aged 19 Years. Jane their Daughter, who died
 April 19th 1862. aged 13 years. William their
 Son, who died Feb. 10th 1849. Aged 3 years.”

On the base of a white marble cross, with the space enclosed by
 a neat palisade :—

“ In Memory of Ann Wren wife of John Wren
 of Cockermouth who died July 5th 1860. Jane
 their Daughter died Dec: 25th 1863.”

On the base of another white marble cross adjoining, the space
 being enclosed by a dwarf wall with festoons of iron chains suspended
 from small obelisk shaped stone posts :—

“ In Memory of Joseph Wren who died June
 30th 1867. Elizabeth Wren died Oct: 14th
 1867.”

On a stone, surmounted by the Arms of the Brown family, with motto, "Goodness is greatness":—

"In memory of Isaac Brown of Cockermouth who died on the 16th of June 1833 aged 50 years Also of Mary his beloved Wife who died on the 15th of March 1833, aged 42 years. Also of Robert their Son who died in Febr. 1839 at Ponce, Porto Rico aged 21 years. Also of Isaac their Son who died the 28th Nov. 1843. Aged 26 Years."

On a neat stone Monument, surmounted by an ornamental cross, is the following gilt inscription, cut on an inlaid slab of polished grey marble:—

"In affectionate Remembrance of Fanny the beloved and devoted Wife of William Miller who died at Croft Hill, Whitehaven Oct: 31st 1867 in her 25th year.

Them also that sleep in Jesus shall God bring with him."

On another small cross beside it is inscribed:—

"Henrietta Miller Ob: Febr 13th 1866 Aged 3 Mo:."

The whole space is neatly planted with flowers, and enclosed by a dwarf wall and festoons of bronzed iron chains.

Round about a floreated cross, within a Gothic quatrefoil, is inscribed "The Spirit shall return unto God, who gave it."—and underneath:—

"In Memory of William Tunstall, of Little Broughton, who died August 5. 1872, Aged 60 Years. Also of Sarah Tunstall, his Wife who died Aug. 2 . 1873, aged 64 years. Also of Jane the Daughter of William & Sarah Tunstall, who died December 7th 1849 aged 5 years.

.....

A few short years of sorrow past
 We'll reach that happy shore
 When death-divided friends at last
 Shall meet to part no more "

“In Memory of..... Alice, the beloved Wife, of James Weatherston, of Greysouthen who died December 13th, 1871, aged 53 years.

Blessed are the dead that die in the Lord

.....
Also Abigail, the beloved Wife of Thomas Weatherston, of Greysouthen who died April 23rd, 1873 aged 26 years, interred at Bridekirk.”

“In affectionate Remembrance of James Irving, of the Goat, who died Sept: 3rd 1871 aged 54 years. Also Ann his wife who died Nov. 2d 1873, aged 52 years. Thomas, Son of the above died Nov: 30th 1845, aged 1 year. Mary Daughter of the above died Sept: 5th 1847 aged 6 years.”

“In Memory of George Smails, of Cockermouth, who died March 18th 1865, aged 52 years..... Also Mary Esther, Daughter of the above who died April 29th 1859, aged 1 year. Also Margaret Jane, Daughter of the above who died March 2nd 1860, aged 2 months. Also James Son of the above who died Feb: 21st 1862, aged 9 years. Also Joseph Son of the above who died March 26th 1862, aged 6 years.

My days are past, my purposes are broken off—
That life is long, which answers life's great end.”

“In Memory of Joseph Stoddart, of Great Broughton, who died May 24th 1869, aged 71 years. Sarah the wife of Joseph Stoddart, who died July 16th 1868, aged 73 years James the son of Joseph and Sarah Stoddart, of Great Broughton, who died Sept. 4th 1844, aged 21 years. Also Ann their Daughter who died April 3rd 1867, Aged 47 Years.”

“In Memory of Thomas France Collins of Cockermonth who died April 12th 1858 aged 31 Years. In Memory of Thomas the Son of John and Mary Ann Mark of Cockermonth who died the 12th of June 1862, aged 6 Weeks. Also William John their Son, who died August 31st 1864, aged 11 Weeks. Also George their Son, who died May 17th 1866, aged 17 Days.”

The following is of fine white marble :—

On a scroll under a bouquet of flowers is “GOD IS LOVE”

“John Mark who died April 28th 1875, aged 50 Years. Thomas Mark died June 16th 1862 aged 6 weeks. William John Mark died August 30th 1864 Aged 11 weeks; George Mark died May 17th 1866 aged 17 Days.”

On a small stone :—

“I. L. Watson Ob. 30 Mar. 1844 Æ. 6 Months”

The following is enclosed about with an ornamental iron railing :—

“Sacred to the Memory of Mary Wood Daughter of Fletcher and Ann Pearson who departed this life on the 3rd of Feb^r 1858 in the 61st year of her age. Also in Memory of the above Fletcher Pearson who departed this life at Cockermonth on the 22nd of Oct^r 1860 in the 91st year of his age. Ann the Wife, of Fletcher Pearson of Cockermonth, and Mother of the above who departed this life on the 12th of Jan^r 1859 in the 85th year of her age.”

Under an ornamental perforated cross :—

“Sacred to the Memory of Henry Pearson, who died at Cockermonth, March 14th, 1858, aged 82 years. Also of Ann his Wife who died February 24th, 1846 aged 67 years; and was interred at Cockermonth.”

"Life how short.

Eternity how long.

Erected in memory of Thomas Holliday of Great Broughton, who died February 20th, 1850, aged 66 years. Also of Rachel Holliday his Wife, who died the 18th day of August 1859 aged 73 years. Also of Daniel, Son of Thomas and Rachel Holliday, who died at the Brewery, Great Broughton, 28th of November 1862, and was interred here, aged 38 years.

In the midst of life we are in Death."

"In Memory of.....Margaret the Wife of Hodgson Saul of Old Field Mill, who died March 3rd, 1871 aged 31 years. Also two of their children, Ann and John died in infancy"

"Sacred to the Memory of Henry Wallace of Graysouthen who departed this Life Oct. 13th 1824, Aged 54 Years. Also of Jane his Wife who died July 3rd 1832, Aged 64 Years. Also of Elizabeth Robinson their Daughter who died Feb^r 12th 1844, Aged 37 Years. Also of John their Son who died Jan^r 2nd 1874 Aged 71 Years."

The following is surmounted by a small perforated cross :—

"In Memory of Johnston Dixon of Little Broughton, who died Dec. 11th. 1860, aged 32 years. Also of Mary Ann, Daughter of Johnston and Jane Dixon, who died Sep. 13th 1857, aged 5 months."

Large stone, with ornamented top :—

"Sacred to the Memory of Joseph Henderson of Distington who died September 26th 1841, Aged 29 Years.....Ann the daughter of Joseph & Eliza Henderson who died June 30th, 1839, Aged 1 Year & 10 Months."

“Sacred to the Memory of John Martin, died December 15th 1840 Aged 91 Years. Dorothy the Wife of John Martin died December 29th 1819. Aged 65 Years. Daniel their Son died March 20th 1817 aged 24 Years. Esther their Daughter died Feb. 15th. 1822 aged 24 Years. Mary Martin died Sep. 9th 1872, aged 93 years.”

“In Memory of John Rook, who departed this Life July 22nd, 1839, Aged 88 Years. Sarah his Wife who died February 22nd 1842, Aged 89 Years. John their Son who died at Egremont, August 6th 1872, Aged 85 years. Also Mary the Wife [of] John Rook, jun. who died August 29th 1838 Aged 64 Years.! William their Son died in London Dec: 19th 1844, Aged 26 Years. Joseph died in Liverpool March 3rd, 1845, aged 24 years.”

Top ornamented with urn, books, &c. :—

“Life how short”

“Eternity how long”

“Sacred to the Memory of Allan Penny, formerly of Bridge Foot Forge, who departed this life January 26th, 1856, Aged 71 Years. Elsey, the Wife of Allan Penny, who departed this life Jan: 5th 1857, in the 59th Year of her Age.

Reflect, O stranger! what is mortal life,
 A complicated scene of woe and strife;
 More fleeting than the blossom of a flow'r,
 Which blooms at morn, and ere the day is o'er
 It droops its head, it fades, and is no more:
 'Tis short indeed—'tis merely but a span;
 Reflect on this, and learn to live, O man.
 Secure in hope, to-day our health we trust,
 To-morrow joins us to our native dust.

Mary Jane, their Daughter, died July 19th 1844, Aged 26 Years.”

Top ornamented with a representation of two large books:—

“John Richardson, Sen: formerly of the Old Brewery in Cockermouth, and Superintendent of the General Sunday School of that place, who died 19th February, 1858, Aged 78 Years.”

Large stone, at top of which is “Life how short, Eternity how long”:—

“Erected in Memory of Joseph Parker, who died at Goat near Cockermouth, May 5th 1859, aged 74 Years.

Farewell dear wife I have gone before,
My love to thee can be no more,
No grief nor sorrow for me make,
But love my children for my sake.

Also Ann his Wife who died May 4th 1871, Aged 82 Years.—

Tho' lost to sight; to memory dear.

Sarah Parker, the Beloved Daughter of Ann Parker, who departed this life at the Goat June 1st 1865, aged 30 Years.

Weep not for me my dearest friends,
Nor shake at death's sudden alarms,
Its but the voice that Jesus sends,
To call one quickly to his arms”

Stone with ornamental shield, but no arms:—

“In Memory of John Ostle, Supervisor of Inland Revenue, who died at Greysouthen, March 22nd 1865, Aged 48 years. Sarah the Daughter of John and Sarah Ostle, died June 25th, 1860, aged 1 Year & 9 Months”

“In Memory of George Martin who died February 27th 1870, Aged 42 Years..... Jane the Daughter of George & Elizabeth Martin died June 28th, 1866 Aged 16 years.”

“ In Memory of..... William the beloved Son, of Wilfred and Ann Robinson, died at Stainburn, March 3rd 1863, Aged 21 years. Sarah Ann their Daughter, died June 28th 1845, Aged 1 year and 7 months ”

Stone, surmounted with books and other ornamentations :—

“ In Memory of Ann the Wife of John Douglas, Surveyor, Hampstead, London, and Daughter of Henry and Elizabeth Ostle, of Greysouthen, who died Dec: 8th 1865, aged 46 years ”

“ Erected in Memory of..... Margaret the beloved Wife of Richard Allison, of Cockermouth, who died May 7th 1865, aged 76 Years. Also of John their Son who died Feb. 2nd 1865, aged 56 Years ”

“ In Memory of Alexander Shepherd who died the 19th of January 1809, Aged 38 Years. Also of Mary his Wife who died the 28th day of January, 1850 Aged 84 Years. Also of George his Son, who died April 11th 1809; Aged 15 Years Also Alexander their Son who died June 6th, 1862, Aged 57 Years. Isabella, Wife of Alexander Shepherd died May 2nd 1835, aged 32 Years ”

At back of stone :—

“ Also Ann, their Daughter the Wife of Thomas Black, who died March 26th 1844, aged 36 years ”

Large stone—“ Life how short Eternity how long ”

“ Erected in memory of George Gunson, of Greysouthen, who died Sep: 9th 1856, Aged 69 Years. Also of Jane, his Wife, who died July 12th, 1858, aged 65 Years ”

The following surmounted with books and ornaments :—

“Therefore be ye also ready ; for in such an hour as ye think not the Son of man cometh.”—S. Matthew xxiv. chap. 44 ve.

The above verse is represented cut on the leaf of an open book, and on the opposite leaf is—“For his End was Peace” :—

“In Memory of Daniel Shepherd, of Brigham, who died on the 31st day of Jan^r 1850, aged 50 Years. Also Margaret his beloved Wife who died Aug^t 28th 1866, aged 59 Years. Thomas the Son of Daniel and Margaret Shepherd who died March 13th 1829, aged 9 months. Also of Hannah their Daughter, who died Nov^r. 11th, 1847, aged 2 months.”

On a large altar tomb, with solid sides and ends ornamented with pointed arches, with the addition of an urn at each end :—

“Erected in Memory of Richard Nuttall of Little Broughton who departed this Life August 13th 1841, aged 78.”

“In Memory of Sarah the Wife of Andrew Irwing, Farmer of Calva, who departed this Life September y^e 25th 1766 ; aged 40 years. Andrew Irwing died Dec^{br}. 14th 1804, aged 84 years.”

“Sacred to the Memory of John Harper of Eaglesfield, who departed this Life on the 29th day of July, 1835, aged 74 Years. Also of Ann his Wife, who died on the 20th day of June, 1835, aged 74 Years.”

On a stone surmounted with an urn :—

“In Memory of John Danson of Greysouthen, who died March 15th, 1799 aged 84 Years. Also Sarah his Daughter died Oct^r. 7th 1763 Aged 3 Years. Also John his Son died Oct^r. 10th 1763 aged 6 Years. Also Mary his Daughter died May 4th 1773. Aged 16 Years.”

“Erected in memory of John Emerson of Crosby, who died May 6th 1853, aged 38 years
Also of William Moore Emerson, Son of the above who died at Cockermouth, the 21st Oct. 1869, aged 20 Years.....Also of William Moor his Uncle of Old Field, who died Jan^r 7th 1840, aged 55 years”

“In Memory of.....Mary Jane the Daughter of William and Mary Cameron, of Brigham, who died April 25th 1871, aged 19 years.

This lovely youth, so young and fair
 Called forth by early doom,
 Came but to show how sweet a flower
 In Paradise would bloom”

On an altar tomb, supported on low pillars:—

“In Memory of John Bell who departed this Life June the 6. 1760 Aged 75.”

“In Memory of Sarah the Wife of Barnabas Brough who died March 14th 1780 Aged 38 years.

Here lies inter'd the faithful Wife
 Who lost her own by giving life
 Yet while she liv'd she found the grace,
 That fits her for that glorious place
 A witness she thro' Christ could sing
 That death had lost his dread & sting.”

Also the above John Soutor died 22^d of May 1835 aged 77 Years. Also of Sarah the Wife of Joseph Soutor who died Dec^r 8th 1838, aged 39 Years.”

Space enclosed by a massive dwarf iron railing.
Beneath an urn is the following inscription :—

“Erected in Memory of John Williamson of Great Broughton, who died August the 30th 1770. Aged 42 Years. Also Sarah Williamson his Wife died February 25th 1808, Aged 69 Years.

Mary their Daughter and Wife of John Dufton of Brigham dedicated this memorial in Testimony of her affection”

Ornamented with books at top :—

“In memory of John Beck, died August 6th 1865, aged 67 years. Rebecca the Wife of John Beck who died January 8th 1850, Aged 53 years also of John their Son, who died Sept. 10th. 1836, aged 3 Weeks ; also of Douglas their Son who died Nov^r 16th, 1840 aged 6 months”

Beneath a book and urn, on a large black stone :—

On a stone, with a neat Gothic finial :—

Top ornamented with a scroll and wreath of palm branches:—

“In Memory of Joseph Piper of Graysouthen and late of Whitehaven Maltster who died Dec: 18th 1782 in the 62 year of his age.

In love I lived in peace I died
Life was desired but God denied,
Then my dear friends forbear to grieve
For when death comes there's no reprove”

Beneath an emblematic design, consisting of a serpent, urn, apples, and cross, inscribed “Faith crushing down sin,” is as follows:—

“ In memory of Dorothy the Daughter of John & Mary Graves of Eaglesfield who died at Maryport Dec. 6. 1859 aged 42 years.

This monument was erected as a mark of esteem by Sarah Douglas of Maryport.”

A Grave enclosed by a small iron palisading, inside of which is a bed of flowers, but without any inscription.

“ Here lies y^e Body of Henry Bacon of Graysothen Black Smith who died November the 20th 1742 aged 71 and also Mary his Wife who died January the 14. 1745-6 Aged 82.”

“ Erected in Memory of Elizeabeth the Wife of George Patrickson who died December the 24th. 1787 aged 74 years. George Patrickson died January 13th 1789 Aged 66 years ”

Surmounted by a large cross :—

John Dufton their Son died June 15th 1766 aged 48 And Mary his Wife died 27th of Sep. 1814 aged 82 years. John Dufton their Son died Jan^r 29th 1838 aged 73 years Mary his Wife died June 28th 1854 aged 84 years William their younger Son M.R.C.S. died Oct. 17th 1859, aged 53 years and was buried in the Church of England Cemetery, Birmingham. He was the sole founder of the Ear [Infirmery] in that town. Sarah their Daughter, died at Brighton Oct. 21st 1873 and was buried in the Cemetery at Birmingham, aged 70. The Rev^d John Dufton M.A. Survivor of the Family, Vicar of Bredfield, Suffolk, died at Brighton, Jan. 12th. 1874 and was buried at Bredfield, Aged 72.”

Near this place lies 4 children of M^r: Thomas & Sarah Westray of Great Broughton, Viz. Mary died March y^e 15. 1751 Aged 17. the Rev: Mr. Henry died y^e 15th of Aug. 1767. aged 27. Christopher and Sarah died in their Infancy. Sarah the Wife of Thomas Westray Departed this life July y^e 10th 1773 Aged 62 years. Also John Westray departed this Life the 6th Day of August 1802 aged 67 years. Also of M^r: Thomas Westray of Great Broughton who departed this Life the 28th of August 1812 aged 75 years. Also of Hannah the Wife of Thomas Westray, Jun^r: who died March 10th 1818 aged 69 years. Also of Jonathan the Son of Thomas Westray, sen^r: who died Dec^r: 7th 1830 aged 77 years."

This stone has carved pillars at the sides, and at back is an elaborate display of arms. On the shield is a lion or dog, raised up on its hind legs, and in the right paw a sword, with the left paw touching it.—Crest dog's head erased, resting on a book :—

"Erected in Memory of Jacob Messenger of Great Broughton who died Feb. 20th 1806. Aged 75. Also Elizabeth his Wife who died May 20th

1835, aged 89 years. Also Jacob Messenger their Son, Late of Great Broughton, who died at Beach Hill, July 1st 1859, Aged 68 years."

"Here lyeth the Body of Jane the Wife of Timothy Malkin of Little Broughton who departed this life the 12th Day of May A.D. 1740 in the 55th year of her age.

Stop Passenger as you pass by
As you are now, so once was I
As I am now so must you be
Therefore prepare for Death & follow me."

"Here lyes the Body of Thomas Malkin who departed This Life in Little Broughtoun in The year 1754, his age 30 years."

"In memory of Anne, the daughter of M^r Isaac & Phoebe Thompson of W^h haven who departed this Life the 17th day of June 1787 aged 23 years.

Should nature mourn the rigid Doom that gave
To Youth and Innocence an early Grave;
And sorrowing o'er the Dust that moulders here
Should fond Affection sometimes shed a Tear
Yet to restrain the Energy of Grief
The Christian's Hope shall bring us blest Relief.
Since freed from human Ills a num'rous Train,
The Friends, the Parents Loss is her Eternal Gain."

"Erected in Memory of Thomas Atkinson, of Great Broughton, who died 7th of October 1847 aged 87 years. Also of Mary his Wife who died February 3rd 1857, aged 80 years. Also Joseph their Son who died 2nd of Dec^r 1802 aged 13 months. Also Thomas their Son, who was Lost at Sea 9th of May, 1826 aged 19 years. Also Robert their Son, who was Lost at Sea, 8th of June 1832, Aged 32 years. Also William their Son who died at Crosby Sep^t 1st 1856 aged 53 years."

Under the large, fine old yew tree is an ornamented white stone:—

“In memory of Phoeby Widow, of the late Rev.^d Thomas Messenger, who died at Overton near Lancaster. She died at Great Broughton, June 4th. 1807 aged 60 years.”

Another under the large yew:—

“Sacred to the memory of Joseph the Son of John and Catherine Tiffin of Dovenby Mill who Departed this Life the 12 of March 1814 aged 17 years. Also Elizabeth their Daughter Who Died the 27th of June 1805 aged 4 years. Also Catherine their Daughter who died July 29th 1831 aged 21 years. Catherine Mother of the above Died 18th April 1846 aged 77 and John their Father died 10th Oct: 1851 aged 85. Also Elizabeth their Daughter who died on the 21st Day of May 1870 aged 64 years.”

Under the yew. A large winged head, under which:—

“Here lies the Body of Thomas Bell of Dovenby who departed this life September y^e 6th 1759 aged 74.”

Under a large winged head:—

“Erected in memory of Christopher Westray of Great Broughton who departed this life y^e 24th day of April 1758 Aged 78 years. Also Cathrine his Wife who departed this life y^e 11th day of December, 1745 Aged 67 years. Two of their Sons John & Edmund. John Died A.D. 1734 Aged 20 years. And Edmund Died A.D. 1727 Aged 9.”

On a large stone with ornamental top:—

“Erected in memory of William Tiffin of Dovenby Mill who died November 27th, 1848

aged 72 years. Also of Ann his Wife, who died the 7th of January 1853 aged 77 years. Also of Mary their Daughter, who died July 7th 1817, aged 8 years."

A large stone slab, lying over two graves, without inscription.

Another large slab, near to the foregoing, has cut upon it:—

"The Body of Elizabeth Mawson is interred in a Vault beneath this Stone MDCCCXXXIII."

And beside a massive stone obelisk, inscribed in capitals:—

"Erected in Memory of Elizabeth Mawson of the Goat Mills, by her affectionate Son William. MDCCCXXXIII."

On an octagonal obelisk shaped monument, with elaborately carved top and base, the following inscription on one of the four in-laid marble sides:—

"In Memory of Thomas Mawson who died July 9th 1853 aged 63 years. Sarah his wife died Nov^r. 25th 1840 aged 55 years."

By this monument the sun dial is placed, and bears the following inscription:—'Transit Gloria Mundi.' 1838. Made by Daniel Maxwell, Nithsdale."

"In Remembrance of Moses Mawson of the Goat Mills who died the 28th January 1805 aged 46 years. And his Wife Elizabeth who Died the 5th July 1833 aged 73 years. Their Son Joseph died at Liverpool the 30th July 1834 aged 42 years and was buried in St. Mary's Cemetery. Their Daughter Sarah Wife of John Harrison died on the 3rd of April 1854 aged 58 years, and was buried at Isel. Their Son William died on the 12th June 1854 aged 66 years."

"Erected in memory of Joseph Paitson of Dovenby who died April 3rd 1812 aged 69 years. Also of Mary his Wife who died 9th of August 1804 aged 59 years. Also of William their Son who died 9th of December 1805 aged 31 years. And of Elizabeth their Daughter who died April 28th 1794 aged 9 years."

Under a large urn with drapery:—

"In Memory of Samuel Fletcher of Gilcrux who died on the 3rd day of June 1855, aged 63 years. Also Jane his wife who died April 3^d 1871, aged 70 years."

"Sacred to the memory of James Ritson of Dovenby, who Departed this Life Febr^y 20th 1840 aged 79 years. Margaret his Wife, died April 5th 1856 aged 82 years. Also James their Son, died at Edinburgh March 20th 1837 aged 30 years. Also of John their Son, who died at Upper Gornal Sedgley on the 29th of June 1856 aged 57 years. Also Thomas their Son, who died at Flimby June 26th 1862 aged 60 years."

Top ornamented with a shield, on which is "I.H.S.", with other ornamentations:—

"In memory of.....Martha the beloved Wife of Joseph Archer of Dovenby, who died June 22^d 1862, aged 69 years."

Under ornaments of books, drapery, strawberries, &c.

“ In Memory of Capt. William Martindale of Dovenby, who died Jan. 1. 1827 aged 61 years. Elizabeth his Wife died Nov. 14. 1835 aged 64 years. Also of Mary Archer their Grandaughter, second Daughter of Joseph and Martha Archer of Dovenby who died the 15th of July 1854 aged 26 years. Greatly respected by all who had the pleasure of her acquaintance.

Stay Stranger Stay and mark the date,
Which tells you of my early fate
Improve your time while yet you may
For death sweeps young and old away.”

On the other side of pathway, west of the large yew :—

“ This Monument is erected in memory of George White Jun^r of Little Broughton who died the 8th of May, 1769 aged 22 years. Jane the Daughter of George White Sen^r Wife of John Nicholson who died the 17th of February 1771 aged 28 years. Also three Daughters of George White Sen^r who departed this life in their Infancy. This monument is in several pieces piled together.

Under an urn with fire issuing from the mouth, etc. :—

Under a similar ornamented stone to the foregoing :—

“ In memory of John Archer of Little Broughton who died on the 17th Day of March 1860 Aged 78 years. Sarah the Wife of John Archer of Little Broughton who died Nov^r. 16th 1837 Æ. 66 years.”

A tin plate inscribed :—

Under a trefoil Gothic ornaments :—

Also Mr. William Paitson their eldest Son died Nov^r. y^e 3rd 1766 Ag^d. 25. Jane Satterthwaite died Octb^r. 3^d 1751 Aged 19 weeks. Also Dorothy her Sister died April 29th 1753 aged 17 weeks Daughters of James Clark Satterthwaite Esq. and Jane his Wife.”

On a large stone obelisk, with sides inlaid with grey marble, and the large space enclosed with a neat iron railing resting on a dwarf stone wall:—

EAST SIDE. "Sacred to the Memory of Thomas Knight of Papcastle, second son of John Knight of Wolverley House Worcestershire, who died August 17th 1853, aged 74 years. Also to Isabella his Wife who died March 21st 1830, Aged 53 years."

NORTH SIDE. "Sacred to the memory of Isabella Knight who died August the 4th 1815, aged 15 years. Charles Knight who died on the 13th of February 1819, aged 5 years. Catharine Wife of J. P. Irwin, Esq. who died 5th June 1828 aged 23 years, and Marianne Satterthwaite Knight who died on the 16th of September 1860 aged 58 years."

WEST SIDE. "This monument was erected as a Tribute of filial and paternal affection by John Knight of Henley Hall, Salop, second son of Thomas Knight of Papcastle."

SOUTH SIDE.

"I.H.S.", in relief a round sunk space:—

"Susan, Wife of Robinson Wilson, who died at Papcastle, March 9th 1875, aged 27 years."

"Sacred to the memory of Nicholas Fletcher of Bridekirk, who Departed this Life the 26th of May 1779, Aged 88 Years. Also Mary his wife who Died y^e 24th of March 1775, Aged 75 years."

.....
 "Memento Mori."

An elaborately carved stone surmounted with a Gothic finial:—

"In memory of Joseph Pattinson of Bridekirk Hall, who died March 16th 1860 Aged 49 Years."

By a yew tree, a grave enclosed with festoons of chains, supported on iron pillars formed of inverted torches resting on stone pillars, and beside it a fine altar tomb, bearing the following inscription :—

“Sacred to the Memory of Daniel Clift Esq^{re} of Cocker-mouth who departed this Life June 17th 1863. Aged 85 years. Jane Wife of Daniel Clift, Esq^{re} of Anns-Hill who departed this Life Jan^r 1st 1813 Aged 35 years.

Daniel their second Son died 29th March 1833, aged 24 years. James Moore their eldest Son died 25th Nov^r 1836, aged 31 years. Jane Eleanor Penny their Grand daughter died 19th March 1843 Æ. 4 yrs. Also Eleanor Walker Slack their eldest Daughter who died Aug^t 20th 1850 aged 45 years. John Payle Clift died Oct^r 10th 1857, aged 46 years. Frances Ann their youngest Daughter who died March 18th 1870 Aged 58 years.”

Large altar tomb, enclosed with an iron palisading, resting on a stone floor :—

“Sacred to the memory of Major Henry Skelton of Papcastle who departed this Life on the 26 Day of April 1836 Aged 59 Years. Also Maria his Wife who Died the 5th of May 1876 Aged 90 Years.”

Another tomb enclosed as the foregoing :—

“Sacred to the memory of Arnoldus Jones Skelton, Esq^r late 3rd Guards of Branthwaite Hall and Papcastle, who died 23rd March, 1793, aged 42 years. Also of Elizabeth his Wife, Daughter of W. Hicks Esq^r of Whitehaven who died 25th June, 1812, aged 56 years. Also of Mary, their Daughter, who died 19th January 1784, aged 8 years. Also of Daniel Jones Skelton, Esq^r. their youngest Son, formerly Captain of the Royal Artillery, who died at Dover, 15th March, 1859,

aged 73 years deeply and universally regretted. Also of Priscella Sarah their Daughter, Widow of Rear Admiral Walker, C.B. who died at Boulogne Sur Mer, 7th January, 1861 aged 77 years.”

Under a draperied urn, acanthus leaves, and roses :—

“ In memory of William Allison of Tallentire, who died on the 25th of August 1845, aged 63 years. Also Elizabeth his Wife, who died the 28th of March 1855 aged 70 years. Betsy their Daughter, Died on the 8th of October, 1838. aged 19 years. William their Son, Died on the 8th of October 1848, aged 31 years. Sarah the Daughter, died Oct. 14th 1848 aged 22 years.”

On a fine black altar tomb, with panelled sides, and pillars at the corners :—

“ In memory of John Donald Allison of Tallentire who died the 15th day April 1843 aged 65 years. Also of Ann his Wife who died the 21st Day of April. 1854 aged 70 years.”

Under an ornamental urn and other arabesque ornaments :—

“ Sacred to the Memory of John Allison of Tallantire who died May 4th 1791 aged 53. Mary his Wife died October 18th 1797, aged 48 years. Joseph their Son Marriner died at Elsinore, the 17th of June 1805 aged 16 years.”

By a yew tree, under an ornamental top with leaves :—

Ornamented top, and festoons of leaves at the sides :—

“Erected in memory of Jacob Ritson of Tallentire, who died Sept: 10th 1813 aged 73 years. Also of Elizabeth his Wife who died Dec: 20th 1816 aged 71 years. Also of Esther, Mother of Jacob Ritson, who died Oct: 14th 1808, aged 91 years. Also of Mary, Wife of John Ritson of Tallentire, who died August 19th 1819, aged 26 years. And of John Son of John and Mary Ritson, who died July 25th 1819, aged 2 months. Also of Jacob, Son of John and Mary Ritson who died May 9th 1826, aged 9 years. Also of John Ritson of Tallentire Son of the above named Jacob and Elizabeth Ritson who died January 18th 1839, Aged 50 years.”

Under a draped urn, etc. :—

“In memory of Mr. Thomas Scott of Great Broughton, who departed this life the 28th day of March, 1785 aged 63 years. Also Catherine his Wife died May 29th 1795 aged 72 years. Likewise John their Eldest Son died January 7th 1794 aged 47 years.”

“In Memory of Nancy, Wife of Thomas Parker of Tallentire, who died June 24, 1843 aged 82 years. Also of the above Thomas Parker who died Dec^r 2nd 1850 aged 77 years. Also Jane the Wife of Jeremiah Tinnion and Daughter of the above who died March 31st 1869 aged 68 years.”

At back of this stone is:—

“In memory of.....Mary the Wife of Robert Grayson of Liverpool, who Died October 3, 1852 aged 35. Also of Ann wife of John Tinnion, Allerby, Mother of the above died March 5th 1859 aged 84.”

“In Memory of Esther Stamper of Tallentire who died highly and deservedly respected as a Schoolmistress, and sincere Christian, the 13th Day of May 1796, Aged 57 years.”

A handsome Gothic floreated cross perforated, with monogram PX conjoined, and the Greek letters Alpha and Omega:—

“In memoriam.

Alfred John Waugh born 12th, died 23^d August 1862. Fanny Ethel Waugh born 3^d Sept^r. 1864, died 12th August, 1867.”

Book, drapery, etc. :—

“Sacred to the memory of John Smith of Tallentire who died on the 31st of December 1839 aged 71 years. Also of Jane his Wife, who died the 30th of September 1845 aged 77 years. Mary Ann the Daughter of John and Jane Smith of Tallentire who died on the 14th of Nov. 1830, aged 25 years. Also of Isabella their Daughter who died Feb. 16th 1837, aged 29 years. Also of John their Son who died June 30th 1863, aged 60 years. Also of Thomas their Son who died Sept. 27th 1867, aged 64 years.”

A foreated cross in relief, within a quatrefoil :—

“Sacred to the memory of Dorothy Chambre of Lowther S^t Whitehaven, died the 14th June 1859 aged 79 years.”

Neat stone or slate, cut by John Watts, Repton, Derbyshire :—

“In memory of Margaret Hagger, Relict of Lieut. J. Hagger who died Dec^r. 18th 1858; aged 74 years. Lieut. Hagger was interred at Cockermouth, where a stone is erected to his Memory.”

“Here Lieth The Body of Richard Newcomb of Bridekirk who Departed this Life the 15th of August 1750 Aged 65 years.”

Neat stone with Gothic trefoil top :—

In Memoriam. Mary Ann Martin, Gale House Bridekirk, Born May 5th 1811, Died February 5th 1873. Also of Jane Houghton sister of the above Born November 1st 1828. Died November 22nd 1865.”

“To the memory of John Bacon of Bridekirk who died March 27th 1831 Aged 72.

Near this Stone to the South and East are interred the Remains of his Grandfathers and Grandmothers of his Father and Mother and Four Sisters. May they be suffered to rest undisturbed.”

“Here lieth the body of George White of Tal-
lentine who died August y^e 22. 1764 aged 73
years.”

Neat blue stone :—

“In memory of Sarah, Widow of Joseph Clementson of Cockermouth. Born 28 January 1790 Died 16 December 1874.”

“Erected in memory of Jane the Daughter of John and Jane Watson of Dovenby, who died 20th of April, 1851 aged 9 years.”

Ornamented with leaves, etc. :—

“In memory of Daniel McMullon of Tallentire Low House who died Dec^r 2^d 1865 aged 60 years.”

“Erected in memory of John Dodgson of Tallentire who died the 24th of April 1779 aged 74.”

“In memory of Isaac Dodgson of Mockerkin who died March 7th 1851 aged 67 years.”

“Here lyeth the Body of Thomas Bacon of Tallentyre who departed this Life the 20 Day of May in the year of our Lord 1742 and in the 69 yea^e of his age. Here also lies the body of Jane the Wife of Thomas Bacon who departed this life at Seaton the 15th day of August 1761 aged 86 years.”

Cut on two raised oval spaces :—

“Erected in memory of Joseph Cheesbrough of Tallantire, who died September 21st 1820, aged 80 years. Also of Elizabeth his Wife, who died April 12th 1826 aged 73 years. And also of Joseph Sewell of Cockermouth the Nephew of Joseph and Elizabeth Cheesbrough who died July 16th 1819 aged 20 years. And also of William Sewell of Cockermouth his Brother, who died October 14th 1826 aged 25 years.”

“In memory of Eleanor Wife of Joseph Telford of Papcastle who died Dec^r 11th 1841 aged 37. Also three of their Children who died in Infancy.”

“Sacred to the memory of John Sewell of Cocker-mouth who Departed this Life July 30th 1833 at Montreal in North America aged XXIX years.

In Foreign climes far from his native home
 He's safely laid beneath the silent tomb
 On life's rough sea his troubled voyage is o'er
 His rambling thoughts can be deceived no more
 With hope he sleeps in man's last dreary bed,
 Till the last trumpet wakes the slumbering dead.

Also of Ann Sewell his Mother, who died May 16th 1831 aged 63 years.”

“Erected in Memory of Jacob Hodgson of Papcastle, who died Jan^r 24th 1853 aged 61 years, and of Mary his Wife died Sept^r 3rd 1862 aged 63 years. Also of Elizabeth, their Daughter, died Feb. 8th 1860, aged 34 years. Also of Simeon their Son, who died April 29th 1864 aged 32 years.”

“Erected in memory of Joseph Burton of Talantire who died June 14th 1864, aged 77 years.”

By the wall of old Chancel, east end:—

“In Memory of John Hodgson of Cocker-mouth who died Nov^r 1841 Aged 47 Years.”

At end of old wall:—

“In memory of Robert Hodgson late of Bridekirk who died Feb. 11th 1844, aged 84 years. Also of Elizabeth his Wife who Died Feb. 12th 1844, aged 84 years. They were married 56 years, and interred together in the same grave. Judith, oldest Daughter of Robert and Elizabeth Hodgson of Bridekirk who died Nov^r 30th 1819 aged 23 years. Also of Ann their youngest Daughter who died July 1st 1810 aged 4 years.

Martha their second Daughter died September 22d. 1835 aged 34 years. Joseph their youngest Son who died the 23d of July, 1842 aged 43 years."

They lived 56 years together, and were buried at one time.

At end of old Chancel, lying flat, a polished Calvary granite cross resting on one, with a stone below inscribed round about in large Old-English letters in relief:—

"† Sacred to the memory of Frecheville Brougham Ballantine Dykes of Dovenby Hall who Died June 13th 1866 Aged 17 years.†"

The whole resting on a stone floor with dwarf wall, on which is a twisted iron rail, supported on ten elegant iron posts.

"In memory of John Tyson of Papcastle who died Dec: 24 1841 aged 56 years. Also of Ann Tyson his Wife who died August 17th 1848 aged 64 years.....Martha Tyson his Mother died August 28. 1840 aged 88..... Elizabeth Atkinson died April 1. 1828 aged 84. Mary Watson died Dec: 13 1830 aged 88."

South end of old Chancel :—

"Erected in memory of Hannah the Wife of Abraham Mackreth of Cockermouth who departed this Life the 10th of April 1819 Aged 34 years. Also Thomas their Son, who Died the 9th day of April 1820 Aged 3 years. George Watson of Papcastle Died the 18th of November 1818 aged 60 years. Also to the memory of the above Ab^m Mackreth Stone Mason and Clark of Cockermouth Church who departed this Life on the 29th of June 1823 Aged 35 years.

Oh cruel death, that would no longer spare
A loving husband and a friend so dear;
Great is the loss to those who 're left behind
But He, we hope, eternal joys doth find."

Handsome altar tomb :—

“ In memory of Humphrey Senhouse of the Fitz who died Octo: 28th 1839 aged 51 years. Also John his Son who died April 27th 1849 Aged 33 years. Emma Wife of the above Humphrey Senhouse and Mother of John Senhouse who died October 30th 1850 aged 59 years. Also William Ponsonby Senhouse their second Son Died the 19th Day of Sept: aged 43 years.”

Neat stone with perforated cross at top :—

“ In memory of William Senhouse, of Lincoln's Inn, Barrister at Law, Son of Humphrey Senhouse Esq. of Cockermouth, and great-great Grandson of Patricius Senhouse of Hames Hall, who died on the 8th July 1829 aged 33. Also of Mary Senhouse, his Sister who died on the 6th December, 1870.”

On a brass plate, inlaid in the floor of the old Chancel :—

“ Beneath this Stone are interred the remains of the first born Son of John Sanderson and Elizabeth Fisher of Wood Hall in this Parish who lived and died on the Third day of August 1805.”

Handsome grey and white marble monument, surmounted with a large white marble sarcophagus, on the face of which is inscribed :—

“ Mary Relict of William Browne Ob. 16. July 1818 Æ: 76.”

On an oval white marble plaque affixed to the face of this monument, with marble drapery over it :—

“ To the memory of William Browne, Esquire, of Tallentire Hall, in this Parish, whose Remains lie deposited within the Railing of this Altar. He died A.D. 1802 Aged 69 years.”

A large space, to the north of the old Chancel, enclosed by a neat low fence, raised on a dwarf wall (Fisher Family, Wood Hall).

North side of old Chancel, under a triangular moulding:—

“Erected in memory of Charlott the Wife of John Yarker of Dovenby, who died the 2nd of March 1845 aged 65 years. Also of Henry Wheatley Yarker, the son of John & Charlott Yarker who died in Jamaica, the 2nd Day of February 1833 aged 18 years. Also of Thomas Yarker their son, who died on his passage from Calcutta the 5th Day of November 1833 aged 17 years. Also of John Yarker their Son who died the 22nd Day of March 1845 aged 35 years.”

“I.H.S.—In memory of.....Sarah the Beloved Wife of Anthony Huntington, of Tallentire, who died Aug 5. 1871. aged 77 years.”

A handsome Gothic top:—

“In Memory of James Hodgson, who departed this Life October 14th 1862, aged 46 years.....
.....Also of Betty their Daughter who died Nov. 5th 1845, aged 4 months. Also of Henry their Son who died March 12th 1859 aged 6 years.”

A tall altar shaped monument, surmounted by an urn:—

“In memory of Isabella the beloved Wife of William Sanderson of Goat who died Feb^r 26th 1872 aged 52 years.”

Open book (Holy Bible) on a star:—

“I Hope in thy Word. Thy Word is Truth.

In affectionate Remembrance. William Armstrong, Appleton Hall who died December 5th 1856 aged 76 years. Sibby his Wife died January 13th 1870, aged 87 years. Hannah their Daughter died at Papcastle, May 12th 1875, aged 48 years.”

Iron labels:—

“J. George 1875.”

Under ring and cross emblems:—

“In affectionate Remembrance of George Ritson of Tallantire who died June 18th 1872, aged 59 years.

Blessed are the Dead which die in the Lord.”

Iron label:—

“Sacred. In Memory of Dickinson Walker of S^t Bees who died June 16th 1854 aged 27 years.”

A stone, original inscription obliterated, modern:—

Under a palm branch, in high relief:—

“Erected in memory of Agnes Daughter of Towers and Mary Tyson, of Taw House, Eskdale who died Nov^r. 6th. 1871 aged 13 months.”

“In front of this stone lies the remains of Frances Cooke relict of the late Ralph Cooke Esq^r of Camerton Hall, who died the 6th day of Jan^r 1833.”

On a neat stone, with “I.H.S.” amongst a bouquet of lilies, the whole within a Gothic quatrefoil, and underneath the following inscription:—

“In Memory of Elizabeth Carter the beloved Wife of Rev^d James Carter, Vicar of Bridekirk. Died April 4. 1873.”

Another similar, but ornaments within a Gothic trefoil:—

“In affectionate Remembrance of..... Henry Son of Henry & Mary Robinson, who died at Cockermouth Jan. 3rd 1875 aged 4 years.

The Lord gave and the Lord hath taken away,
Blessed be the name of the Lord.”

Under an urn, etc. :—

“In memory of Wilson Pearson of Bridekirk Esquire who died November 4th 1799 aged 62 years. Also of Allan Pearson Esq^r who died 2nd Nov^r 1823, and also of John Thompson Esq^r who died 3rd Sept^r 1824.”

Plain large slate-coloured stone :—

“In memory of Henry Teshmaker Thompson Esquire of Bridekirk who died May 1st 1855, aged 62 years.”

An altar tomb, supported on six elegant pillars :—

“Underneath this Stone is interred the Body of William Hervey of Bridekirk Surgeon who died the 27th November 1834, aged 27 years. Also within these Rails Frederick George Son of William Slack Esq. of Anns Hill and Jane Hephzibah his Wife who died on the 19th of July 1837 aged three months. And also Christina Maria Daughter of William & Jane H. Slack, Died the 4th of March 1841 Aged 5 years & 6 months.”

A handsome monument of fine Sicilian marble, surmounted with a draped female winged figure, etc. :—

“In memory of Georgina Caroline, the beloved Wife of William Lamplugh Hervey who died on the 17th October 1872 aged 21 years.

The Lord gave & the Lord hath taken away; blessed be the name of the Lord.”

She was accidentally thrown from her carriage and killed.

The whole space is enclosed by an elegant bronzed iron palisading, resting on a dwarf wall.

Under a draped urn :—

“Sacred to the memory of Daniel Lancaster of Papcastle who died on the 19th of December 1803, Aged 63 years.”

An ancient well-carved stone, and the inscription represented on drapery, but entirely obliterated, except the end near the ground:—

“Aged 78 years.”

An urn and drapery:—

“In memory of Joseph Robinson Mariner of Maryport who died Oct. 13th 1836 aged 61 years. Also of Sarah the Wife of Robert Bell who died March 28. 1838 Æ. 68.”

“George y^e Son of M^r. Richard Raisbeck of Dovenby died Octob^r. the 10th 1737 aged 7 years. Mrs. J. Raisbeck, Mother of the s^d George died 10 ber y^e 19th 1742 Aged 47. Sacred to y^e memory of M^r. Richard Raisbeck Husband and Father of the above who Dyed May y^e 13th 1757 aged 70 years.”

Solid large altar tomb, raised on a stone floor, with crest in relief; at W. end, a cross crosslet:—

“Sacred to the memory of William Rudd Esq. of Cockermouth who died Sep. 11th 1841 aged 61 years. Also Maria his Wife, youngest Daughter of Arnoldus Jones Skelton, Esq of Papcastle who died Oct. 11th 1824 aged 35 years. Three of their Children died in Infancy. Mary Ann Second Wife of the above named William Rudd younger Daughter of John Head, Esq. of High Cross in Loweswater Died Feb. 5th 1842. Aged 37. Two of their Children died in Infancy. Also James Satterthwaite, Lieutenant H.M. 32nd Light Infantry, third son of the above William and Mary Ann Rudd who died at Sydenham 7th of August, 1856 aged 32 years. Also John Trohear, Captain H.M. 59th. Regiment Fourth son of the above William and Mary Ann Rudd who died at Sandgate Kent, June 27th 1875 aged 36 years.”

Altar tomb on four pillars :—

“ Here lies the Body of Jane, Wife of Tho: Trohear of Papcastle who died the 24th June 1742 aged 46. Also Tho: Trohear Husband to the aboves^d Jane who died Nov: 2^d 1753 aged 74. Als Thos. their Son who died June 27th 1762 aged 33. Also M^{rs} Ann Rudd, widow of Papcastle their Daughter, who died July 30th, 1793 aged 73. Also John Rudd Esq. of Cockermouth, eldest Son of the said Ann Rudd who died Nov. 22nd 1800 aged 58. And also Jane his Wife who died March 31st 1832 aged 83. Also Sarah Rudd of Derwent House Cockermouth their Daughter who died January 22. 1864 aged 90.”

“ Sacred to the memory of Richard Thompson of Bridekirk who died the 14th August 1773 aged 52 years. Also of Ann Thompson His Widow who died the 14th May 1811 aged 86 years.”

Cable moulding, and flower in a trefoil :—

“ In memory of Elizabeth Carter, beloved Wife of William Carter of Tallentire who died February 16th 1874, aged 35 years. John Carter Son of the above who died December 31st 1865 aged 21 Days.”

Draped urn, bunches of flowers, and strawberries :—

“ William Pearson late of Great Broughton who died at Wigton on the 26th of November 1842 Æ. 77 years. Isabella Wife of William Pearson who departed this Life at Great Broughton August 26th 1831, aged 48.”

“ Elizabeth Tolson 1709.”

“In memory of Henry Tolson of Papcastle who departed this Life November 19th 1767 aged 55. Also of Mary Poole his grand daughter who died 15th Dec^r 1780 Aged 11 years. And also of Elizabeth Tolson, his Daughter who died 12th of May 1781 Aged 39. And also Ann his Wife who died April 19th 1789 Aged 71.

Henry Tolson of Papcastle Esq. Son of the above Henry and Ann Tolson, who died Nov^r the 22^d 1807 aged 62 years. Also of M^{rs} Margaret Tolson Wife of the above Henry Tolson of Papcastle Esq^r who departed this Life the 22^d of February 1814 in the 64th year of her age.”

Altar tomb, on four pillars, beside pathway :—

“Here lies the Body of John Brumfield of Papcastle who died April y^e 17 aged 79 years. Anno Domini 1743. Allso Thomas Brumfield his Son who died y^e 12 of January, in y^e 9th year of his age Anno Domini 1712. Also Frances the Wife of y^e above John Brumfield who departed this life February y^e 2nd 1758 aged 87 years. M^r Thomas Brumfield died July 20th 1773 aged 70. Also M^{rs} Sarah his Wife who departed this Life the 6 of October 1797 aged 83 years. M^r John Brumfield of Papcastle Son of M^r Thomas and Sarah Brumfield died the 4th of May 1814 aged 69 years, and also of M^{rs} Mary Brumfield his Wife who departed this Life the 5th day of January 1814 in the 73rd year of her age.”

“Here lieth y^e Body of Rob^t Crosthwaite of Papcastle who died April y^e 1 1735 aged 79 years. Also Mary his Wife who died April y^e 8th 1741 aged 81 years.”

Under drapery, ornaments, etc. :—

“Sacred to the memory of Ann the Wife of Henry Twentyman of Great Broughton, who died 29th of January 1810 aged 46 years. Also of the above Henry Twentyman who died on the 5th Day of September 1824 Aged 70 years. Also of Rachel their fifth Child, who died 22nd December 1797 aged 7 years. And of Rachel their ninth Child, who died Oct. 9th 1800 aged 1 year and 3 months. Also of Jane Twentyman their Daughter who died June 21st 1813, aged 18 years. And of Elizabeth their Daughter who died October 12th 1816, aged 23 years. Sarah their Daughter the Wife of John Harrison died March 11th 1827 aged 25 years.”

“Here lies the Corps of the Rev John Harrison A.M. late Vicar of Bridekirk Aged 77. 1755. Also The Corps of his Dear Wife Aged 71. 1754.”
Built in the S. wall of the old Chancel, outside.

“In memory of Ann the Wife of John Fisher of Papcastle who departed this life the 19th of December 1779 aged 87 years.”

“Here lieth the body of John Thursby of Tallentire died May y^e 4th 1771, aged 80 years. Also Mary his Wife who Died May 20th 1785 aged 83 years.”

A slab, unscribed, lying flat over the grave beside a coffin-shaped, half round stone, lying also flat on the grave.

“Here lies y^e Body of Richard y^e Son of John Carter of Tallintier who died July y^e 26th 1739 aged 18 years. John the Son of John Carter died February y^e 28. 1740, aged 26 years.”

“Here rests the Body of Christopher Atkinson of little Broughton who departed this Life Nov^r 15th 1749 in the 57 year of his age.

“ Here lies y^e body of Jane y^e wife to Thomas Carter of Tallentire who died December y^e 29th Anno dom. 1740 aged 24 years. Mary her Daughter who died January y^e 6th 1749 aged 11 years.”

On an altar tomb:—

“ Heare lies Richard Lamplugh of Dovenby who died March 23 17... Aged ... years. Also Mary the third Daughter who died..... Aged ... years.”

The next four refer to the painted Windows.—East end, on a brass plate, inside new Edifice, as are all the remaining inscriptions:—

“ These Windows were placed here to the memory of Joseph Dykes Ballantine Dykes and Mary Ballantine his Wife by their surviving Children A.D. 1869.”

West end:—

“ TO · THE · BELOVED · MEMORY · OF
OUR · FATHER · F. L. B. DYKES. · AND OF
OUR BROTHER F. B. B. DYKES WHO BOTH
DIED IN THE YEAR 1866.”

North transept:—

“ In Memory of his Father and Mother Robert & Mary Stockdale of Tallentire. This Window has been Erected By George Stockdale of 9 Hanover Villas Kensington Park London formerly of this Parish AD 1874.”

South:—

“ This Window has been presented By George Stockdale of No 9 Hanover Villas Kensington Park, London formerly of this Parish in affectionate Memory of Catherine his beloved Wife who died in London July 8. 1869. & is Buried in the Cemetry, Brompton.”

On a brass plate, affixed to the pulpit, inscribed in black, red, and blue:—

“In memory of her Husband John Smith of Tallentire who died June 30th 1863. This Pulpit has been presented to the Parish Church of Bridekirk by his affectionate Widow Sarah Smith, née Rooke, 1869.”

On a brass plate, affixed to the reading desk:—

“This Desk has been presented to the Parish Church of Bridekirk together with the Lord’s Table, Table Cover & two Chairs by Mrs. George Stockdale of 9 Hanover Villas Kensington Park London 1869.”

Porch; west wall.—White marble, on a black ground:—

“In Memory of Miss Hephzibah Hervey who died Jan. 27th. 1838 aged 65 years.”

Opposite wall.—On slate, with black marble frame:—

“In Memory of Jane Hephzibah Wife of William Slack Esq^r of Anns Hill who died 17th May 1839 aged 36 years.”

White marble cenotaph, over the inner entrance to porch:—

“Sacred to the Memory of Dorothy the Wife of Joseph Steel of Cockermouth Solicitor, and Daughter of John Ponsonby Esq^r of Hail Hall who died February 11th 1799 aged 37 years.”

Near this monument stands the celebrated ancient carved stone Font, with its Runic inscription.—See *History of Cumberland*.

Altar tomb of white marble, surmounted by a marble urn:—

“Sacred to the memory of Sarah wife of the Rev^d H. A. Hervey Vicar of this Parish died Nov^r 3rd 1827 Aged 55 years.”

“The memory of the just is Blessed”

“And the Spirit shall return to God who gave it.”

The following is cut on a brass plate, and is kept in the Vestry:—

This inscription was first published in John Le Neve's "Monumenta Anglicana: being Inscriptions on the Monuments of several Eminent Persons, deceased in or since the year 1650 to the end of the year 1679. 8vo. London, 1718." As it differs from the above, it is here printed as it there appears, viz. :—
