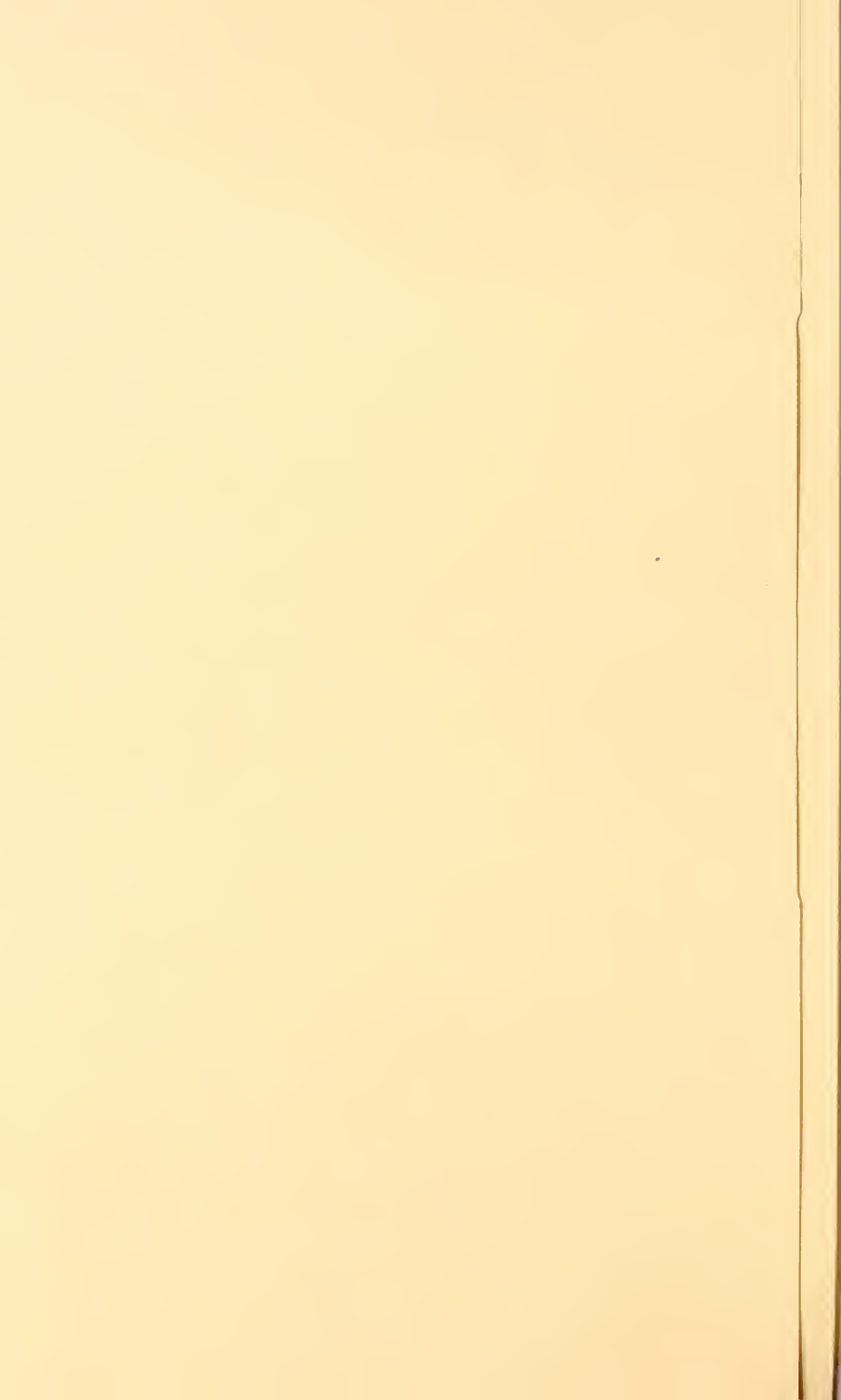

AMENDMENT NO. 2 TO THE RULES AND REGULATIONS FOR CARRY- ING OUT THE PROVISIONS OF THE INSECTICIDE ACT OF 1910.

The rules and regulations for carrying out the provisions of the insecticide act of 1910 are hereby amended by the addition of the following regulation, to be effective at once:

“REGULATION 14 (a). DEFINITION OF FUNGI.

“(Section 6.)

“The term ‘fungi,’ as used in the act and these regulations, is understood to mean all nonchlorophyll-bearing plants of a lower order than mosses and liverworts (i. e. nonchlorophyll-bearing thallophytes), comprising rusts, smuts, mildews, molds, yeasts, bacteria, etc.”
