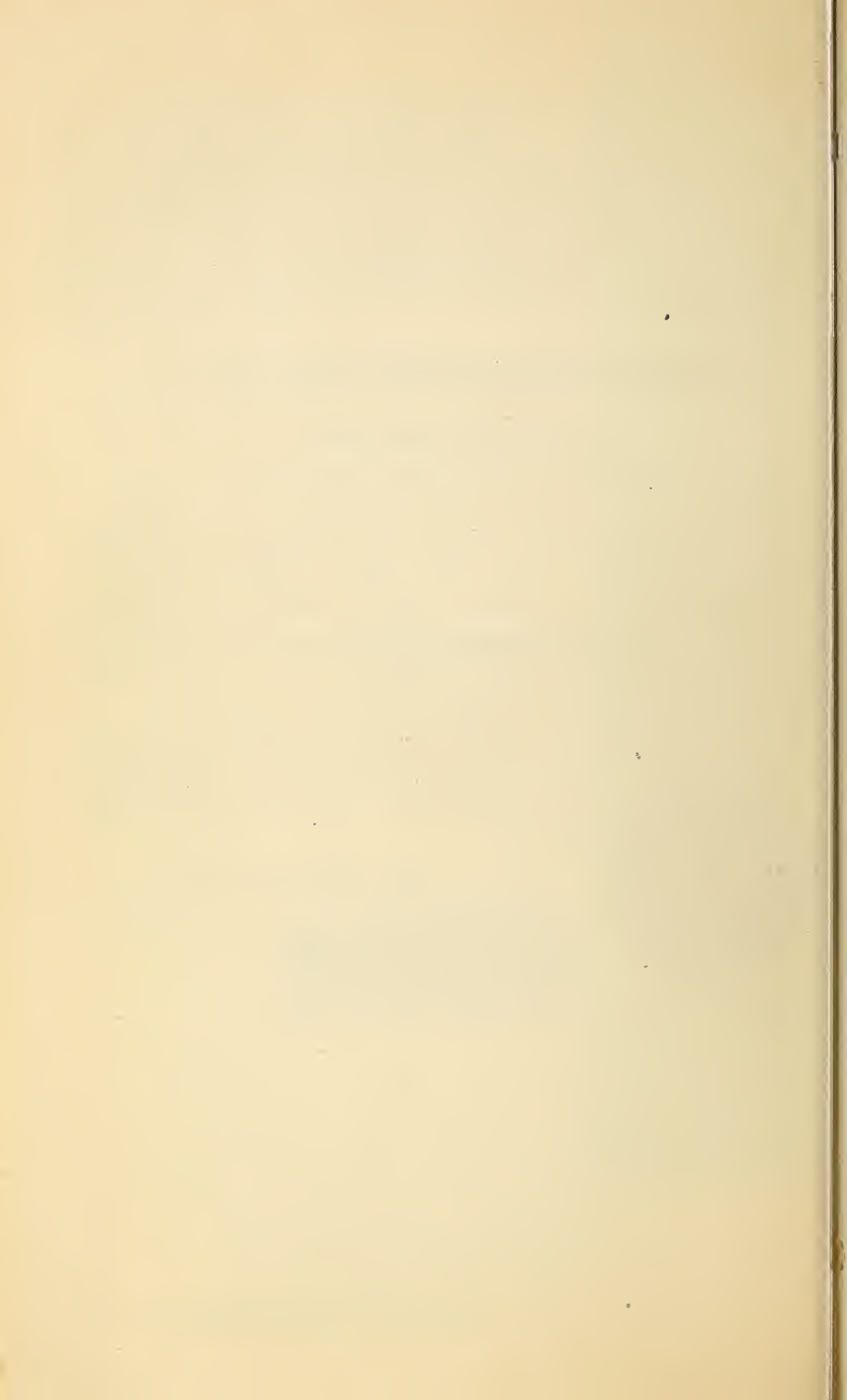

AMENDMENT NO. 2 TO CIRCULAR NO. 46.

By virtue of the authority vested in the Secretary of Agriculture by the United States Cotton Futures Act of August 18, 1914 (38 United States Statutes at Large, page 693), I, David F. Houston, Secretary of Agriculture, do make, prescribe, publish, and give public notice of the following amendment to the rules and regulations of the Secretary of Agriculture, dated February 10, 1915, under said act, said amendment to be effective on and after this day:

In Regulation 3, section 1, strike out the words "Fall River, Mass."

In Regulation 3, section 2, strike out the words "Fall River, Mass."
