Dear Ron, Jose & Kevin:

Awesome! I just sat down and read TALES OF STRANGEFATE #210–213 in one sitting and couldn't believe what I read! Knowing that "Jade Inferno" would be an epic, I waited for the whole storyline to come out before I sat down and read it (the anticipation nearly killed me). It was worth the wait! I always thought Frankie Rayner was a lousy successor to the power of the green flame, but she really earned the right in "Inferno," even if she needed the help of a certain enigmatic demigod. A few suggestions:

Doctor Strangefate has always been a character on the outskirts of the Amalgam Universe, and I've had kind of a love/hate relationship with him since way back when. I like heroes, and this guy is so unlike a classic hero it's hard to peg him. He seems to have the best of intentions but often does things so manipulative and underhanded to attain those ends, it's hard to just accept him as a good guy. Take for example his victory over Baron Wotan way back in TALES OF STRANGEFATE #157-did he really have to do that to Bruce Banner to defeat the Baron?
